- a. Inspect the engine coolant (See ON-VEHICLE INSPECTION).

2. INSPECT ENGINE OIL

- a. Inspect the engine oil (See ON-VEHICLE INSPECTION).

3. INSPECT BATTERY

- a. Inspect the battery (See ON-VEHICLE INSPECTION).

4. INSPECT AIR CLEANER FILTER ELEMENT SUB-ASSEMBLY

- a. Remove the air cleaner filter element sub-assembly.
- b. Visually check that there is no dirt, blockage, and/or damage to the air cleaner filter element.

HINT:

- If there is any dirt or a blockage in the air cleaner filter element, clean it with compressed air.
- If any dirt or a blockage remains even after cleaning the air cleaner filter element with compressed air, replace it.

5. INSPECT SPARK PLUG

- a. Inspect the spark plugs (See ON-VEHICLE INSPECTION).

6. INSPECT VALVE LASH ADJUSTER NOISE

- a. Rev up the engine several times. Check that the engine does not emit unusual noises.

If unusual noises occur, warm up the engine and idle it for over 30 minutes. Then repeat this procedure.

HINT:

If any defects or problems are found during the inspection above, perform lash adjuster inspection (See INSPECTION).

7. INSPECT IGNITION TIMING

- a. Warm up the engine.
- b. When using Techstream:

Check the ignition timing.

1. Connect Techstream to the DLC3.

2. Enter DATA LIST mode with Techstream.

Ignition timing: 8 to 12° BTDC at idle

HINT:

Refer to Techstream operator's manual for help when selecting the DATA LIST.

- c. When not using Techstream:

Check the ignition timing.

1. Using SST, connect terminals 13 (TC) and 4 (CG) of the DLC3.

SST 09843-18040

NOTE:

- **Confirm the terminal numbers before connecting them. Connection with a wrong terminal can damage the engine.**
- **Turn off all electrical systems before connecting the terminals.**
- **Perform this inspection after the cooling fan motor is turned off.**

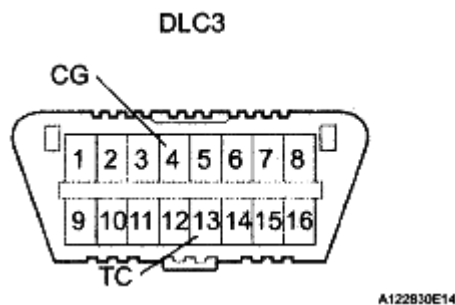


Fig. 1: Identifying DLC3 Connector Terminals

2. Remove the V-bank cover.
3. Pull out the red lead wire harness.
4. Connect the tester terminal of the timing light to the red lead wire as shown in the illustration.

NOTE: Use a timing light which can detect the first signal.

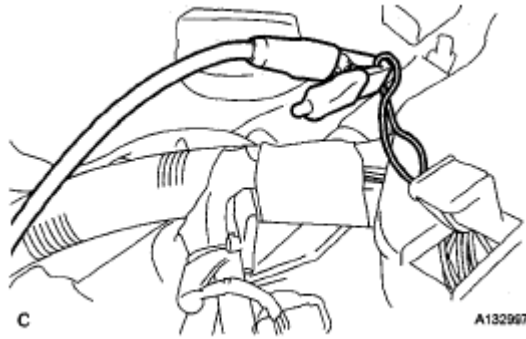


Fig. 2: Connecting Tester Terminal Of Timing Light To Red Lead Wire

5. Check the ignition timing at idle.

Ignition timing: 8 to 12° BTDC at idle

NOTE: When checking the ignition timing, the transmission should be in neutral.

HINT:

Run the engine at 1000 to 1300 rpm for 5 seconds, and then check that the engine rpm returns to idle speed.

6. Disconnect terminals 13 (TC) and 4 (CG) of the DLC3.
7. Check the ignition timing at idle.

Ignition timing: 7 to 24° BTDC at idle

8. Confirm that the ignition timing moves to the advanced angle side when the engine rpm is increased.
9. Remove the timing light.

8. INSPECT ENGINE IDLE SPEED

- a. Warm up the engine.
- b. When using Techstream:

Check the idle speed.

1. Connect Techstream to the DLC3.
2. Enter DATA LIST mode with Techstream.

Idle speed: 600 to 700 rpm

NOTE:

- When checking the idle speed, the transmission should be in neutral.
- Check the idle speed with the cooling fan off.
- Switch off all accessories and air conditioning before connecting Techstream.

HINT:

Refer to Techstream operator's manual for further details.

- c. When not using Techstream:

Check the idle speed.

1. Using SST, connect the tachometer test probe to terminal 9 (TAC) of the DLC3.

2. Check the idle speed.

Idle speed: 600 to 700 rpm

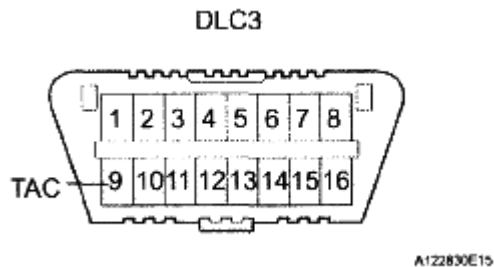


Fig. 3: Identifying DLC3 Connector Terminals

9. INSPECT COMPRESSION

- a. Warm up and stop the engine.
- b. Disconnect the injector connectors.
- c. Remove the intake air surge tank (See **REMOVAL**).
- d. Remove the 6 ignition coils.
- e. Remove the 6 spark plugs.
- f. Check the cylinder compression pressure.
 1. Insert a compression gauge into the spark plug hole.
 2. While cranking the engine, measure the compression pressure.

Compression pressure: 1.3 MPa (13 kgf/cm² , 189 psi)

Minimum pressure: 0.98 MPa (10 kgf/cm² , 142 psi)

Difference between each cylinder: 0.1 MPa (1.0 kgf/cm² , 15 psi)

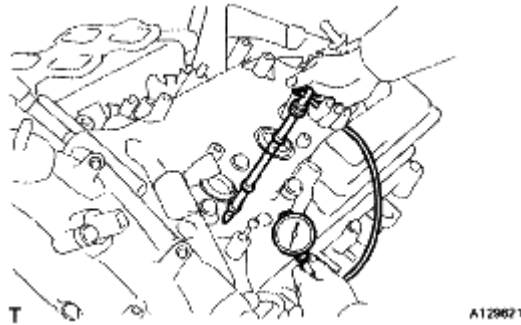


Fig. 4: Checking Cylinder Compression Pressure

NOTE:

- Always use a fully charged battery to obtain an engine speed of 250 rpm or more.
- Check the other cylinders' compression pressure in the same way.
- This measurement must be done as quickly as possible.

3. If the cylinder compression is low, pour a small amount of engine oil into the cylinder through the spark plug hole and inspect again.

HINT:

- If adding oil increases the compression, the piston rings and/or cylinder bore may be worn or damaged.
- If pressure stays low, a valve may be stuck or seated improperly, or there may be leakage in the gasket.

- g. Install the 6 spark plugs.

Torque: 18 N*m (184 kgf*cm, 13 ft.*lbf)

- h. Install the 6 ignition coils.

Torque: 10 N*m (102 kgf*cm, 7 ft.*lbf)

- i. Install the intake air surge tank (See **INSTALLATION**).

10. INSPECT CO/HC

- a. Start the engine.
- b. Run the engine at 2500 rpm for approximately 180 seconds.

- c. Insert the CO/HC meter testing probe at least 40 cm (1.3 ft.) into the tailpipe during idling.
- d. Check CO/HC concentration at idle and/or 2500 rpm.

HINT:

Check regulations and restrictions in your area when performing 2 mode CO/HC concentration testing (engine check at both idle speed and at 2500 rpm).

If the CO/HC concentration does not comply with regulations, perform troubleshooting in the order given below.

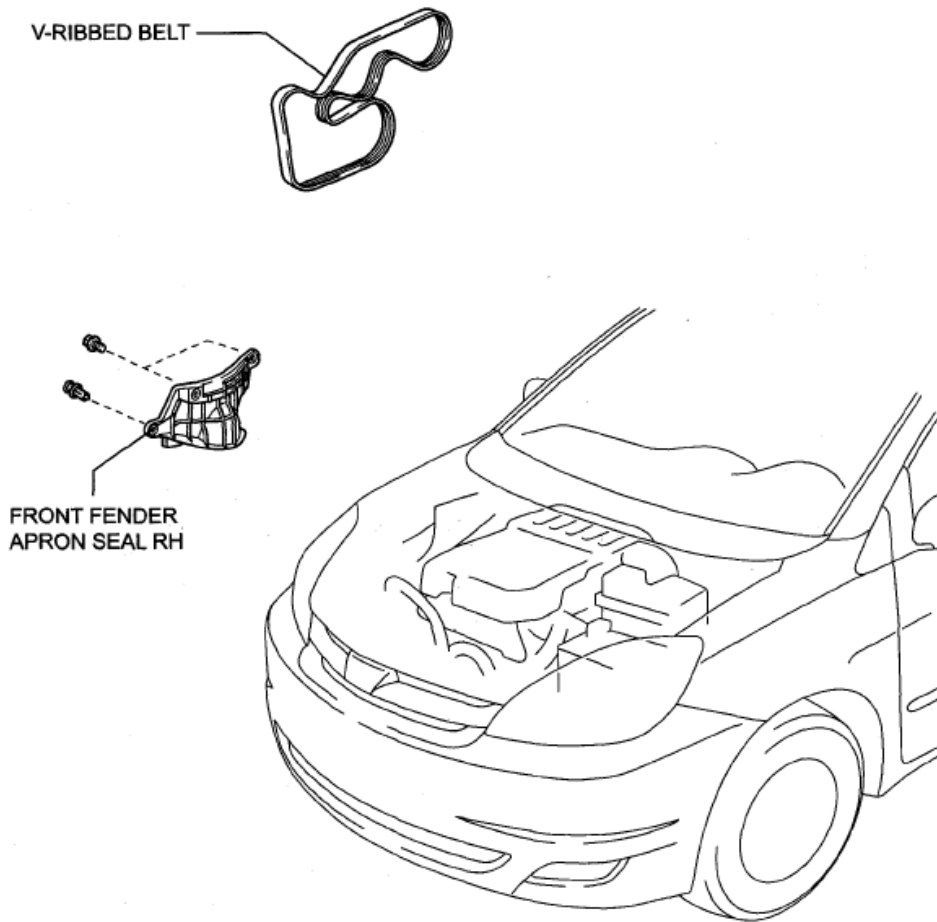
1. Check air fuel ratio sensor and heated oxygen sensor operation.
2. See the table below for possible causes, and then inspect and repair.

REMOVAL

1. **REMOVE FRONT WHEEL RH**
2. **REMOVE FRONT FENDER APRON SEAL RH** (See **REMOVAL**)
3. **REMOVE V-RIBBED BELT**
 - a. Using SST, release the belt tension by turning the belt tensioner counterclockwise, and remove the V-ribbed belt from the belt tensioner.

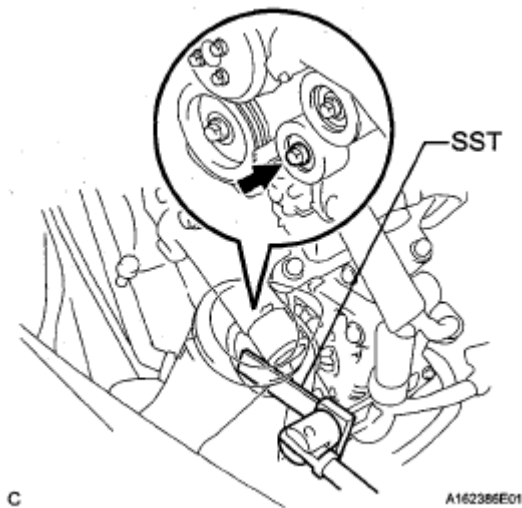


Fig. 6: Identifying SST 09249-63010

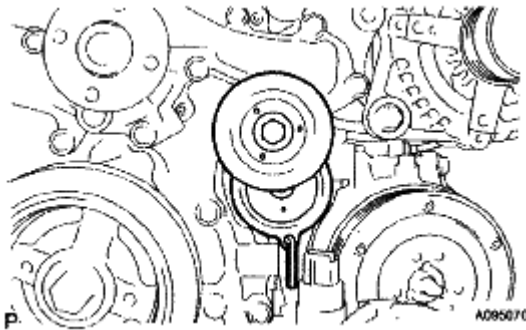


Fig. 7: Inserting Bi-Hexagon Wrench Into Holes To Fix V-Ribbed Belt Tensioner

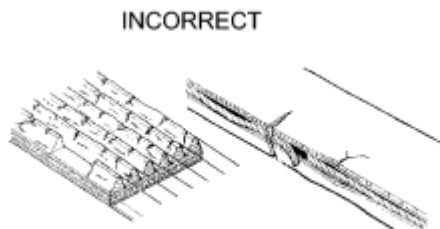


Fig. 8: Check The Belt For Wear, Cracks Or Other Signs Of Damage

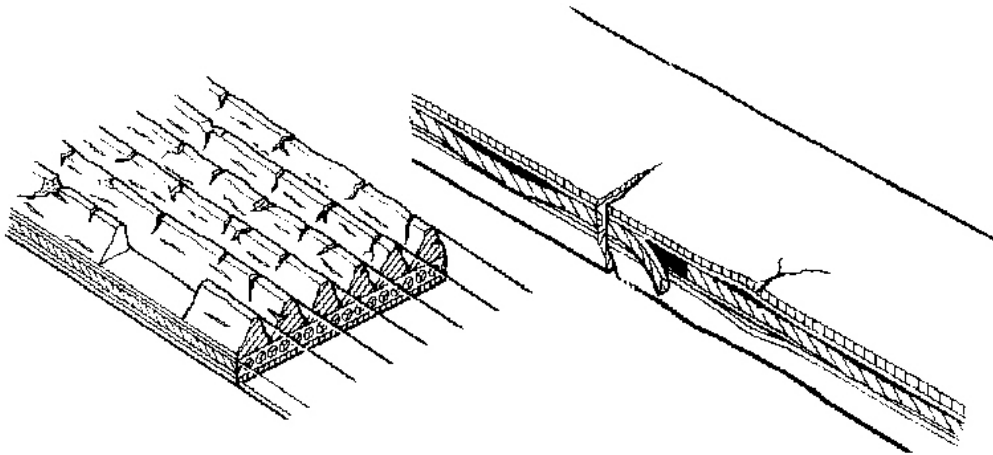

- a. Check the belt for wear, cracks or other signs of damage.

If any defect has been found, replace the V-ribbed belt.

- The belt is cracked.
- The belt is worn out to the extent that the cords are exposed.
- The belt has chunks missing from the ribs.

- b. Check that the belt fits properly in the ribbed grooves.

NOTE: Check with your hand to confirm that the belt has not slipped out of the grooves on the bottom to the pulley. If it has slipped out, replace the V-ribbed belt. Install a new V-ribbed belt correctly.

2. INSPECT V-RIBBED BELT TENSIONER ASSEMBLY

- a. Check that nothing gets caught in the tensioner by turning it clockwise and counterclockwise. If a malfunction exists, replace the tensioner.

INSTALLATION

1. INSTALL V-RIBBED BELT

- a. Install the V-ribbed belt.
- b. Using SST, turn the belt tensioner counterclockwise and remove the bar.

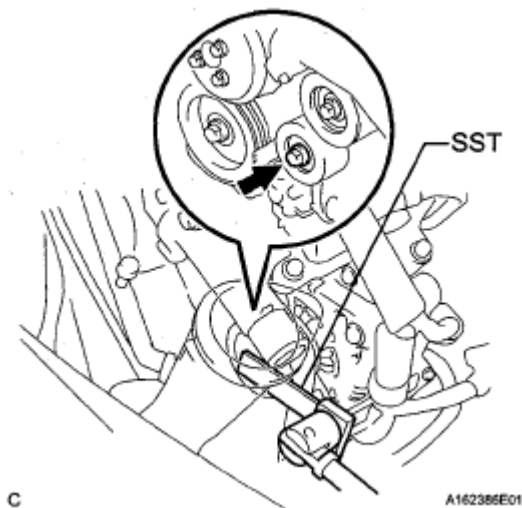
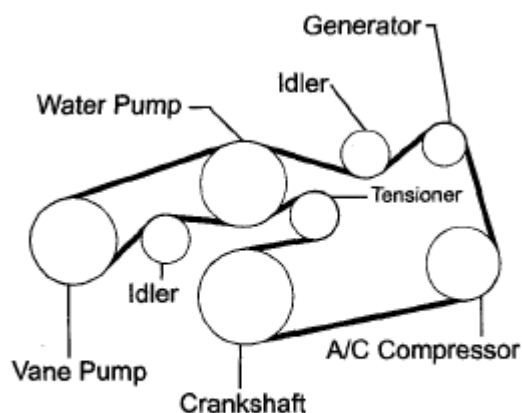


Fig. 10: Identifying SST 09249-63010

- c. If it is difficult to install the V-ribbed belt, perform the following procedure:
 1. Put the V-ribbed belt on every pulley except the tensioner pulley as shown in the illustration.

2. While releasing the belt tension by turning the belt tensioner counterclockwise, put the V-ribbed belt on the tensioner pulley.

NOTE:

- Put the backside of the V-ribbed belt on the tensioner pulley and idler pulley.
- Check that the V-ribbed belt is properly set to each pulley.

3. After installing the V-ribbed belt, check that it fits properly in the ribbed grooves. Confirm that the belt has not slipped out of the grooves on the bottom of the crank pulley by hand.

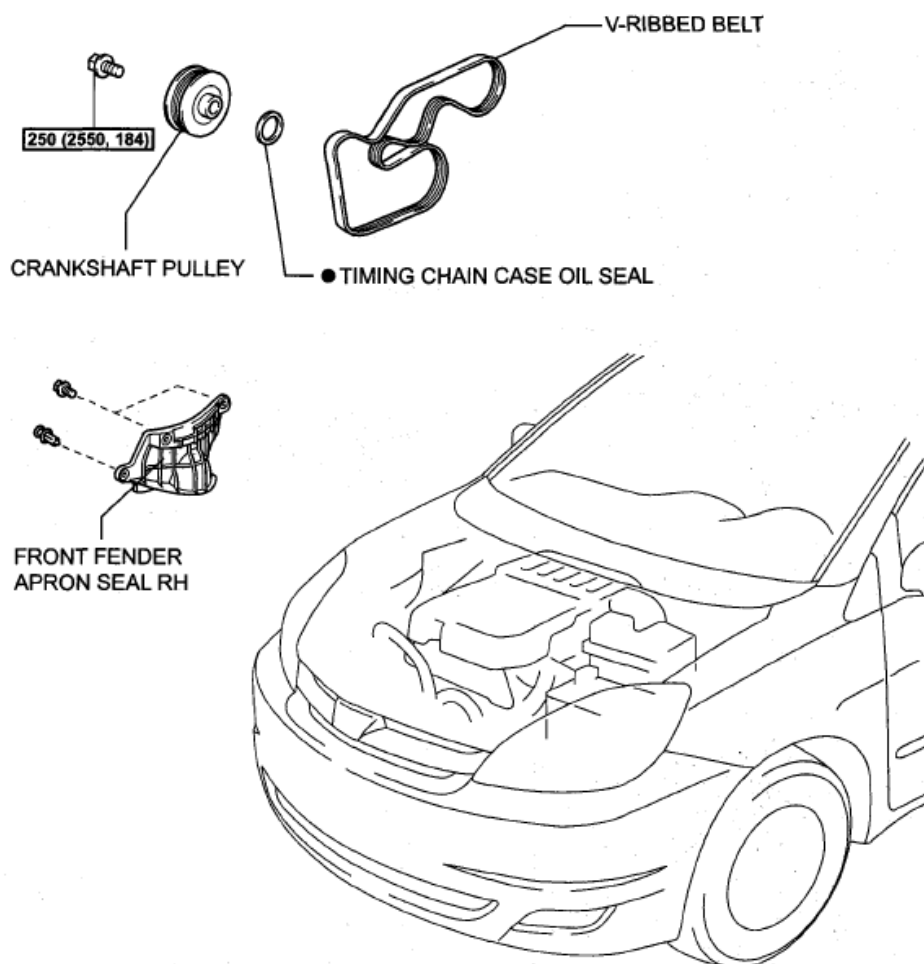

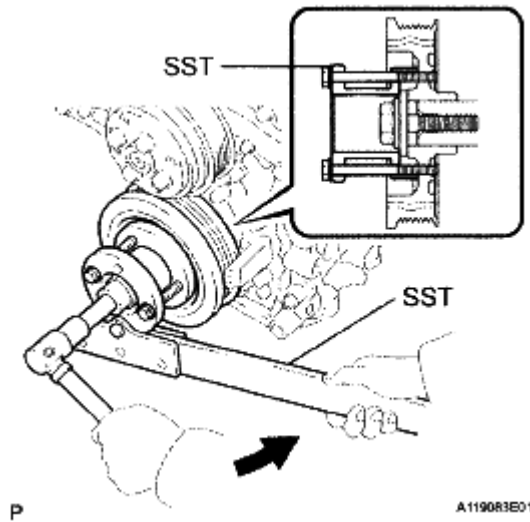


Fig. 13: Loosening Crankshaft Pulley Bolt Using SST

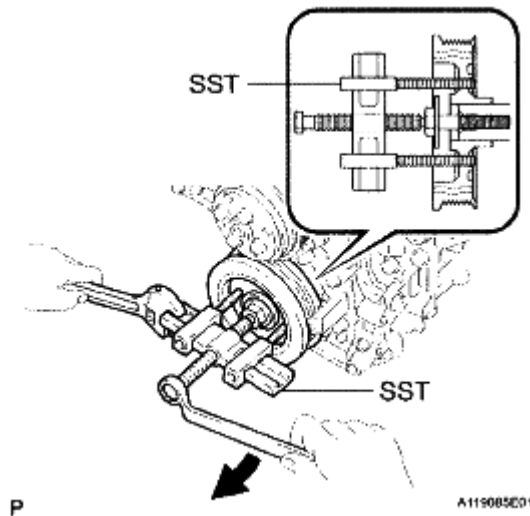


Fig. 14: Identifying Pulley Bolt & Pulley

Tape the screwdriver tip before use.

NOTE: After the removal, check the crankshaft for damage. If it is damaged, smooth the surface with 400-grit sandpaper.

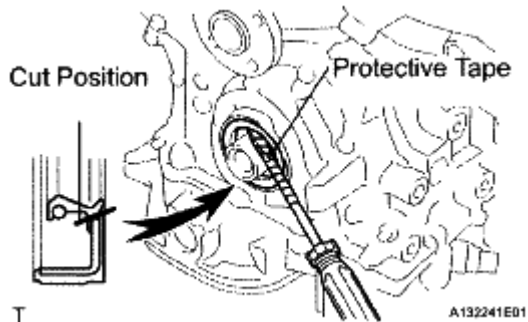


Fig. 15: Prying Out Oil Seal

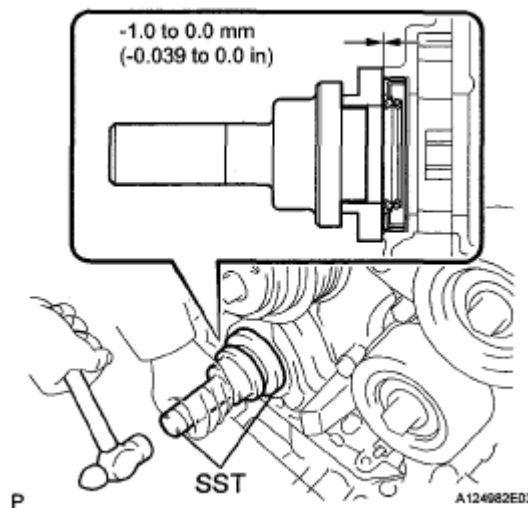


Fig. 16: Taping Oil Seal

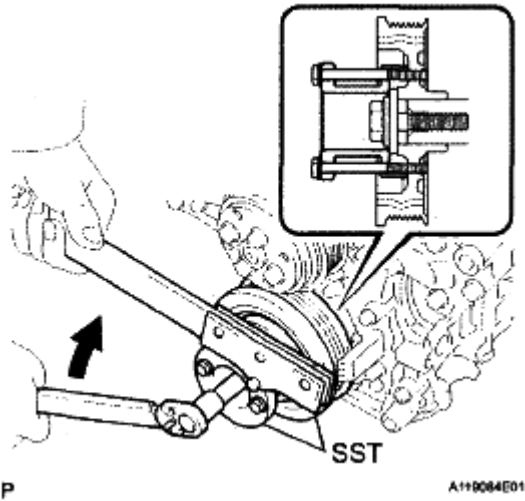


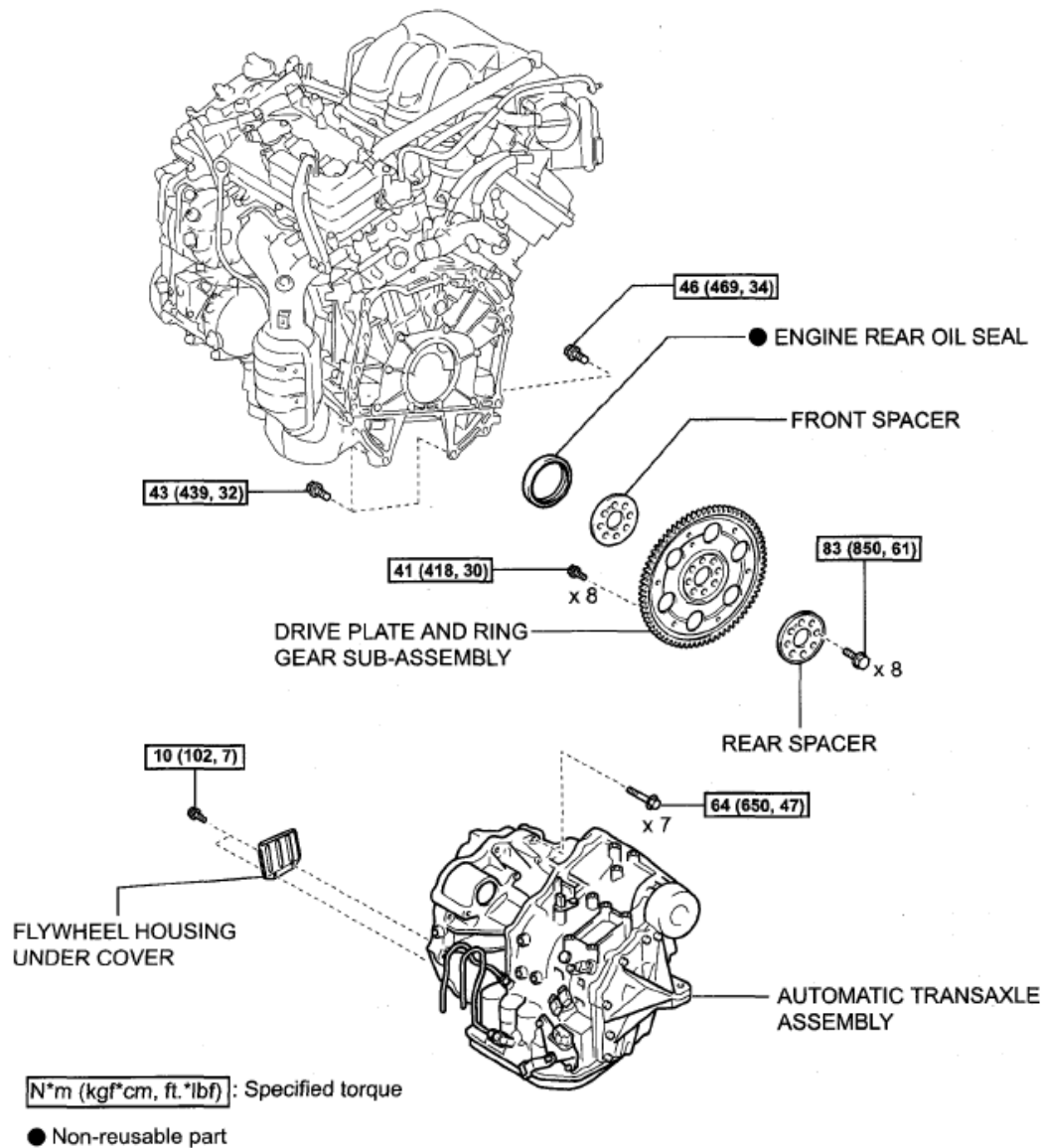
Fig. 17: Installing Crankshaft Pulley Bolt

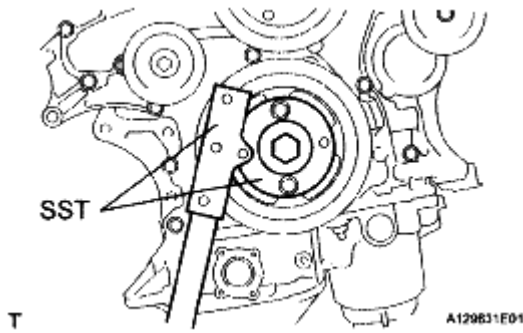


Fig. 19: Holding Crankshaft Using SST

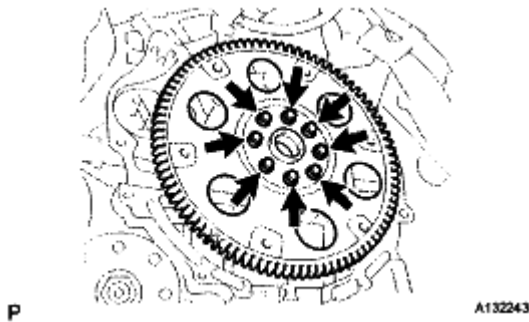


Fig. 20: Removing Bolts, Front Spacer, Drive Plate And Rear Spacer

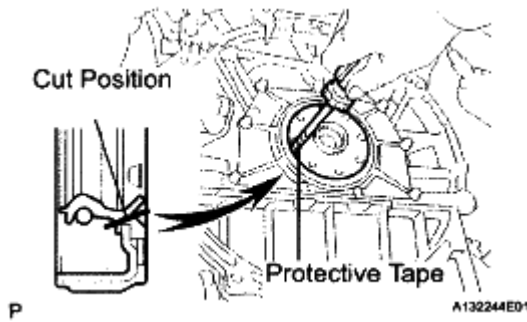


Fig. 21: Prying Out Oil Seal

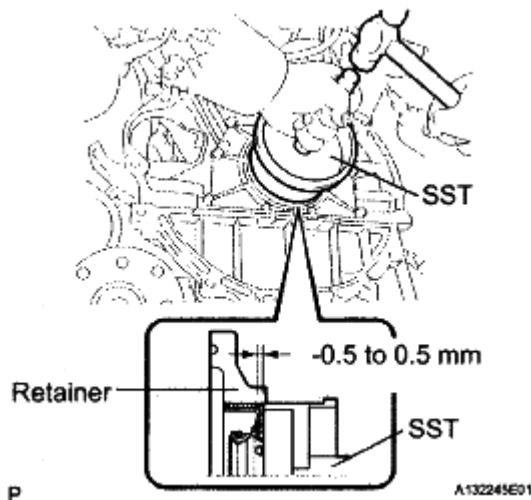


Fig. 22: Tapping In Oil Seal

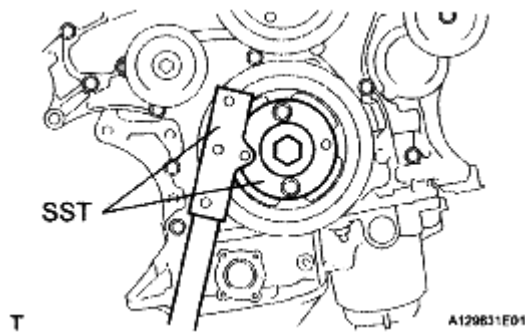


Fig. 23: Holding Crankshaft Using SST

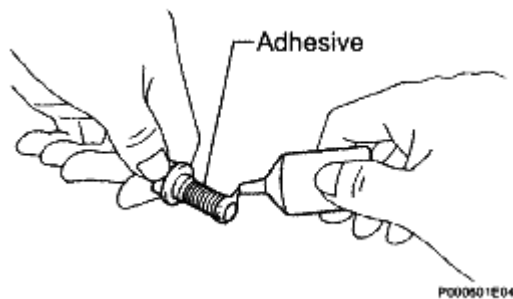


Fig. 24: Applying Adhesive To 2 Or 3 Threads Of Mounting Bolt End

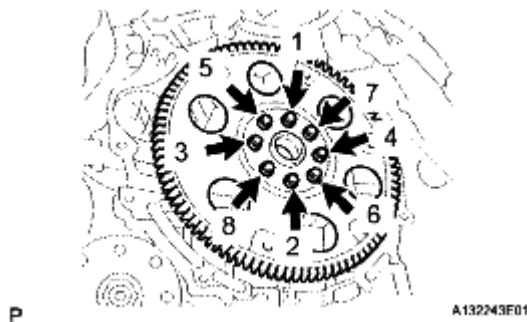


Fig. 25: Locating Mounting Bolts

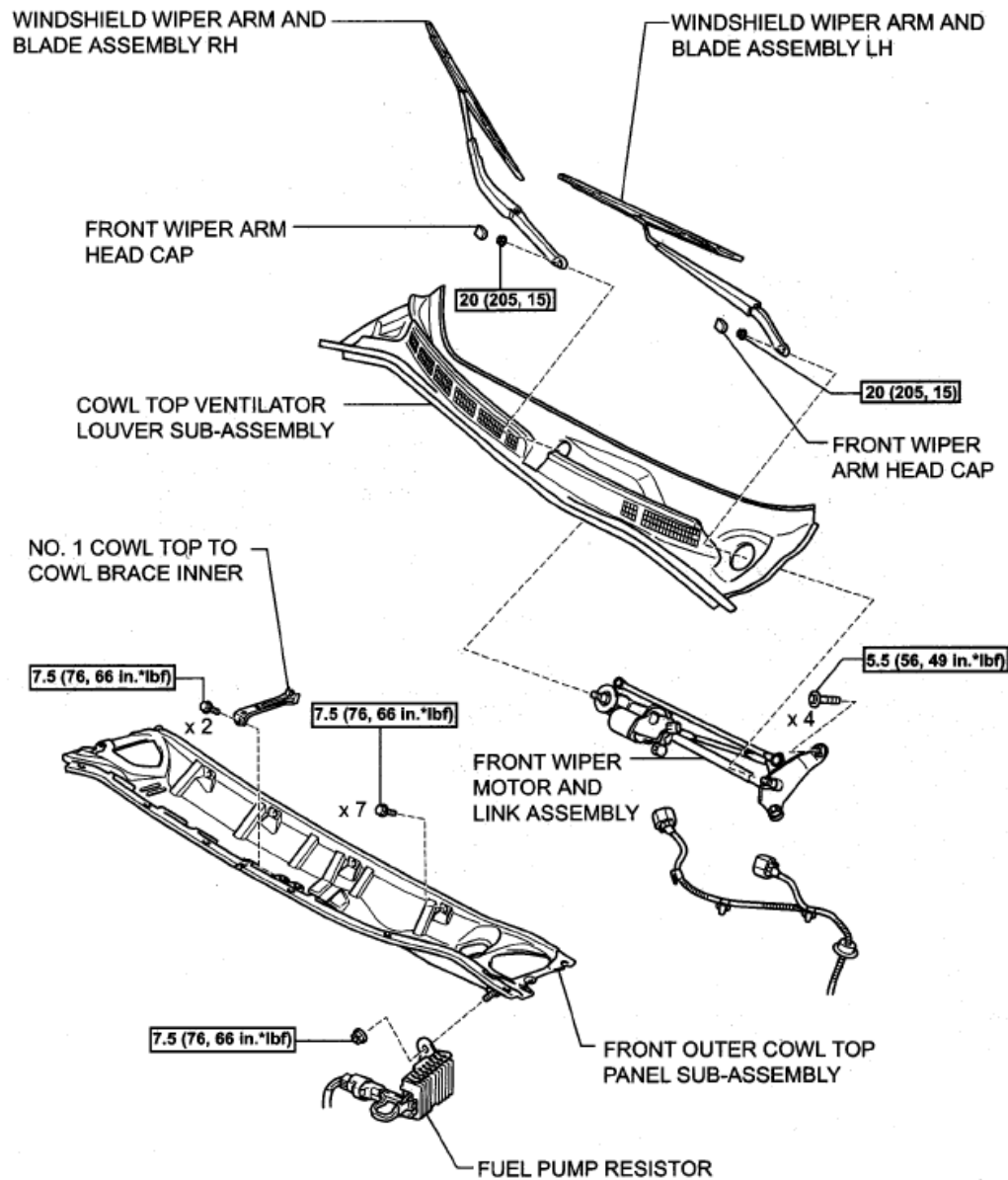

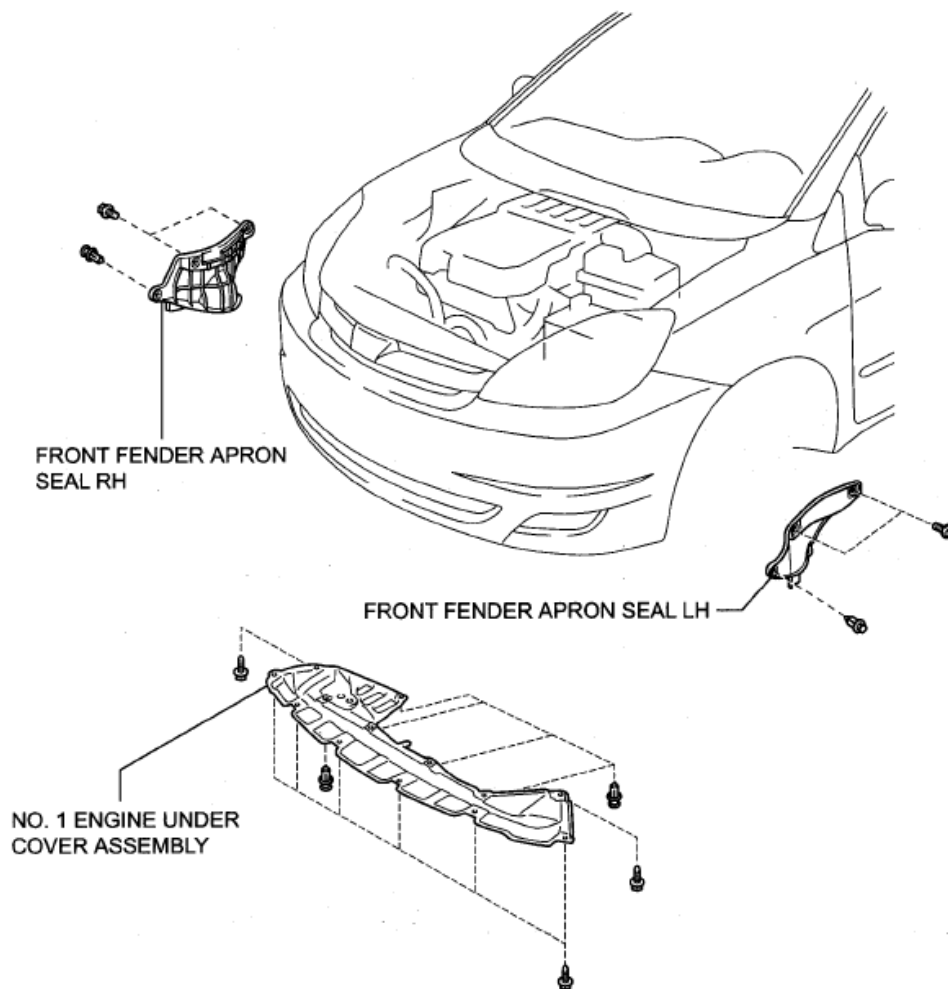

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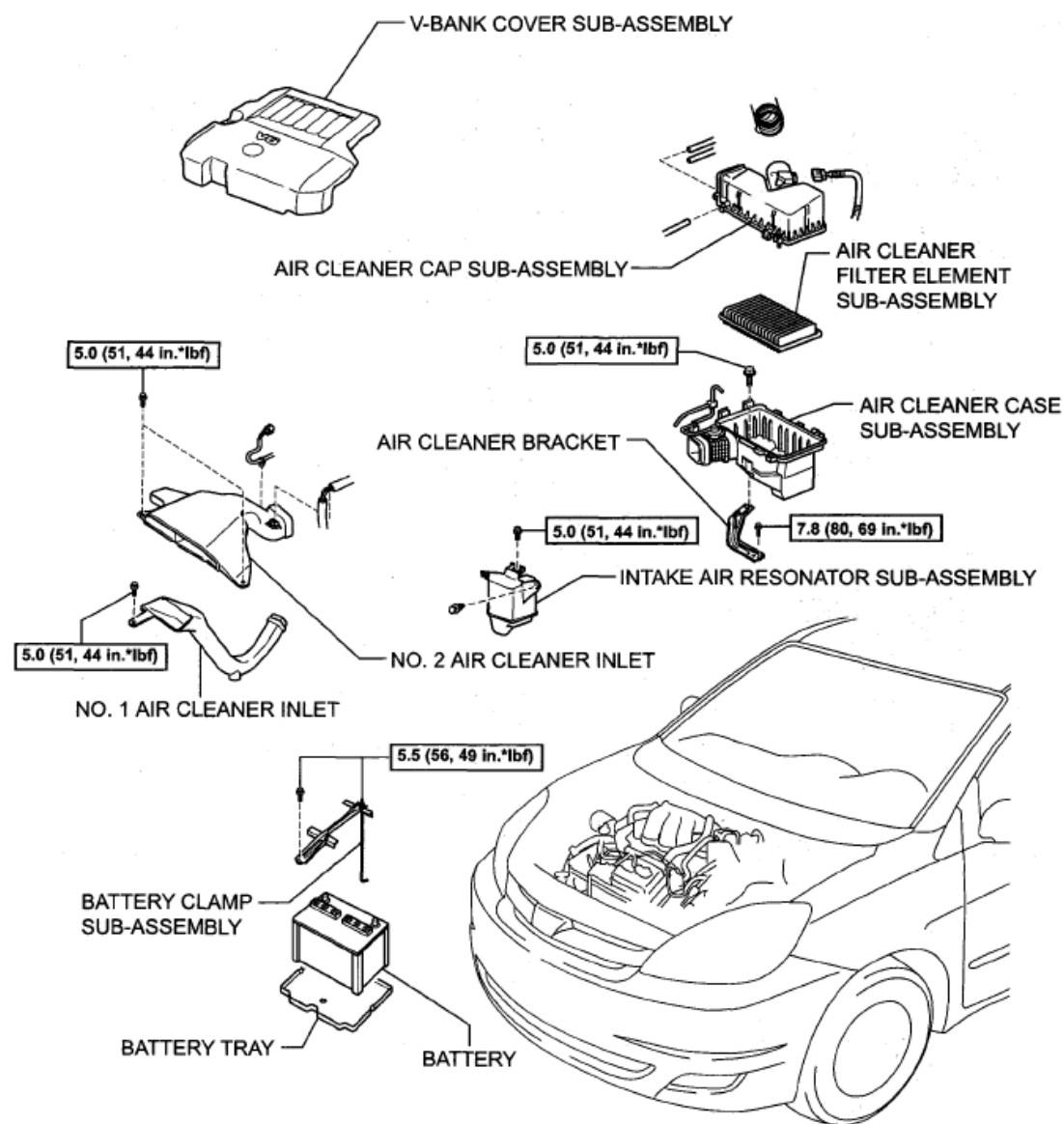
Fig. 26: Identifying Engine Assembly Replacement Components With Torque Specifications (1 Of 12)

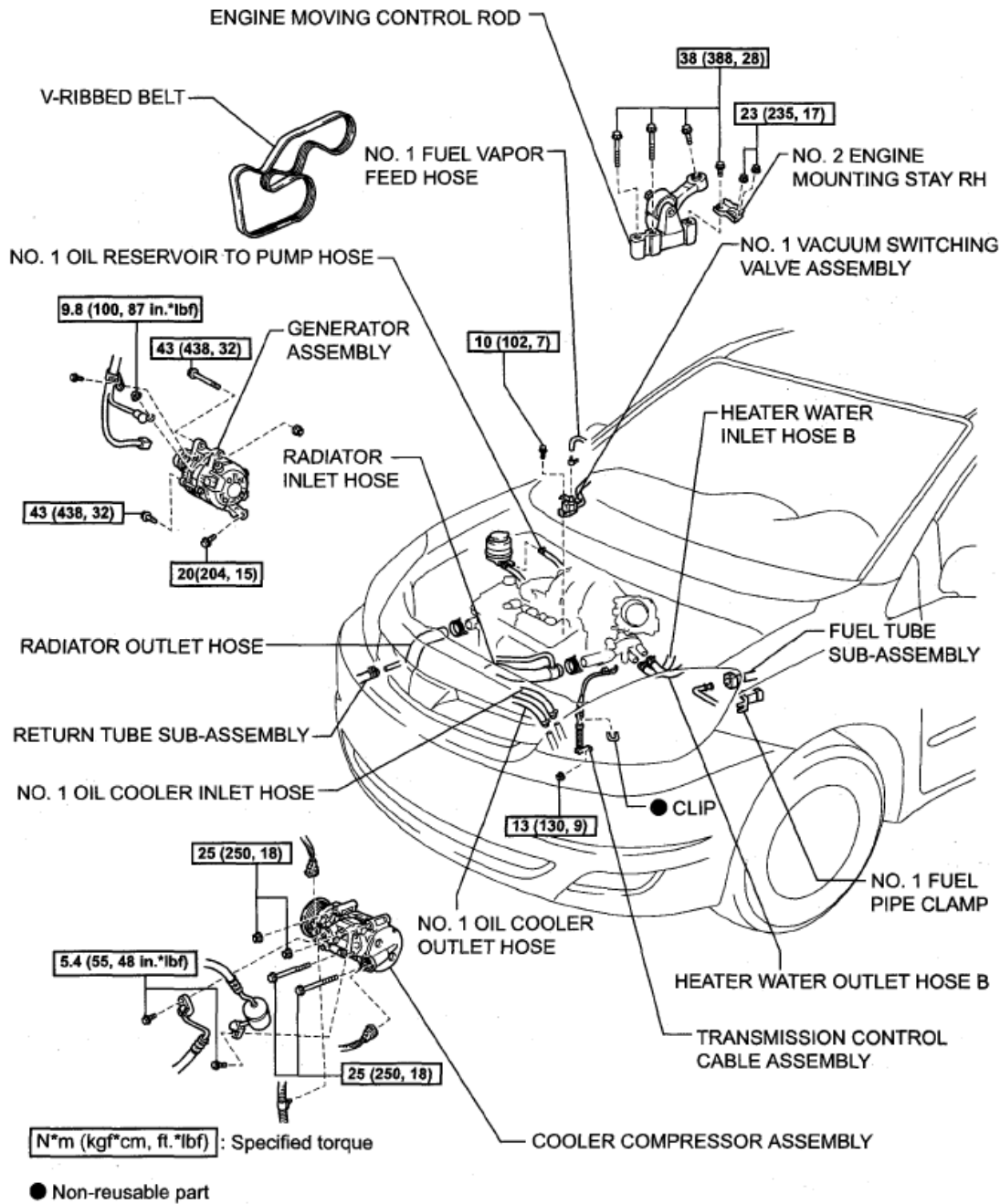
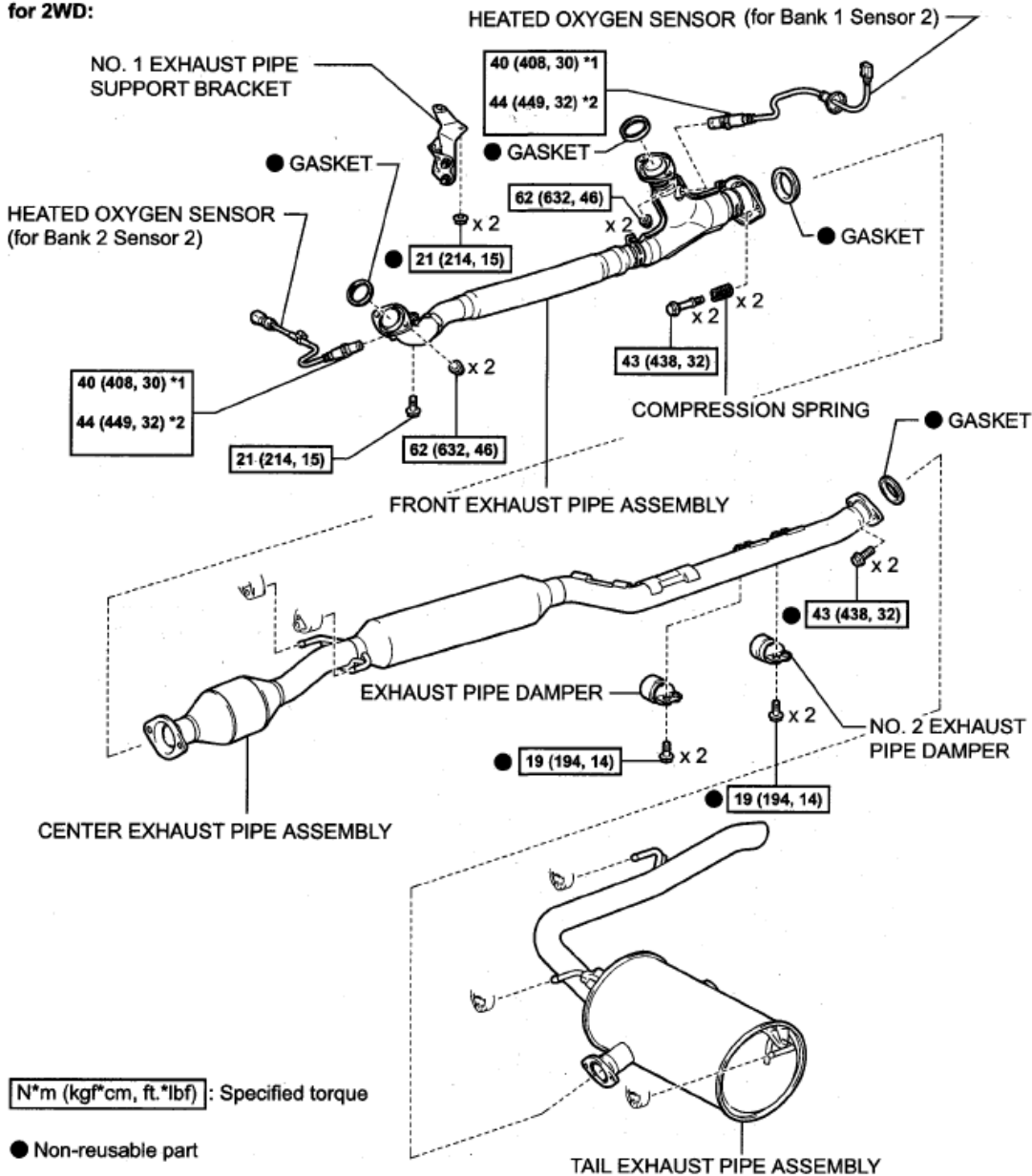


Fig. 29: Identifying Engine Assembly Replacement Components With Torque Specifications (4 Of 12)

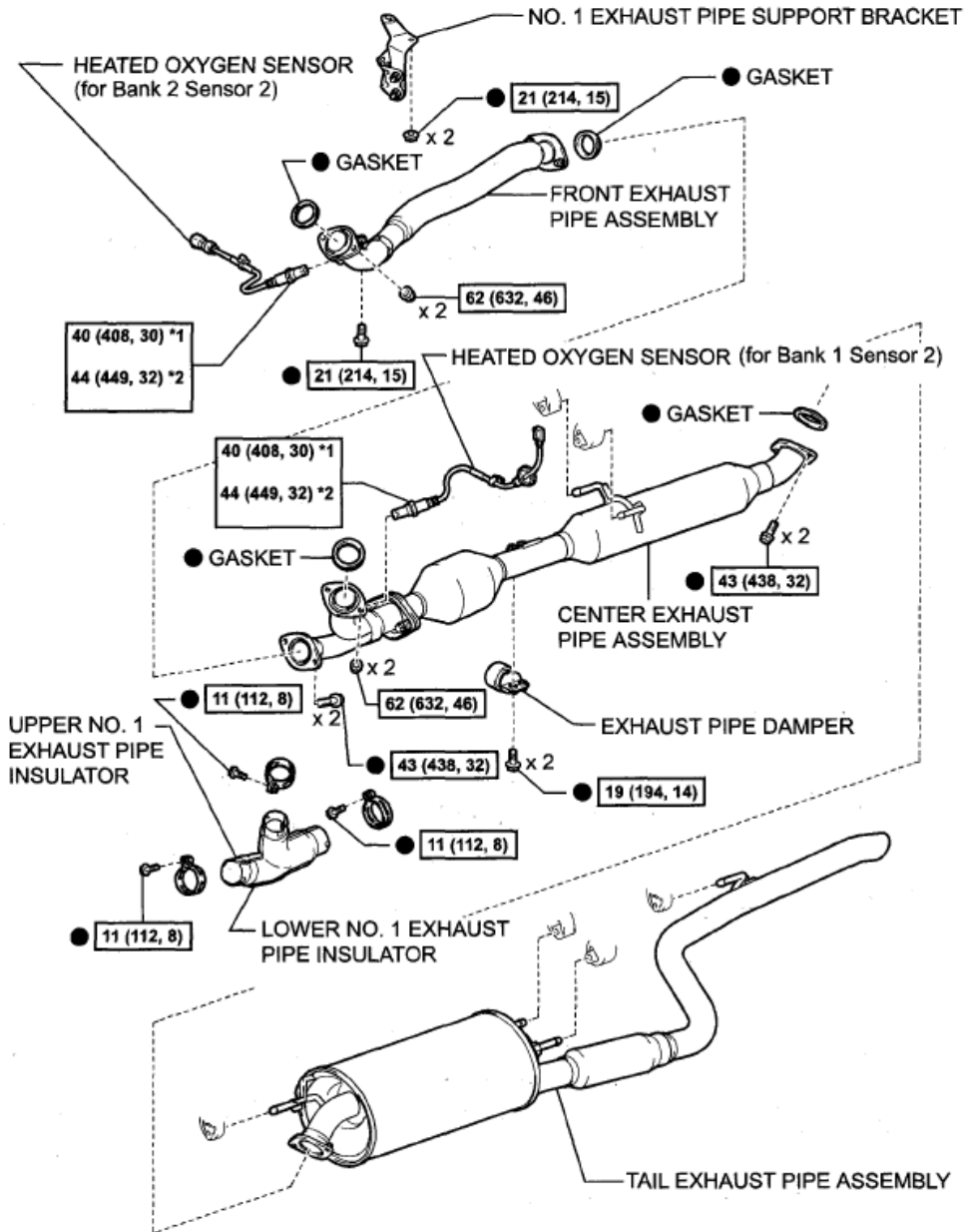

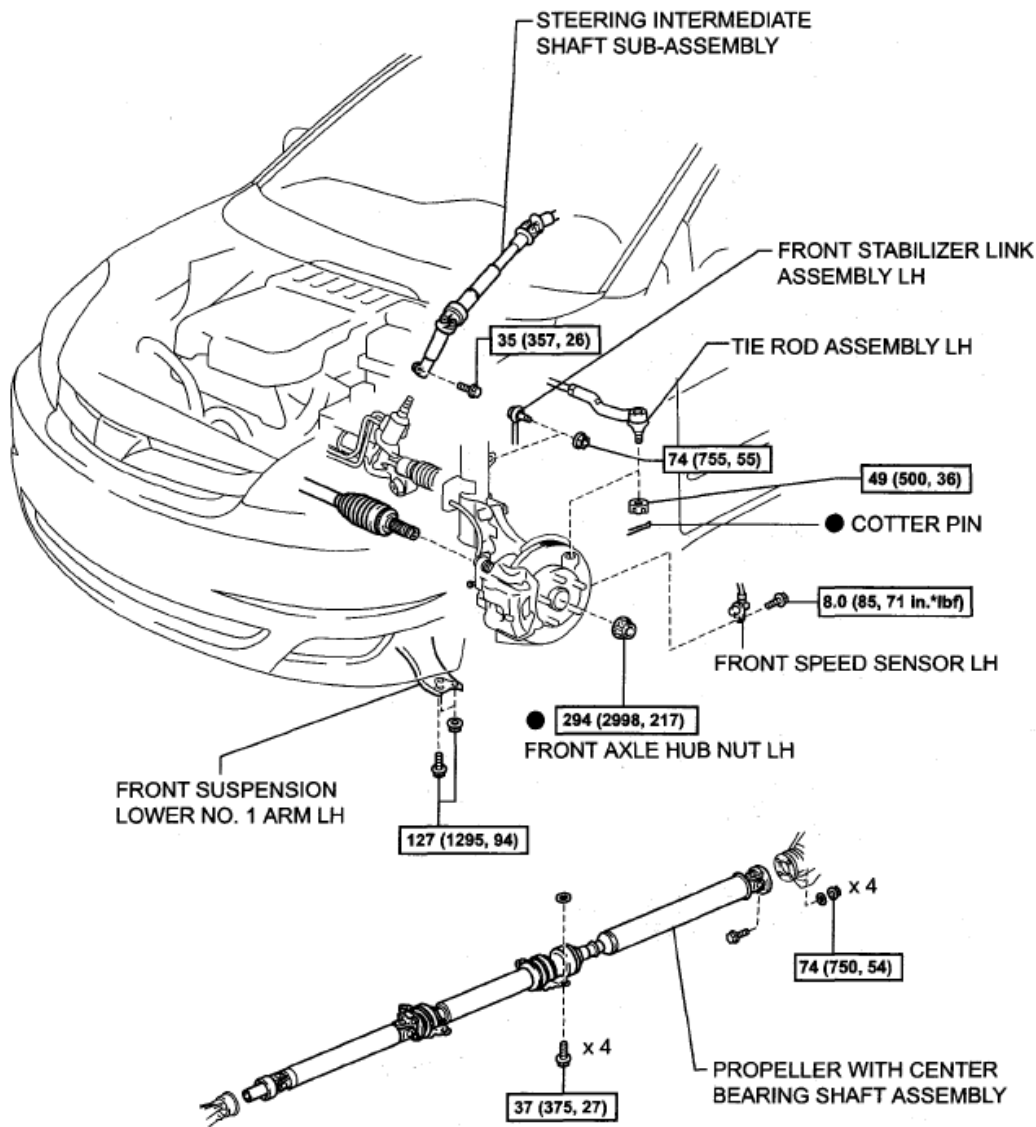

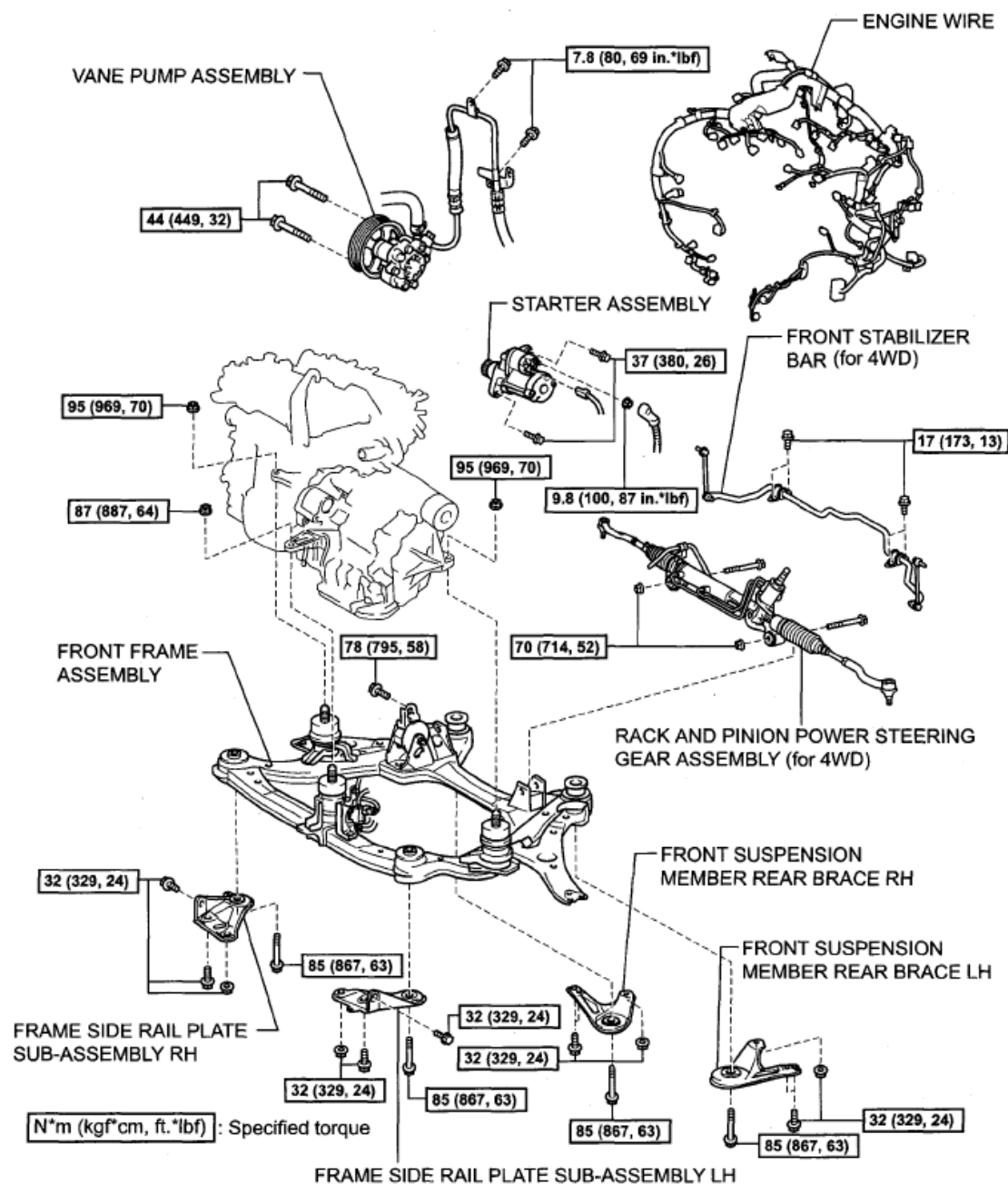

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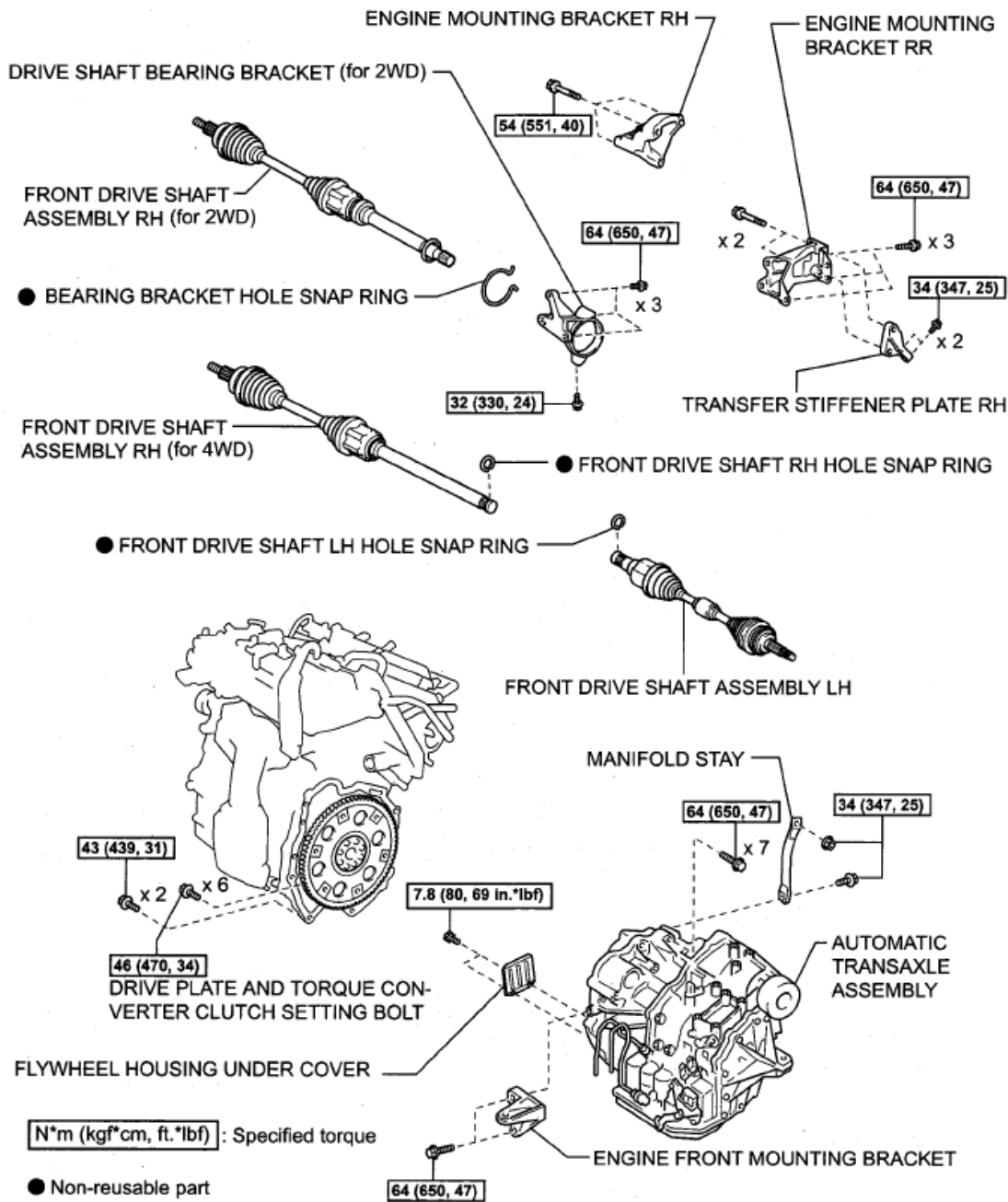
Fig. 32: Identifying Engine Assembly Replacement Components With Torque Specifications (7 Of 12)

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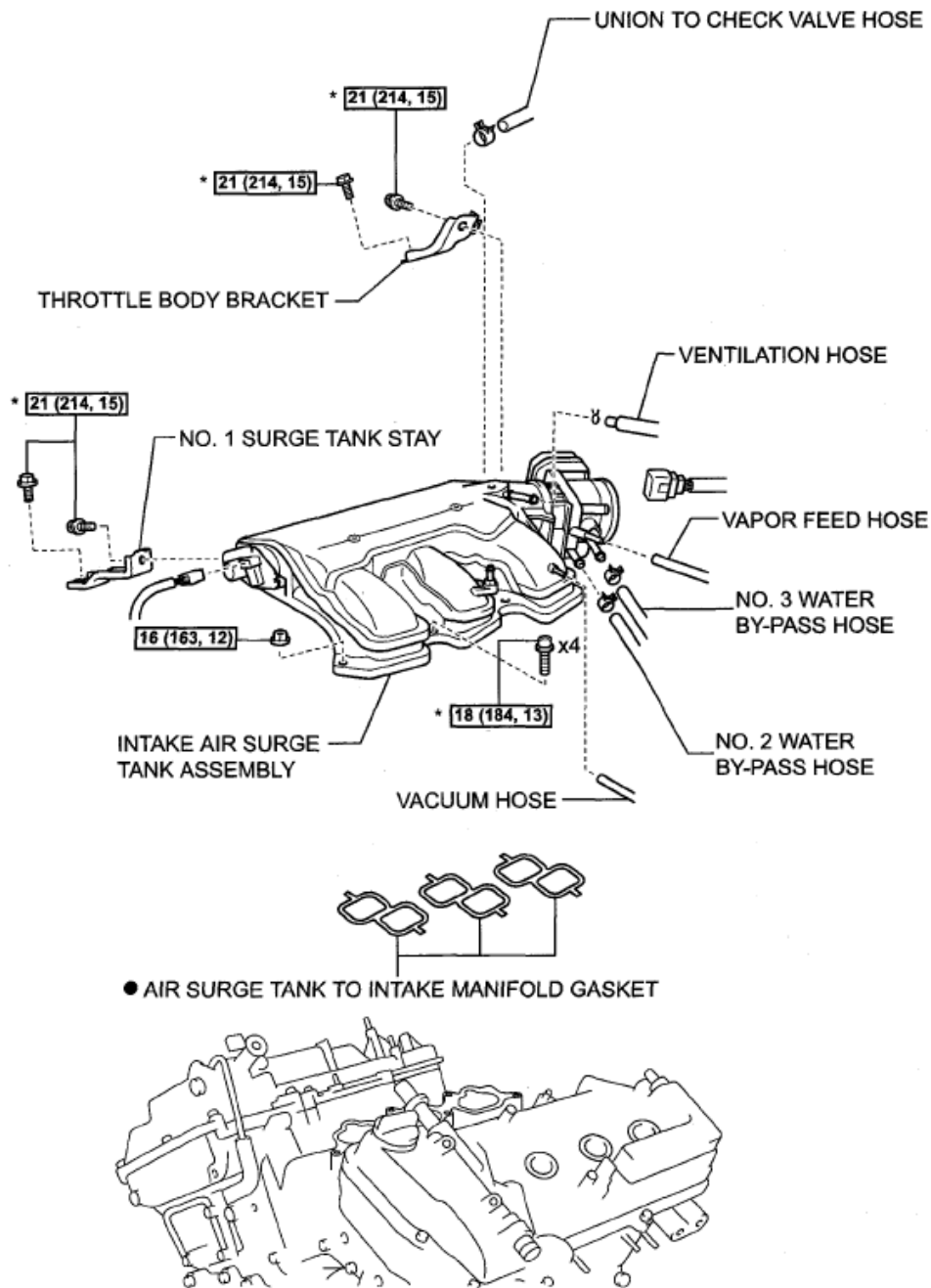
Fig. 33: Identifying Engine Assembly Replacement Components With Torque Specifications (8 Of 12)

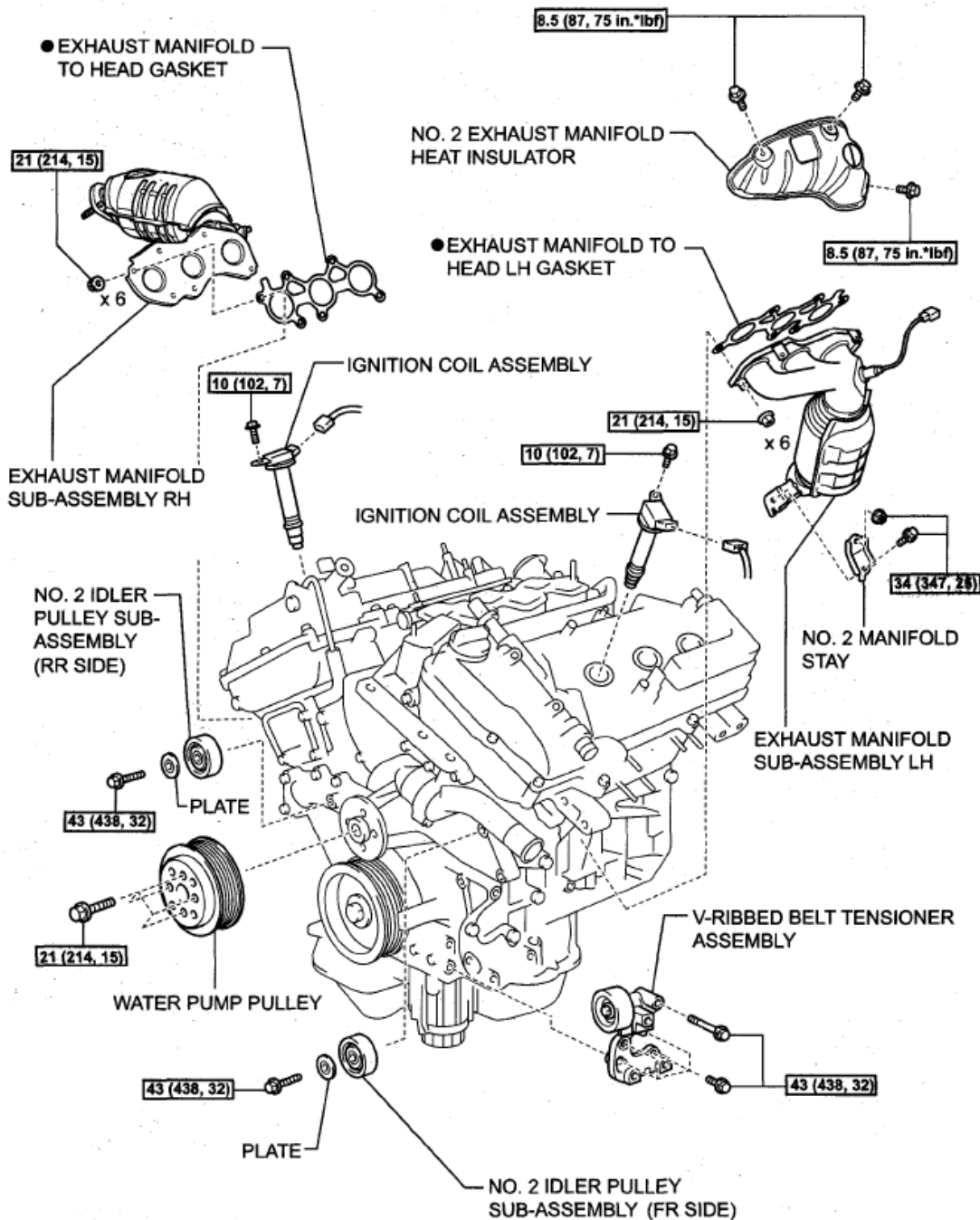

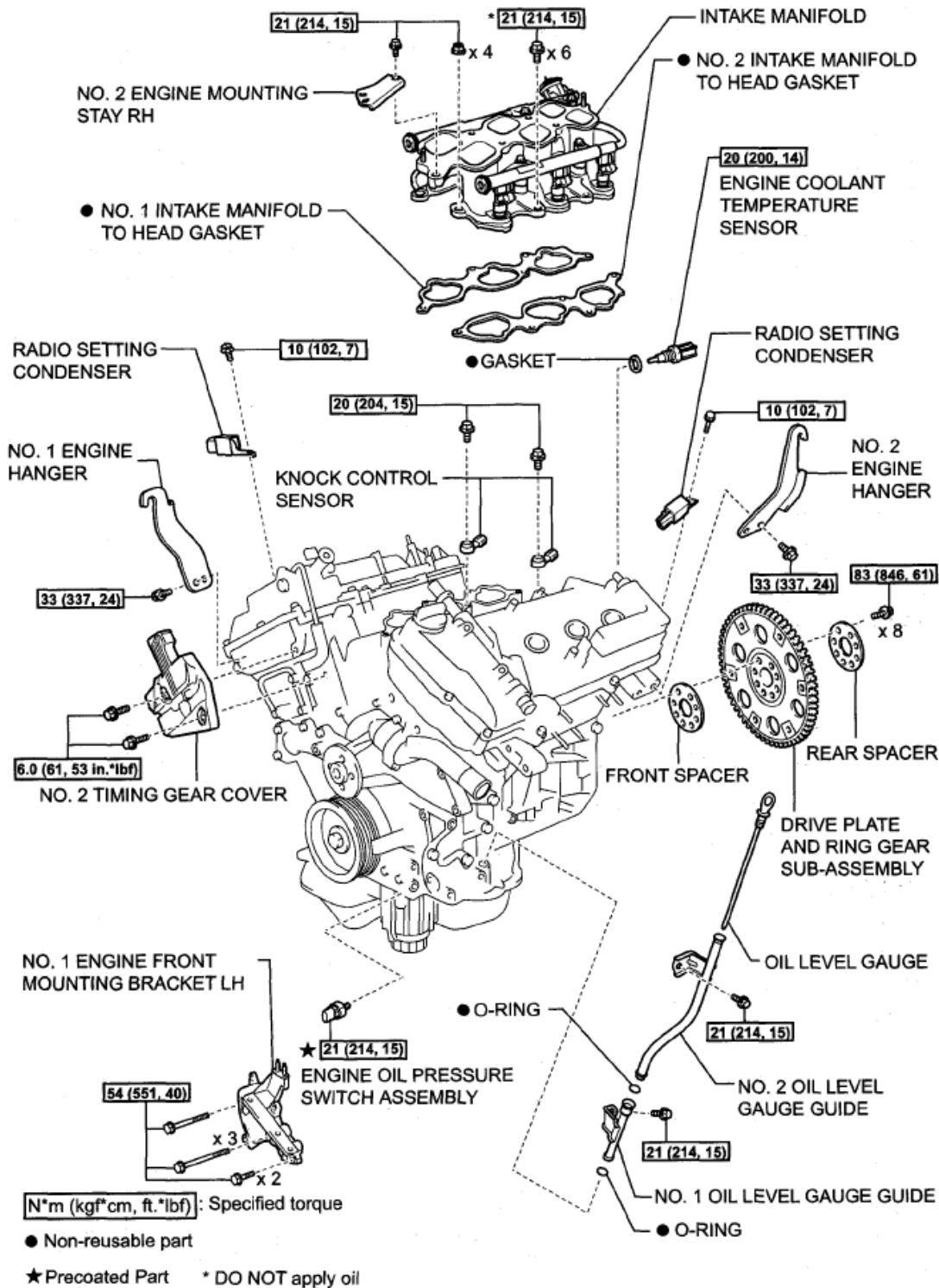

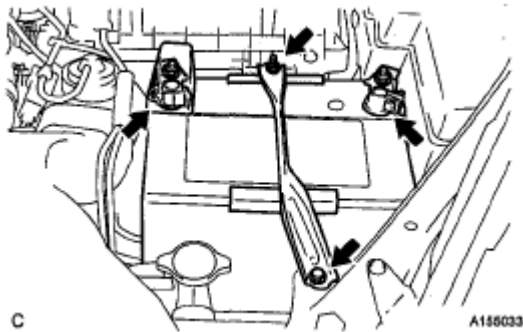


Fig. 38: Locating Bolts On Battery And Battery Tray

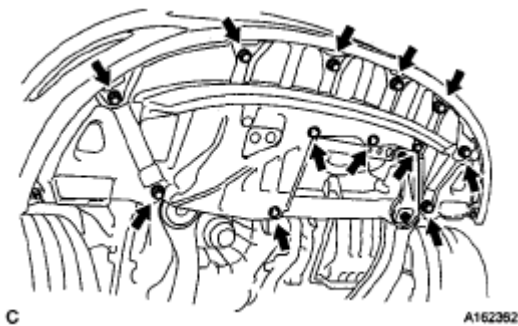


Fig. 39: Locating No. 1 Engine Under Cover Assembly Bolts

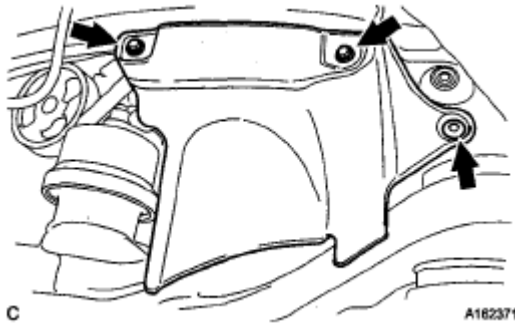


Fig. 40: Locating Bolts And Clip For Front Fender Apron Seal RH

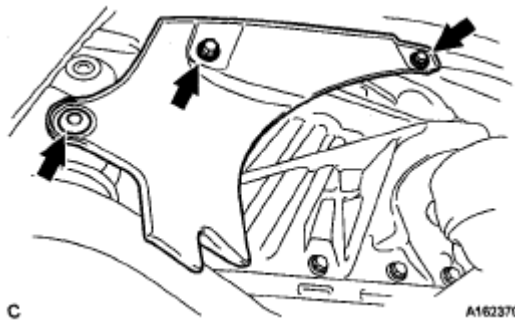


Fig. 41: Locating Bolts And Clip For Front Fender Apron Seal LH

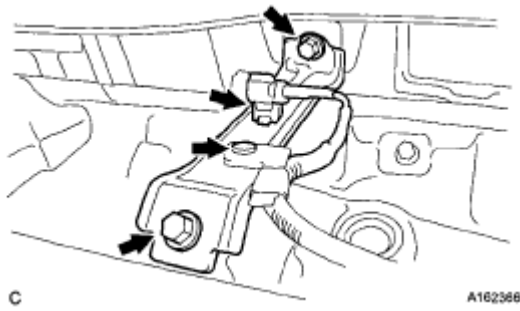


Fig. 42: Locating No. 1 Cowl Top To Cowl Brace Inner Bolts And Clips

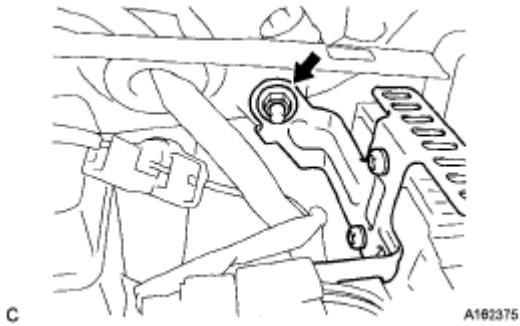


Fig. 43: Locating Nut On Fuel Pump Resistor

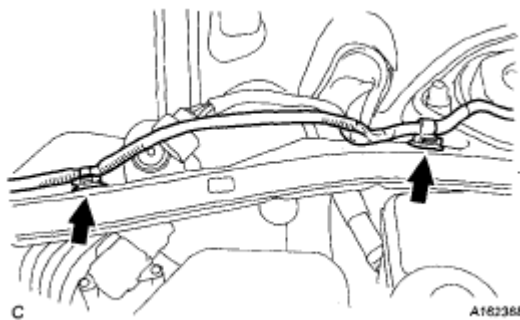


Fig. 44: Locating Clips For Engine Wire

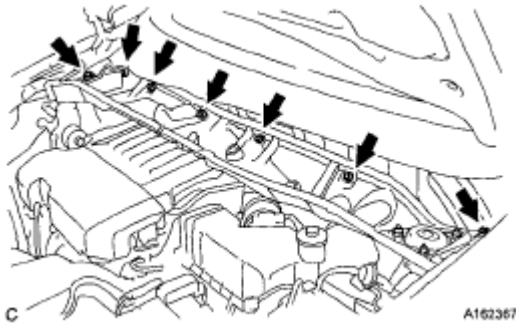


Fig. 45: Locating Bolts On Front Outer Cowl Top Panel Sub-Assembly

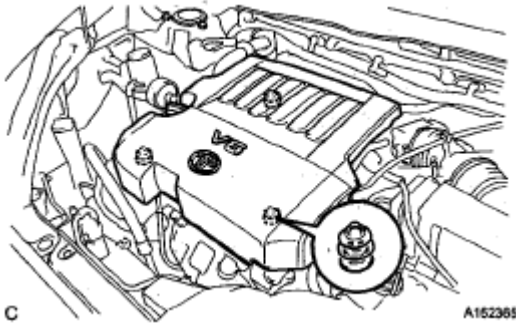


Fig. 46: Identifying Clip On Rear Of Cover

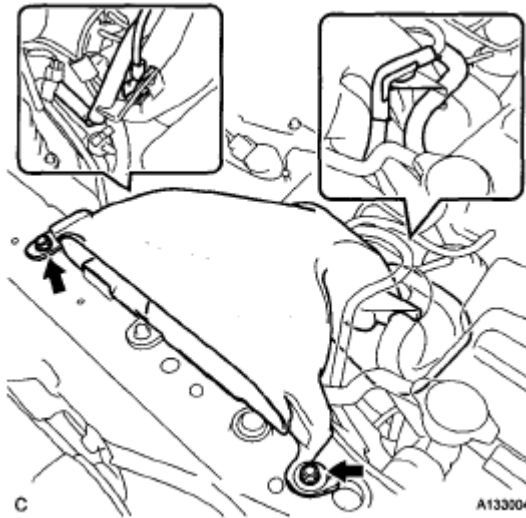


Fig. 47: Locating Bolts On No. 2 Air Cleaner Inlet

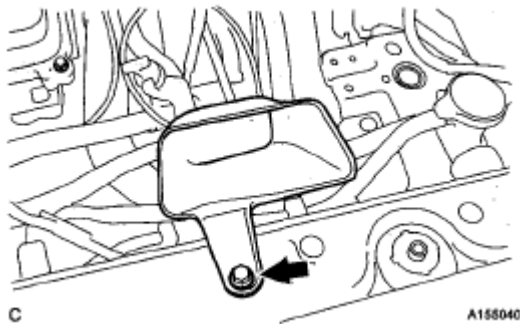


Fig. 48: Locating Bolt On No. 1 Air Cleaner Inlet

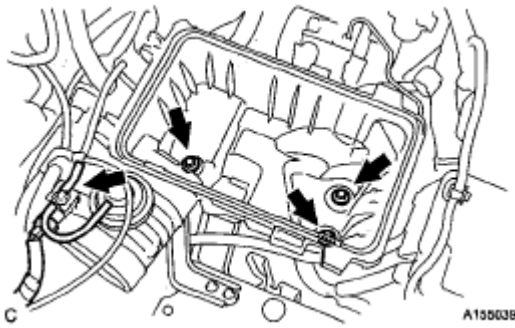


Fig. 49: Locating Bolts On Air Cleaner Case

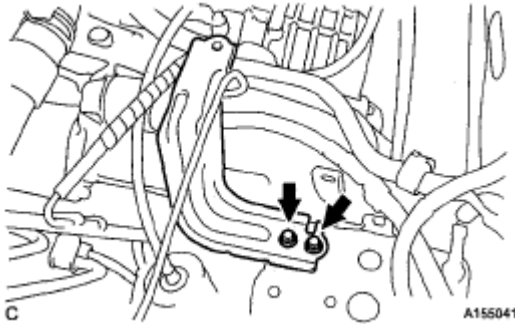


Fig. 50: Locating Bolts For Air Cleaner Bracket

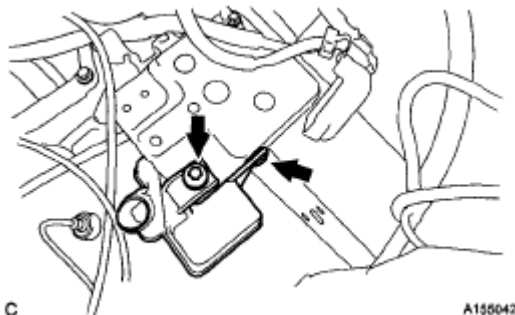


Fig. 51: Locating Clip And Bolt On Intake Air Resonator

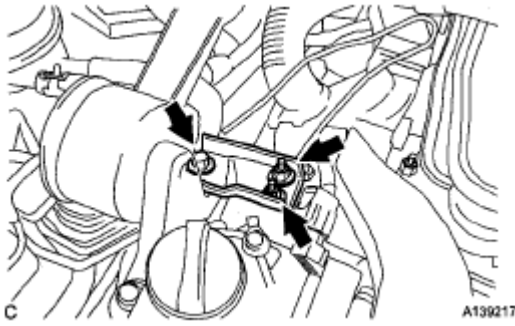


Fig. 52: Locating Nuts On No. 2 Engine Mounting Stay RH

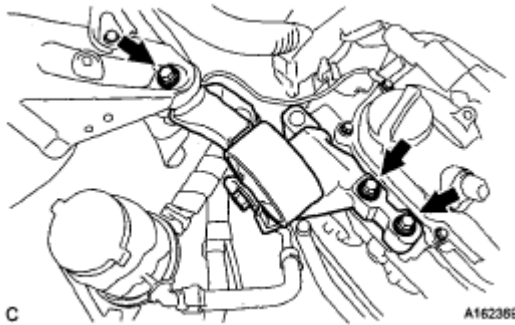


Fig. 53: Locating Bolts On Engine Moving Control Rod

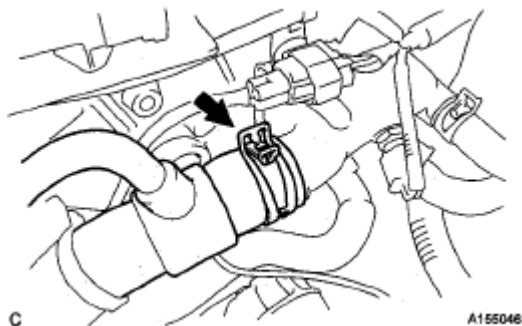


Fig. 55: Locating Radiator Inlet Hose Clip

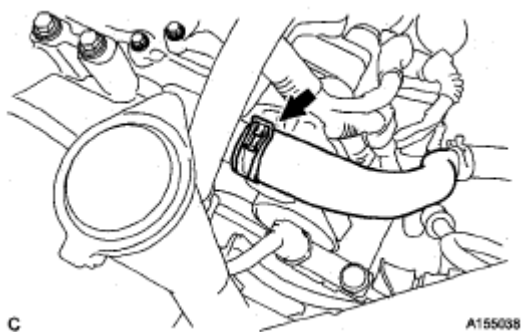


Fig. 56: Locating Radiator Outlet Hose Clip

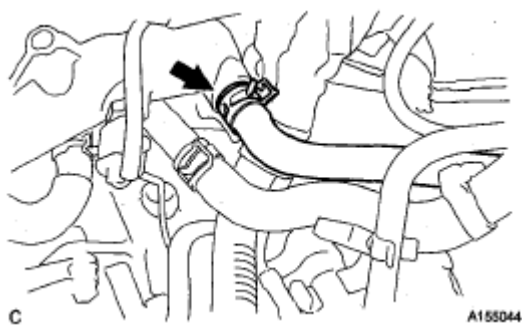


Fig. 57: Locating Heater Water Outlet Hose Clip

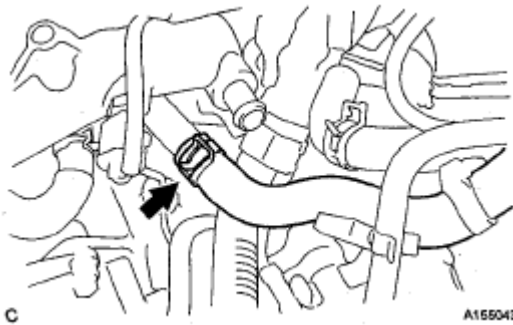


Fig. 58: Locating Heater Water Inlet Hose Clip

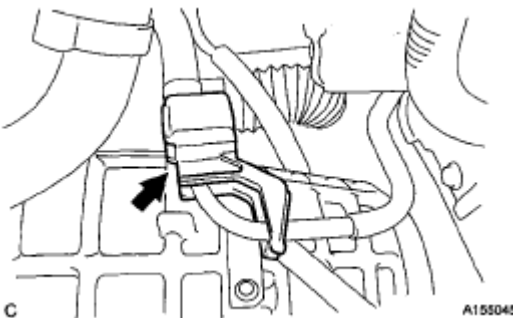


Fig. 59: Locating No. 1 Fuel Pipe Clamp

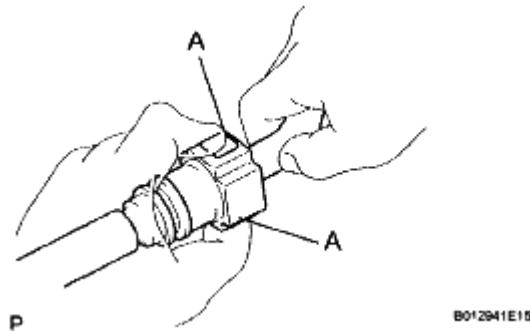


Fig. 60: Identifying Connector & Tube

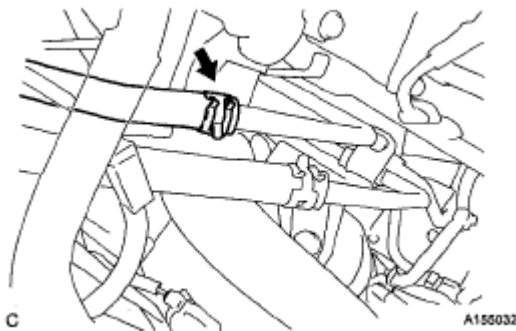


Fig. 61: Locating No. 1 Oil Cooler Inlet Hose Clip

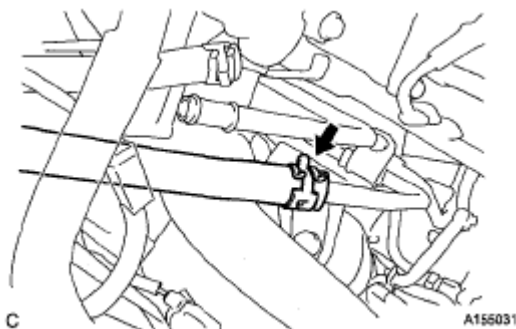


Fig. 62: Locating No. 1 Oil Cooler Outlet Hose Clip

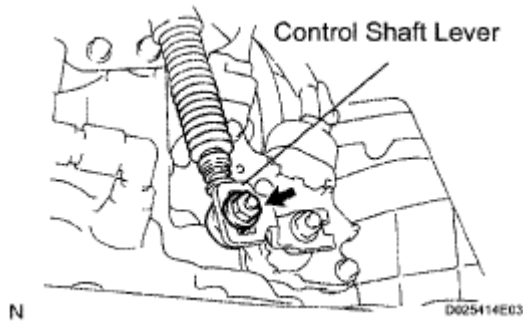


Fig. 63: Locating Nut And Control Shaft Lever

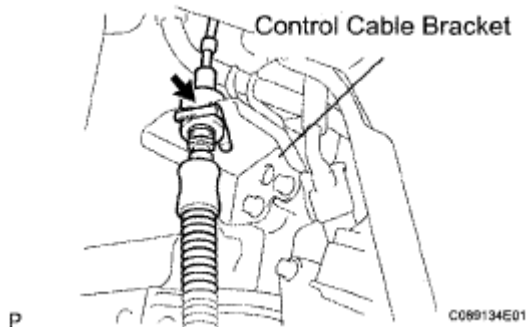


Fig. 64: Locating Transmission Control Cable Assembly Clip

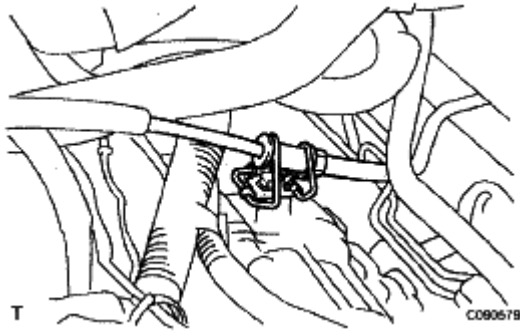


Fig. 65: Identifying Control Cable And Control Cable Clamp

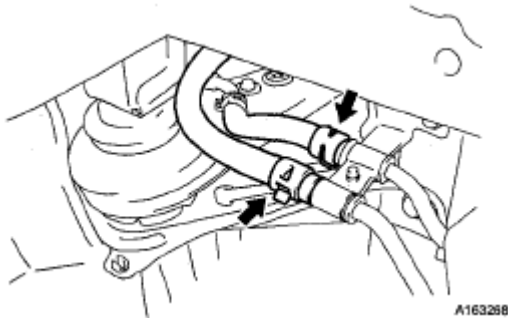


Fig. 66: Locating Return Tube Sub-Assembly Clips

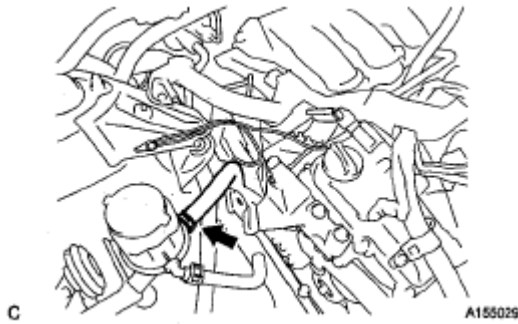


Fig. 67: Locating No. 1 Oil Reservoir To Pump Hose Clip

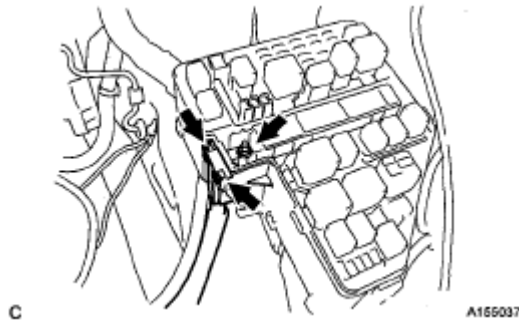


Fig. 68: Separating Wire Harness

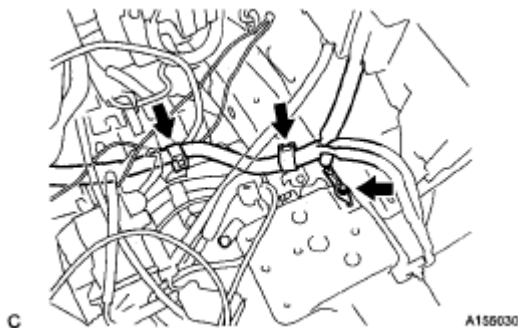
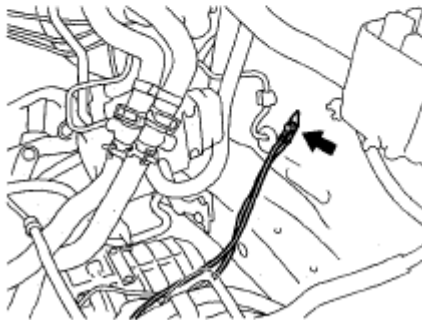
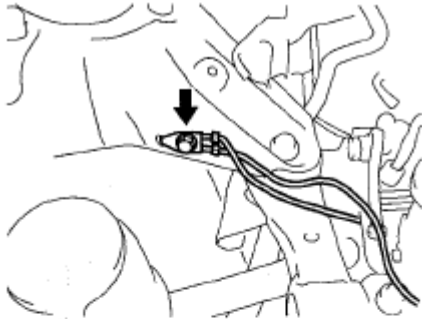


Fig. 69: Locating Bolt And Clamps On Body

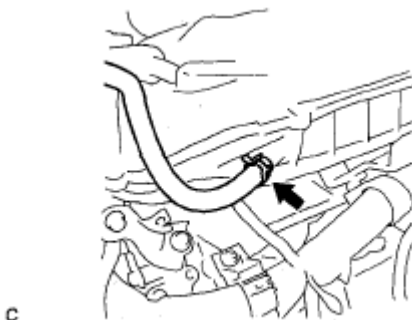
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Fig. 70: Locating Bolts And Ground Cables

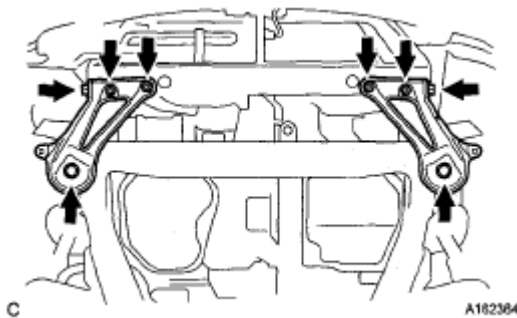


Fig. 72: Locating Bolts, Nuts, And Frame Side Rail Plates RH And LH

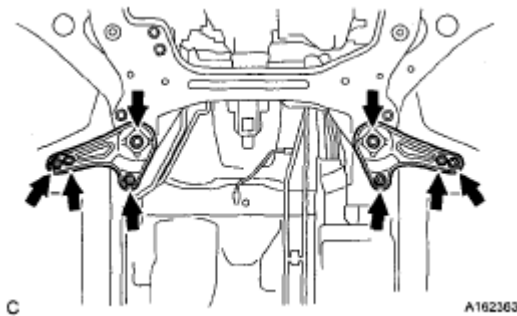


Fig. 73: Locating Bolts, Nuts, And Front Suspension Member Brace Rear RH And LH

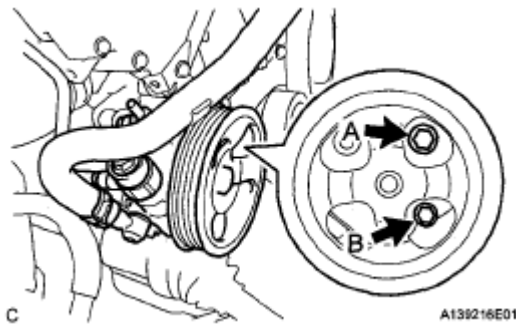


Fig. 75: Locating Bolts And Power Steering Link With Vane Pump

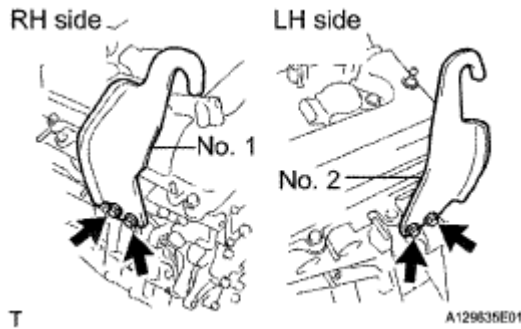


Fig. 76: Locating Engine Hangers With Bolts

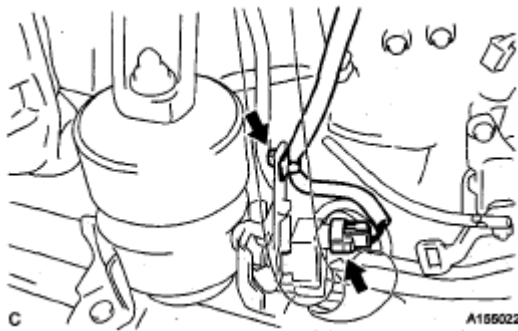
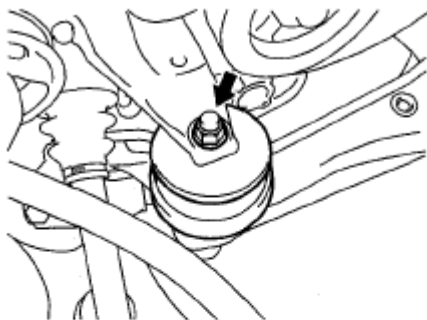


Fig. 77: Locating Active Mount VSV Connector And Harness Clamp

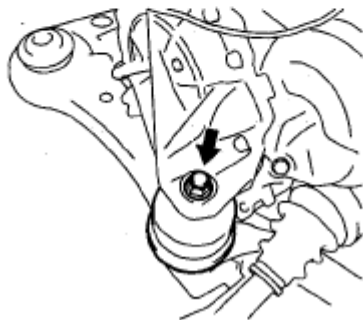

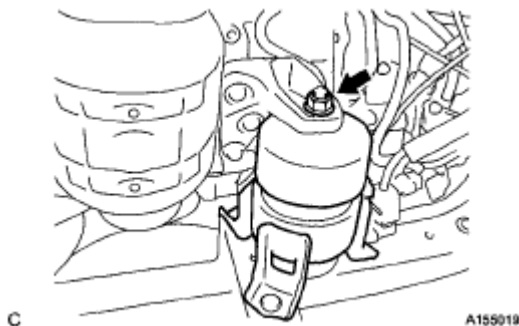


Fig. 79: Locating Bolt And Engine Mounting Insulator FR

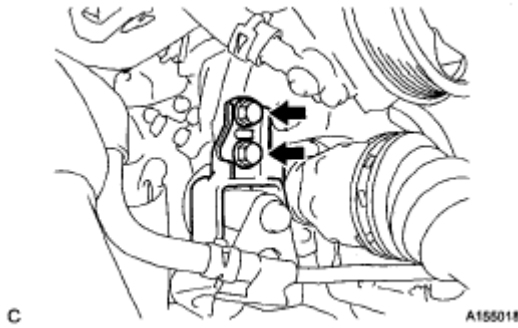


Fig. 80: Locating Engine Mounting Insulator RR (For 4WD)

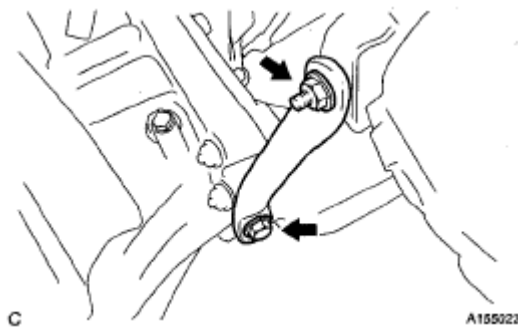


Fig. 81: Locating Bolt, Nut, And Manifold Stay

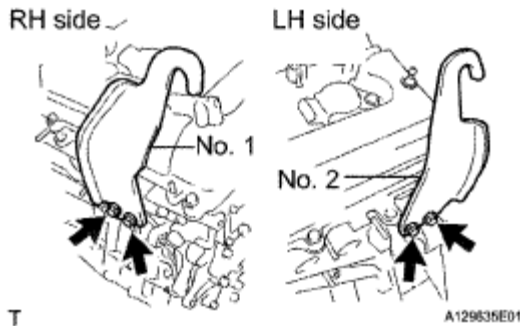


Fig. 82: Locating Engine Hangers With Bolts

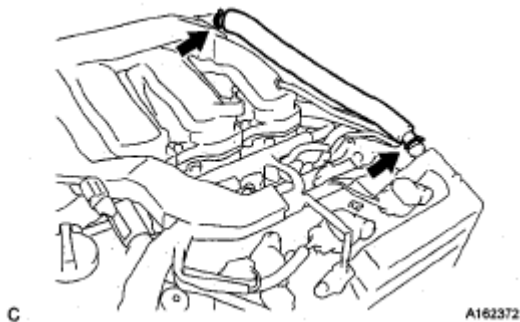


Fig. 83: Locating Ventilation Hose

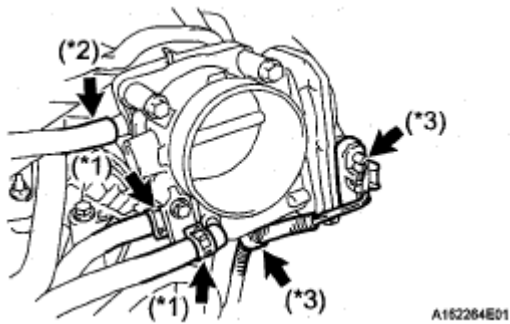


Fig. 84: Locating No. 1 Ventilation Hose

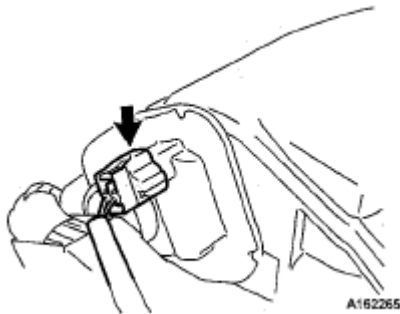


Fig. 85: Locating Bolts, No. 1 Surge Tank Stay And Throttle Body Bracket

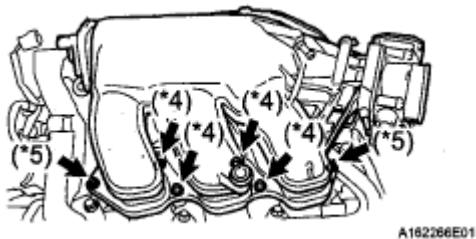


Fig. 86: Locating Bolts, Nuts, And Air Surge Tank Gasket

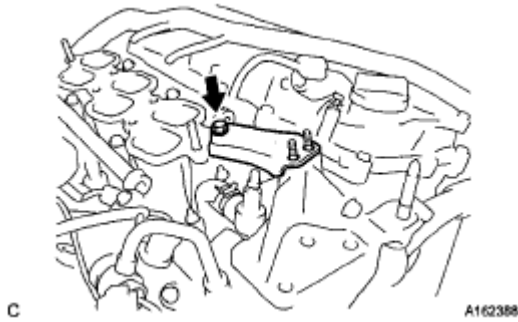


Fig. 87: Locating Bolt And No. 2 Engine Mounting Stay RH

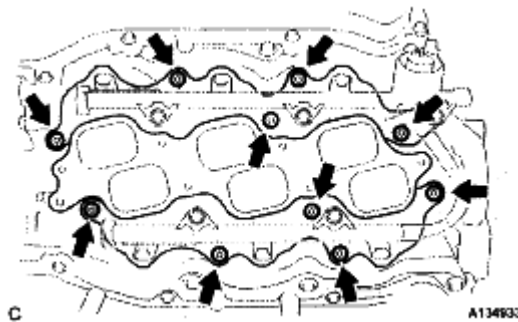


Fig. 88: Locating Intake Manifold Bolts And Nuts

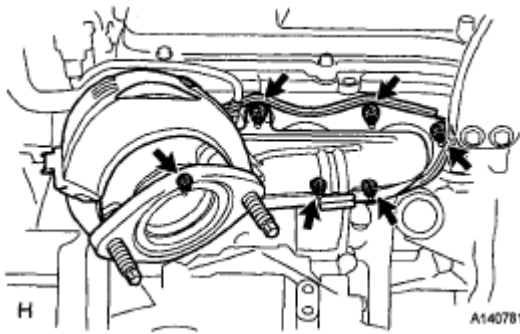


Fig. 89: Locating Exhaust Manifold And Gasket

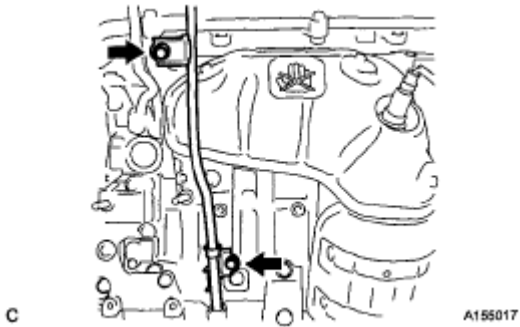


Fig. 90: Locating Oil Level Gauge Guide Sub-Assembly

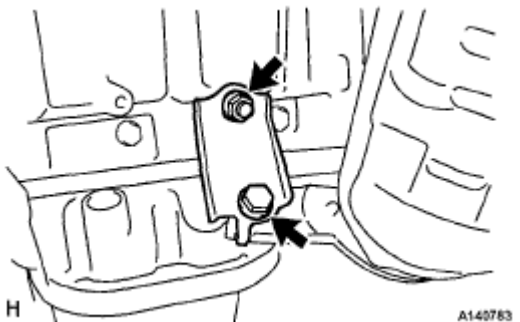


Fig. 91: Locating No. 2 Manifold Stay With Bolt And Nut

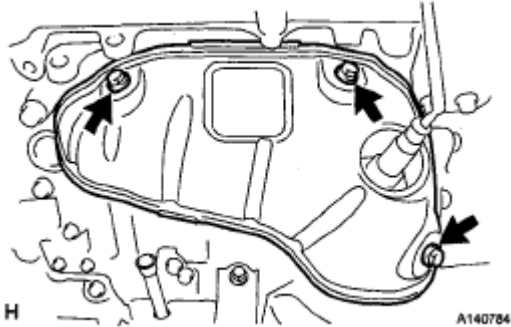


Fig. 92: Locating No. 2 Exhaust Manifold Heat Insulator

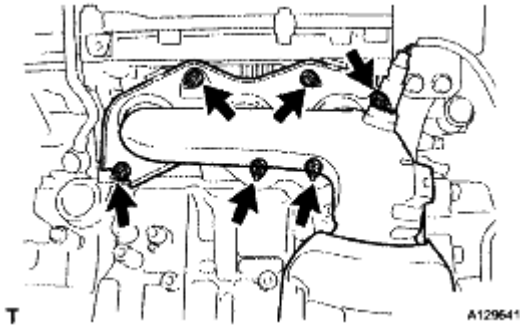


Fig. 93: Locating Exhaust Manifold Sub-Assembly

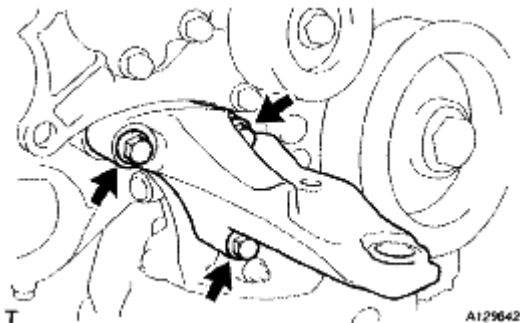
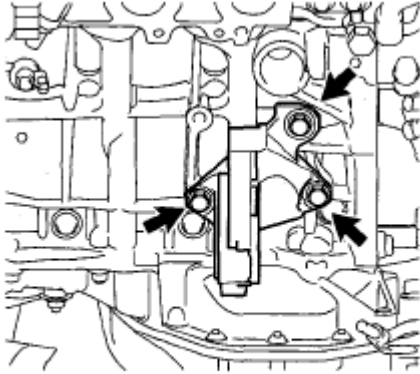


Fig. 94: Locating Engine Mounting Bracket RH With Bolts

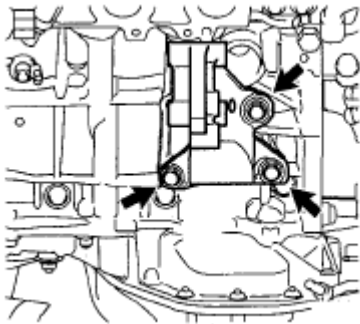


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Fig. 95: Locating Drive Shaft Bearing Bracket (For 2WD)

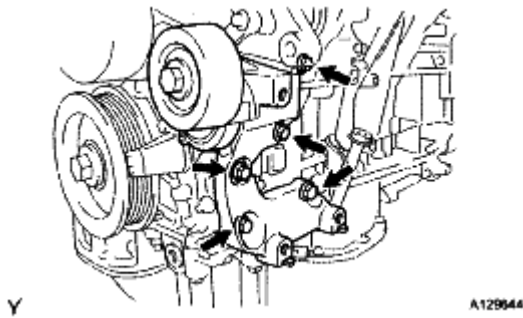


Fig. 97: Locating Bolts And V-Ribbed Belt Tensioner Assembly

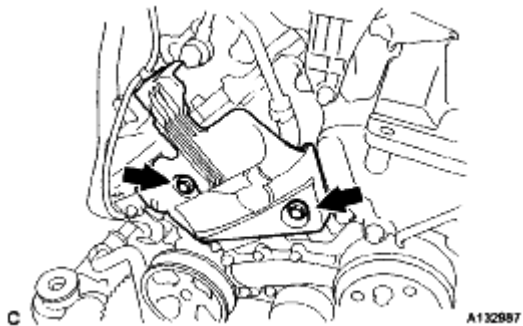


Fig. 98: Locating No. 2 Timing Gear Cover With Bolts

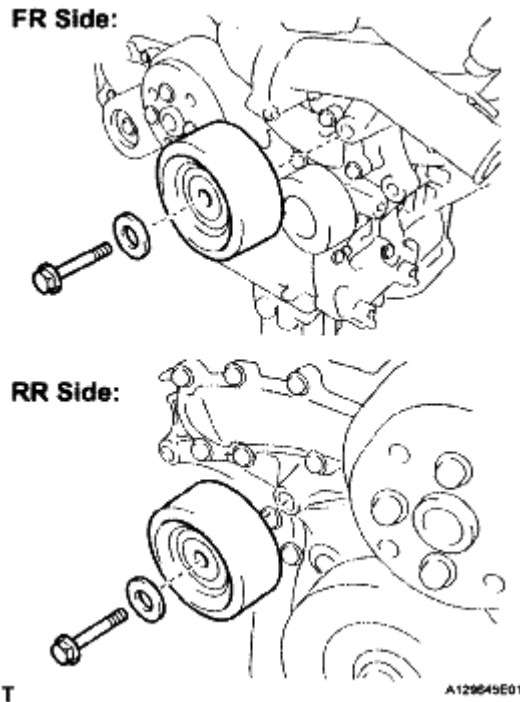


Fig. 99: Identifying Bolts, Idler Pulley Cover Plates And Idler Pulley Sub-Assemblies

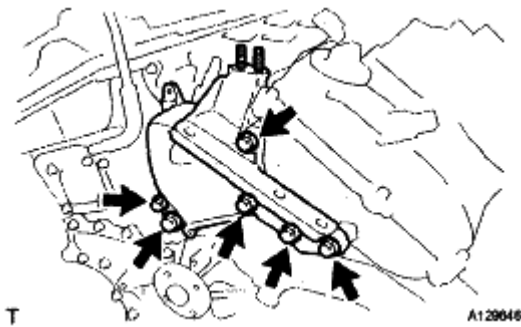


Fig. 100: Locating Engine Mounting Bracket Front

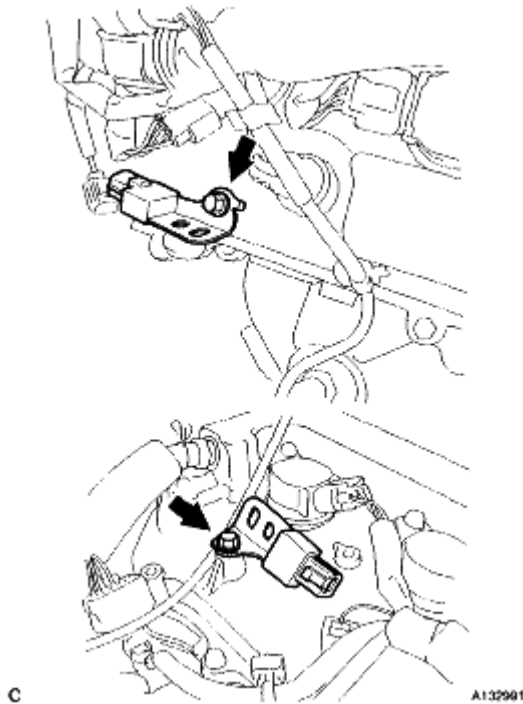


Fig. 101: Locating Bolts And Radio Setting Condensers

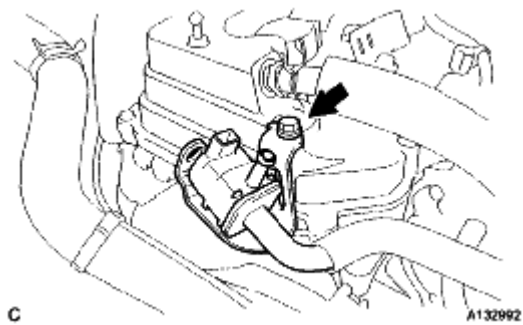


Fig. 102: Locating Bolt And No. 1 Vacuum Switching Valve

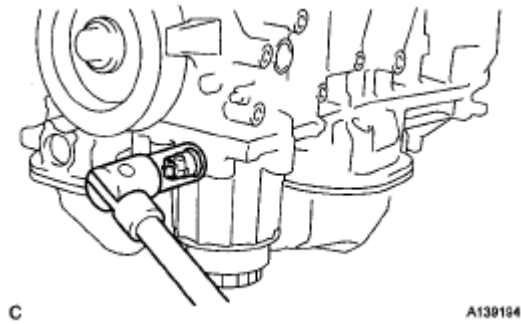


Fig. 103: Locating Engine Oil Pressure Switch Assembly

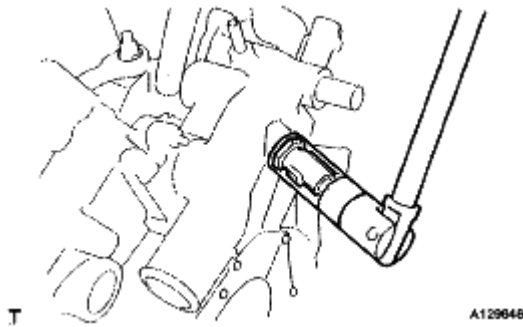


Fig. 104: Identifying EFI Engine Coolant Temperature Sensor

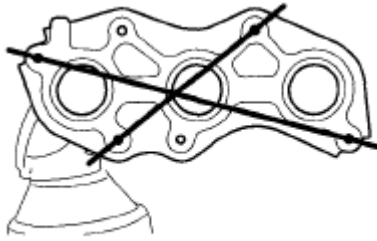

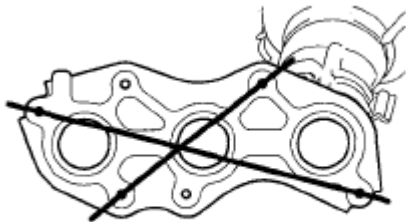

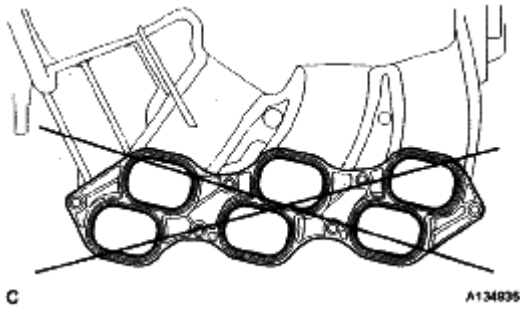


Fig. 107: Inspecting Intake Air Surge Tank Assembly

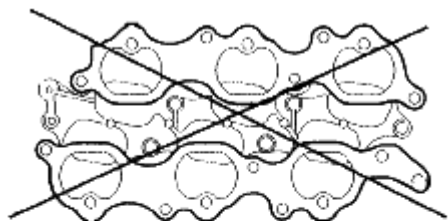

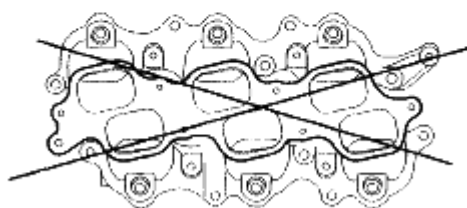

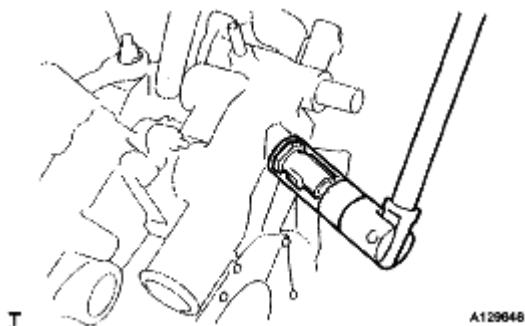


Fig. 109: Identifying EFI Engine Coolant Temperature Sensor

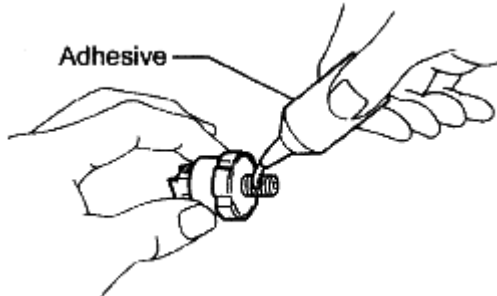

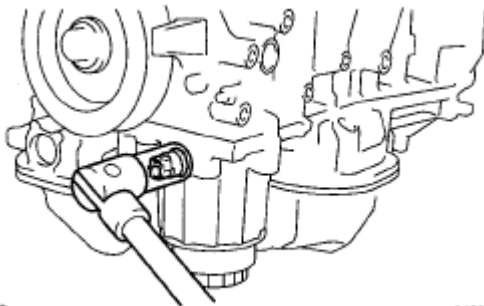


Fig. 111: Locating Engine Oil Pressure Switch Assembly

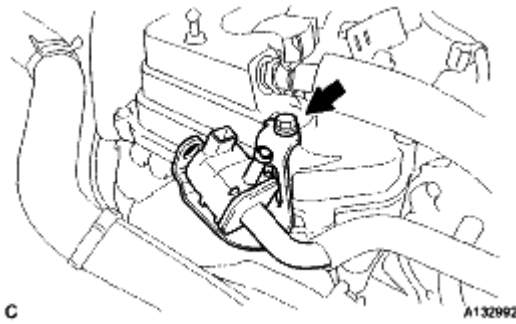


Fig. 112: Locating Bolt And No. 1 Vacuum Switching Valve

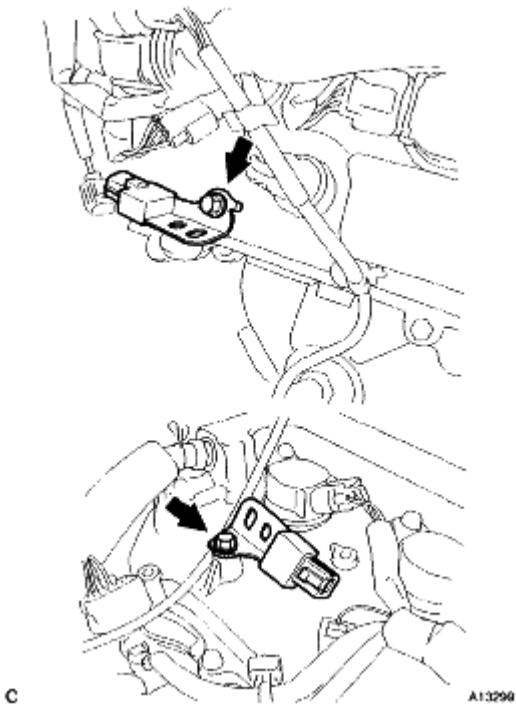


Fig. 113: Locating Bolts And Radio Setting Condensers

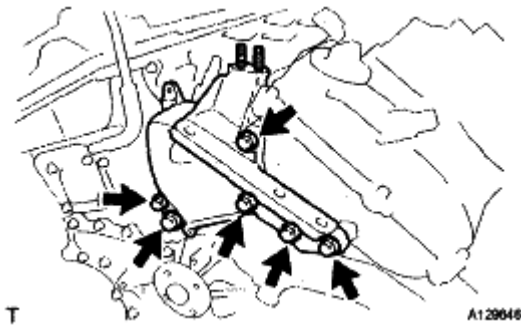


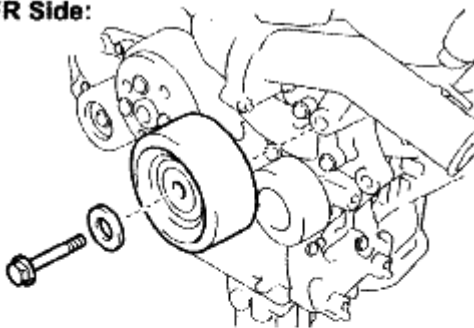
Fig. 114: Locating Engine Mounting Bracket Front

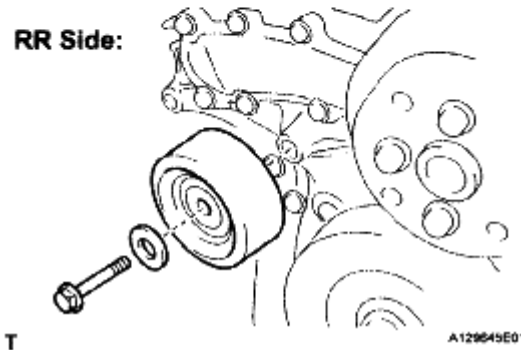


Fig. 115: Identifying Bolts, Idler Pulley Cover Plates And Idler Pulley Sub-Assemblies

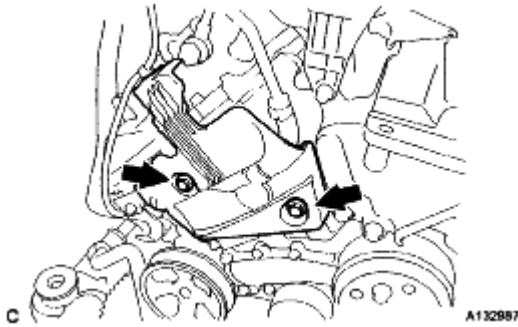


Fig. 116: Locating No. 2 Timing Gear Cover With Bolts

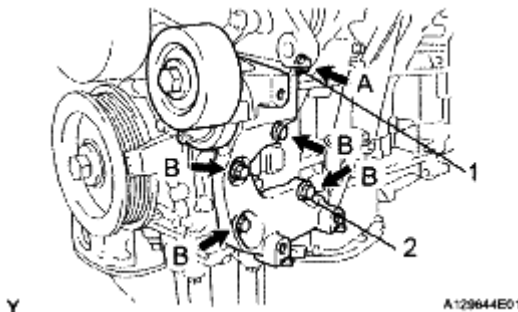


Fig. 117: Locating Bolts And V-Ribbed Belt Tensioner Assembly

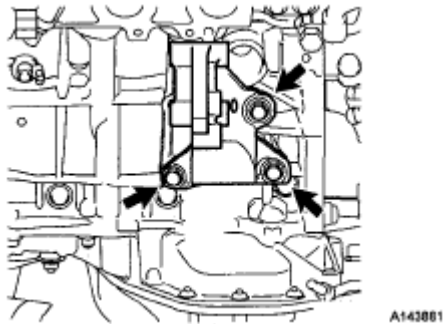


Fig. 118: Locating Bolts And Engine Mounting Bracket RR

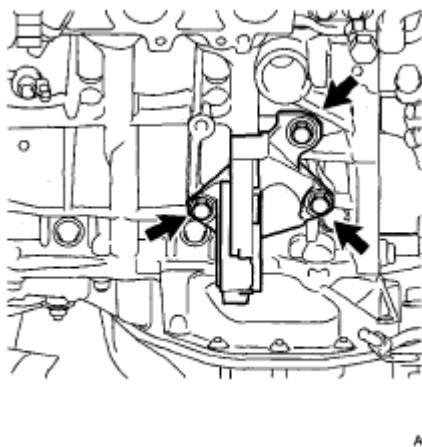


Fig. 119: Locating Drive Shaft Bearing Bracket (For 2WD)

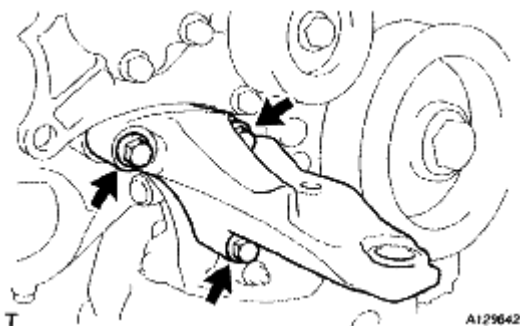


Fig. 120: Locating Engine Mounting Bracket RH With Bolts

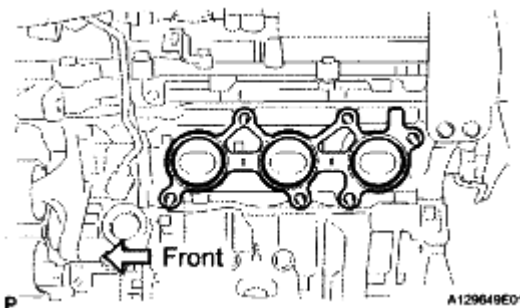


Fig. 121: Installing Exhaust Manifold Sub-Assembly RH With Nuts

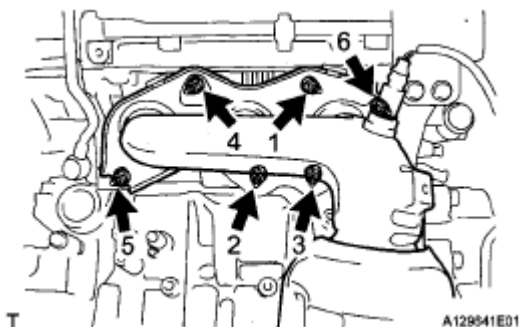


Fig. 122: Installing Exhaust Manifold Sub-Assembly LH With Nuts

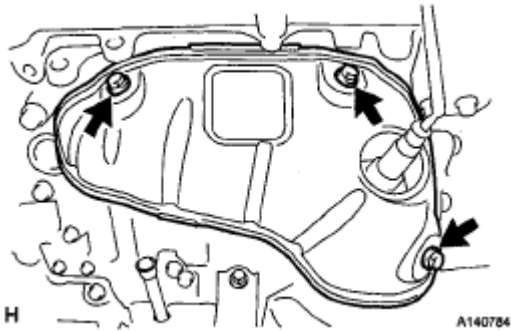


Fig. 123: Locating No. 2 Exhaust Manifold Heat Insulator

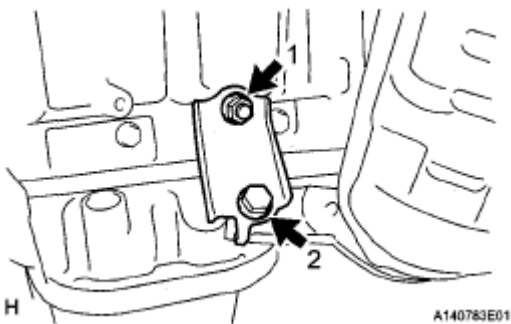


Fig. 124: Locating No. 2 Manifold Stay With Bolt And Nut

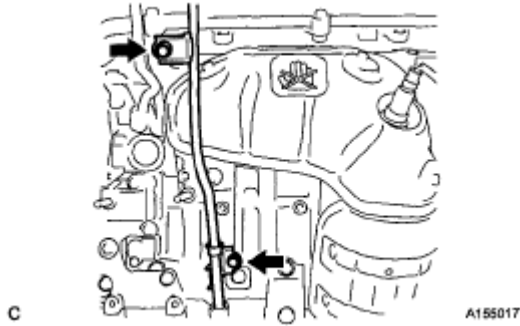


Fig. 125: Locating Oil Level Gauge Guide Sub-Assembly

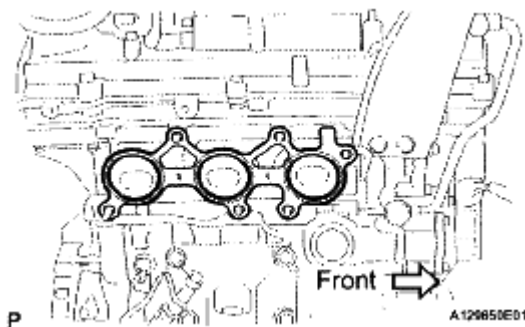


Fig. 126: Locating Exhaust Manifold Sub-Assembly RH Gasket

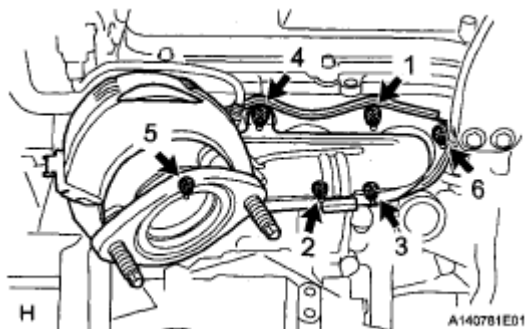


Fig. 127: Identifying Exhaust Manifold Sub-Assembly RH With Nuts

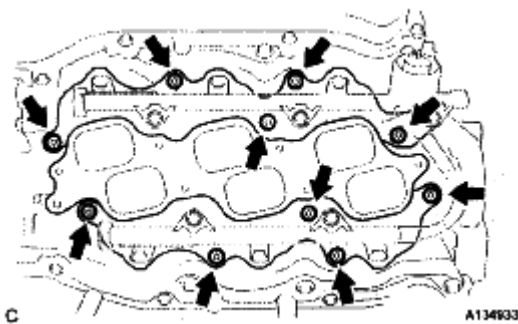


Fig. 128: Locating Intake Manifold Bolts

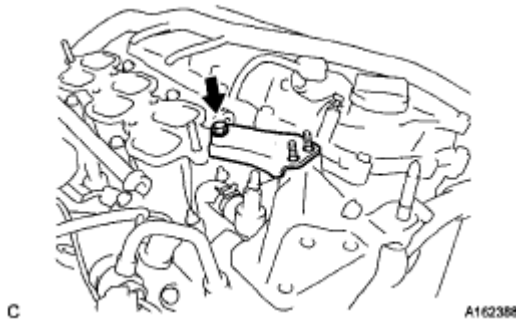


Fig. 129: Locating Bolt And No. 2 Engine Mounting Stay RH

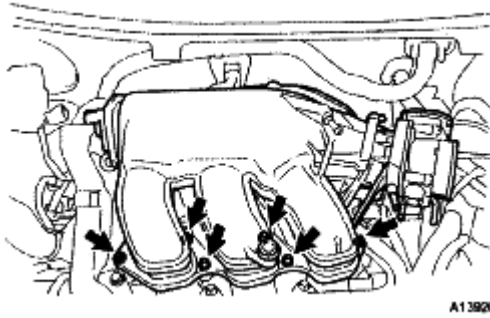


Fig. 130: Locating Throttle Body Bracket, No. 1 Surge Tank Stay And Bolts

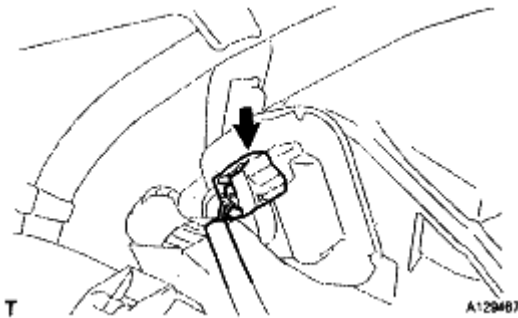


Fig. 131: Locating Connector

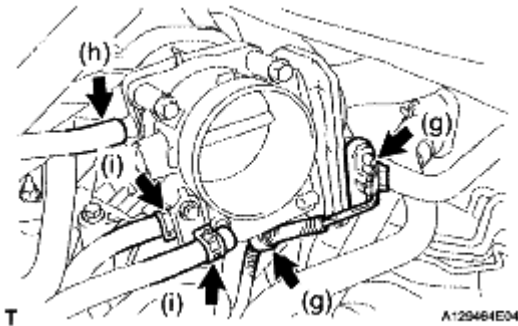


Fig. 132: Locating Water By-Pass Hoses To Throttle With Motor Body Assembly

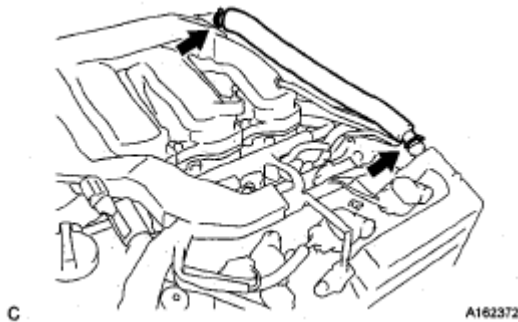


Fig. 133: Locating Ventilation Hose

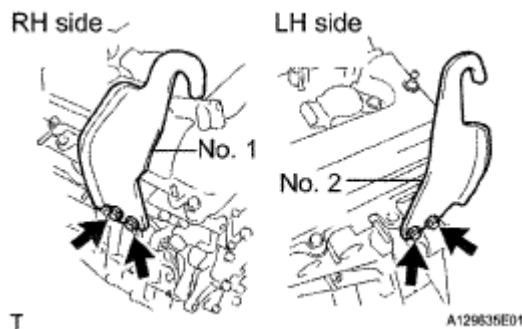


Fig. 134: Locating Engine Hangers With Bolts

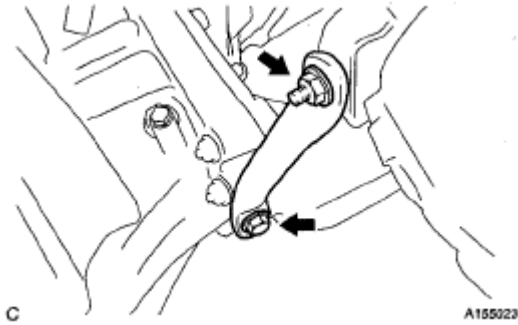


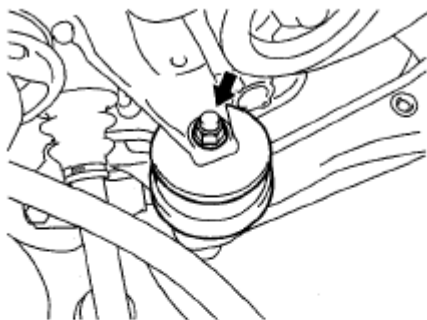
Fig. 135: Locating Bolt, Nut, And Manifold Stay

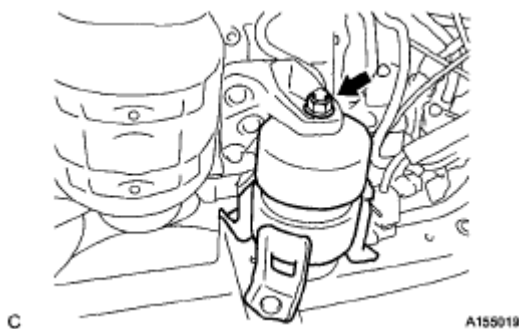


Fig. 137: Locating Bolt And Engine Mounting Insulator FR

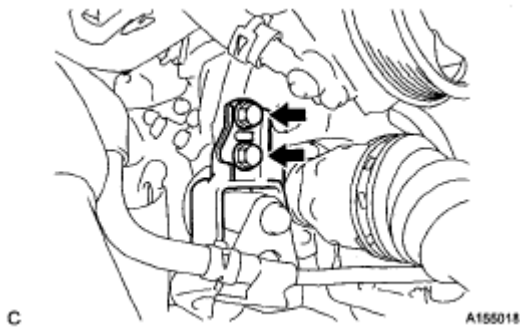


Fig. 138: Locating Engine Mounting Insulator RR (For 4WD)

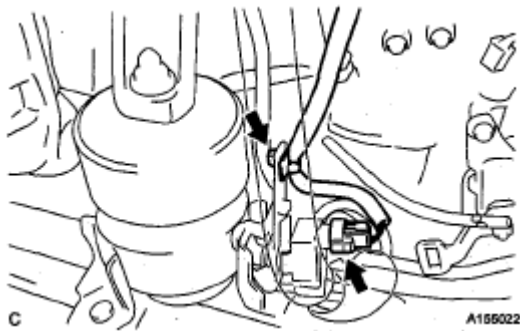


Fig. 139: Locating Active Mount VSV Connector And Harness Clamp

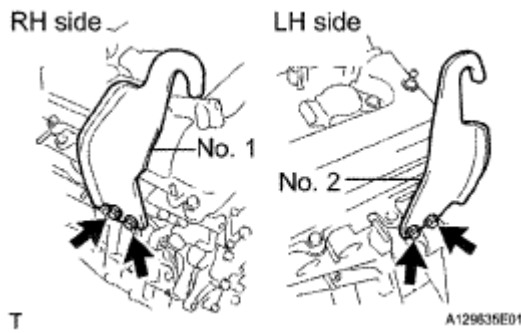


Fig. 140: Locating Engine Hangers With Bolts

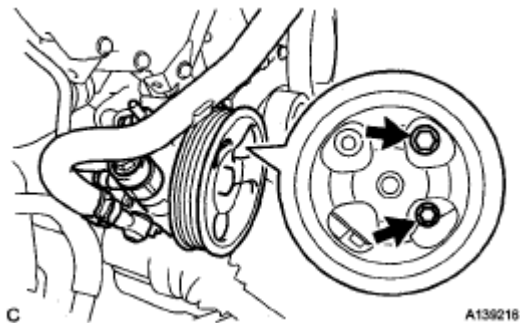


Fig. 141: Locating Vane Pump With Bolts And Nut

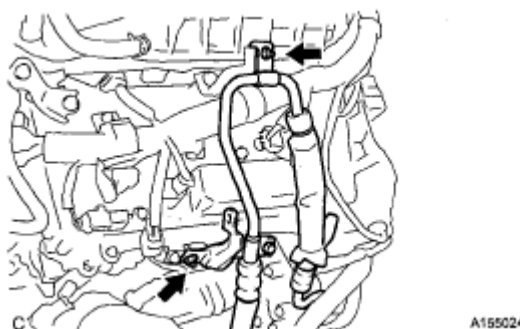


Fig. 142: Locating Power Steering Oil Pressure Switch Connector

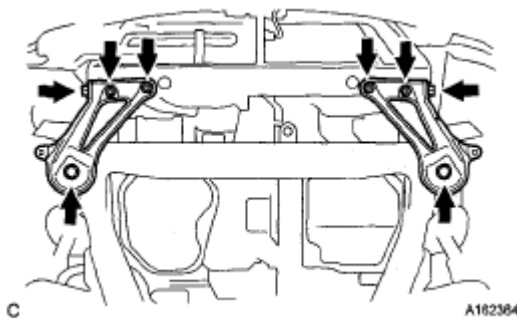


Fig. 143: Locating Bolts, Nuts, And Frame Side Rail Plates RH And LH

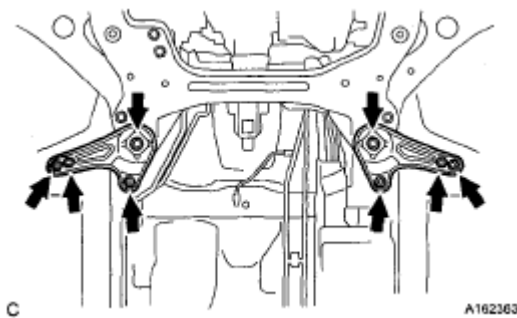


Fig. 144: Locating Bolts, Nuts, And Front Suspension Member Brace Rear RH AND LH

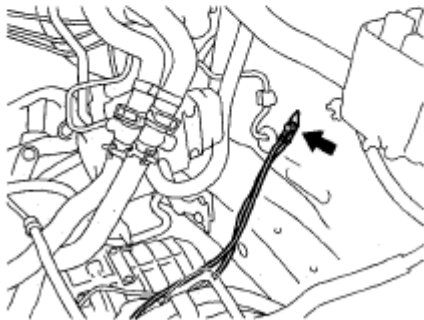
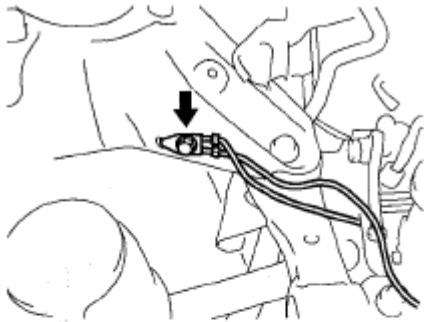

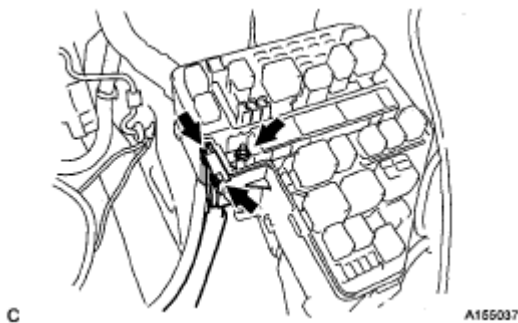


Fig. 147: Locating Wire Harness

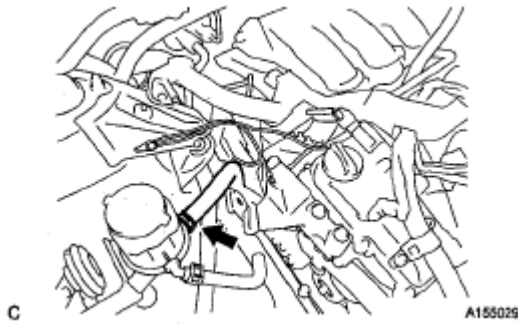


Fig. 148: Locating No. 1 Oil Reservoir To Pump Hose Clip

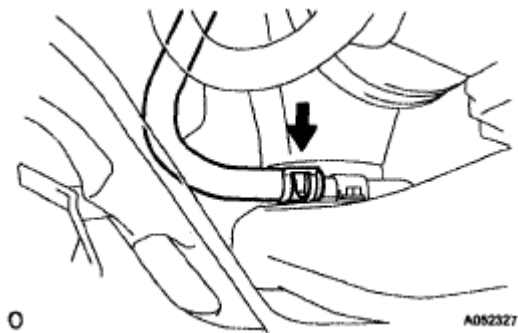


Fig. 149: Locating Steering Gear Outlet Return Tube

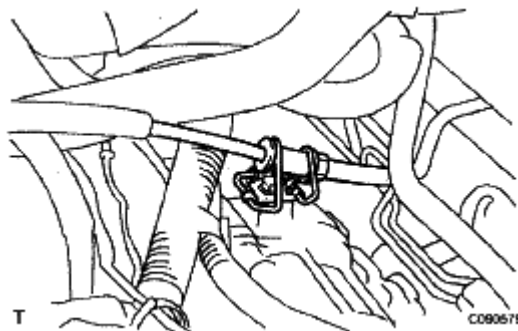


Fig. 150: Identifying Control Cable And Control Cable Clamp

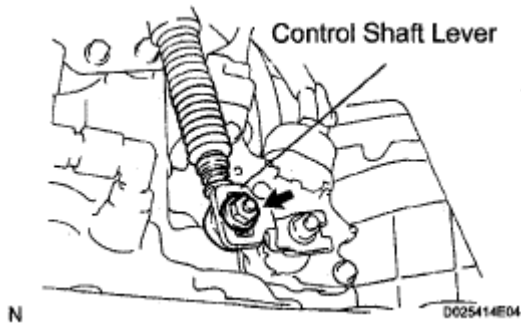


Fig. 151: Locating Control Shaft Lever With Nut

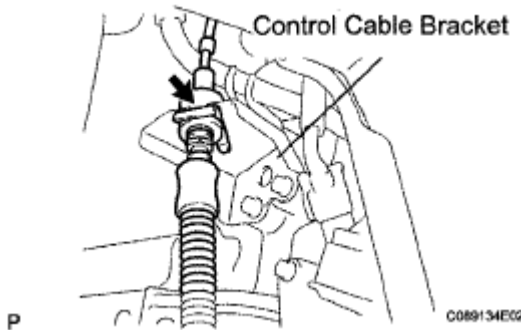


Fig. 152: Locating Control Cable Assembly Clip

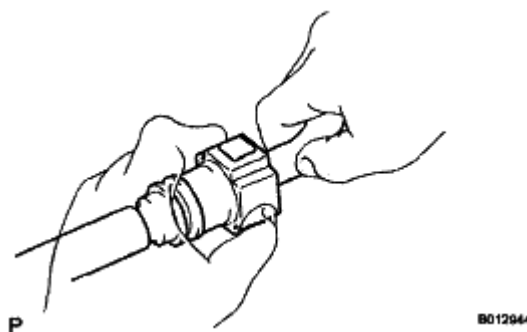


Fig. 153: Identifying Fuel Tube Connector

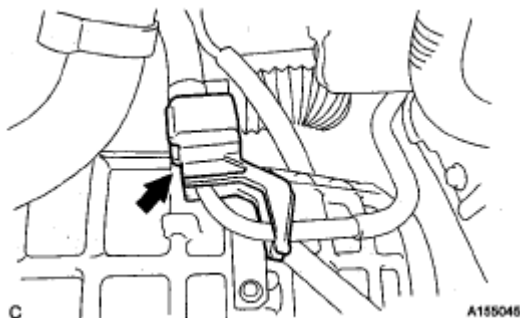


Fig. 154: Locating No. 1 Fuel Pipe Clamp

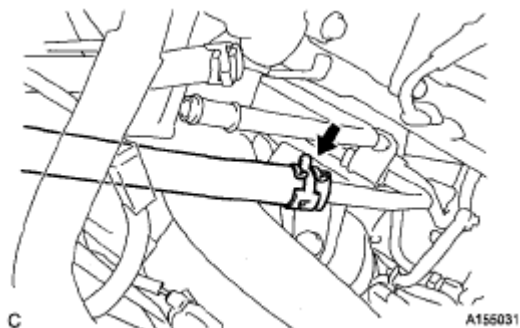


Fig. 155: Locating No. 1 Oil Cooler Outlet Hose Clip

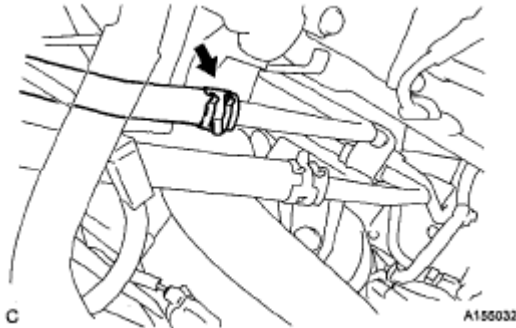


Fig. 156: Locating No. 1 Oil Cooler Inlet Hose Clip

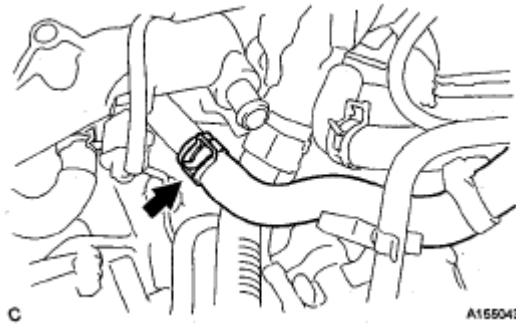


Fig. 157: Locating Heater Water Inlet Hose Clip

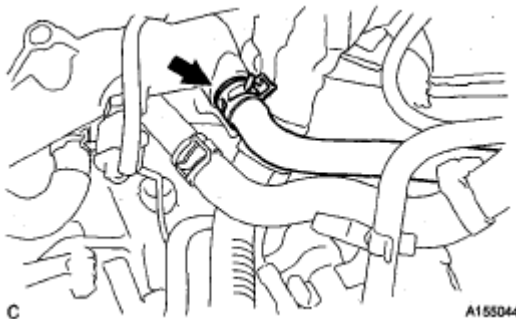


Fig. 158: Locating Heater Water Outlet Hose Clip

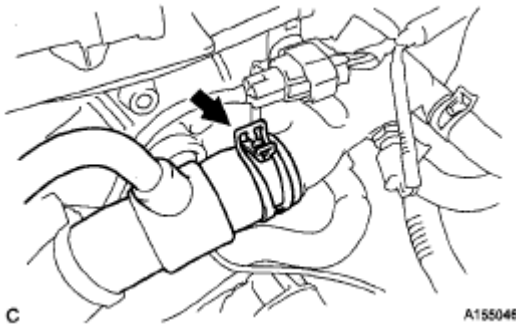


Fig. 159: Locating Radiator Inlet Hose Clip

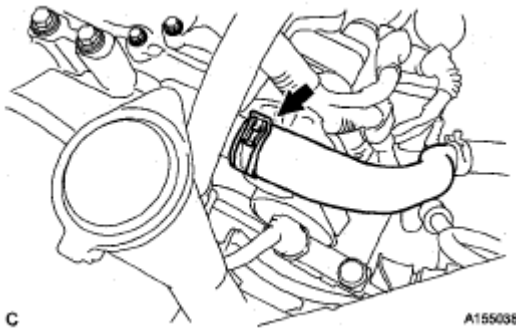


Fig. 160: Locating Radiator Outlet Hose Clip

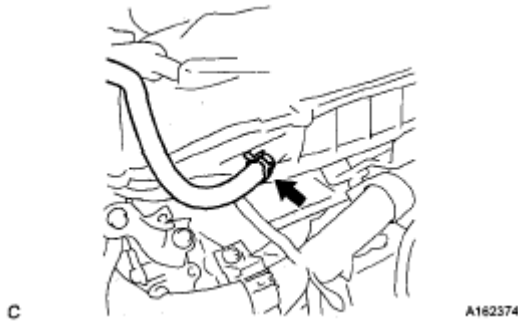


Fig. 161: Locating Union To Check Valve Hose Clip

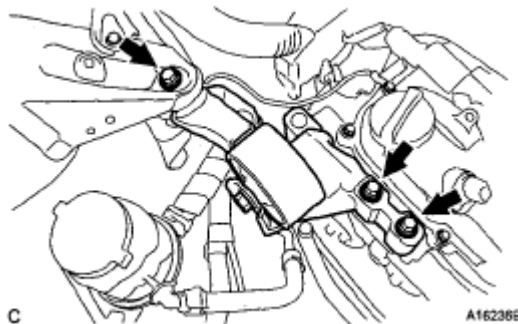


Fig. 163: Locating Bolts On Engine Moving Control Rod

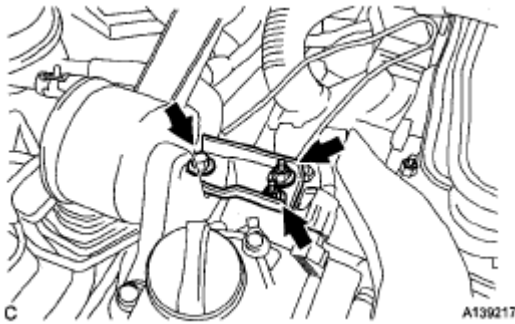


Fig. 164: Locating Nuts On No. 2 Engine Mounting Stay RH

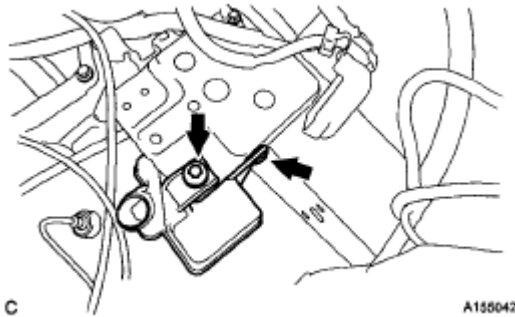


Fig. 165: Locating Clip And Bolt On Intake Air Resonator

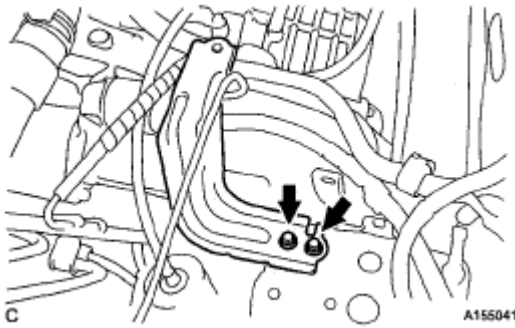


Fig. 166: Locating Bolts For Air Cleaner Bracket

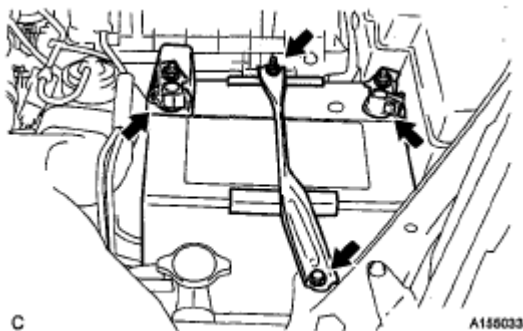


Fig. 167: Locating Bolts On Battery And Battery Tray

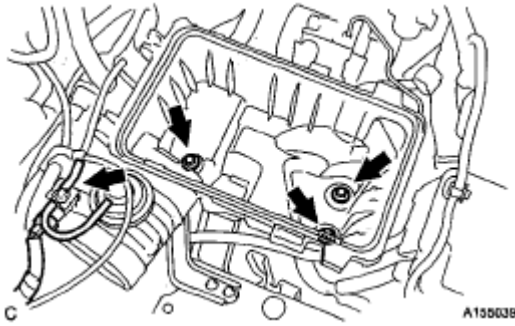


Fig. 168: Locating Bolts On Air Cleaner Case

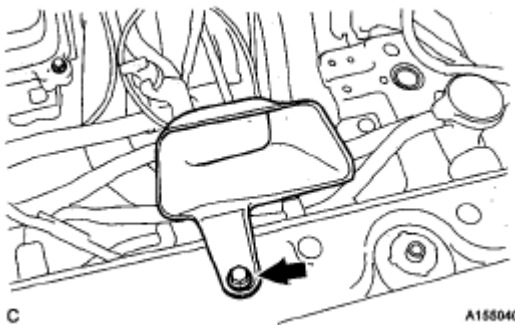


Fig. 169: Locating Bolt On No. 1 Air Cleaner Inlet

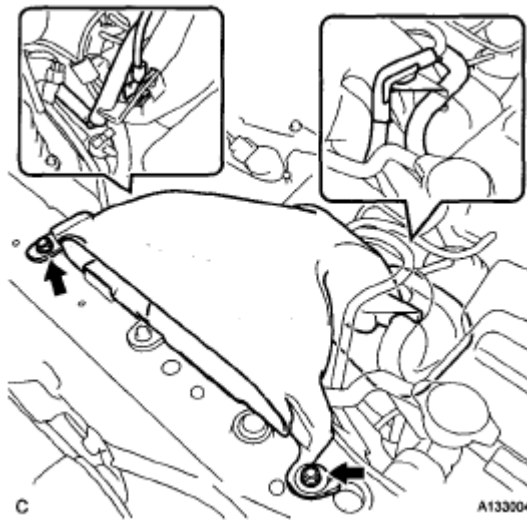


Fig. 170: Locating Bolts On No. 2 Air Cleaner Inlet

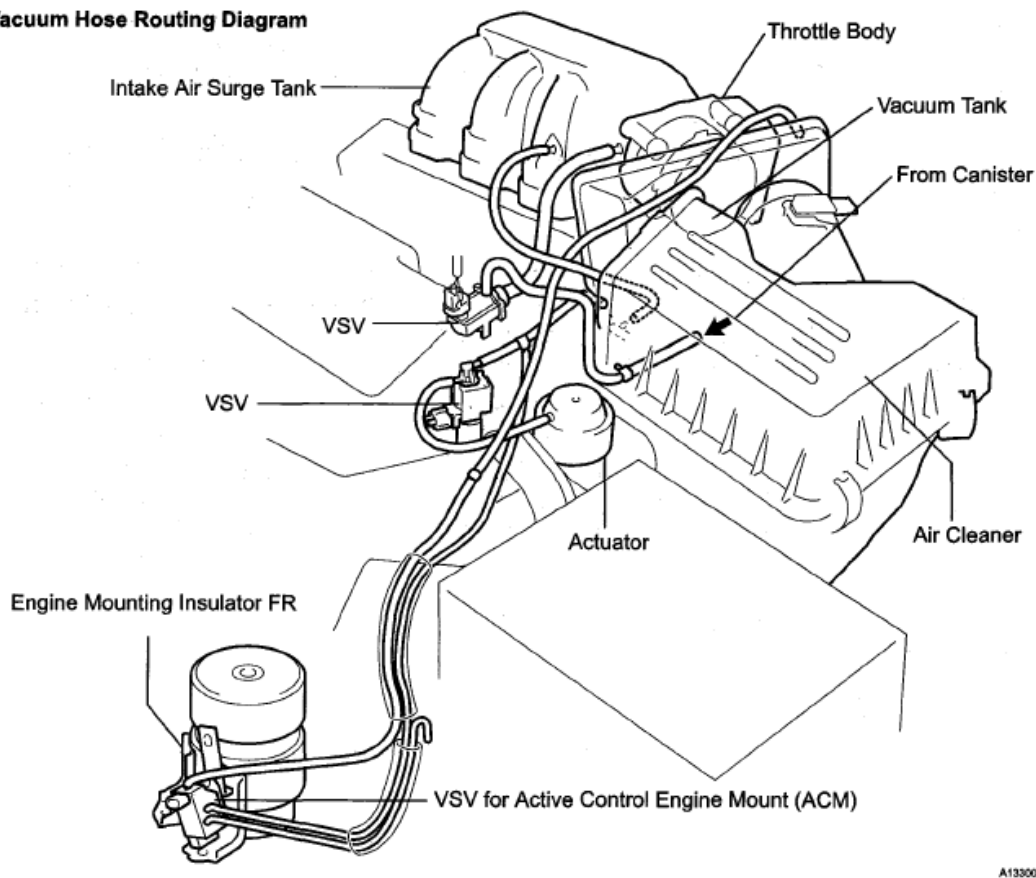


Fig. 171: Vacuum Hoses Routing Diagram

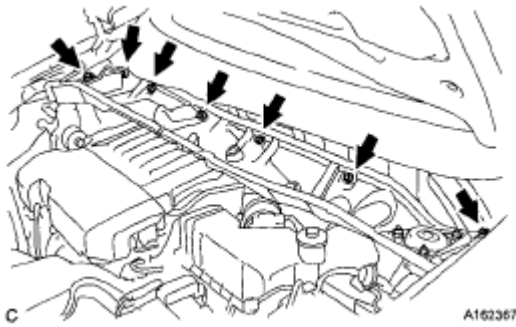


Fig. 172: Locating Bolts On Front Outer Cowl Top Panel Sub-Assembly

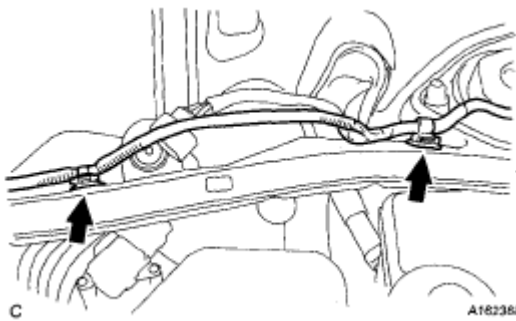


Fig. 173: Locating Clips For Engine Wire

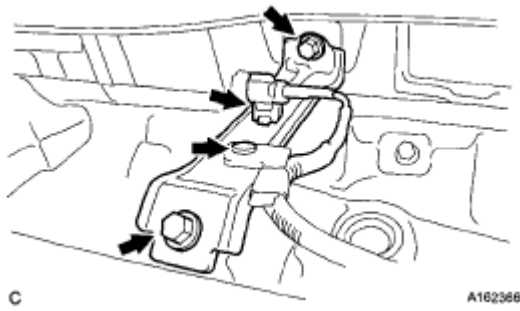


Fig. 174: Locating No. 1 Cowl Top To Cowl Brace Inner Bolts And Clips

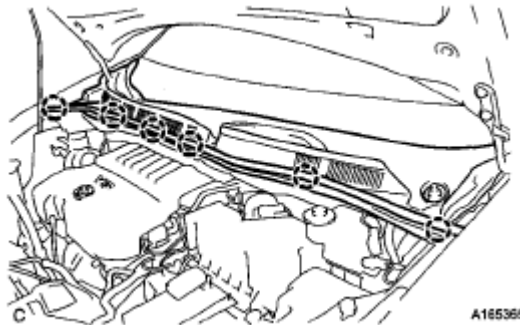


Fig. 175: Locating Cowl Top Ventilator Louver Sub-Assembly

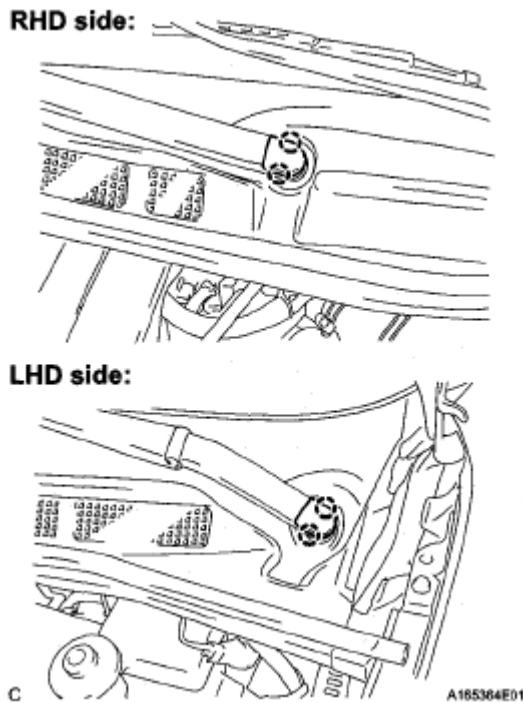


Fig. 176: Locating Front Wiper Arm Head Caps

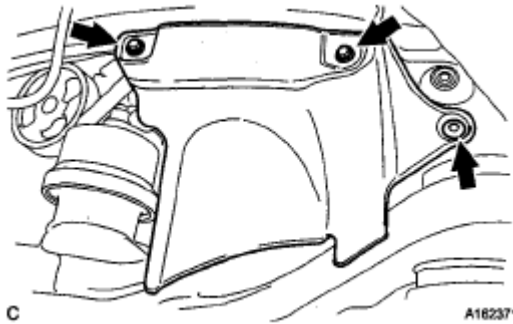


Fig. 177: Locating Bolts And Clip For Front Fender Apron Seal RH

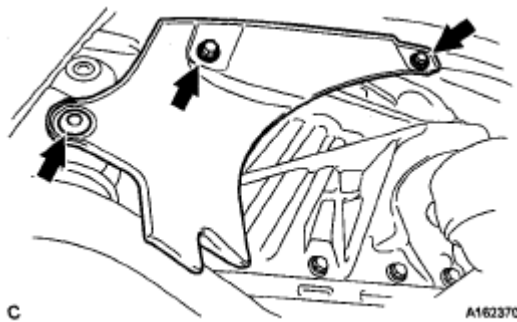


Fig. 178: Locating Bolts And Clip For Front Fender Apron Seal LH

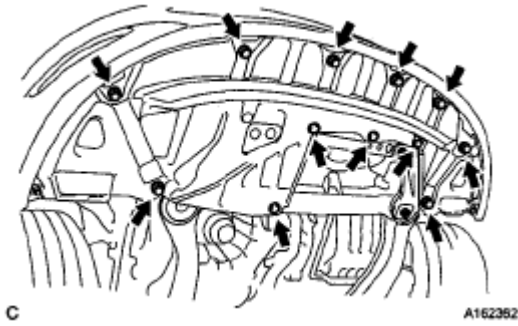


Fig. 179: Locating No. 1 Engine Under Cover Assembly Bolts

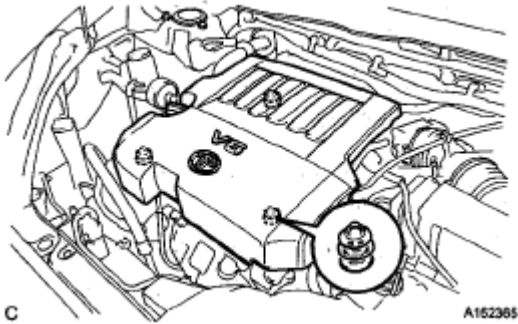


Fig. 180: Identifying Clip On Rear Of Cover

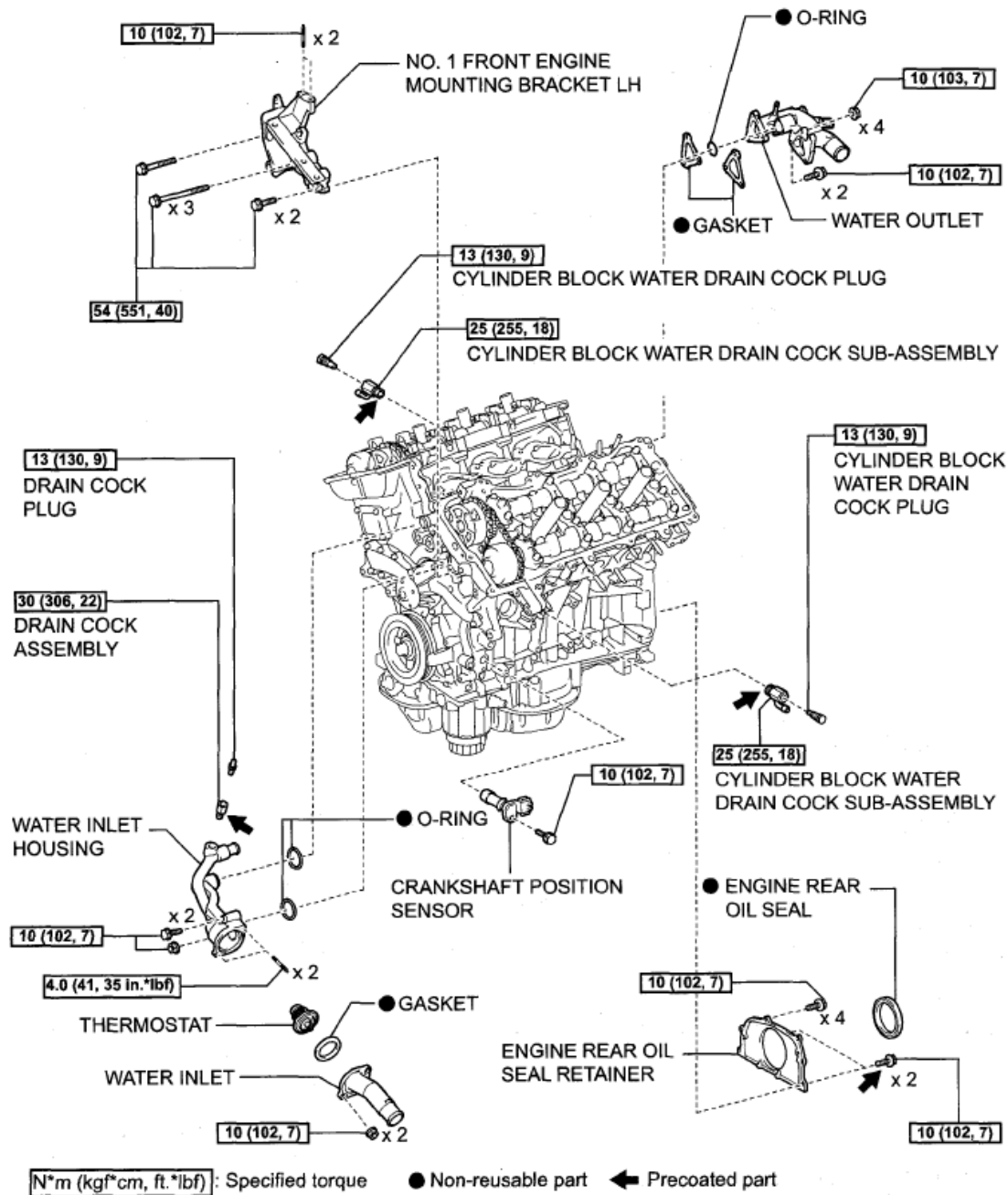

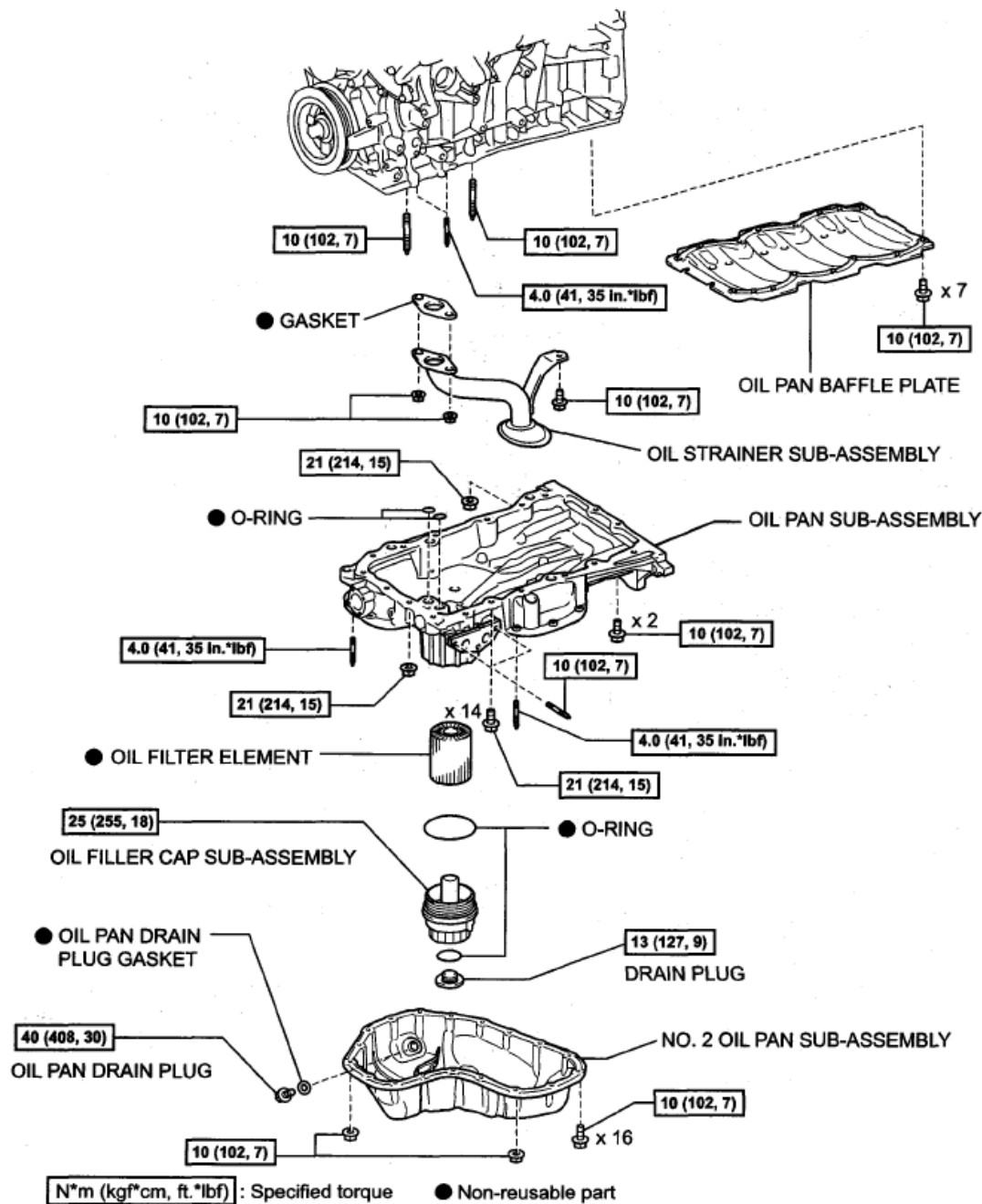


Fig. 185: Identifying Engine Unit Components With Torque Specifications (5 Of 12)

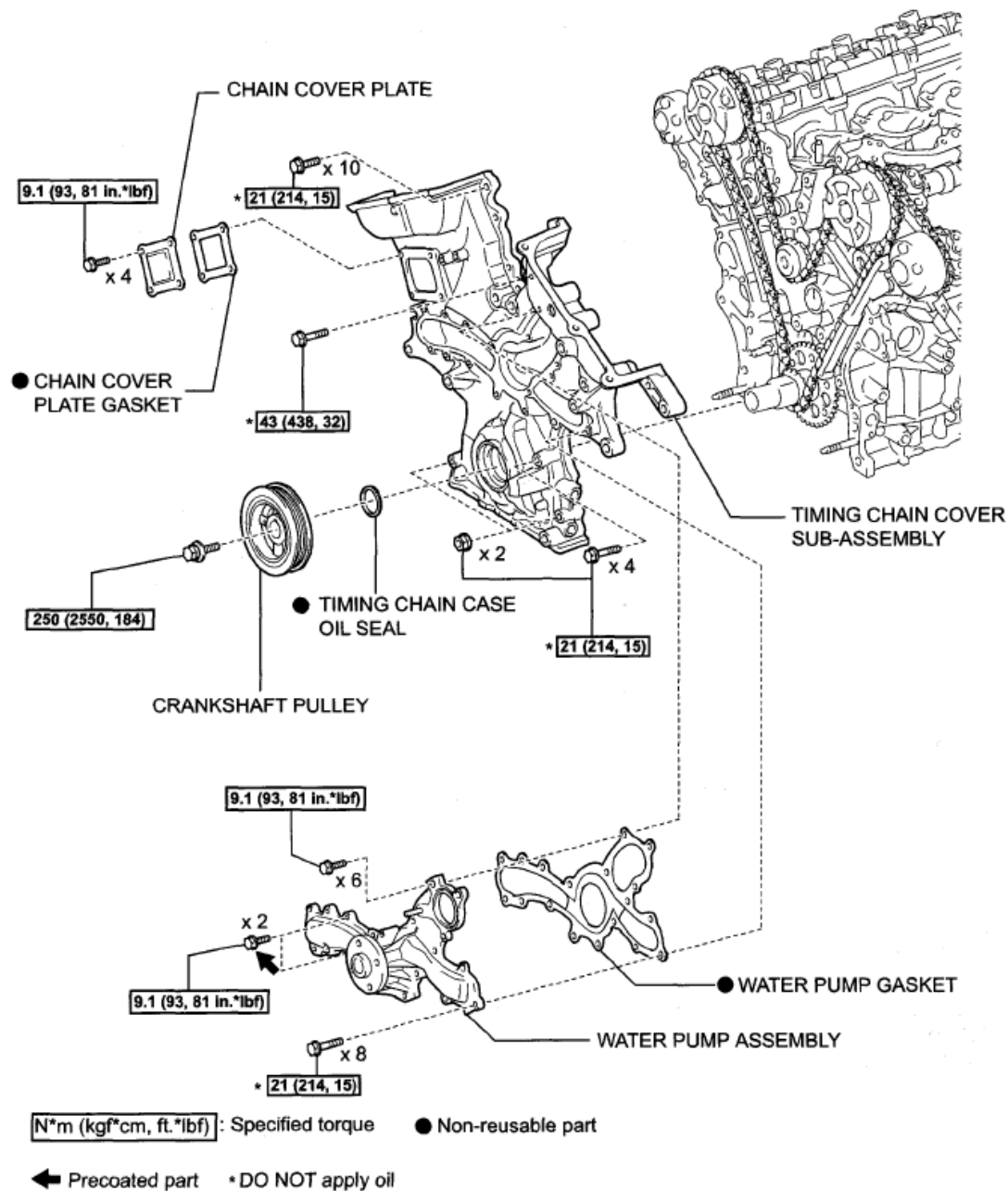
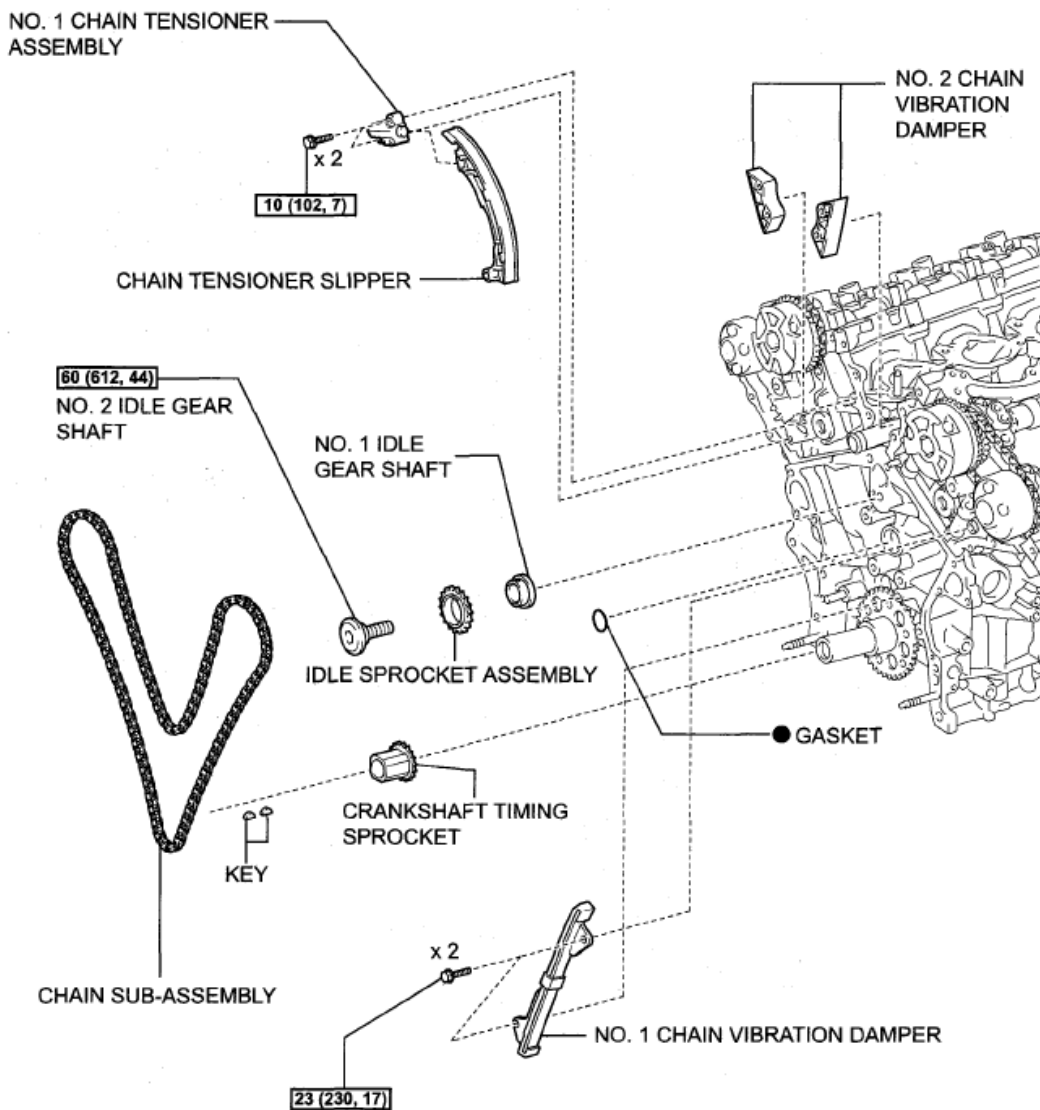


Fig. 186: Identifying Engine Unit Components With Torque Specifications (6 Of 12)

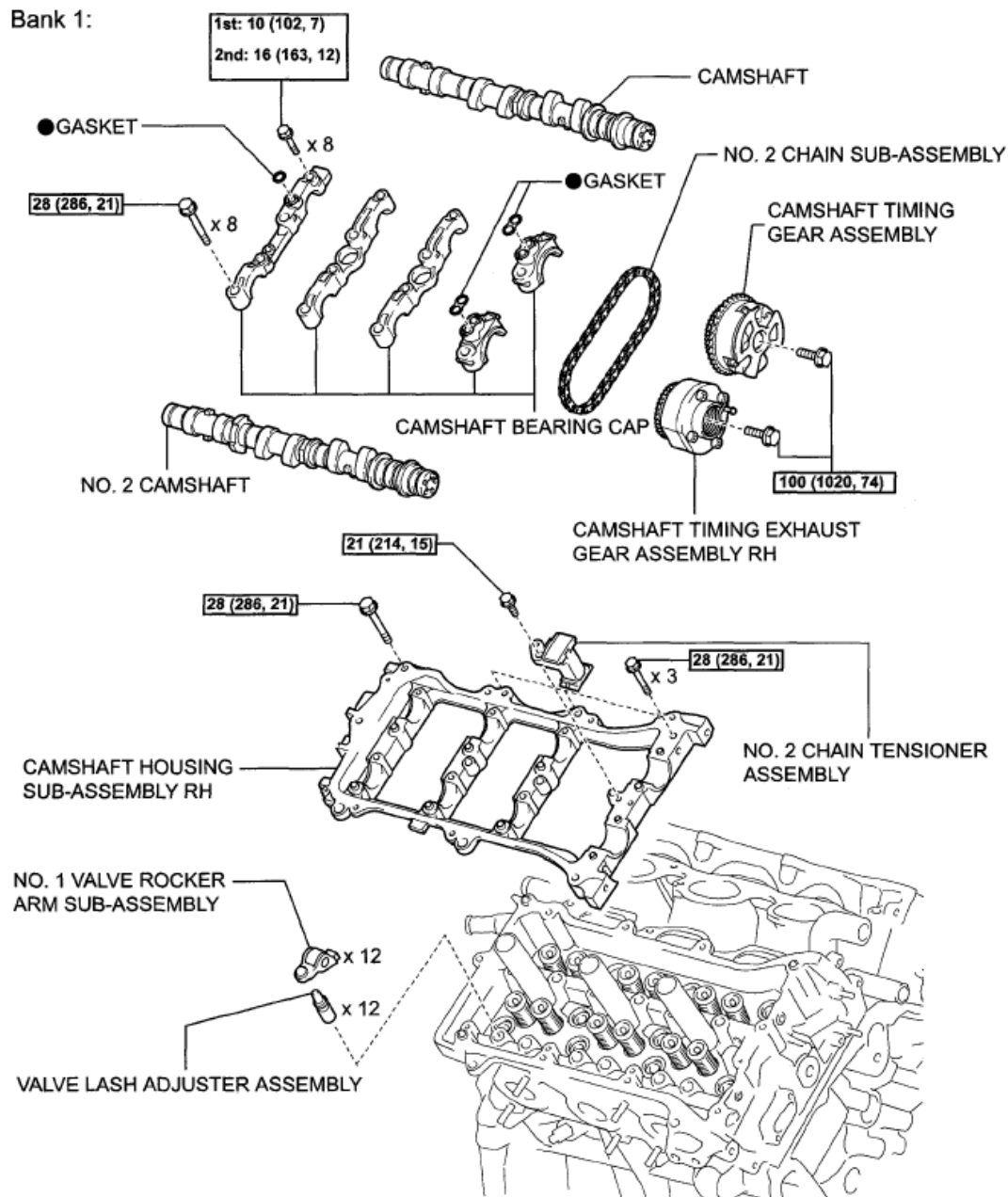

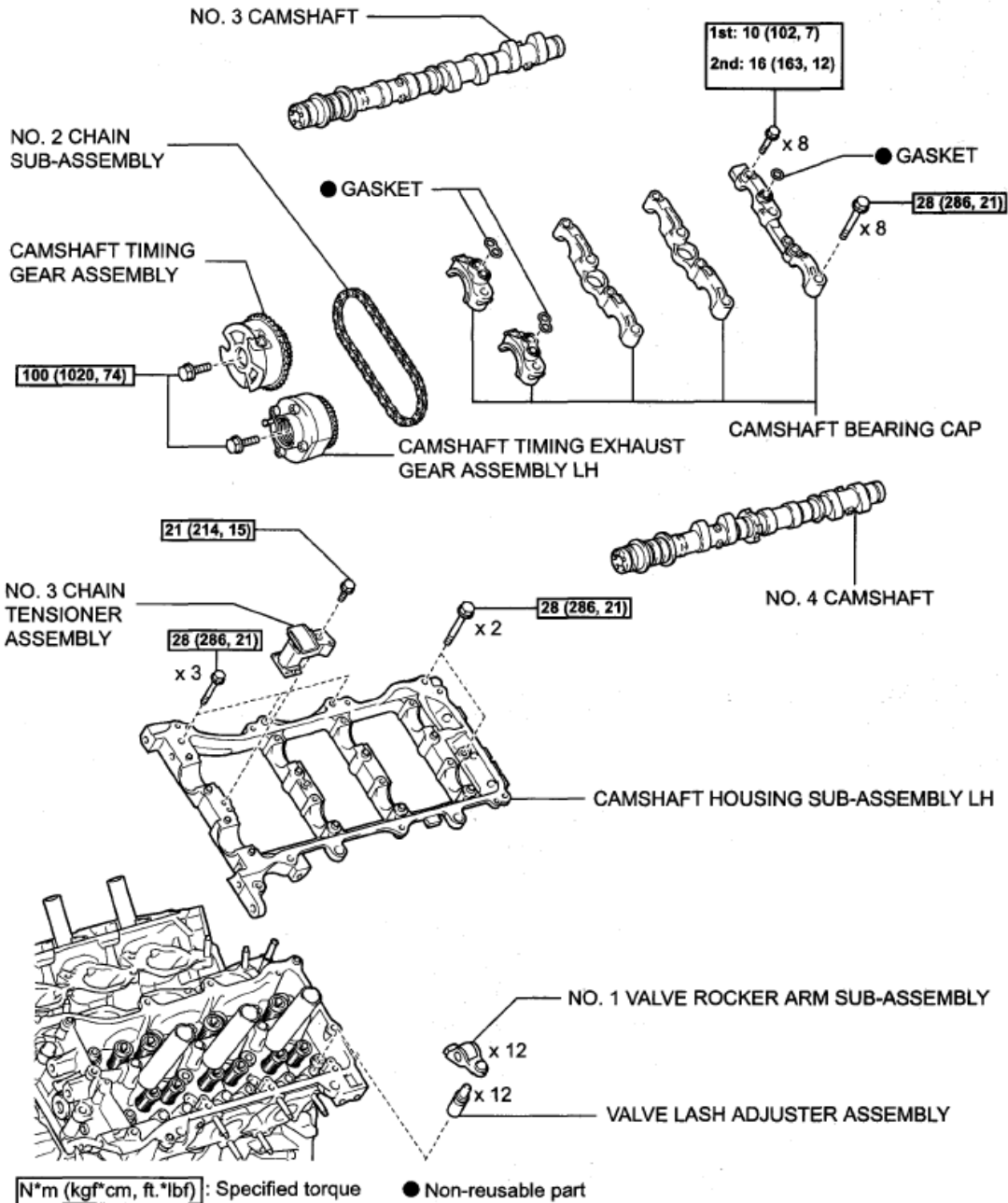
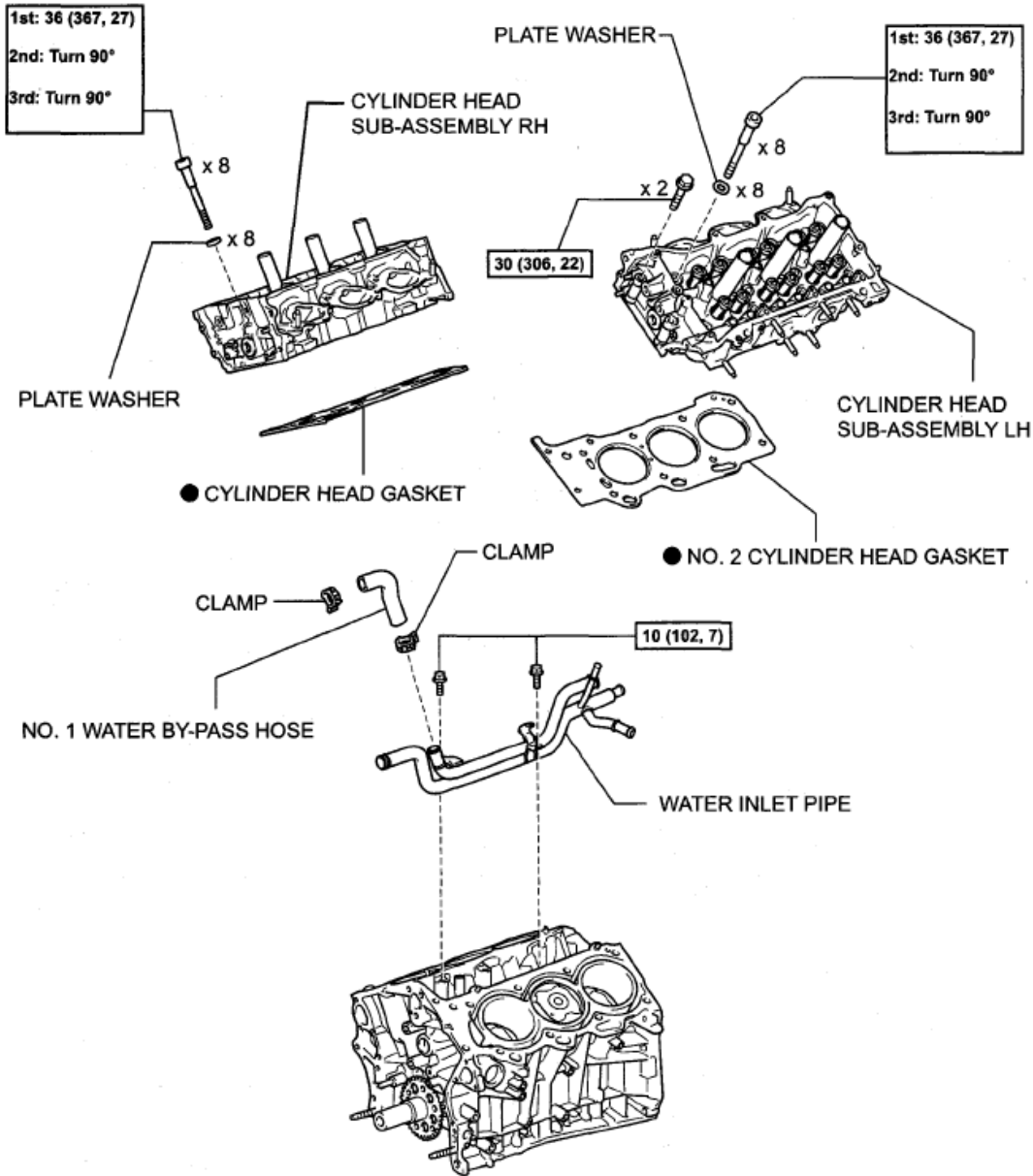


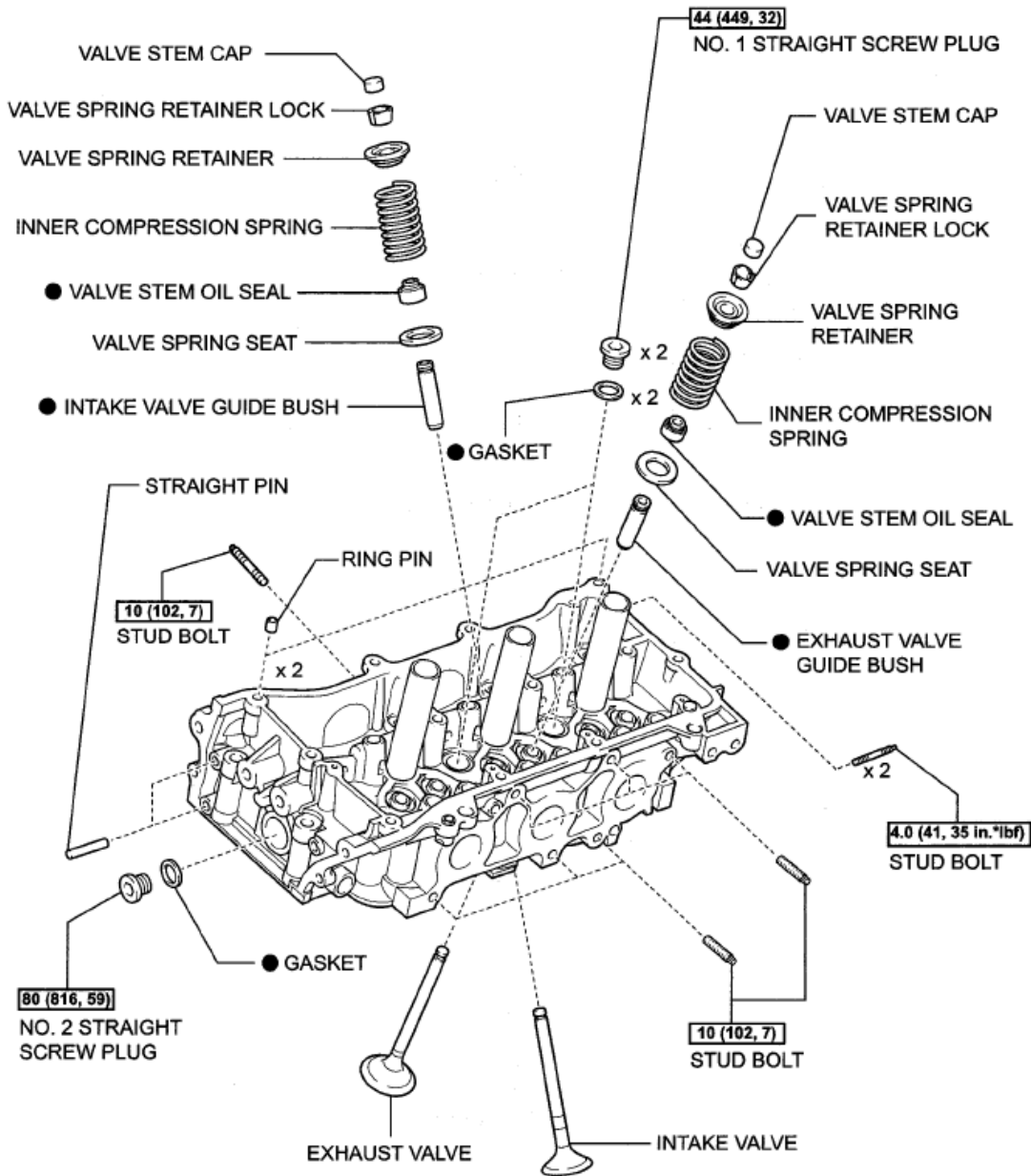
Fig. 189: Identifying Engine Unit Components With Torque Specifications (9 Of 12)

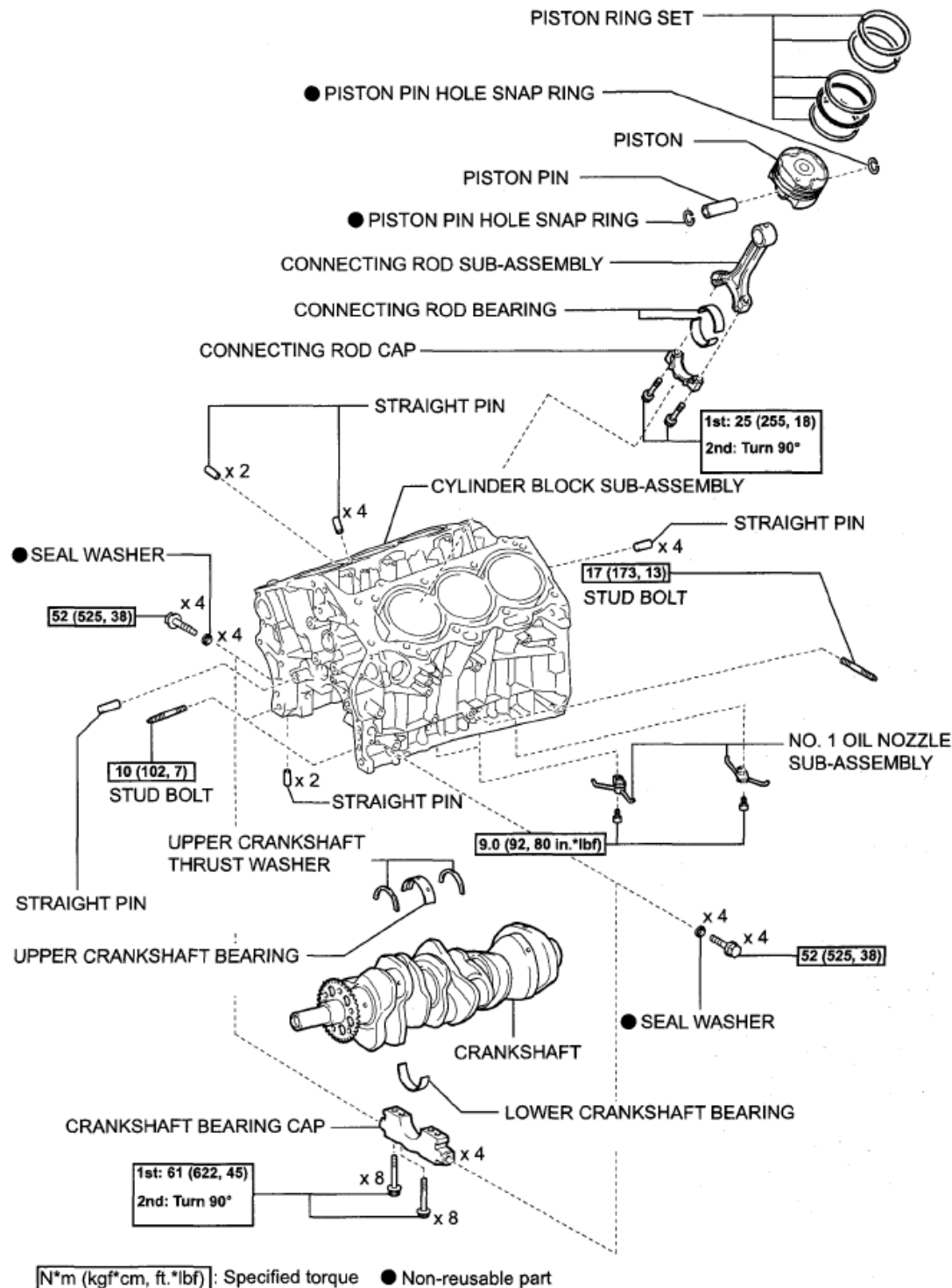


Fig. 192: Identifying Engine Unit Components With Torque Specifications (12 Of 12)

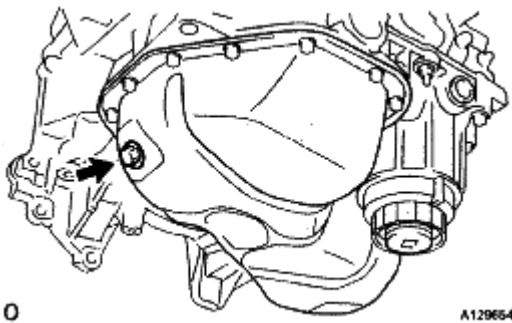


Fig. 193: Locating Oil Pan Drain Plug

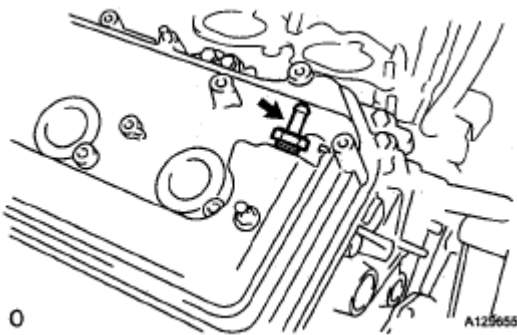


Fig. 194: Locating Ventilation Valve Sub-Assembly

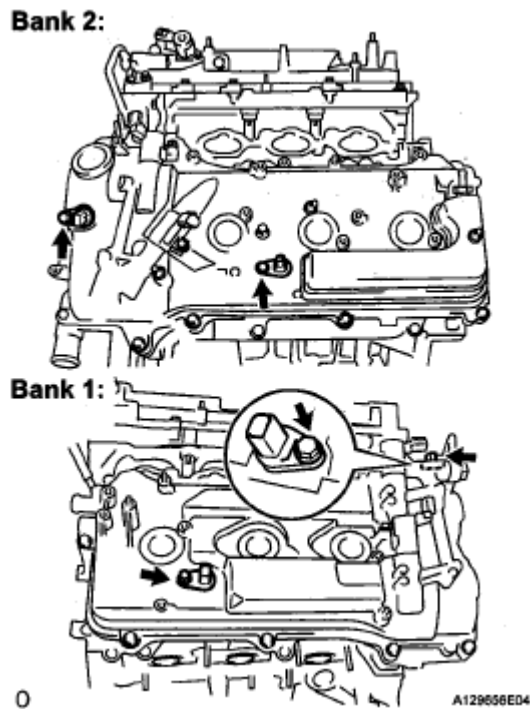


Fig. 195: Locating Bolts And Camshaft Position Sensors

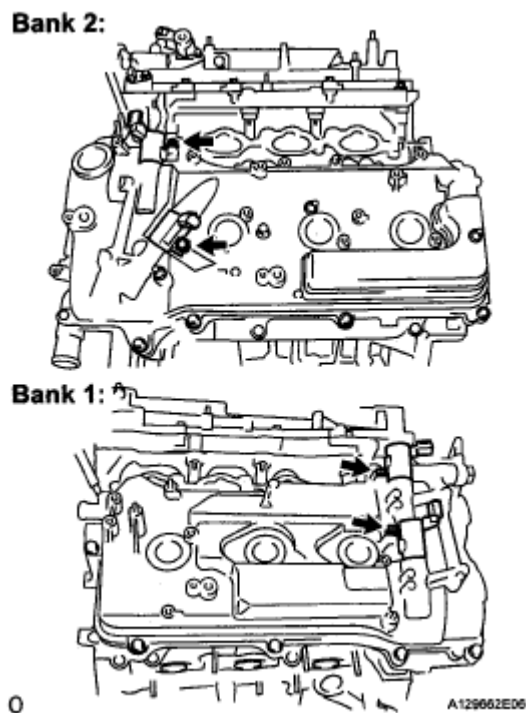


Fig. 196: Locating Bolts And Camshaft Oil Control Valves

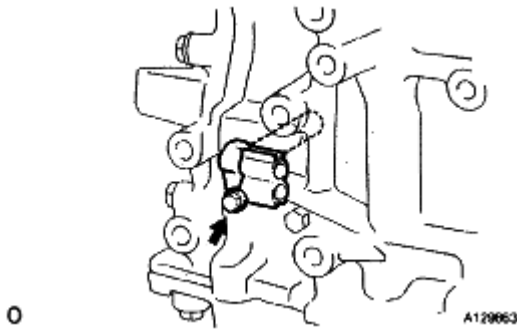


Fig. 197: Locating Crankshaft Position Sensor

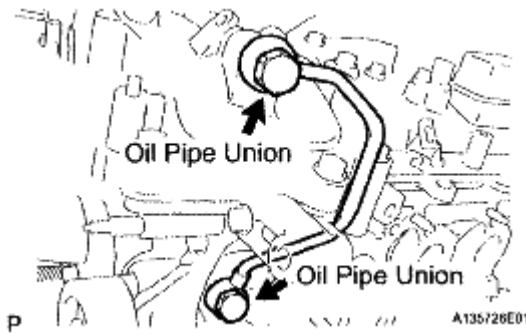


Fig. 198: Locating Oil Pipe Unions And Oil Pipe

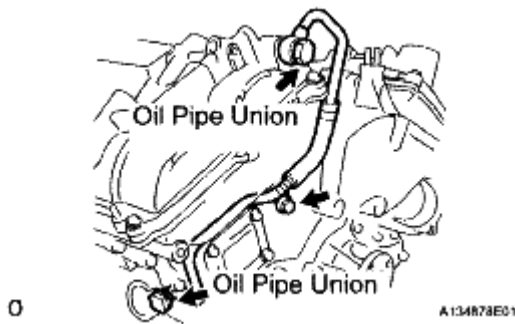


Fig. 199: Locating Oil Pipe Unions And Oil Pipe

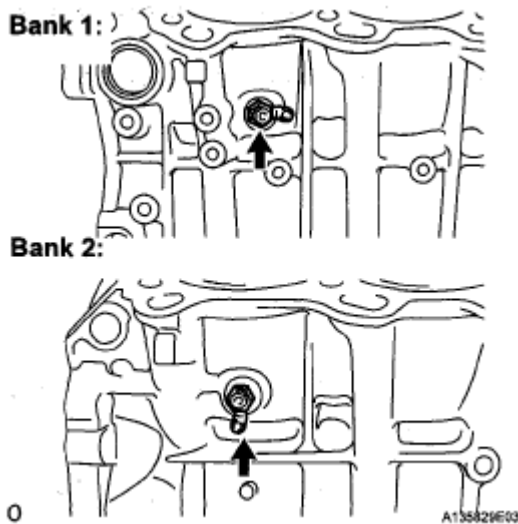


Fig. 200: Locating Cylinder Block Water Drain Cock Sub-Assembly

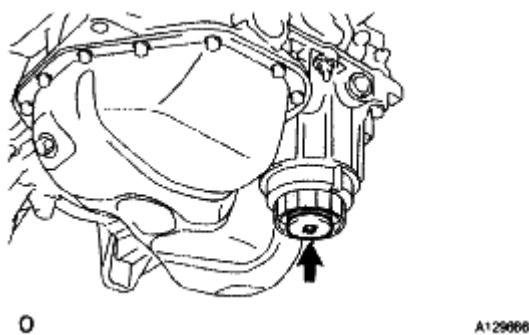


Fig. 201: Locating Drain Plug

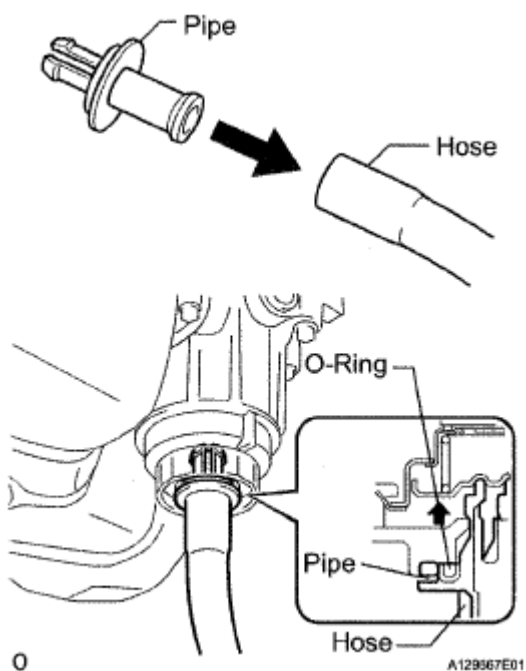


Fig. 202: Connecting Hose To Pipe

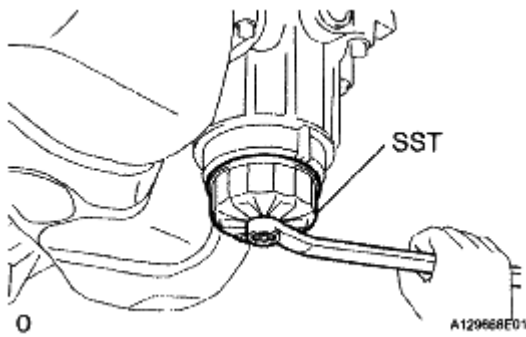


Fig. 203: Locating Oil Filter Cap Sub-Assembly

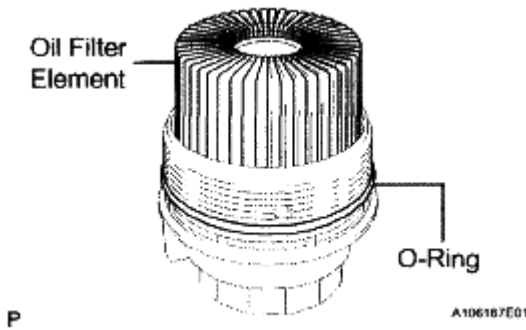


Fig. 204: View Of Oil Filter Element And O-Ring

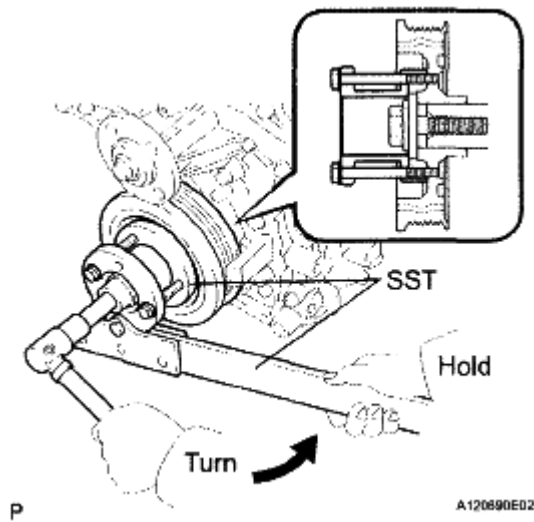


Fig. 205: Loosening Crankshaft Pulley Bolt

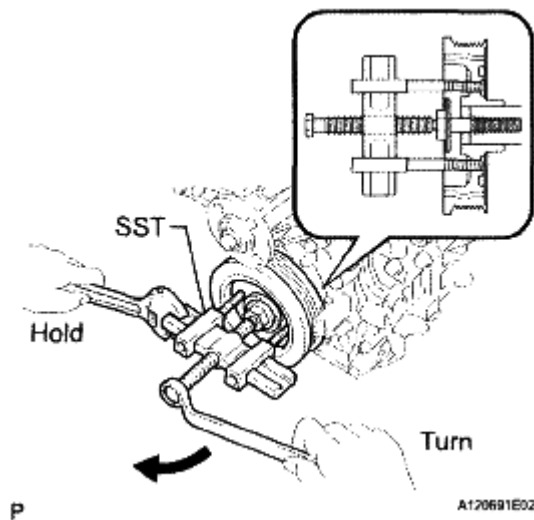


Fig. 206: Removing Crankshaft Pulley Bolt And Crankshaft Pulley

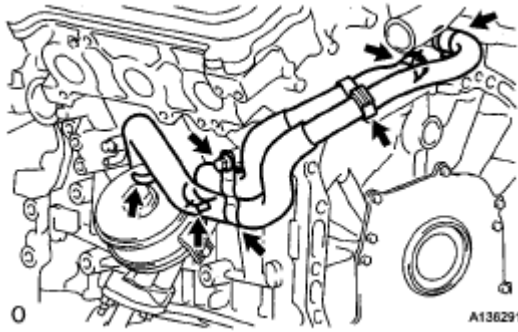


Fig. 207: Locating Bolt, Clamps, And Clips

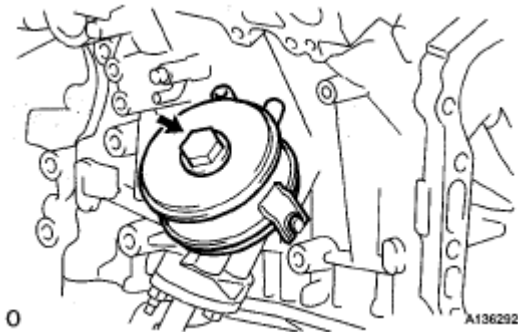


Fig. 208: Locating Oil Cooler Union Bolt

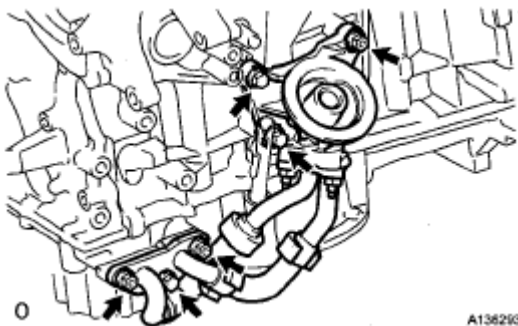


Fig. 209: Locating Bolts, Nuts, And Oil Cooler Pipe With No. 1 Oil Cooler Bracket

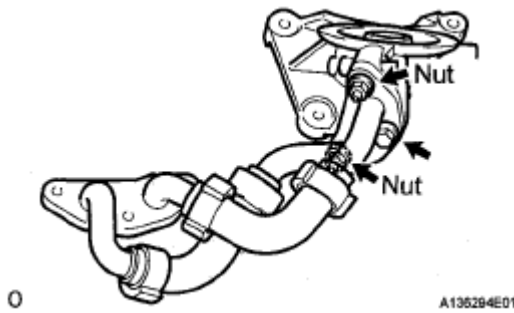


Fig. 210: Locating Bolt, Nuts, No. 1 Oil Cooler Bracket, And Gasket

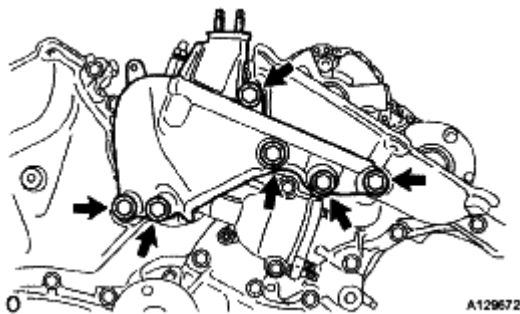


Fig. 211: Locating Engine Mounting Bracket Front And Bolts

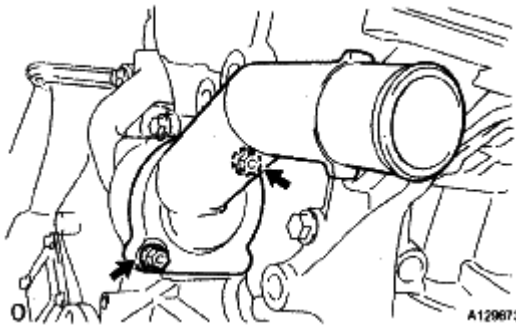


Fig. 212: Locating Water Inlet With Nuts

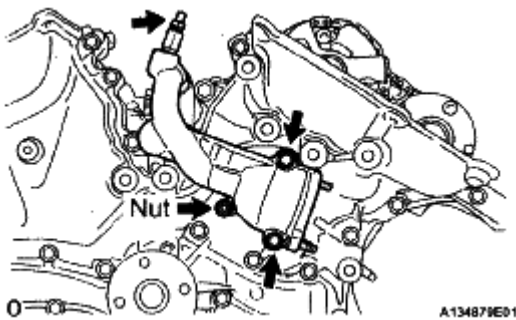


Fig. 213: Locating Bolts, Nut, And Water Inlet Housing

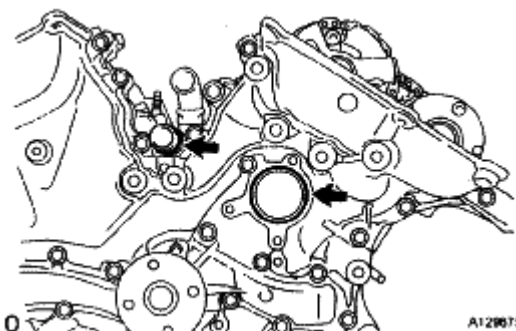


Fig. 214: Locating O-Rings

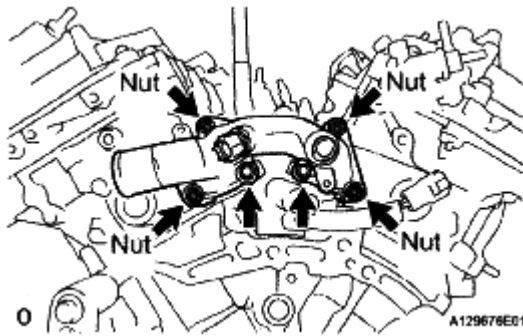


Fig. 215: Locating Bolts, Nuts And Water Outlet

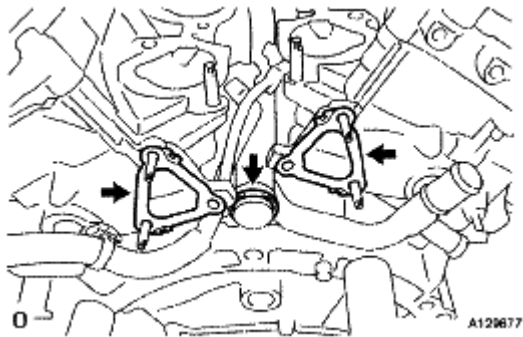


Fig. 216: Locating Gaskets And O-Ring

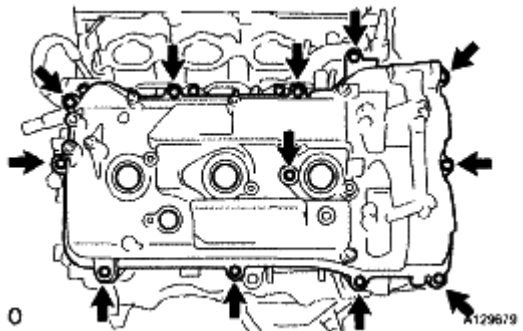


Fig. 217: Locating Bolts, Head Cover And Gasket

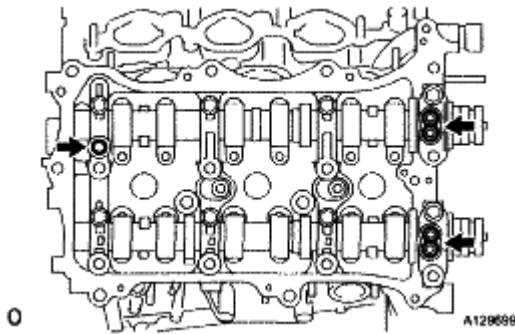


Fig. 218: Locating Gaskets

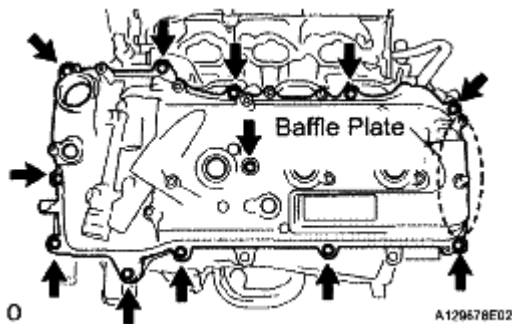


Fig. 219: Locating Bolts, Seal Washer, Head Cover And Gasket

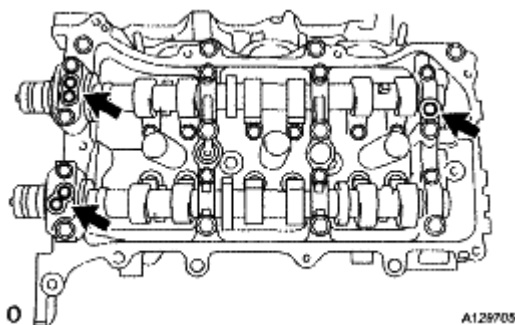


Fig. 220: Locating Gaskets

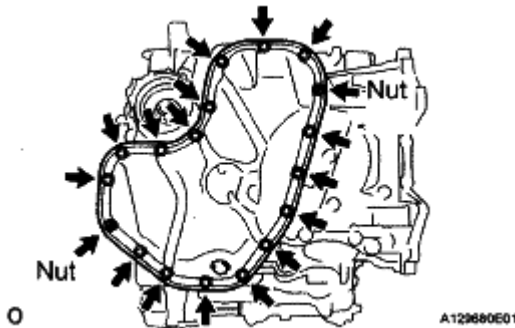


Fig. 221: Identifying Oil Pan With Bolts And Nuts

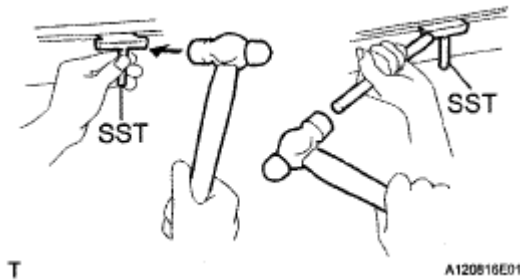


Fig. 222: Inserting Blade Of SST Between Oil Pans

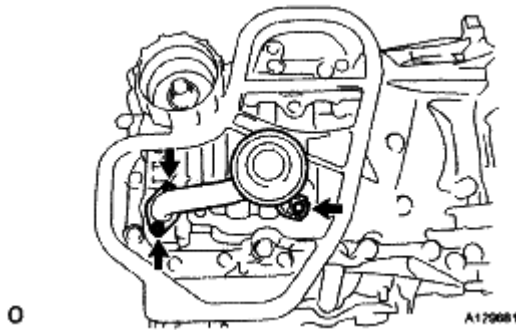


Fig. 223: Identifying Oil Strainer With Bolt And Nuts

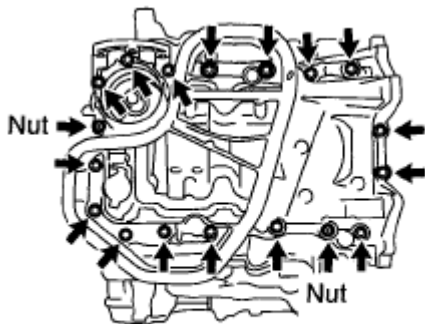


Fig. 224: Locating Bolts And Nuts

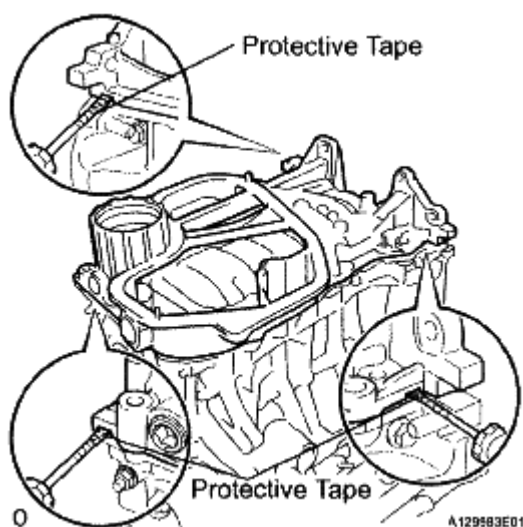


Fig. 225: Removing Oil Pan Sub-Assembly By Prying Oil Pan Sub-Assembly

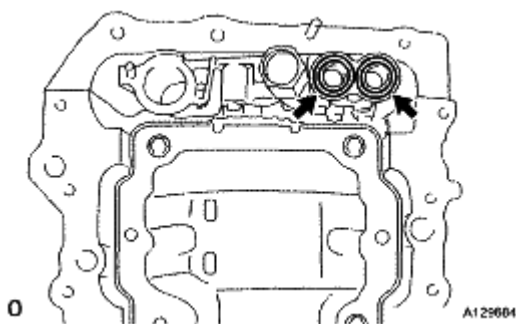


Fig. 226: Locating O-Rings

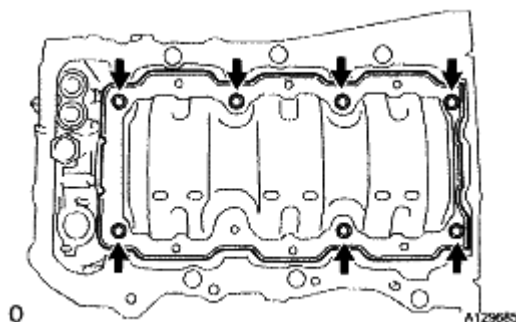


Fig. 227: Locating Oil Pan Baffle Plate Bolts

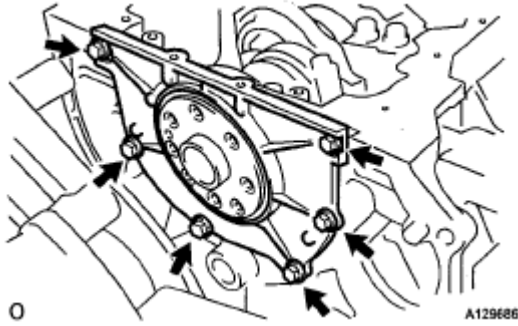


Fig. 228: Locating Engine Rear Oil Seal Retainer Bolts

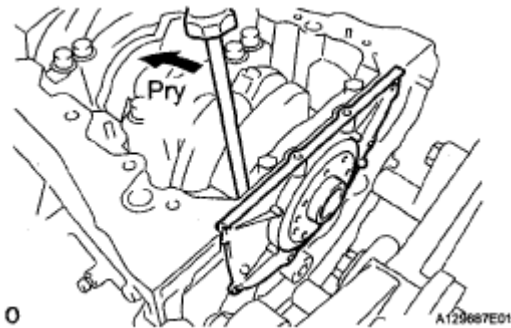


Fig. 229: Prying Out Oil Seal Retainer

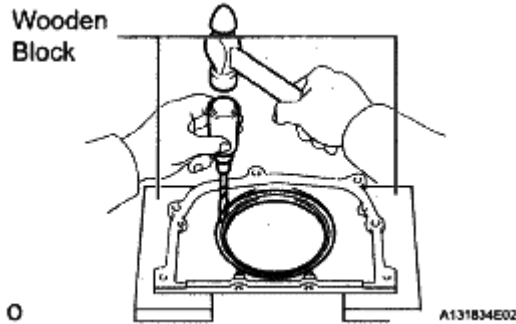


Fig. 230: Taping Out Oil Seal

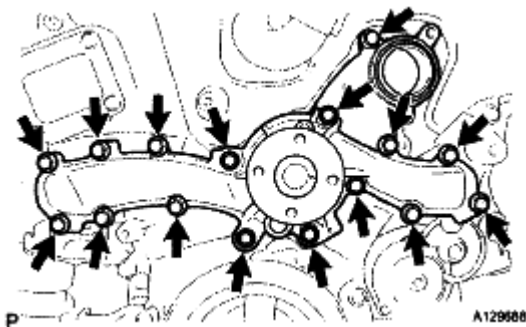


Fig. 231: Locating Bolts, Water Pump And Gasket

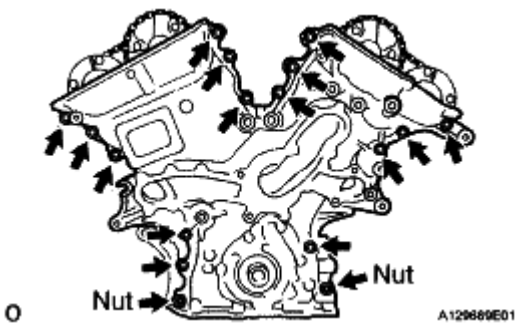


Fig. 232: Locating Timing Chain Cover Bolts And Nuts

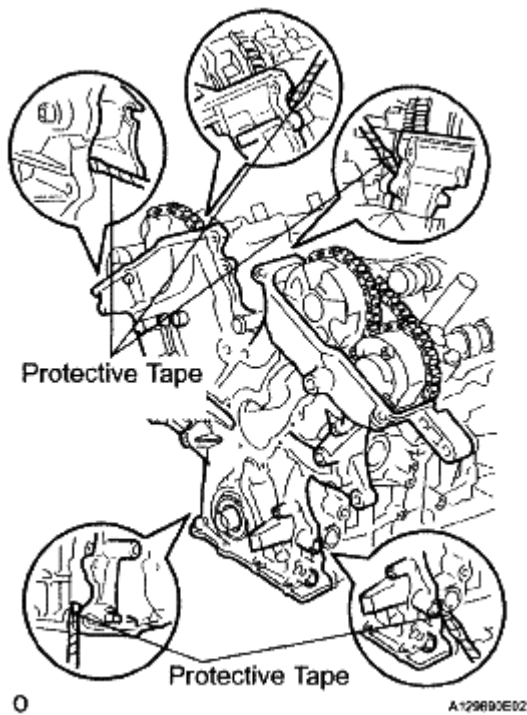


Fig. 233: Prying Between Timing Chain Cover And Cylinder Head Or Cylinder Block

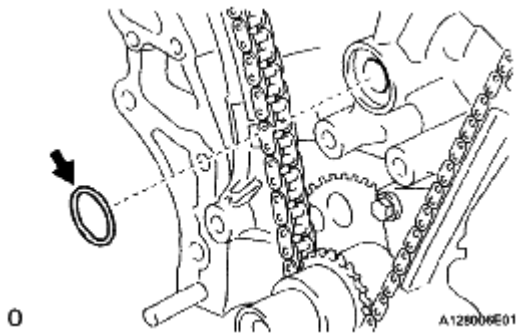


Fig. 234: Locating Gasket

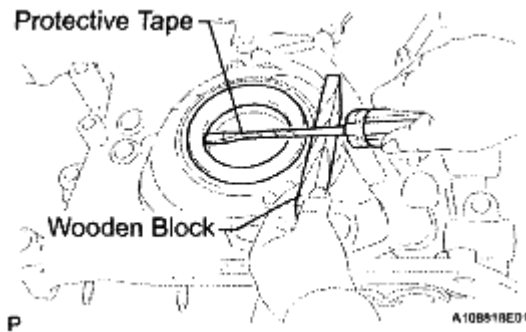


Fig. 235: Prying Out Oil Seal Using Screwdriver

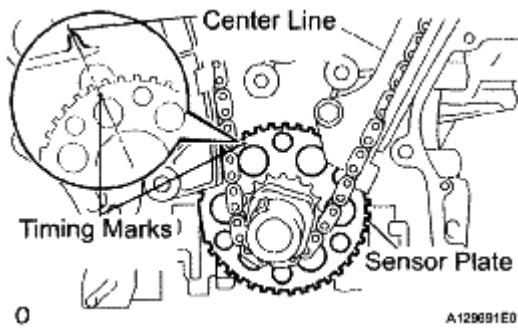


Fig. 236: Identifying Timing Mark On Crank Angle Sensor Plate

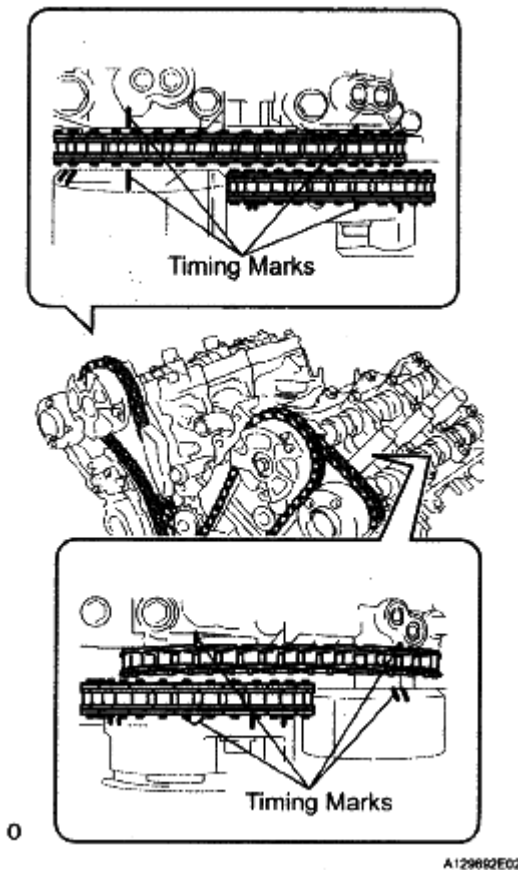


Fig. 237: Identifying Bearing Cap Timing Marks

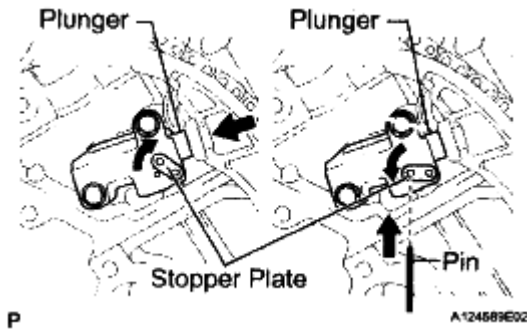


Fig. 238: Locating No.1 Chain Tensioner Assembly

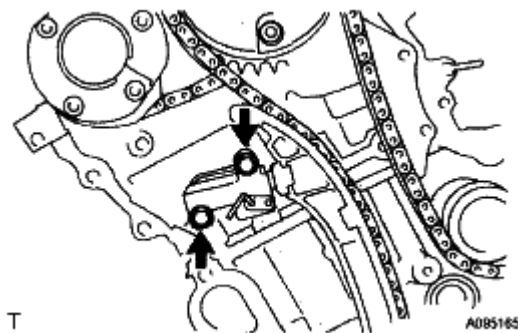


Fig. 239: Locating Chain Tensioner With Bolts

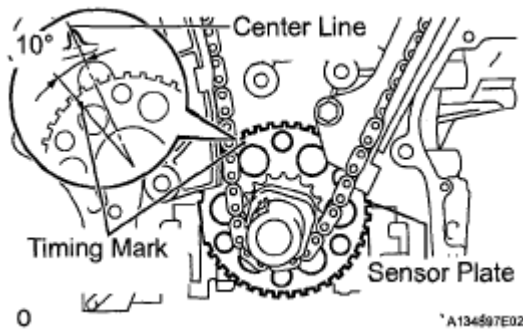


Fig. 240: Identifying Timing Mark On Crankshaft Timing Sprocket

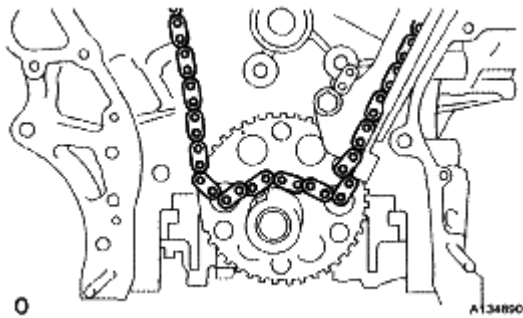


Fig. 241: Identifying Chain Set

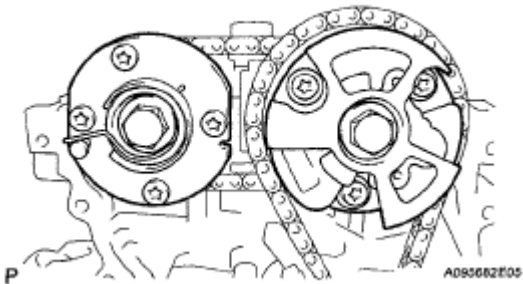


Fig. 242: Identifying Camshaft Timing Gear Assembly Position

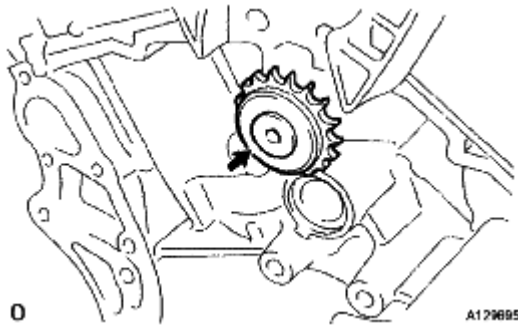


Fig. 243: Locating Idle Gear Shaft No. 2, Idle Sprocket And Idle Gear Shaft

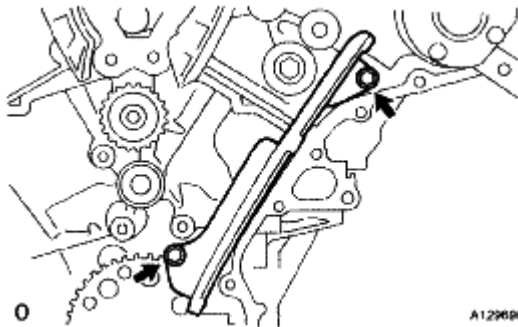


Fig. 244: Locating Chain Vibration Damper With Bolts

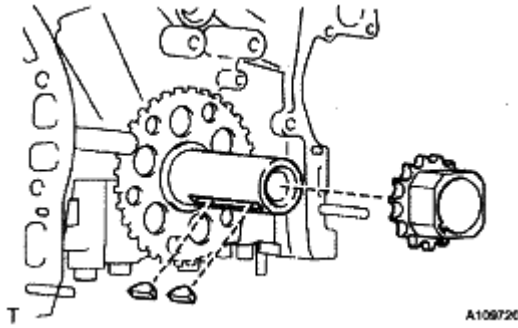


Fig. 245: Identifying Crankshaft Timing Sprocket

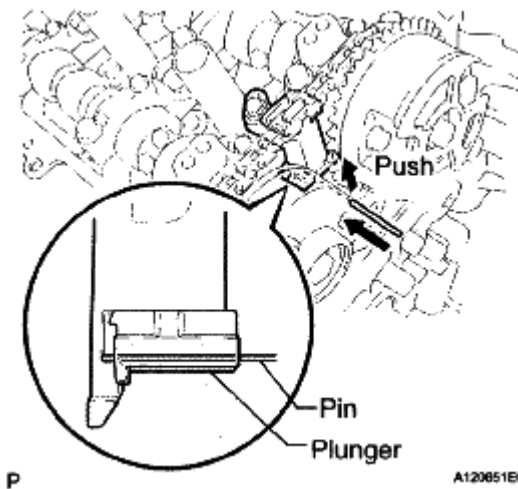


Fig. 246: Inserting Pin Into Hole For Fixing No 2 Chain Tensioner

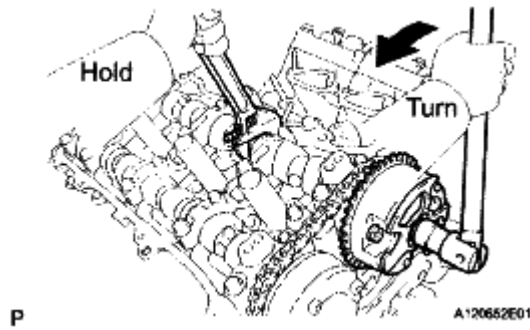


Fig. 247: Identifying Camshaft Timing Gear Assemblies

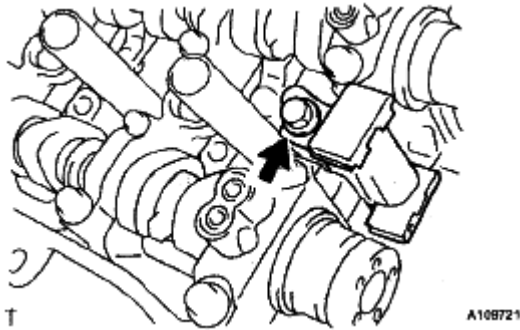


Fig. 248: Locating No.2 Chain Tensioner Bolt

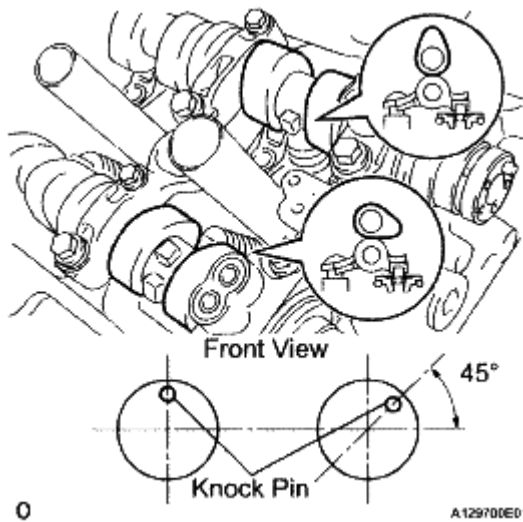


Fig. 249: Identifying Knock Pin Of Camshaft

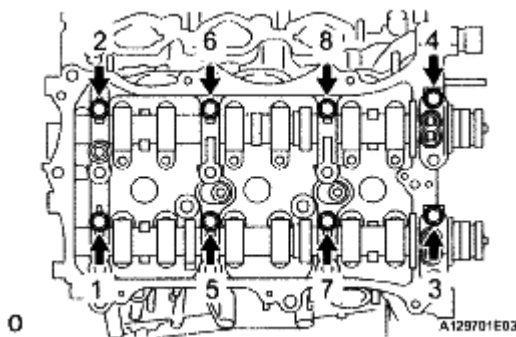


Fig. 250: Identifying Bearing Cap Bolts Loosening Sequence

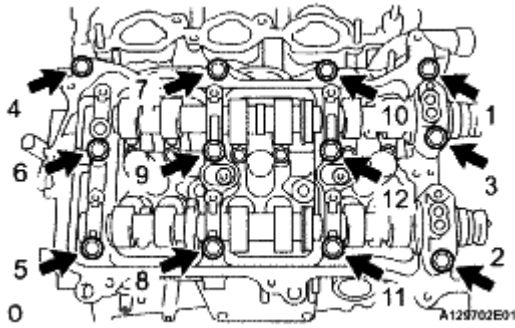


Fig. 251: Locating Bearing Cap Bolts

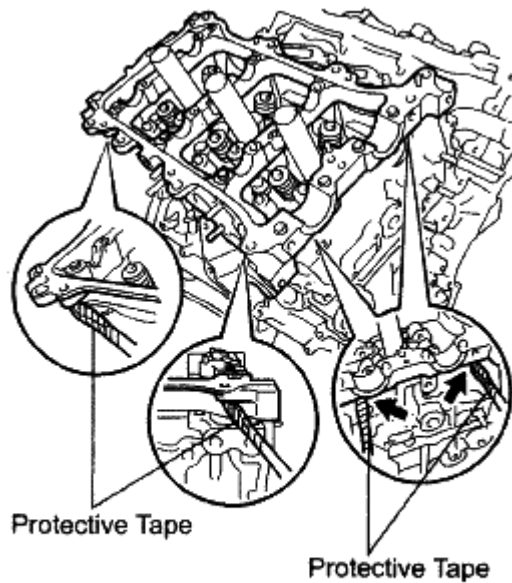

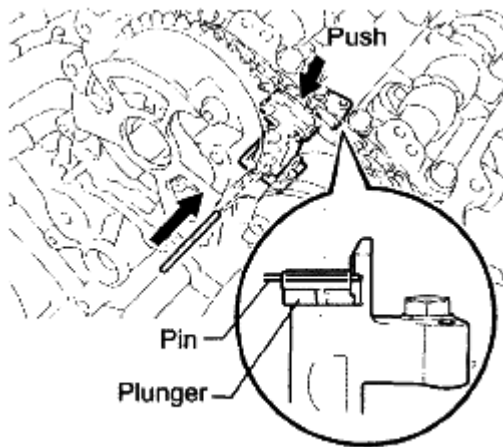
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Fig. 252: Prying Between Cylinder Head And Camshaft Housing Sub-Assembly

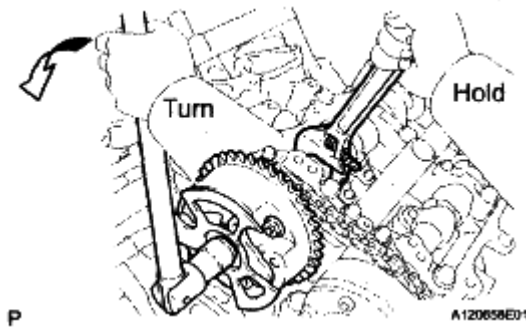


Fig. 254: Identifying Camshaft Timing Gears & No. 2 Chain (For Bank 2)

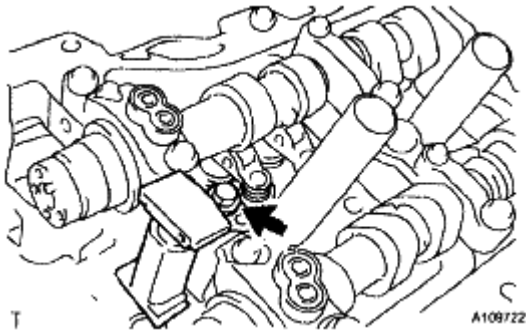


Fig. 255: Identifying No.3 Chain Tensioner Bolt

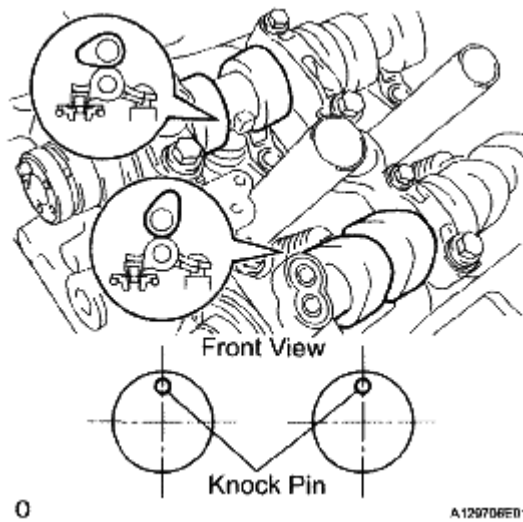


Fig. 256: Identifying Knock Pin Of Camshaft

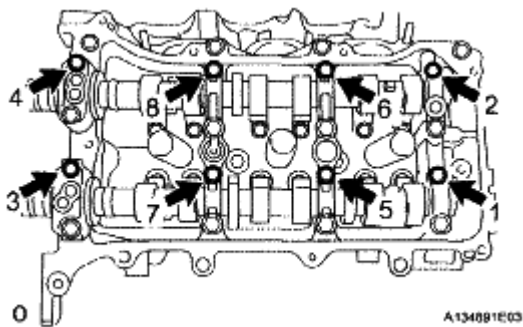


Fig. 257: Identifying Bearing Cap Bolts Loosening Sequence

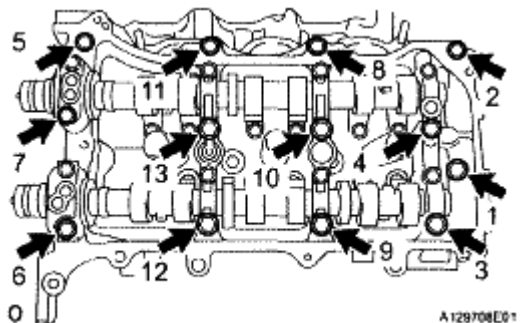


Fig. 258: Locating Bearing Cap Bolts

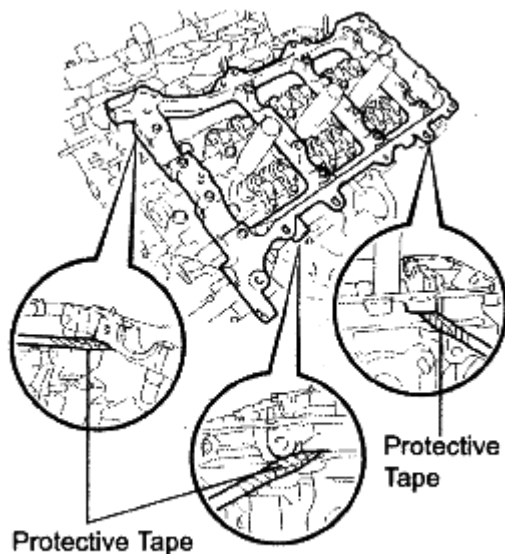

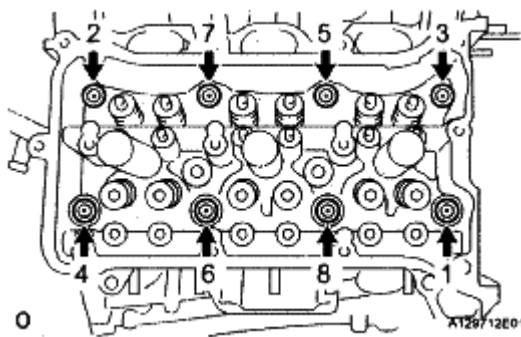


Fig. 260: Locating Cylinder Head Bolts And Plate Washers

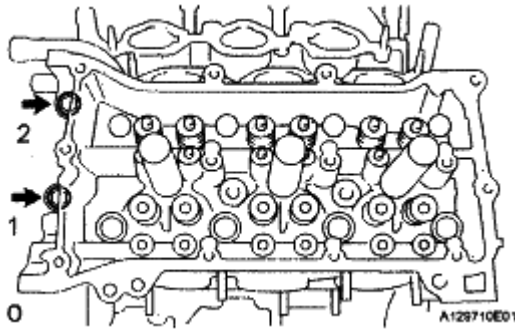


Fig. 261: Identifying Bolts In Sequence

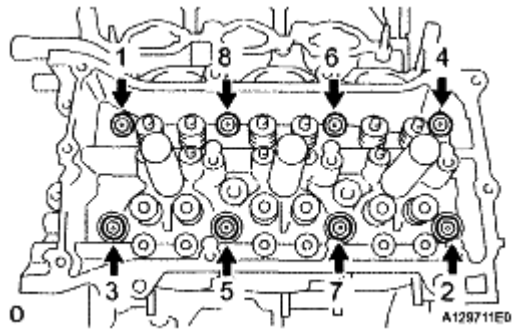


Fig. 262: Locating Cylinder Head Bolts And Plate Washers

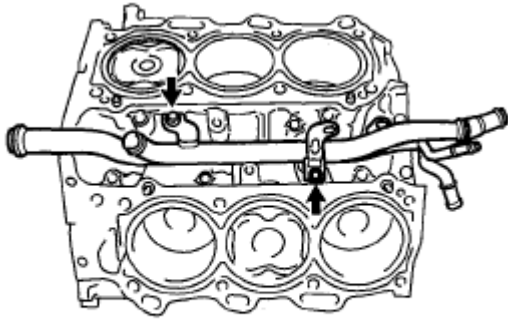

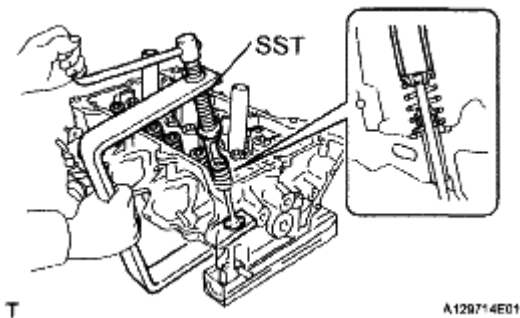

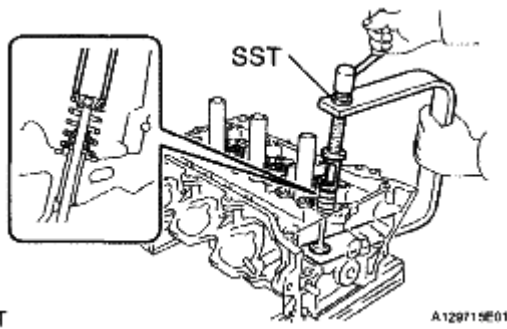


Fig. 265: Using SST To Compress Inner Compression Spring To Remove Exhaust Valve

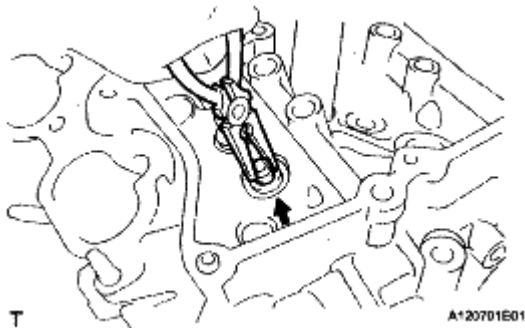


Fig. 266: Removing Valve Stem Oil Seal Using Needle-Nose Pliers

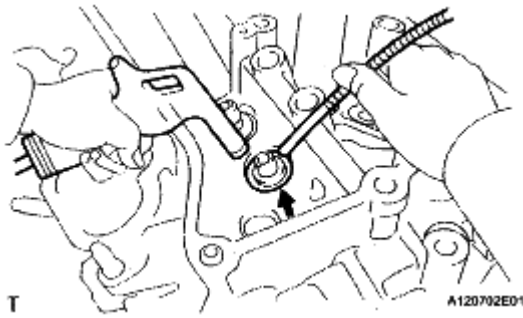


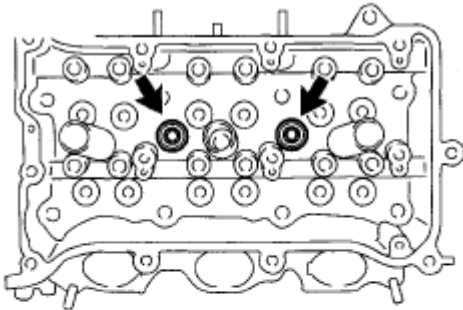
Fig. 267: Identifying Valve Spring Seat

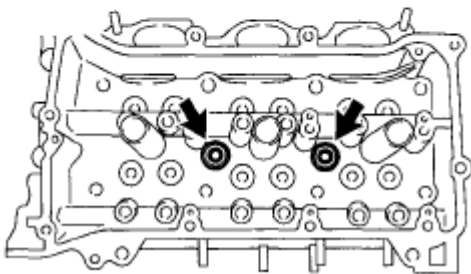

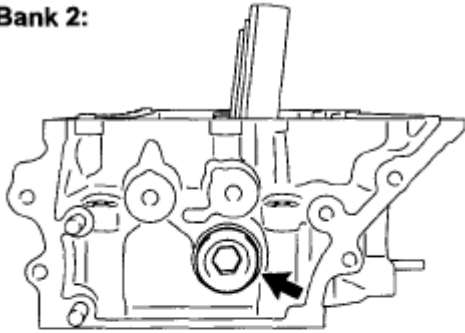

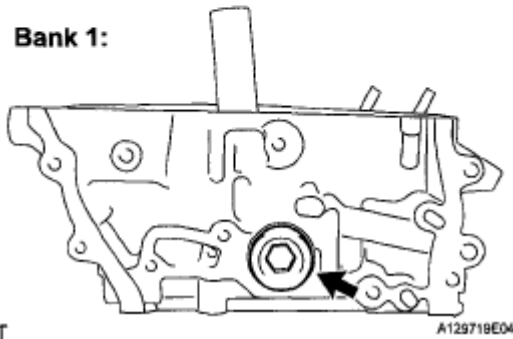


Fig. 269: Locating No. 2 Straight Screw Plugs And Gaskets

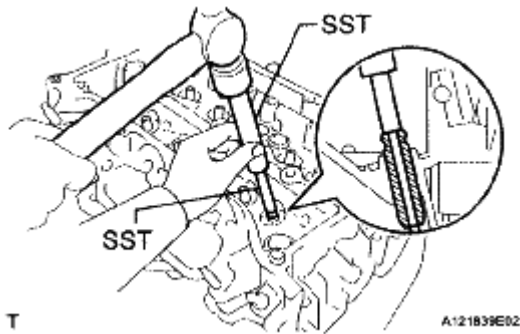


Fig. 270: Tapping Out Intake Valve Guide Bushes

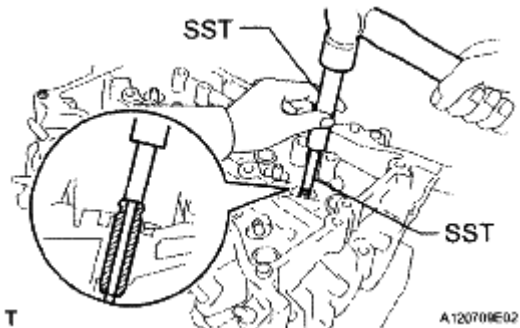


Fig. 271: Tapping Exhaust Valve Guide Bush

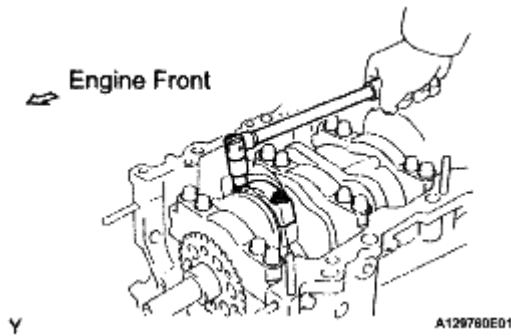


Fig. 272: Locating Connecting Rod Cap Bolts

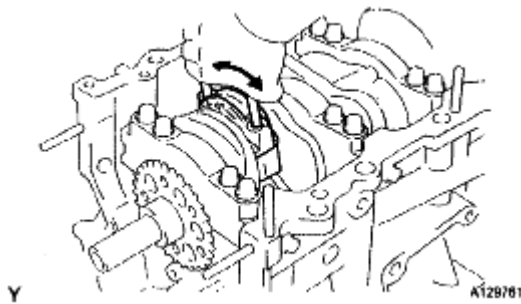


Fig. 273: Locating Connecting Rod Cap

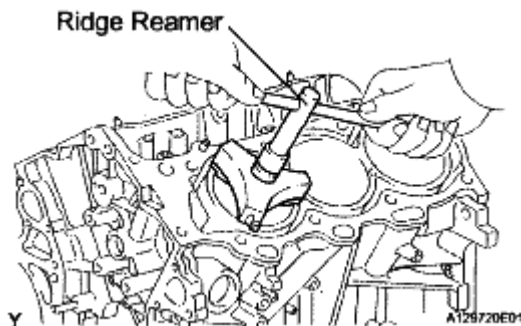


Fig. 274: Removing Carbon From Top Of Cylinder

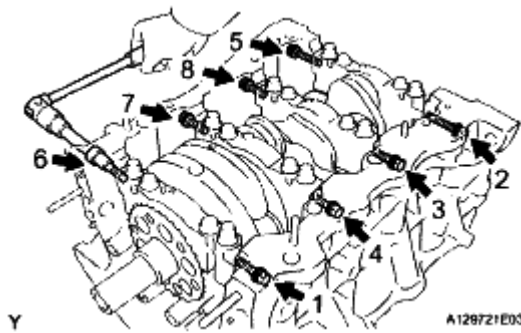


Fig. 275: Locating Connecting Rod Bearing Cap Bolts

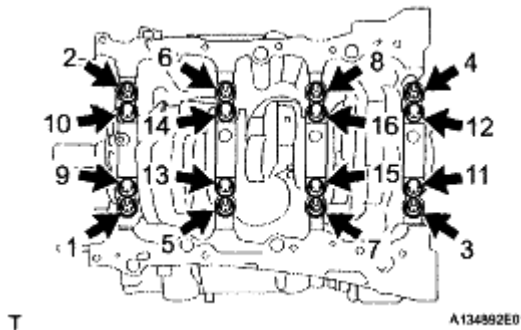


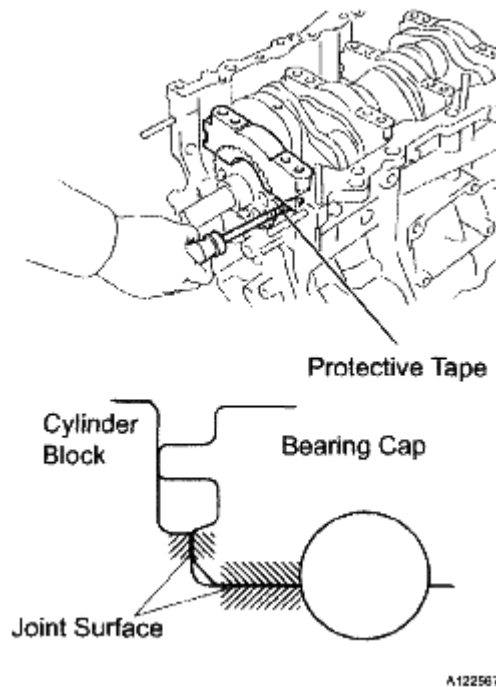
Fig. 276: Identifying Bearing Cap Bolts Loosening Sequence

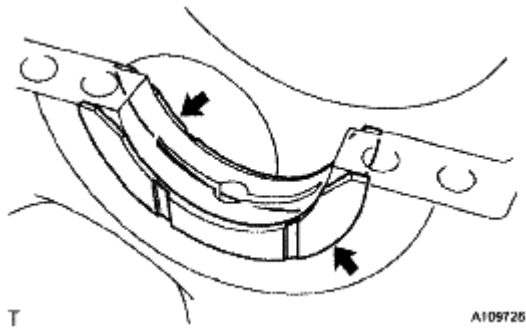


Fig. 278: Identifying Upper Bearings & Upper Thrust Washers

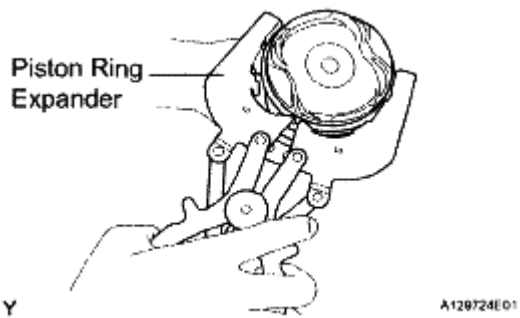
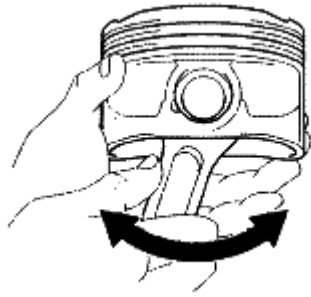


Fig. 279: Identifying Compression Rings

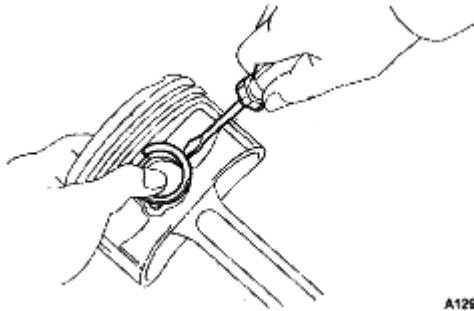


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Fig. 280: Checking Fitting Condition Between Piston And Piston Pin

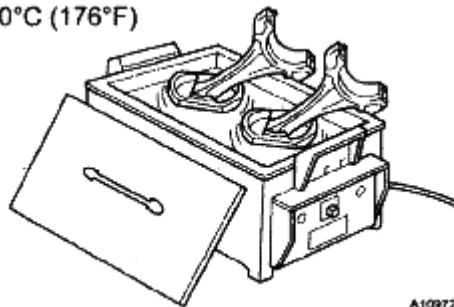

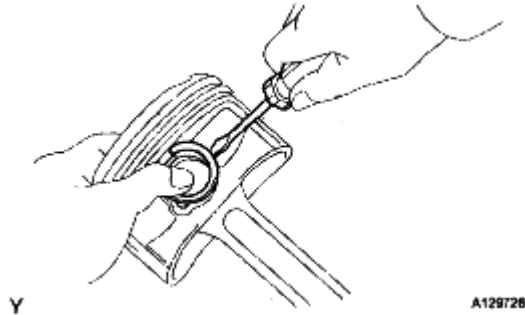


Fig. 283: Prying Off Snap Rings From Piston

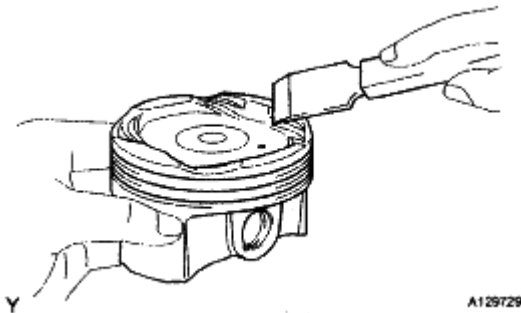


Fig. 284: Removing Carbon From Piston Top

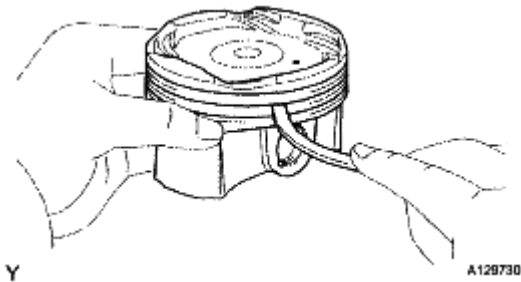


Fig. 285: Cleaning Piston Ring Grooves

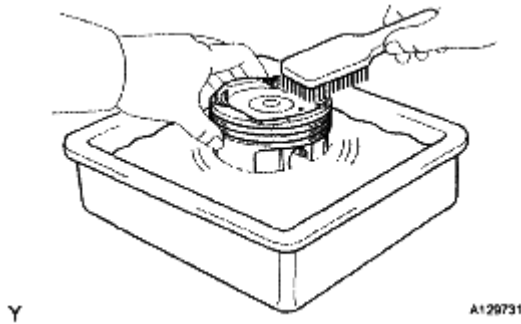


Fig. 286: Cleaning Piston Using Solvent And Brush

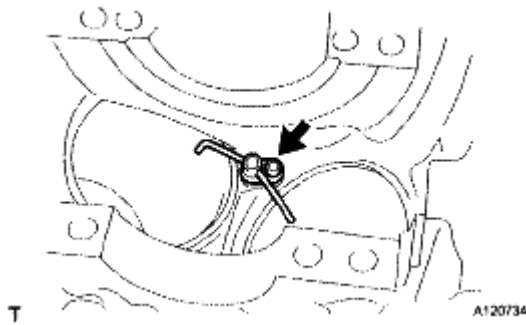


Fig. 287: Identifying Bolt And Oil Nozzle

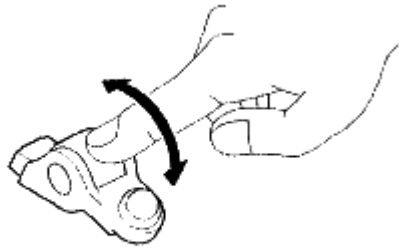

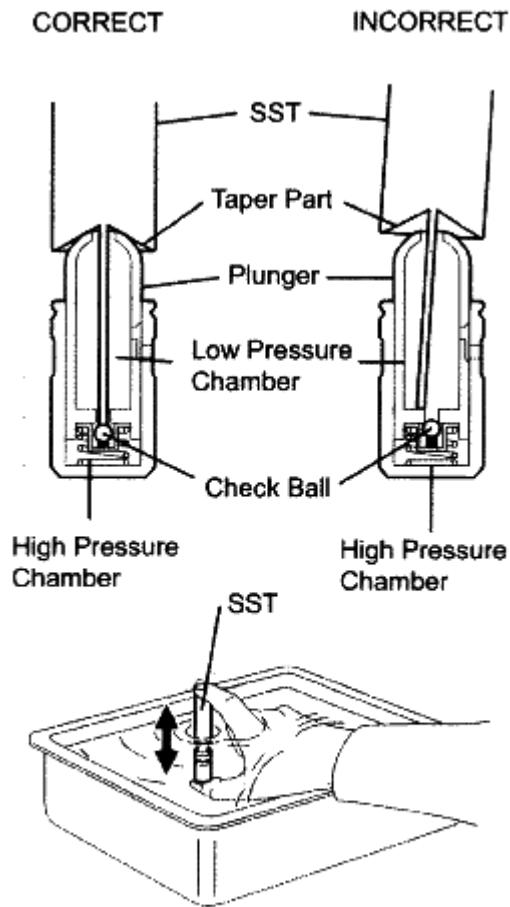

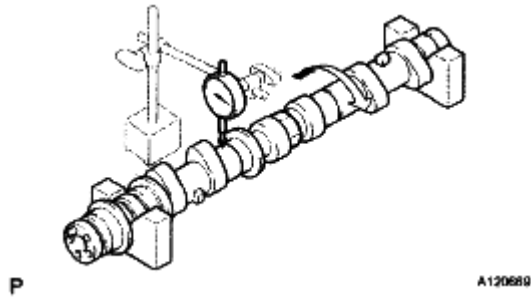


Fig. 290: Measuring Circle Runout At Center Journal

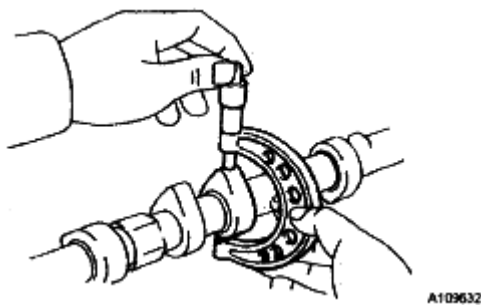


Fig. 291: Checking Cam Lobe Height

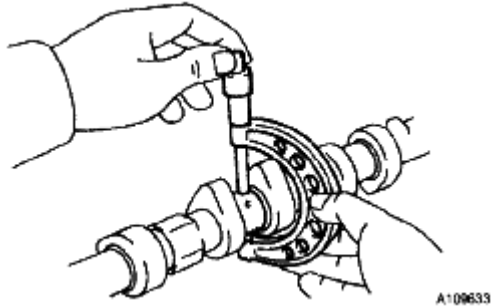


Fig. 292: Checking Journal Diameter

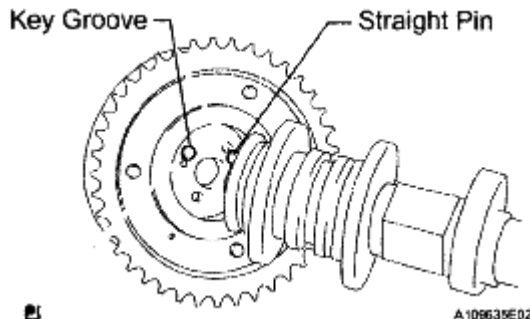


Fig. 293: Identifying Key Groove And Straight Pin

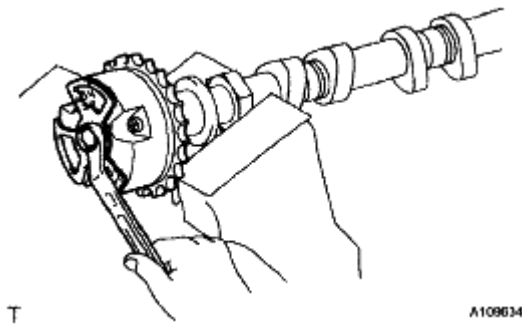


Fig. 294: Checking Lock Of Camshaft Timing Gear

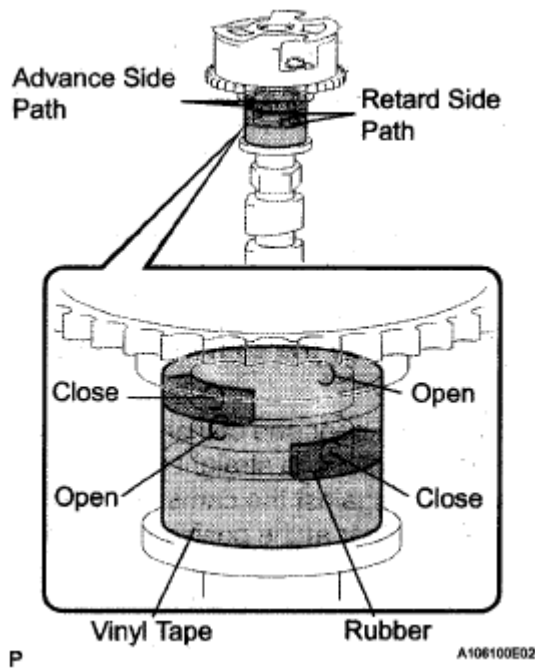


Fig. 295: Covering Oil Paths Of Cam Journal With Vinyl Tape

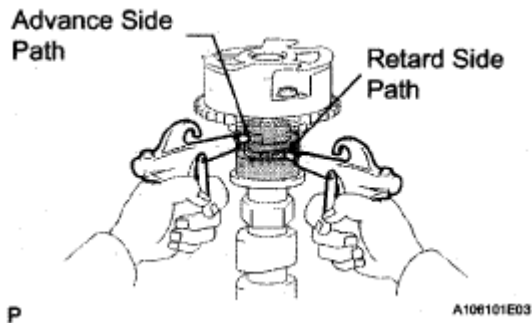


Fig. 296: Applying Air Pressure To Two Broken Paths

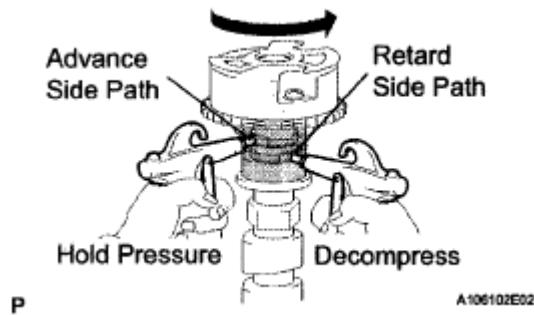


Fig. 297: Checking Camshaft Timing Gear Revolves In Advance Direction

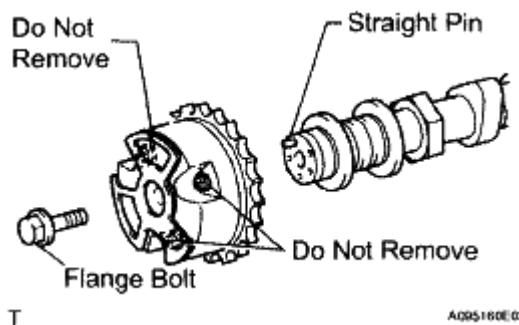


Fig. 298: Removing Flange Bolt And Camshaft Timing Gear

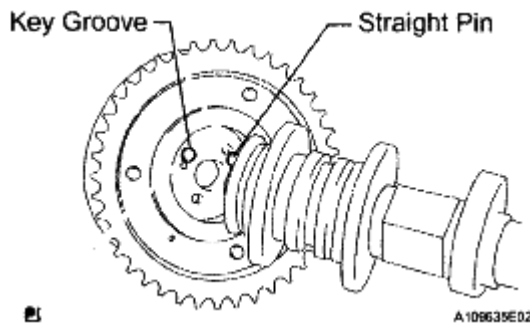


Fig. 299: Identifying Key Groove And Straight Pin

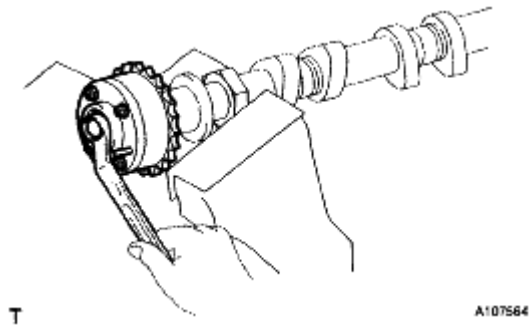


Fig. 300: Checking Camshaft Timing Exhaust Gear Lock

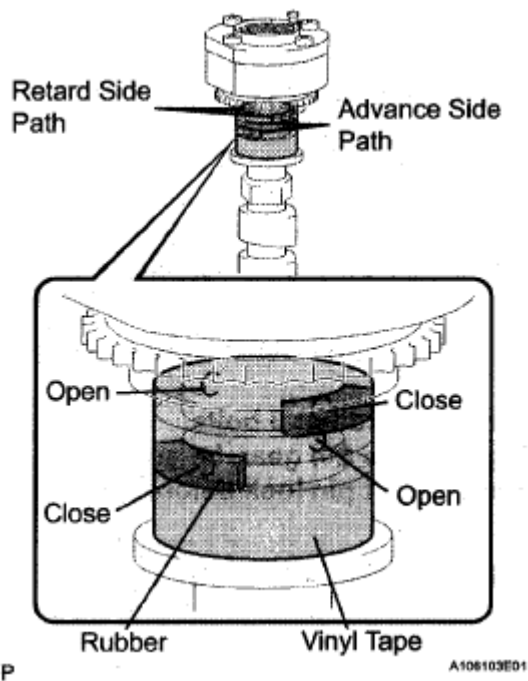


Fig. 301: Covering Oil Paths Of Cam Journal With Vinyl Tape

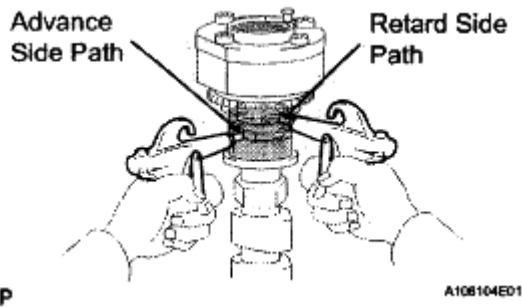


Fig. 302: Applying Air Pressure To Two Broken Paths

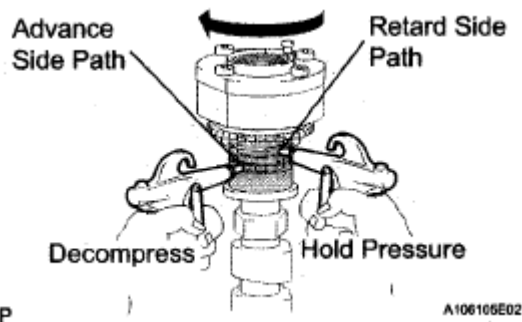


Fig. 303: Checking Camshaft Timing Exhaust Gear Turns In Retard Direction

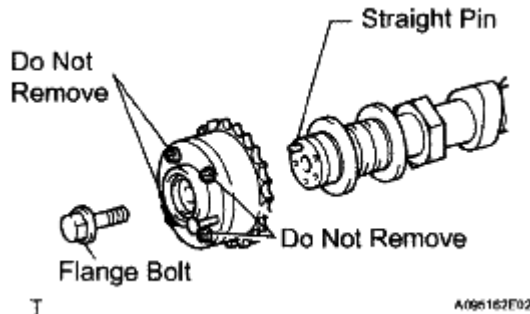


Fig. 304: Removing Flange Bolt And Camshaft Timing Exhaust Gear

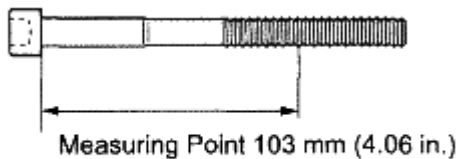

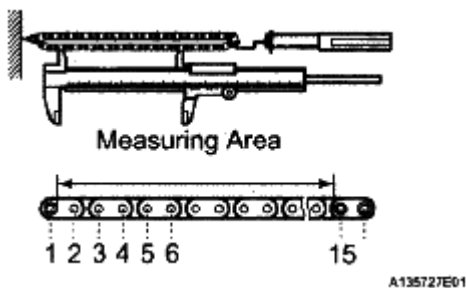


Fig. 306: Measuring Chain Elongation

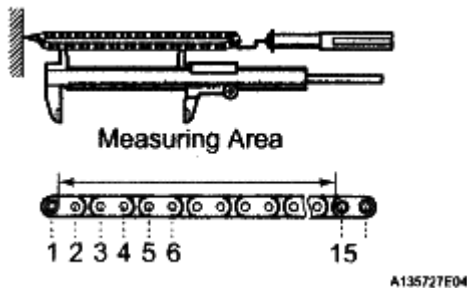


Fig. 307: Measuring No. 2 Chain Elongation

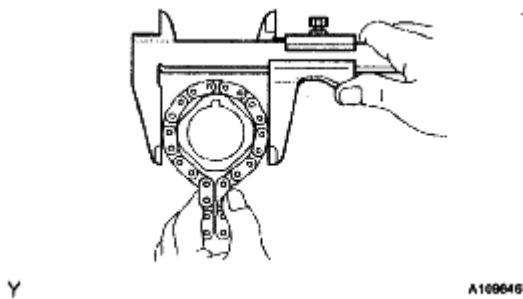


Fig. 308: Checking Crankshaft Timing Sprocket Diameter With Chain

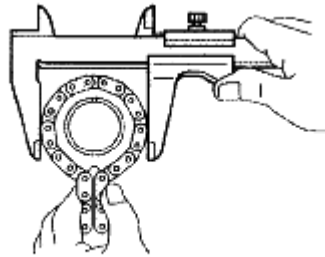

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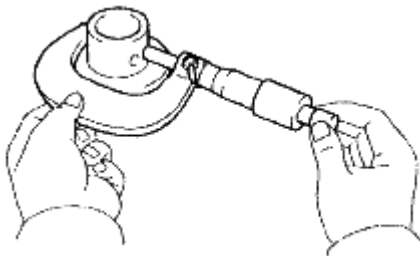
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Fig. 309: Checking Idle Sprocket Diameter With Chain

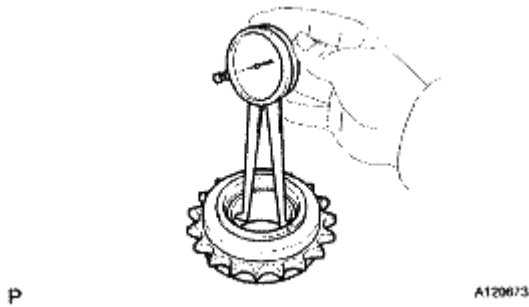


Fig. 311: Checking Inside Diameter Of Idle Gear

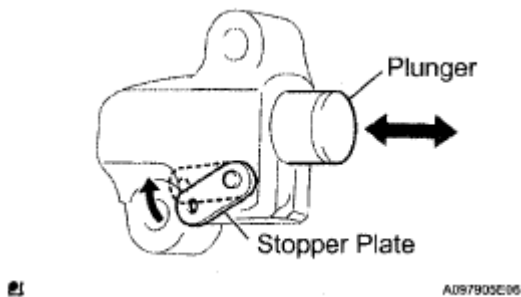


Fig. 312: Inspecting No. 1 Chain Tensioner Assembly

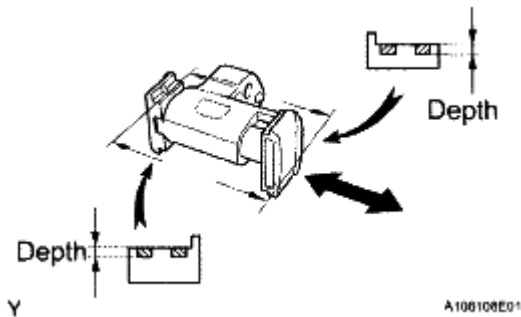


Fig. 313: Checking No 2 Chain Tensioner Assembly

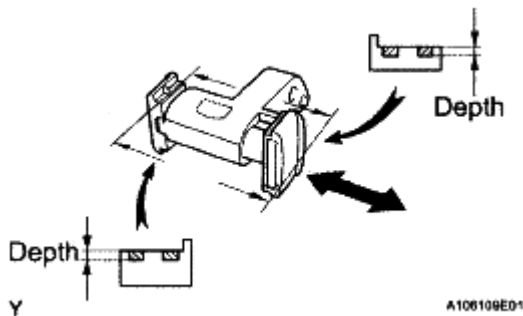


Fig. 314: Checking No 3 Chain Tensioner Assembly

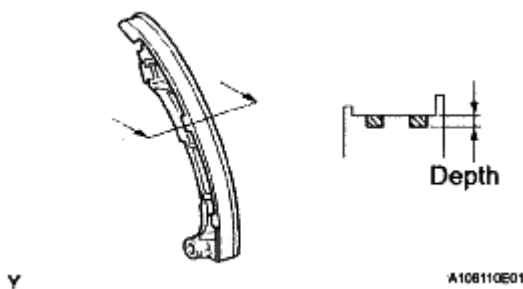


Fig. 315: Inspecting Chain Tensioner Slipper

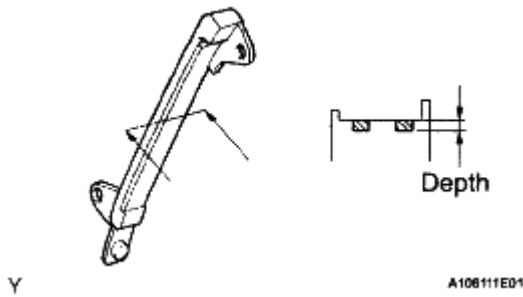


Fig. 316: Inspecting No. 1 Chain Vibration Damper

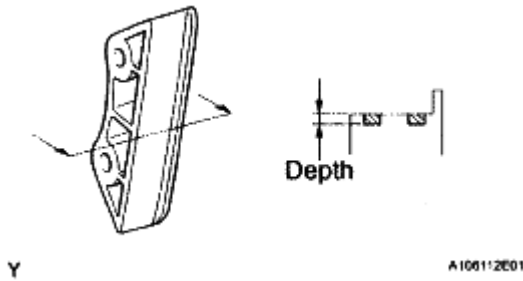


Fig. 317: Inspecting No. 2 Chain Vibration Damper

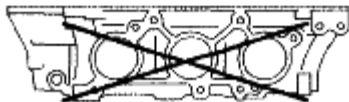

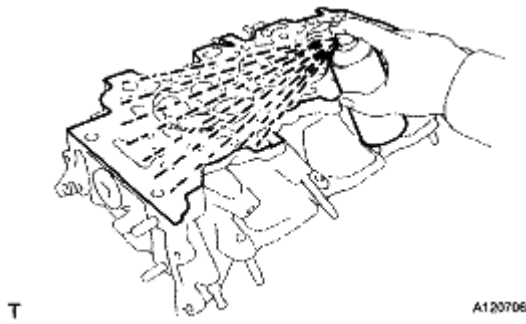


Fig. 319: Checking Intake Ports, Exhaust Ports And Cylinder Surface For Cracks

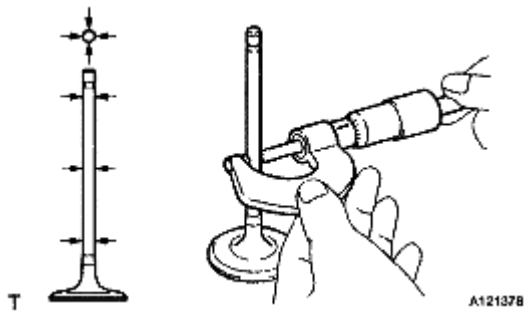


Fig. 320: Checking Valve Stem Diameter

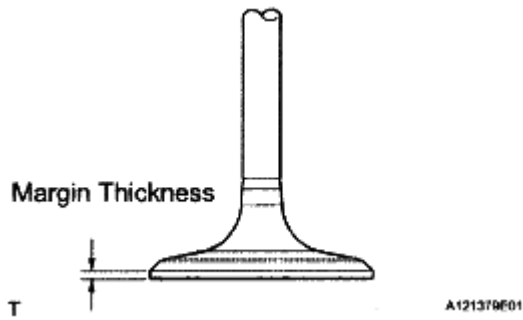


Fig. 321: Inspecting Head Margin Thickness

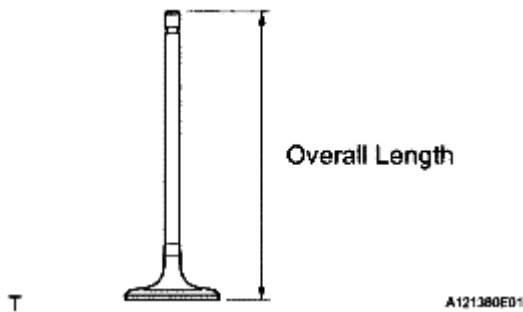


Fig. 322: Inspecting Valve Overall Length

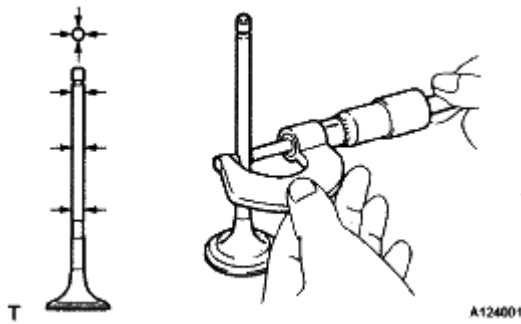


Fig. 323: Checking Diameter Of Exhaust Valve Stem

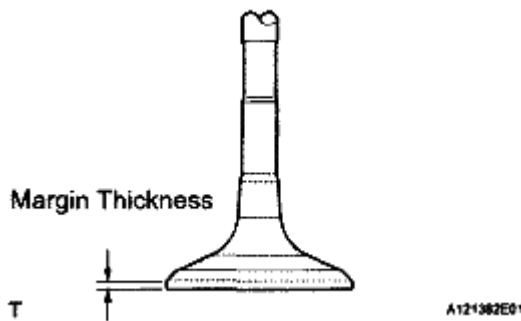


Fig. 324: Inspecting Valve Head Margin Thickness

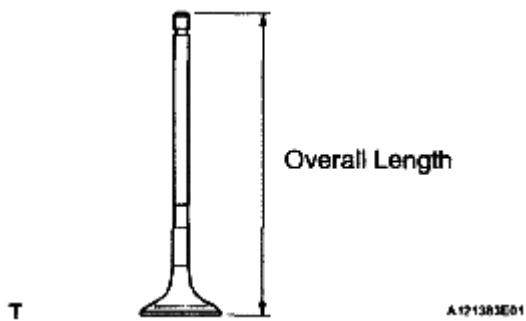


Fig. 325: Identifying Valve Overall Length

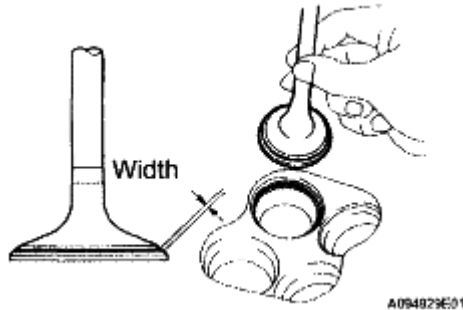


Fig. 326: Applying Light Coat Of Prussian Blue (Or White Lead) To Valve Face

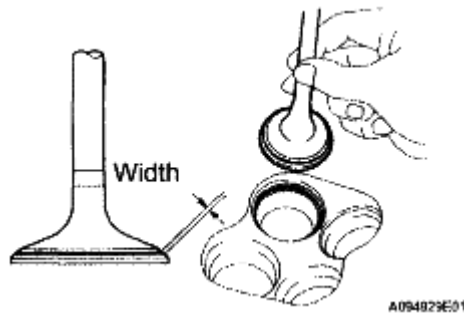


Fig. 327: Applying Light Coat Of Prussian Blue (Or White Lead) To Valve Face

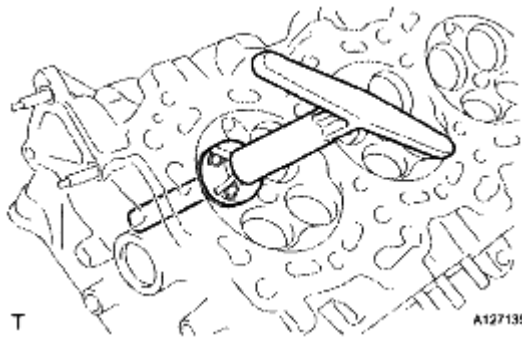


Fig. 328: Surfacing Valve Seat

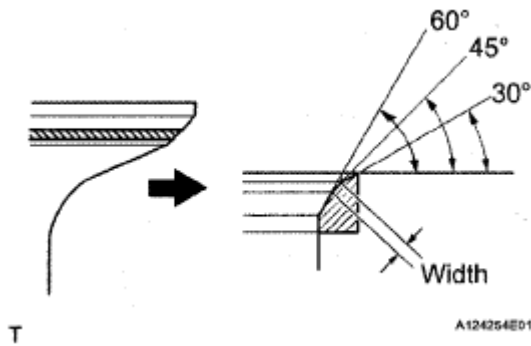


Fig. 329: Identifying Valve Seat Width

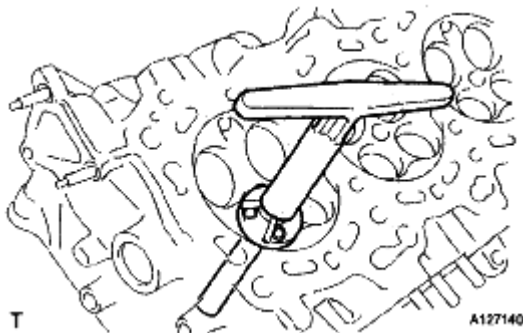


Fig. 330: Surfacing Valve Seat

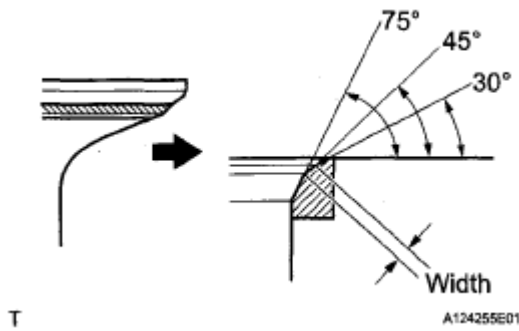


Fig. 331: Checking Valve Seating Position

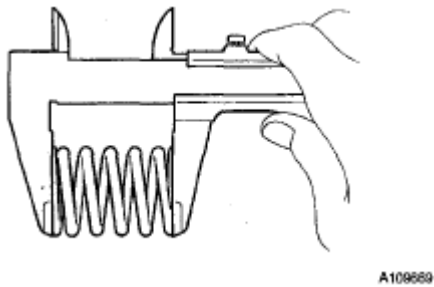


Fig. 332: Checking Inner Compression Spring Free Length

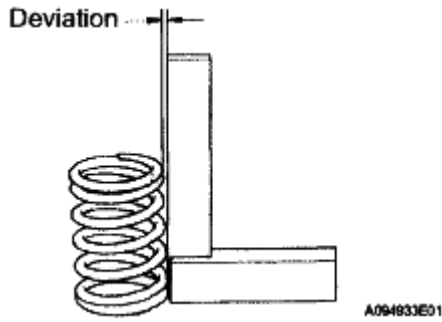


Fig. 333: Measuring Deviation Of Inner Compression Spring

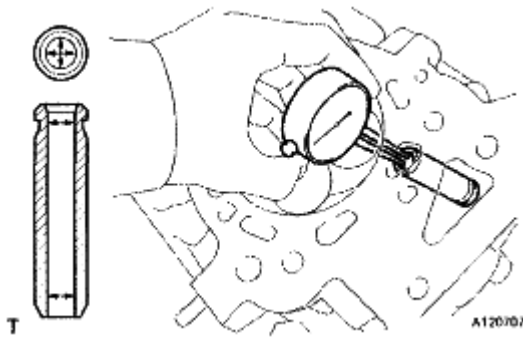


Fig. 334: Checking Inside Diameter Of Guide Bush

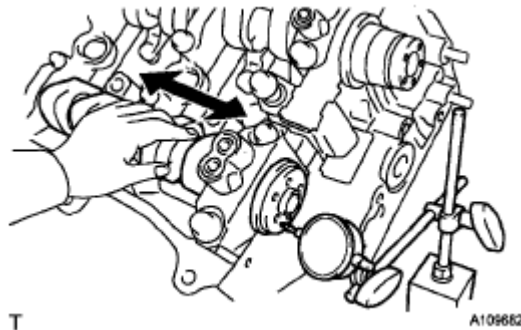


Fig. 335: Checking Camshaft Thrust Clearance

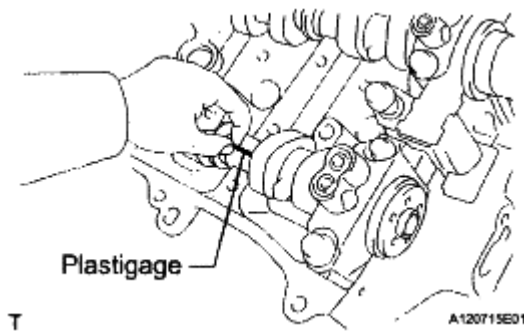


Fig. 336: Checking Camshaft Oil Clearance

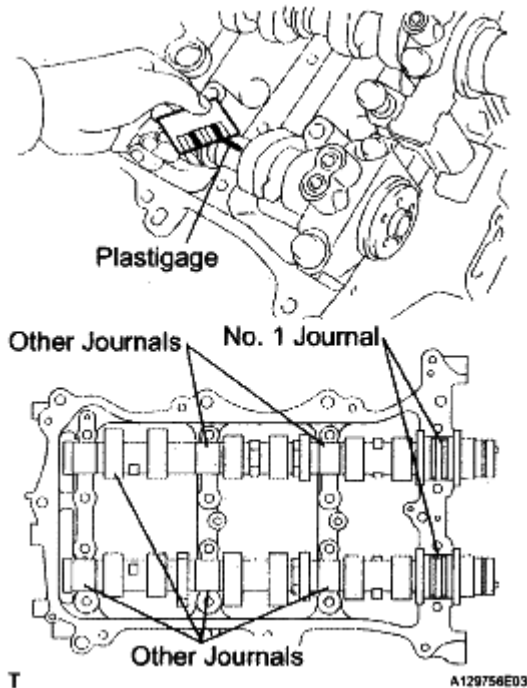


Fig. 337: Measuring Plastigage At Camshaft Widest Point

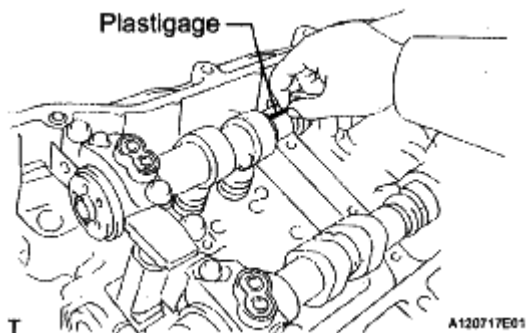


Fig. 338: Laying Strip Of Plastigage Across Each Of Camshaft Journals

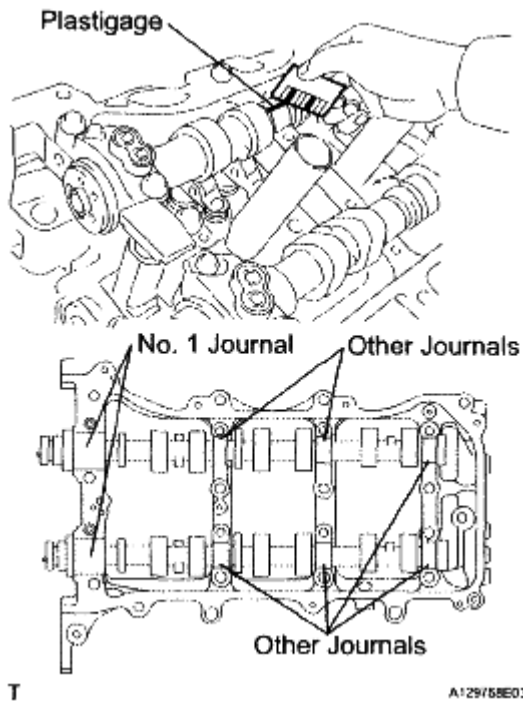


Fig. 339: Measuring Plastigage At Camshaft Widest Point

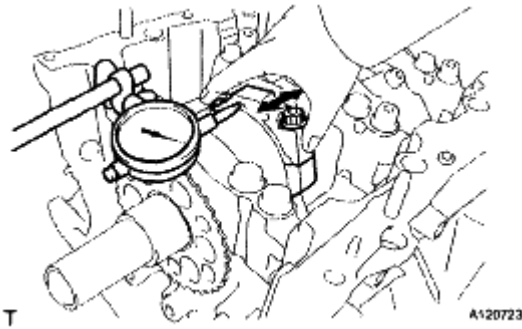


Fig. 340: Checking Connecting Rod Thrust Clearance

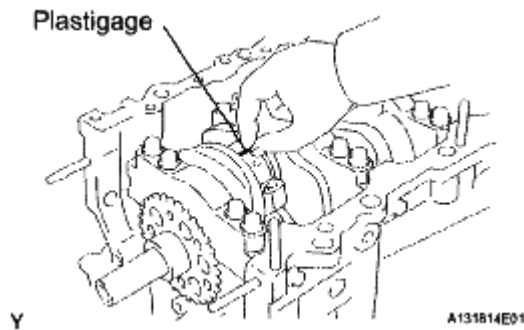


Fig. 341: Laying Strip Of Plastigage On Crank Pin

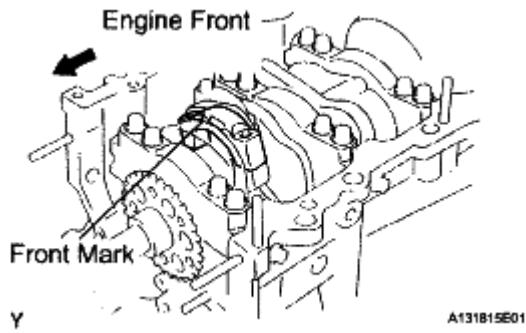


Fig. 342: Checking Front Mark Of Connecting Rod Cap

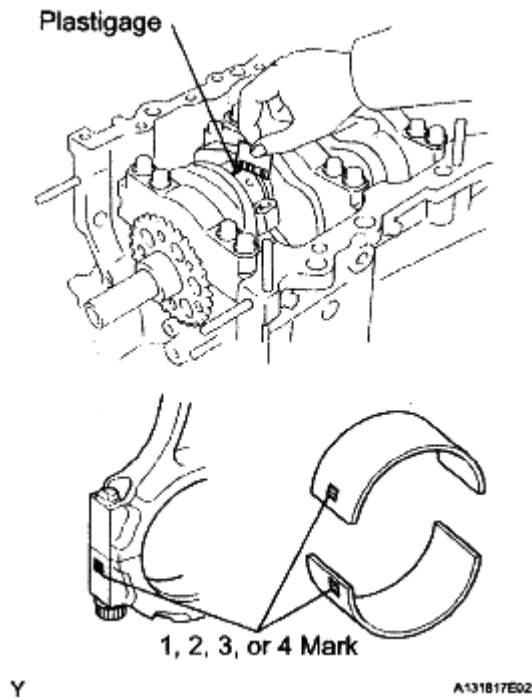


Fig. 343: Measuring Plastigage Widest Point

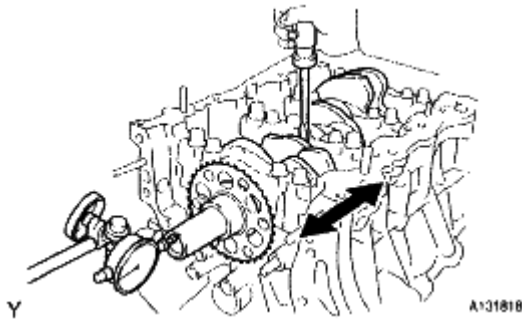


Fig. 344: Measuring Crankshaft Thrust Clearance

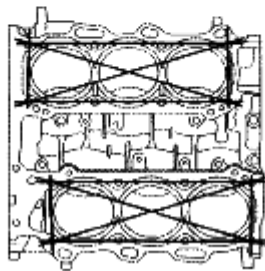
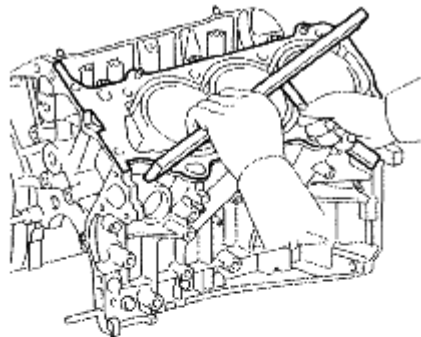


Fig. 345: Measuring Warpage Of Contact Surface Of Cylinder Head Gasket

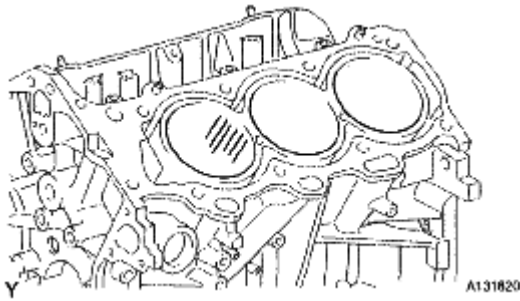


Fig. 346: Checking Cylinder For Vertical Scratches

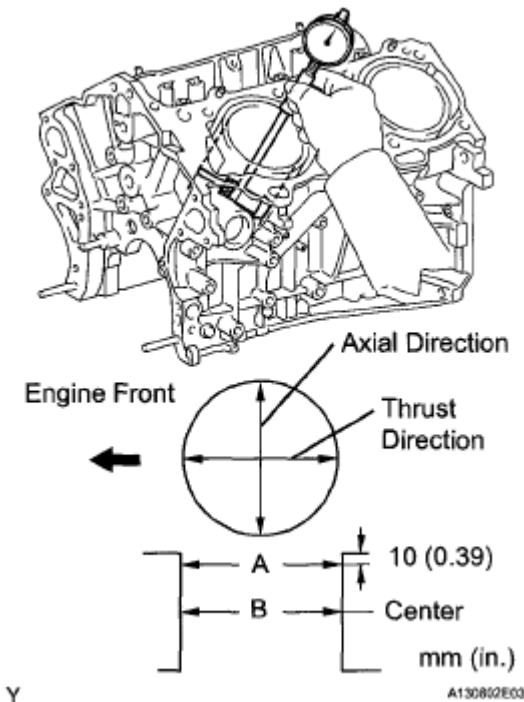


Fig. 347: Measuring Cylinder Bore Diameter

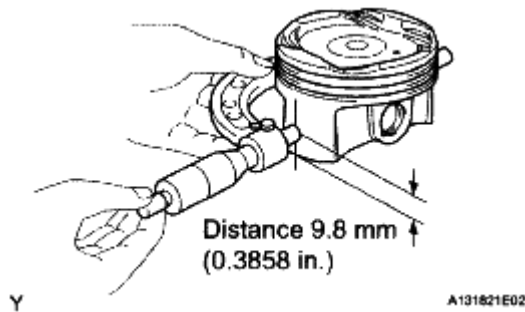


Fig. 348: Checking Piston Diameter

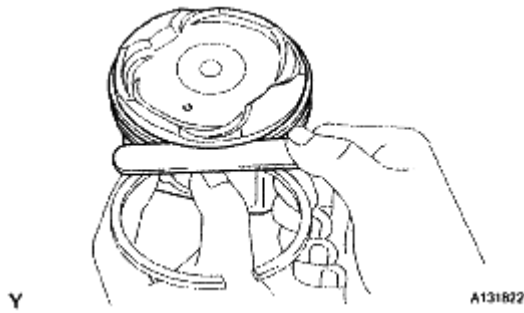

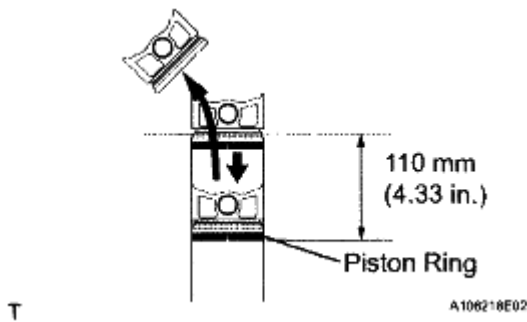

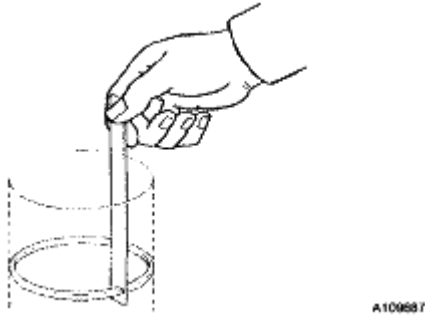


Fig. 351: Checking End Gap

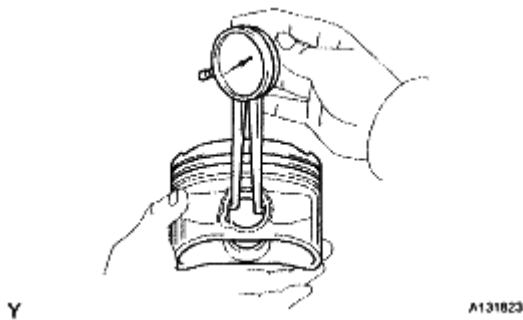


Fig. 352: Measuring Inside Diameter Of Piston Pin Hole

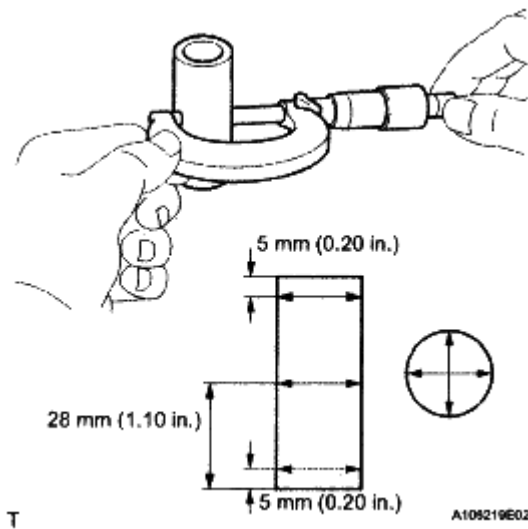


Fig. 353: Checking Piston Pin Diameter

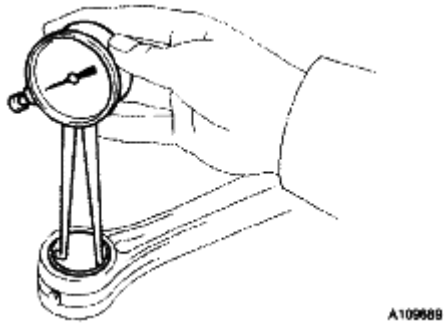


Fig. 354: Checking Inside Diameter Of Connecting Rod Bushing

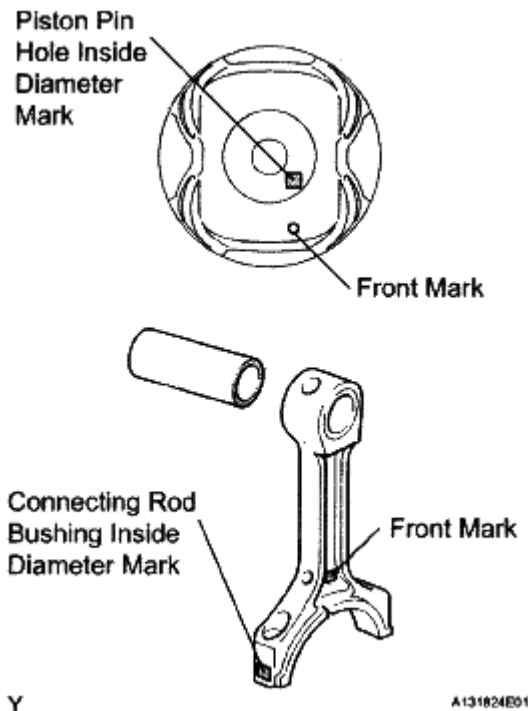


Fig. 355: Identifying Front Mark Of Piston Pin

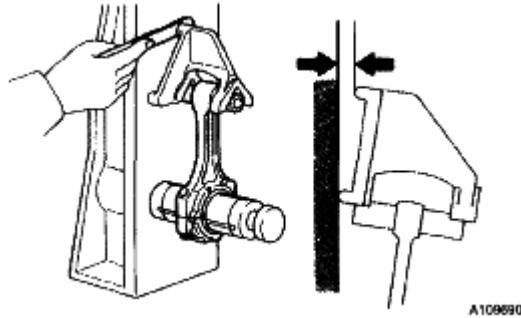


Fig. 356: Checking Connecting Rod Alignment

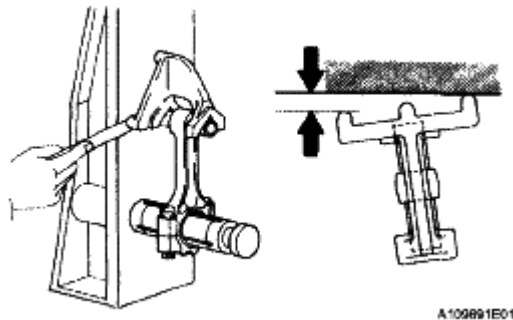


Fig. 357: Checking Connecting Rod For Twist

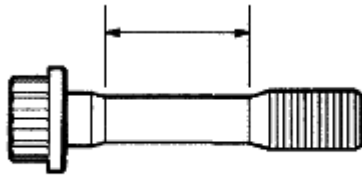

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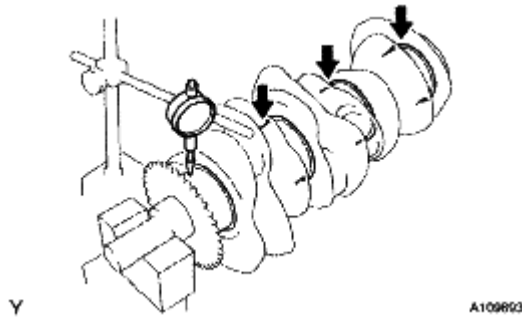
Fig. 358: Identifying Tension Portion Diameter Of Bolt

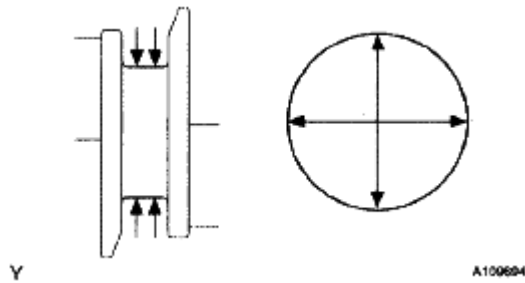


Fig. 360: Checking Main Journal For Taper And Out-Of Round

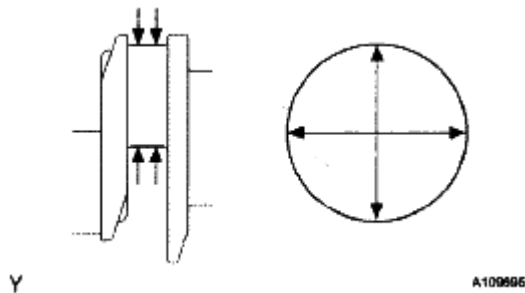


Fig. 361: Checking Crank Pin For Taper And Out-Of Round

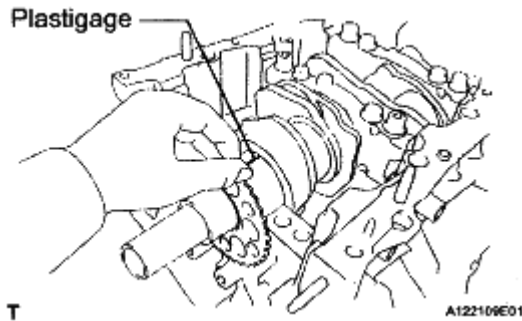


Fig. 362: Laying Strip Of Plastigage Across Each Journal

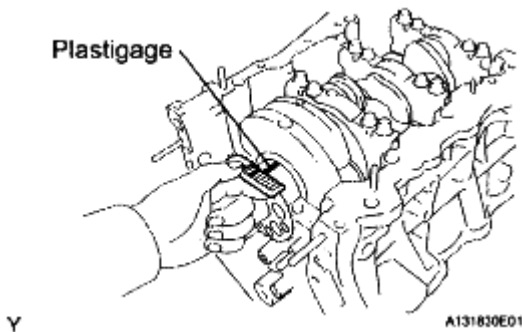


Fig. 363: Measuring Plastigage At Widest Point

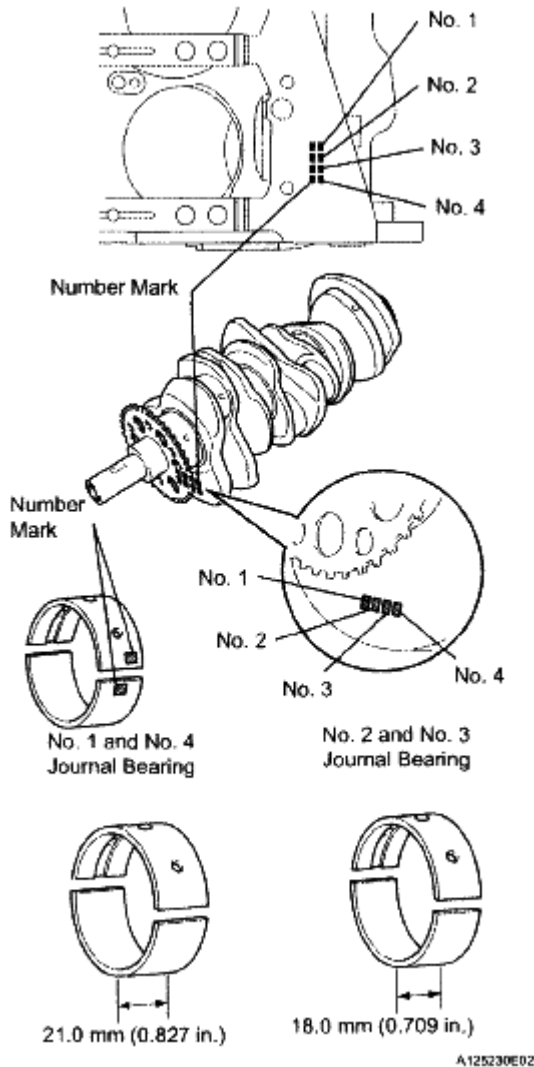


Fig. 364: Identifying Journal Bearing Diameter

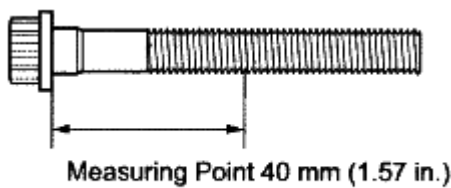

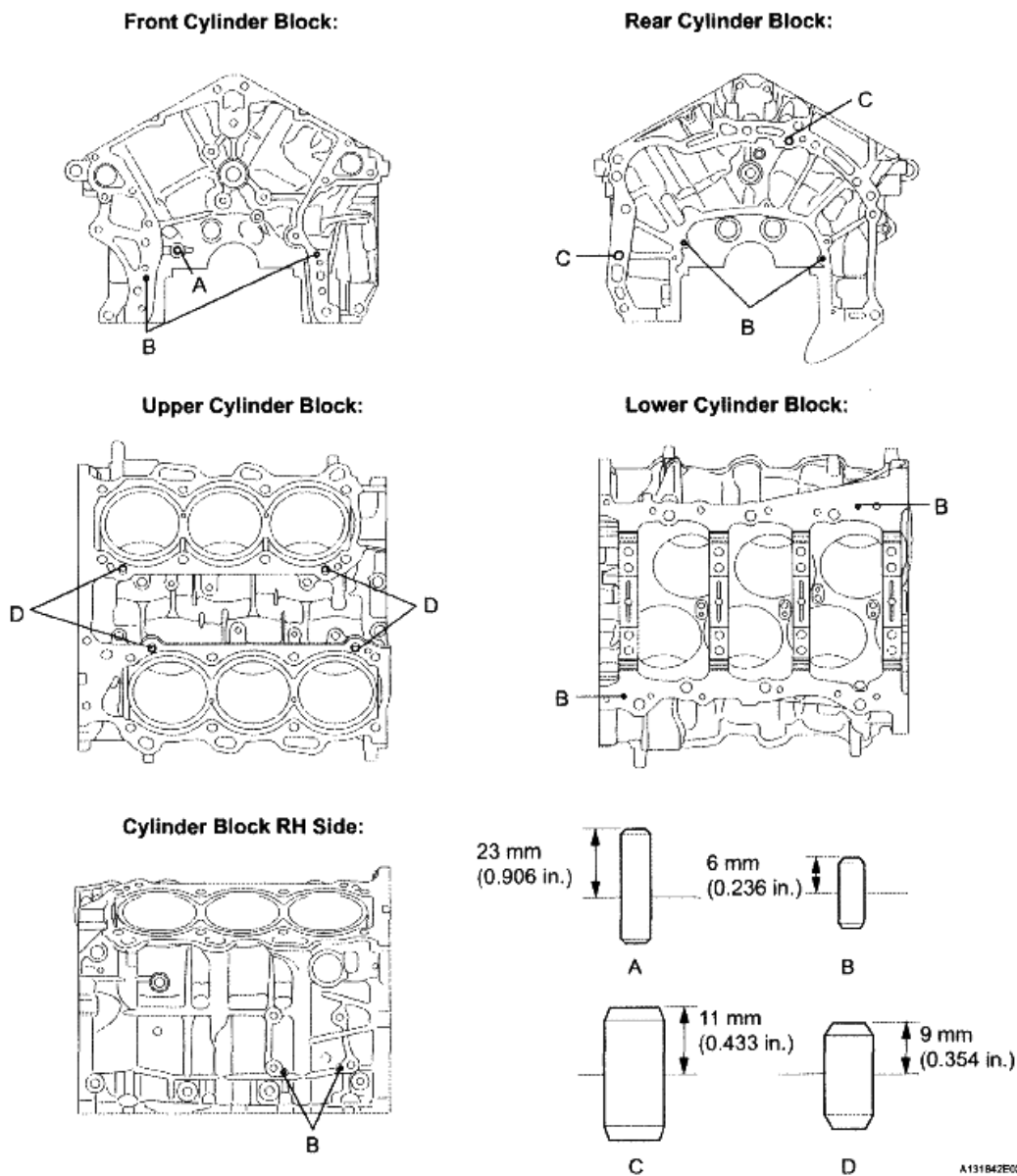


Fig. 366: Identifying Straight Pin Installation Position

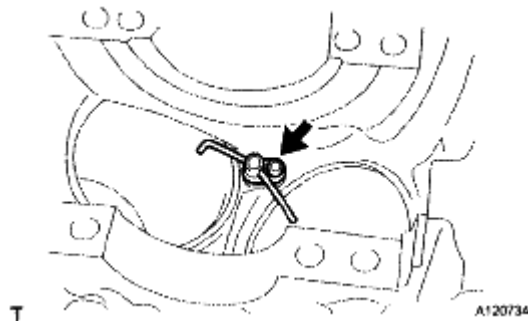


Fig. 368: Identifying Bolt And Oil Nozzle

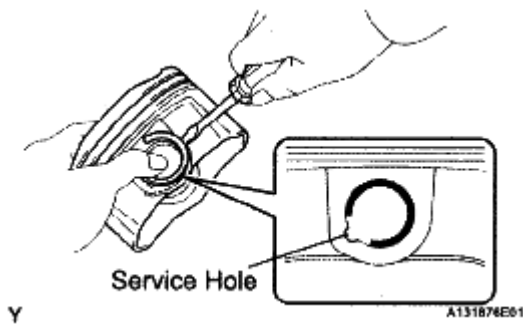


Fig. 369: Aligning Snap Ring

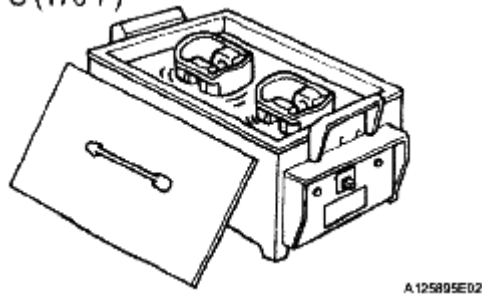


Fig. 370: Heating Piston

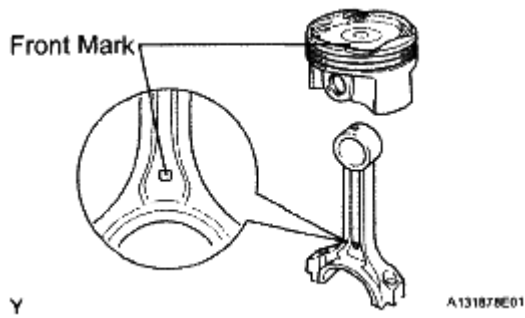


Fig. 371: Aligning Front Marks Of Piston And Connecting Rod

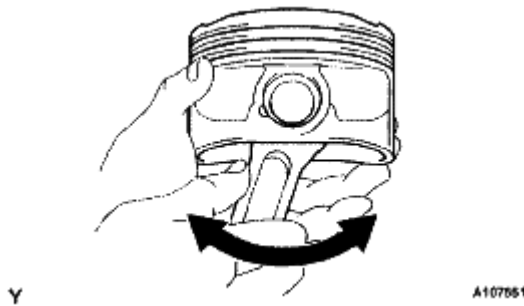


Fig. 372: Checking Fitting Condition Between Piston And Piston Pin

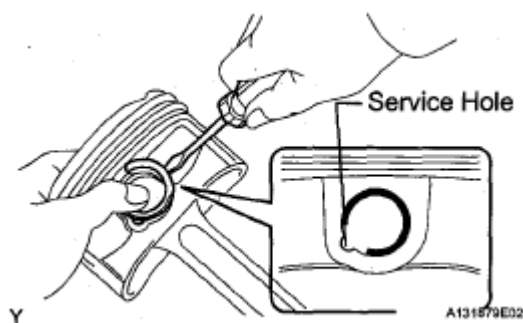


Fig. 373: Identifying Piston Pin Hole Snap Ring

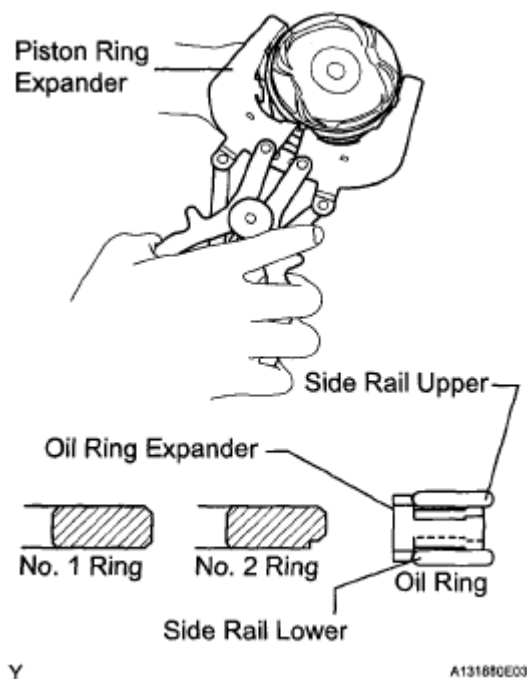
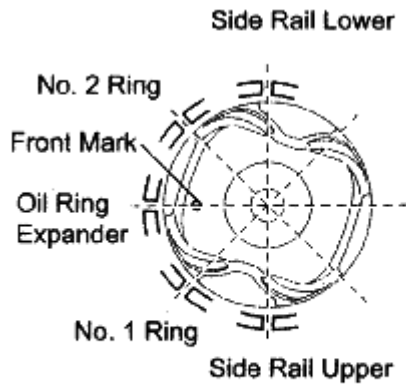


Fig. 374: Identifying Compression Ring

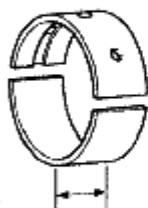

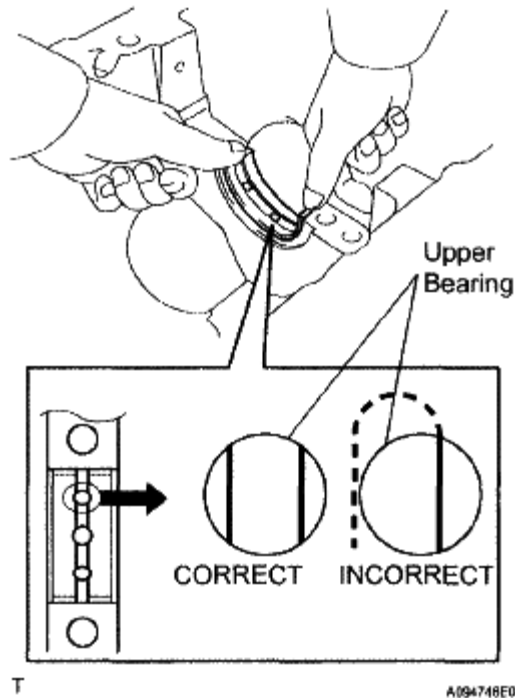


Fig. 377: Identifying Upper Bearing

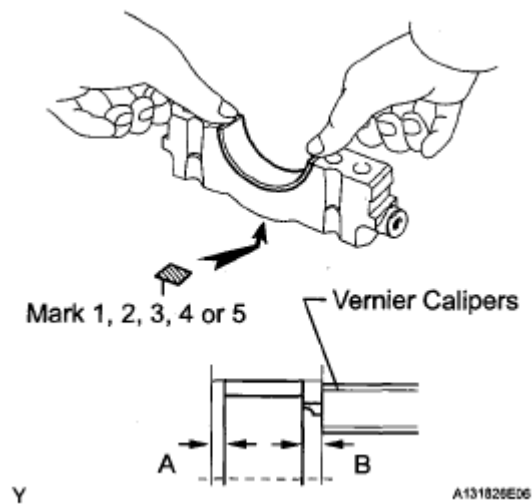


Fig. 378: Locating Lower Crankshaft Bearing

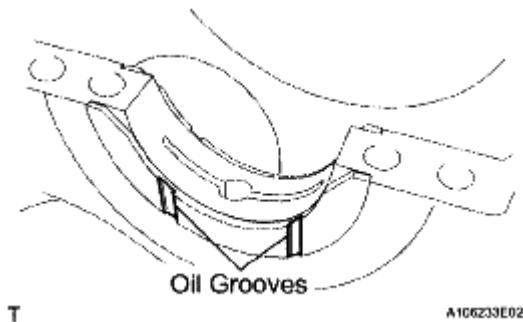


Fig. 379: Identifying Oil Grooves

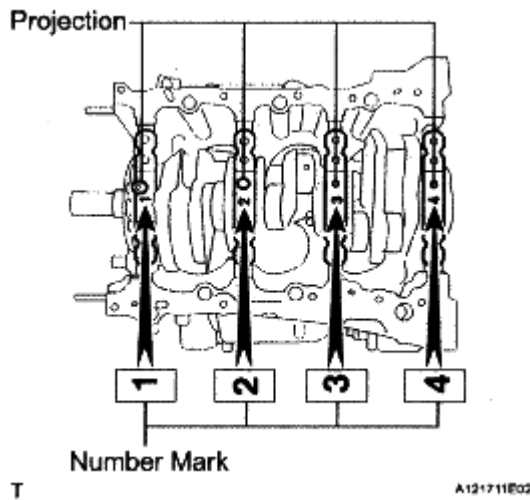
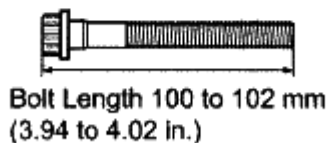
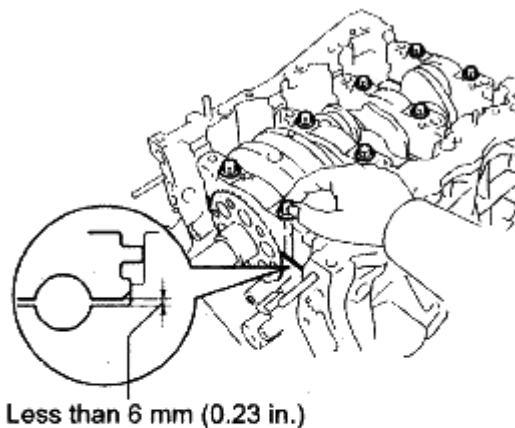


Fig. 380: Identifying Projection And Numbers Of Main Bearing Caps

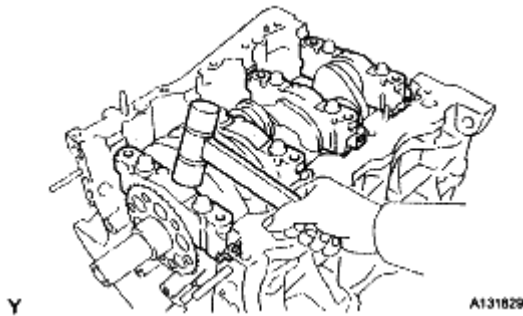


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Fig. 381: Identifying Bolt Length

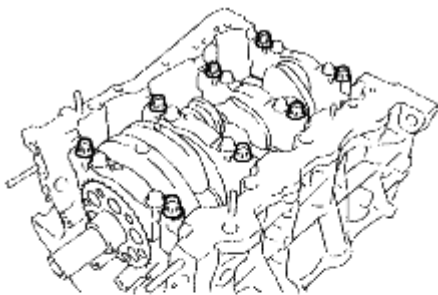
**Fig. 382: Tapping Bearing Cap**

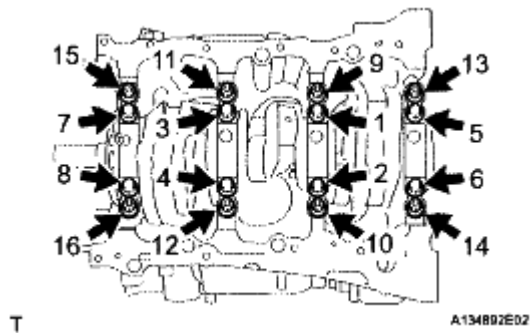


Fig. 384: Locating Main Bearing Cap Bolts Loosening Sequence

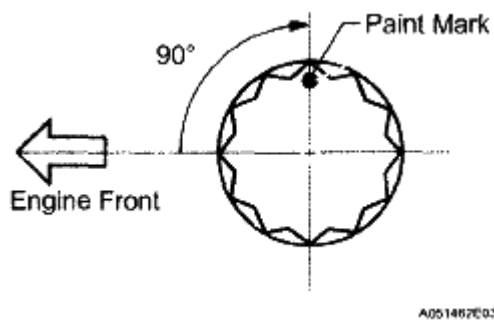


Fig. 385: Identifying Paint Mark

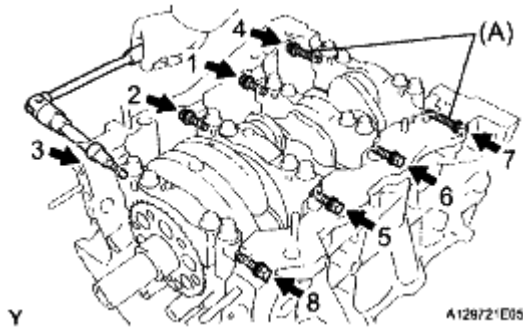


Fig. 386: Locating Connecting Rod Bearing Cap Bolts

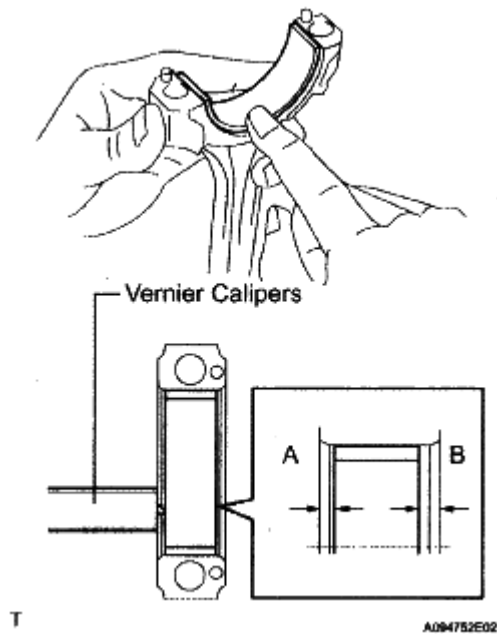
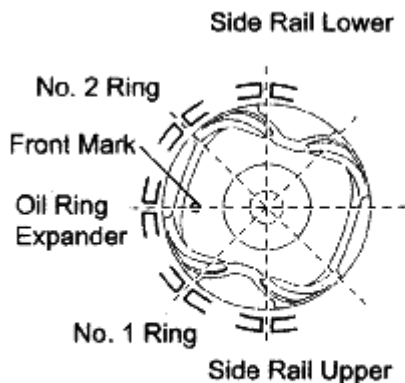


Fig. 387: Measuring Distance Between Connecting Rod And Bearing Cap Edges

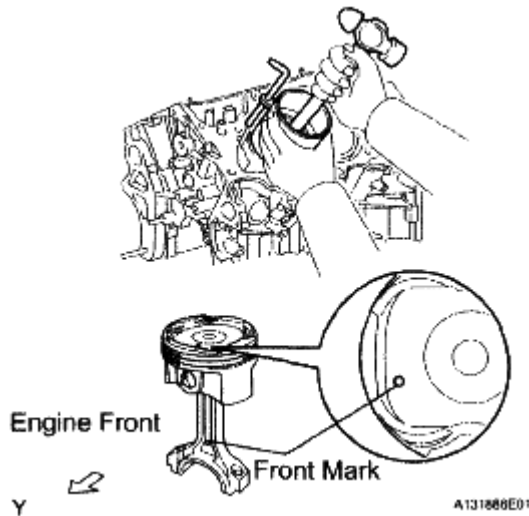


Fig. 389: Pushing Piston And Connecting Rod Assembly Into Cylinder

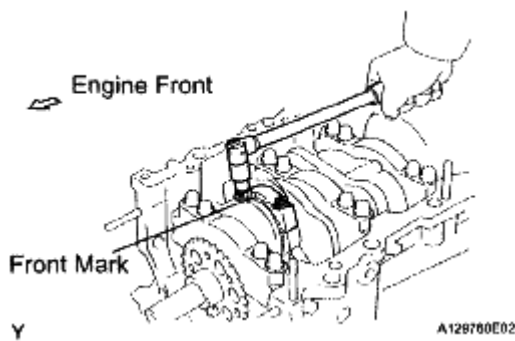


Fig. 390: Locating Connecting Rod Cap Bolts

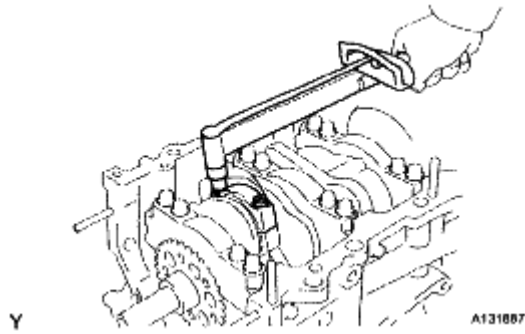


Fig. 391: Tightening Connecting Cap Bolts

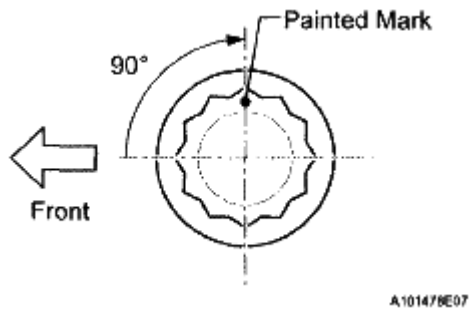


Fig. 392: Identifying Retightening Angle Of Connecting Rod Cap Bolt

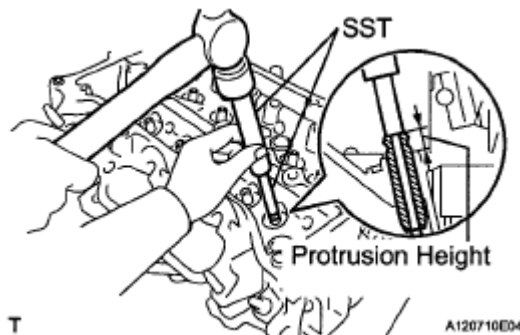


Fig. 394: Tapping In Intake Valve Guide Bushes

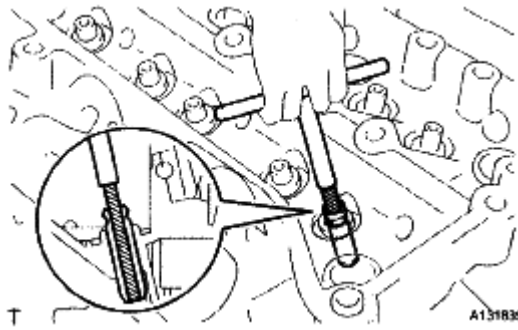


Fig. 395: Reaming Valve Guide Bush

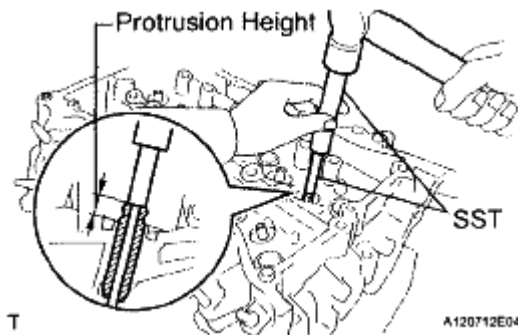


Fig. 397: Tapping Valve Guide Bushes

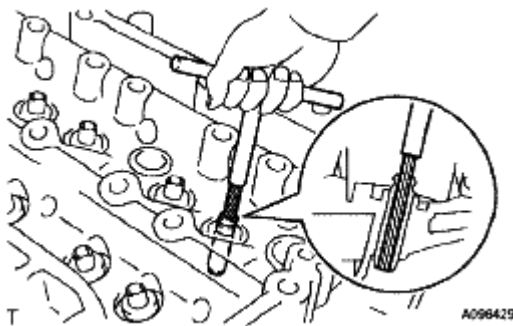


Fig. 398: Reaming Valve Guide Bushing

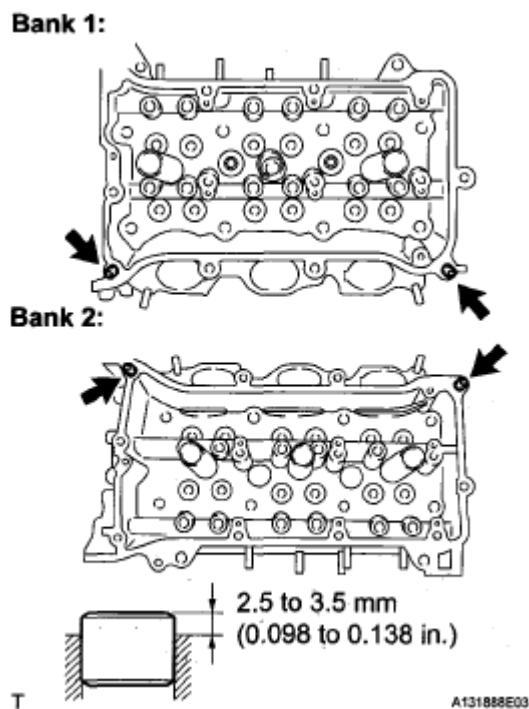


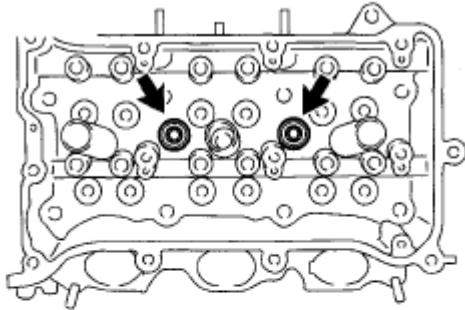
Fig. 399: Identifying Protrusion Height

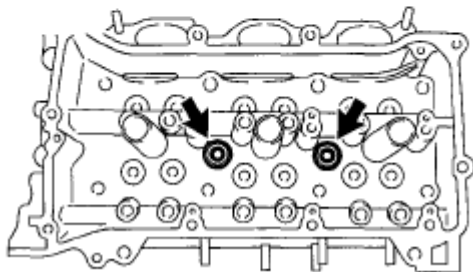

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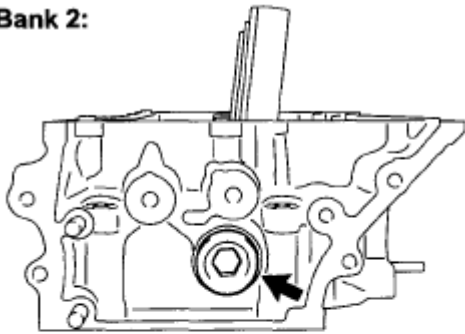
Fig. 400: Locating No. 1 Straight Screw Plugs And Gaskets

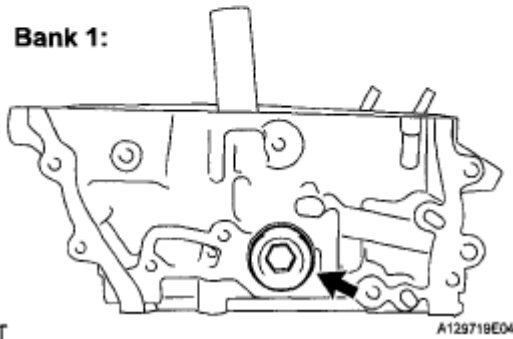
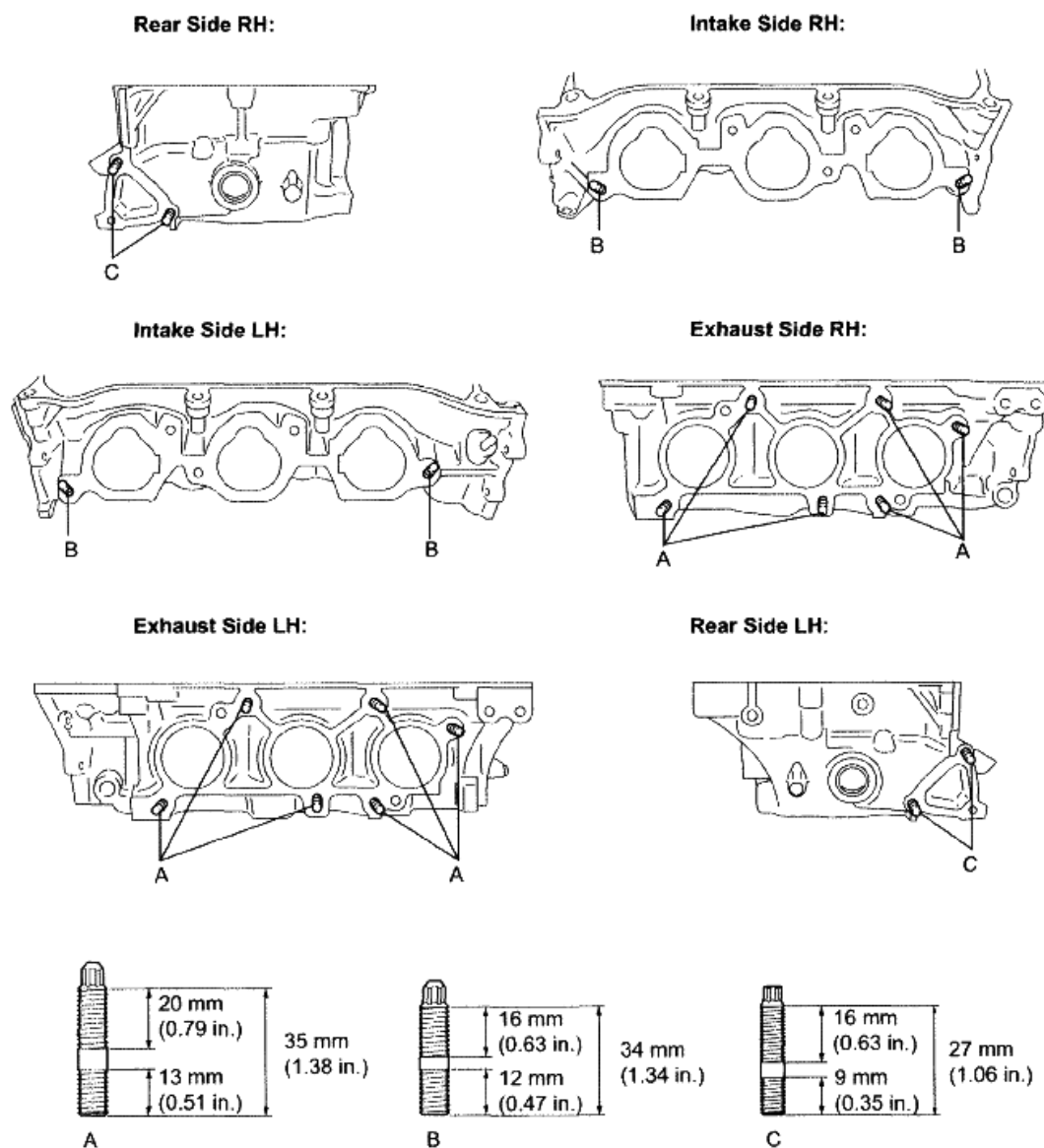


Fig. 401: Locating No. 2 Straight Screw Plugs And Gaskets

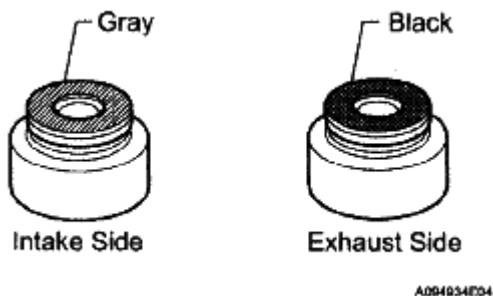


Fig. 404: Identifying Intake And Exhaust Valve Oil Seals

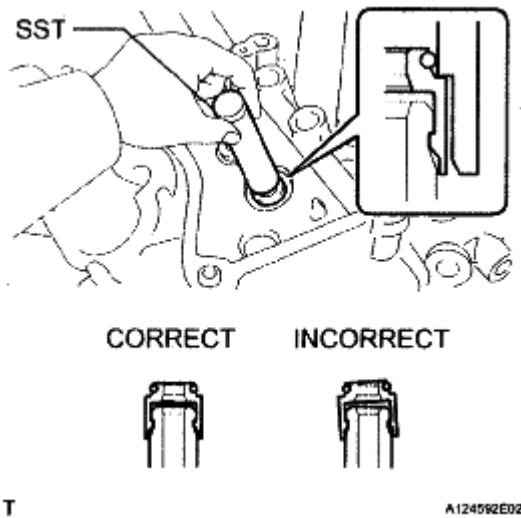


Fig. 405: Pushing In Oil Seals Using SST

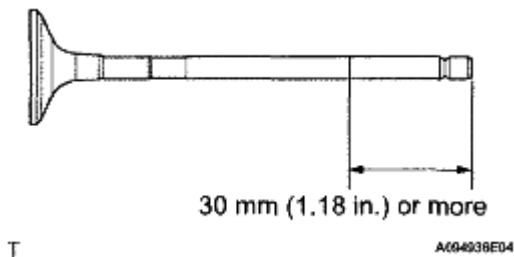


Fig. 406: Identifying Intake Valve Tip Area Length

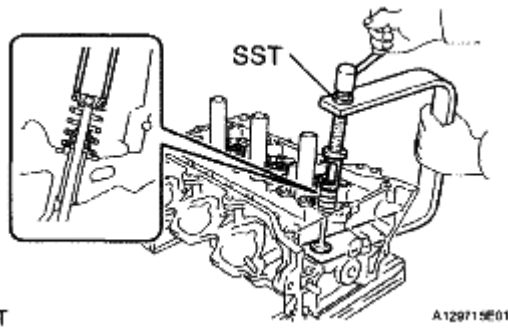


Fig. 407: Using SST To Compress Inner Compression Spring To Install Exhaust Valve

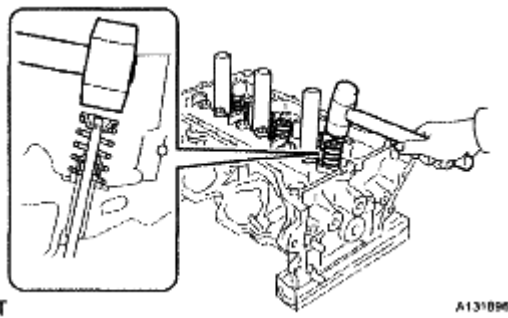


Fig. 408: Tapping Valve Stem Tip To Ensure Proper Fit

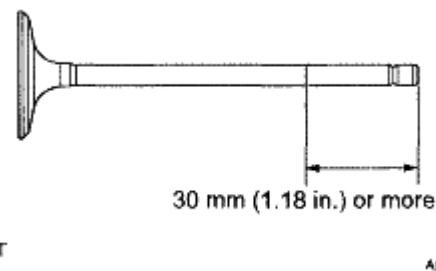


Fig. 409: Identifying Intake Valve Tip Area Length

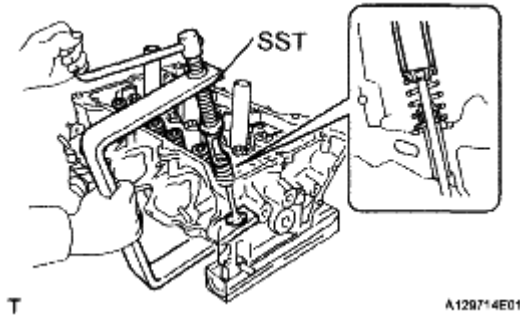


Fig. 410: Using SST To Compress Inner Compression Spring To Install Intake Valve

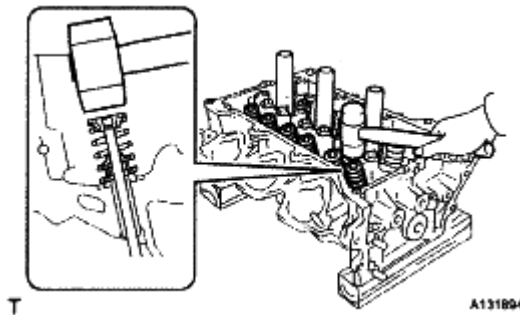


Fig. 411: Tapping Valve Stem Tip To Ensure Proper Fit

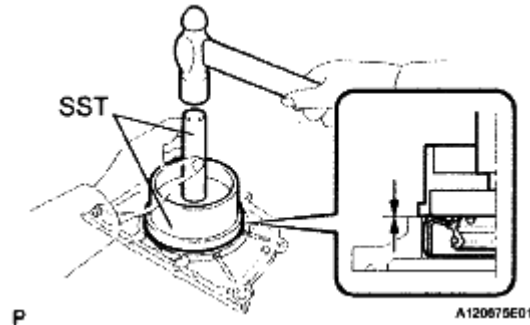


Fig. 412: Identifying Engine Rear Oil Seal

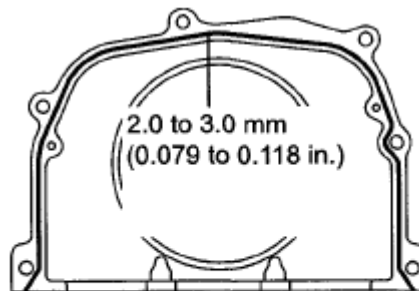

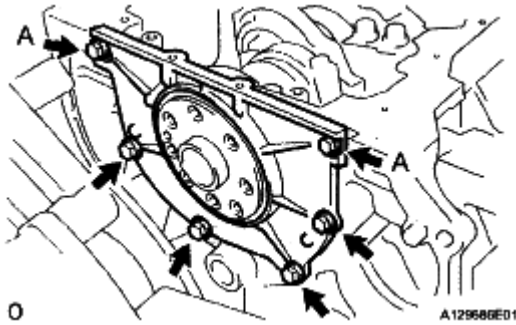


Fig. 414: Locating Oil Seal Retainer

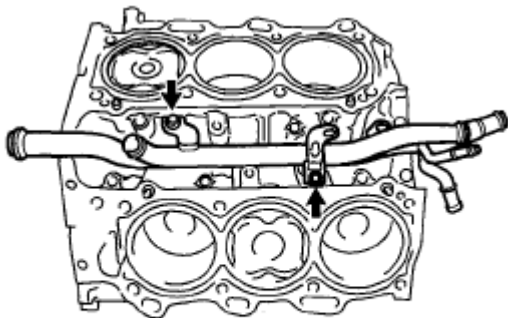


Fig. 415: Locating Bolts And Water Inlet Pipe

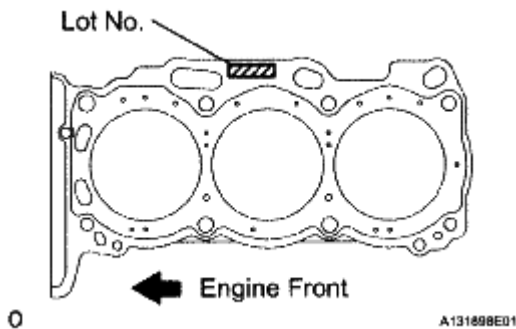


Fig. 416: Identifying Cylinder Head Gasket

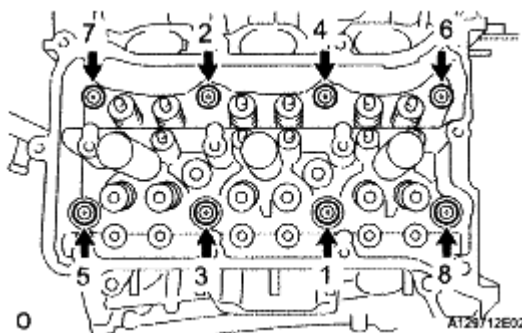


Fig. 417: Locating Cylinder Head Bolts

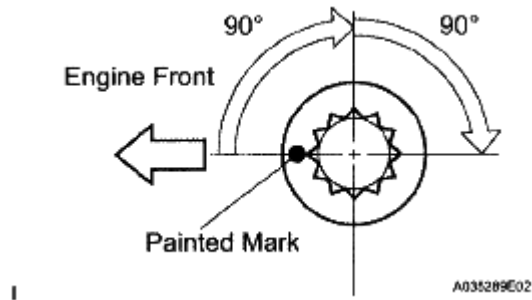


Fig. 418: Identifying Painted Mark

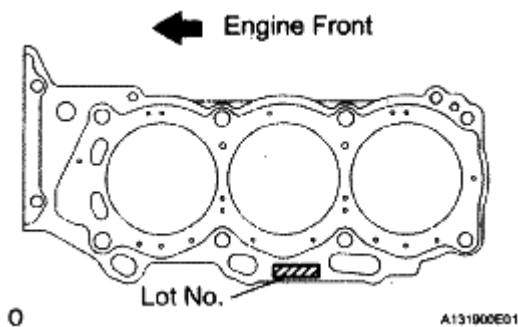


Fig. 419: Identifying Cylinder Head Gasket

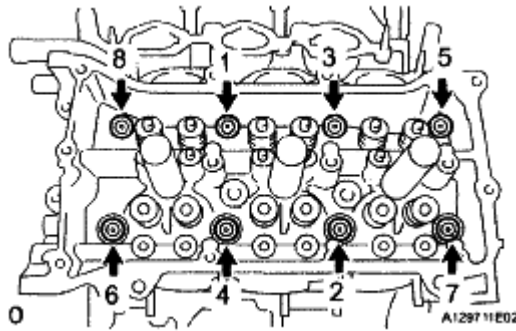


Fig. 420: Locating Cylinder Head Bolts

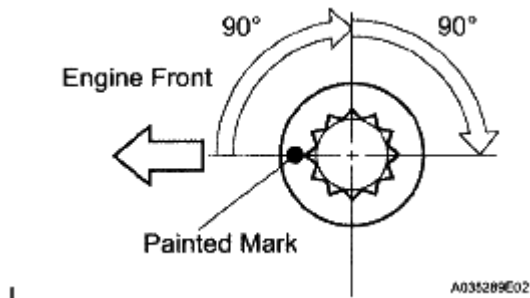


Fig. 421: Identifying Painted Mark

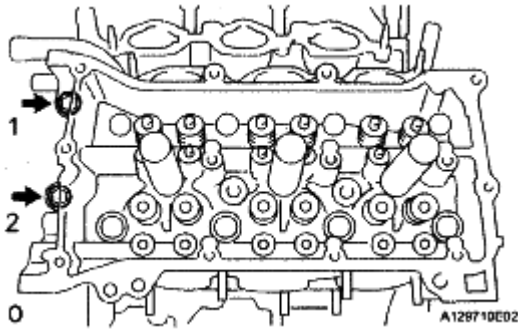


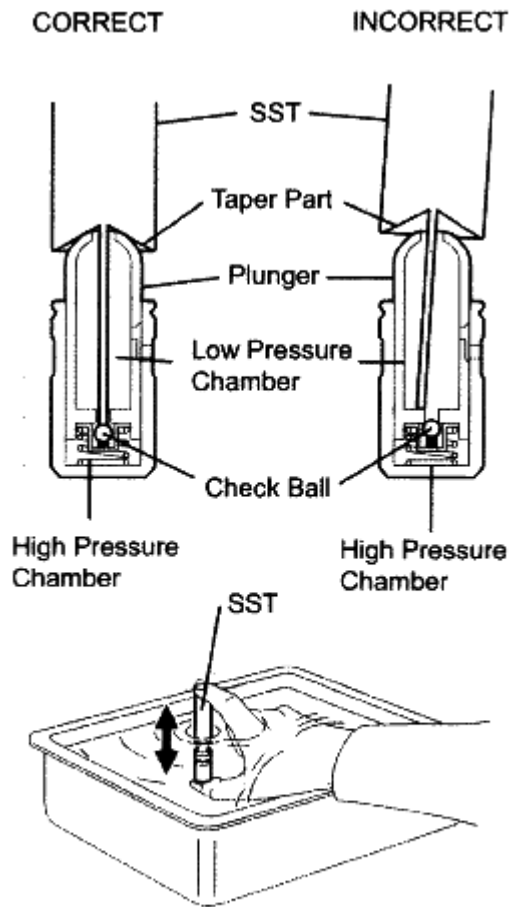
Fig. 422: Identifying Bolts Tightening Sequence

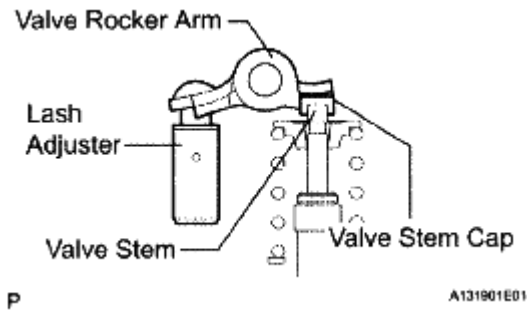


Fig. 424: Identifying Valve Rocker Arm Assembly

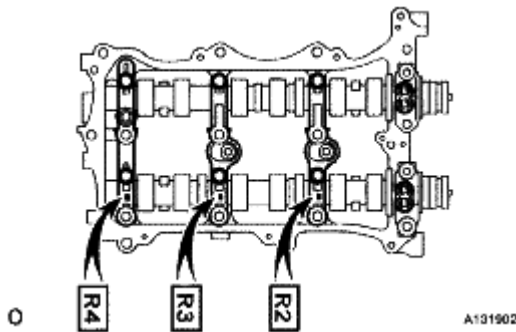


Fig. 425: Identifying Marks And Numbers On Camshaft Bearing Caps

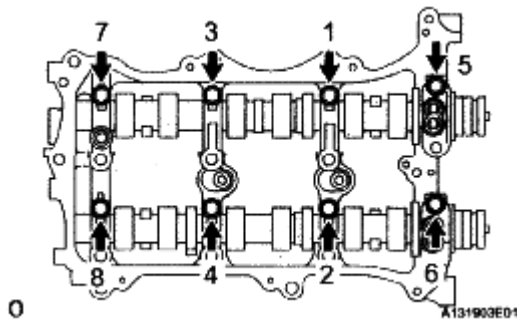


Fig. 426: Identifying Bolts Tightening Sequence

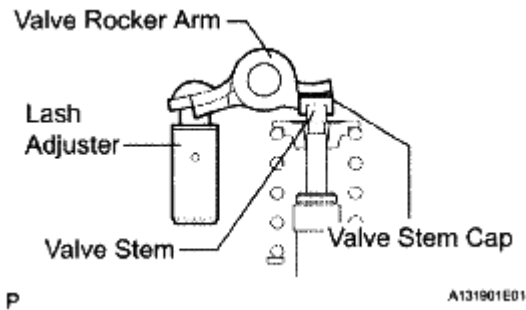


Fig. 427: Identifying Valve Rocker Arm Assembly

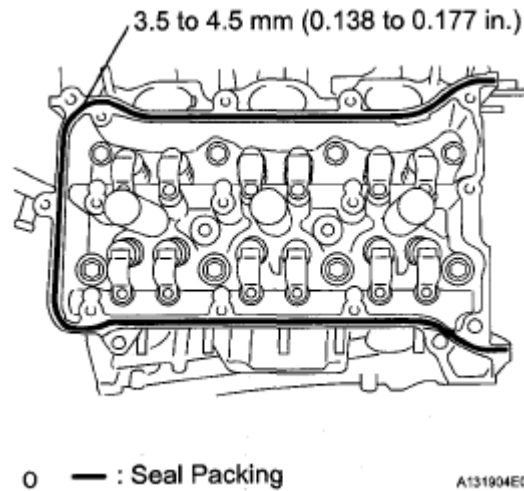


Fig. 428: Identifying Seal Packing

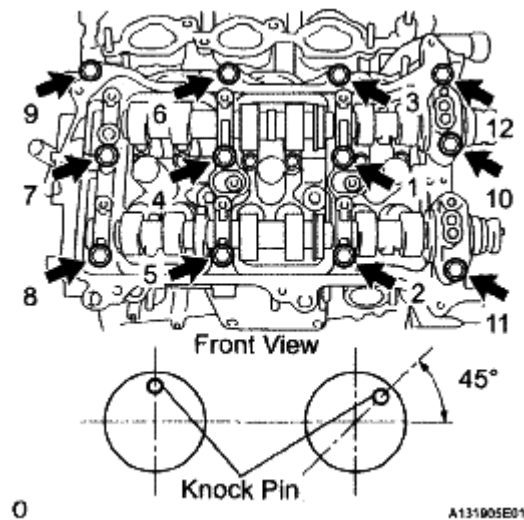


Fig. 429: Identifying Bolts Tightening Sequence

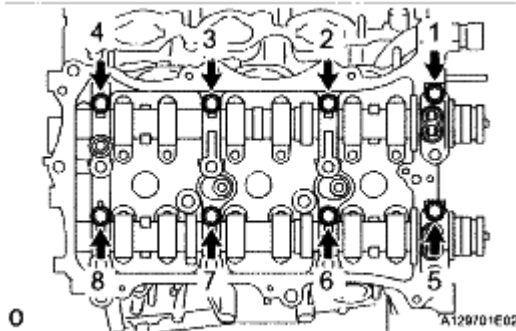


Fig. 430: Identifying Bolts Tightening Sequence

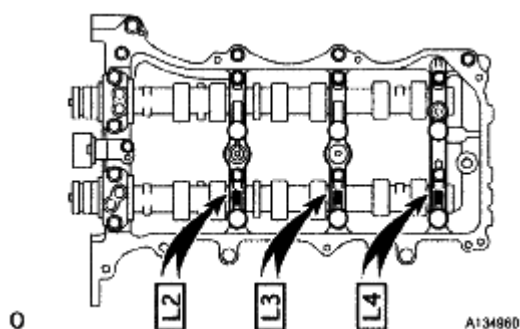


Fig. 431: Identifying Marks And Numbers On Camshaft Bearing Caps

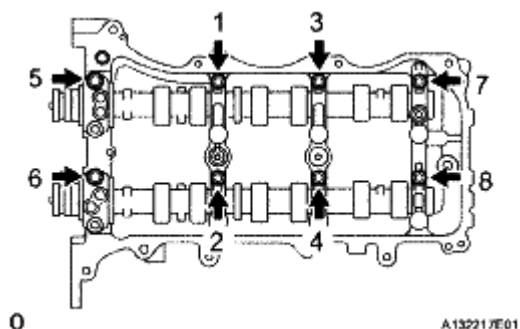


Fig. 432: Identifying Bolts Tightening Sequence

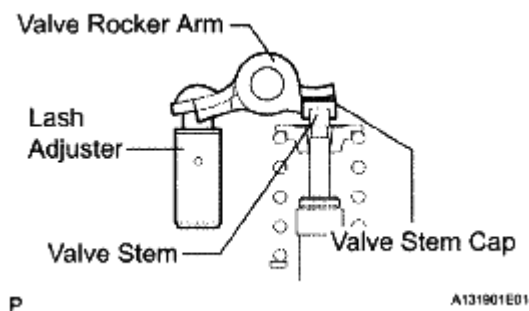


Fig. 433: Identifying Valve Rocker Arm Assembly

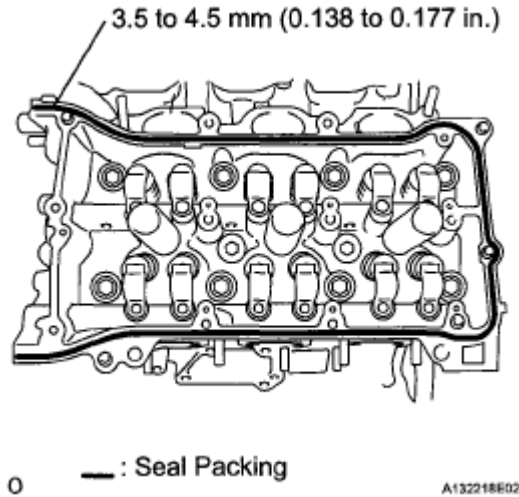


Fig. 434: Identifying Seal Packing

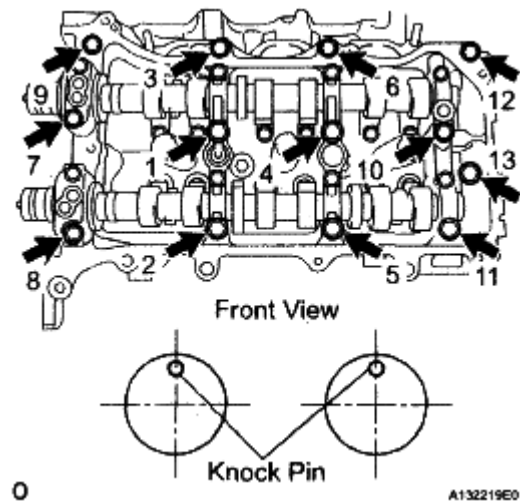


Fig. 435: Identifying Bolts Tightening Sequence

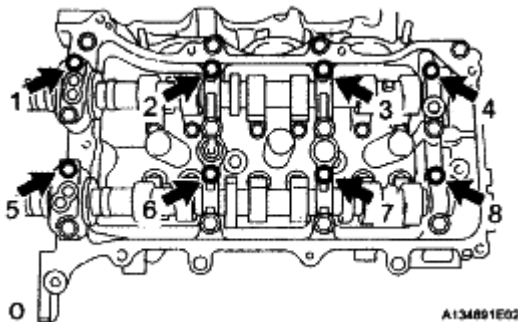


Fig. 436: Locating Bolts

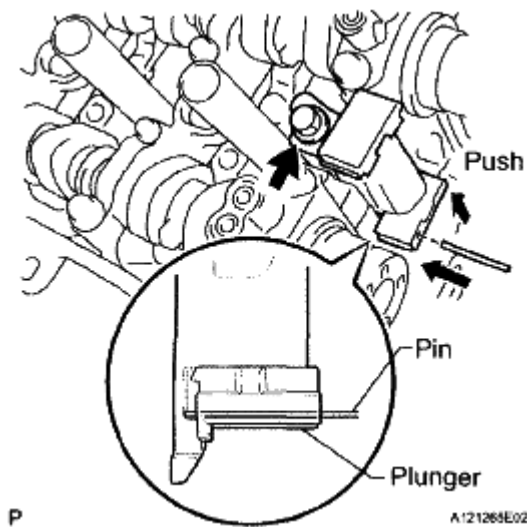


Fig. 437: Installing No 2 Chain Tensioner

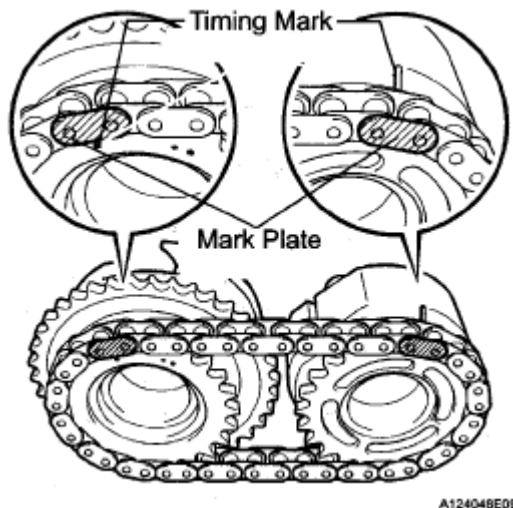


Fig. 438: Identifying Timing Mark

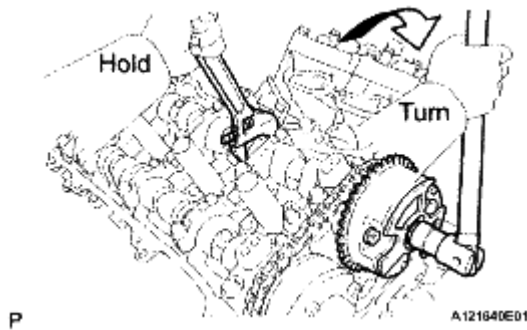


Fig. 439: Tightening Camshaft Bolt

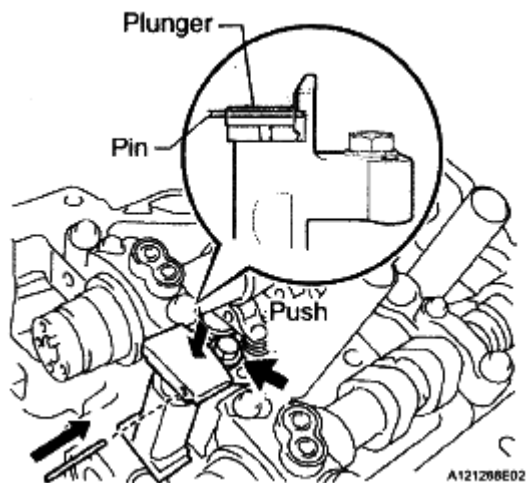


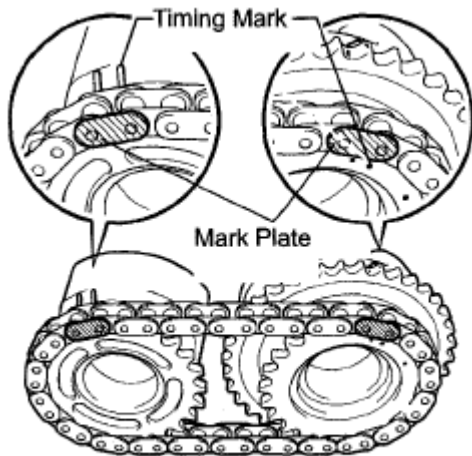
Fig. 440: Identifying No.3 Chain Tensioner Assembly

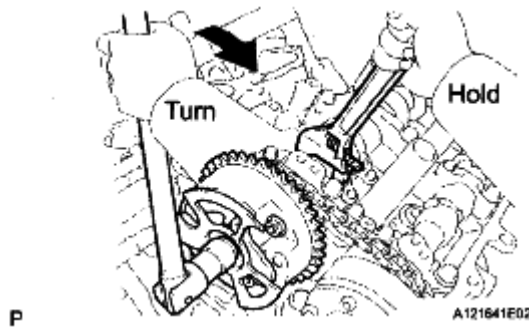


Fig. 442: Holding Hexagonal Portion Of Camshaft Using Wrench

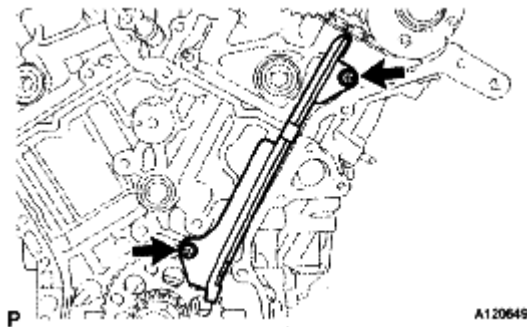


Fig. 443: Identifying No.1 Chain Vibration Damper Bolts

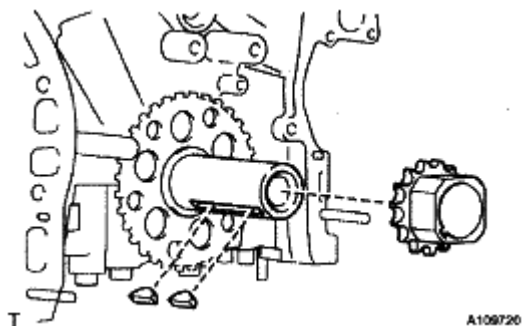


Fig. 444: Identifying Crankshaft Timing Sprocket

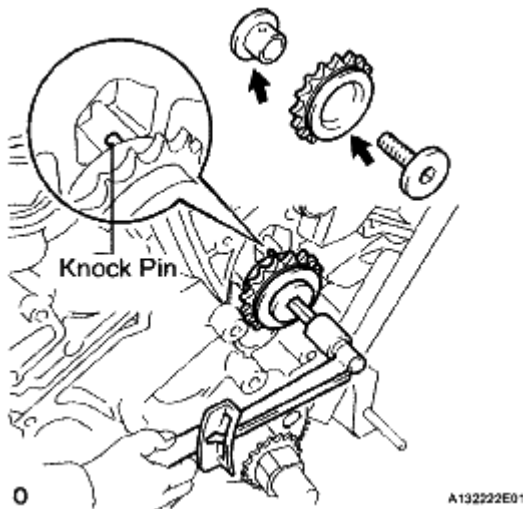

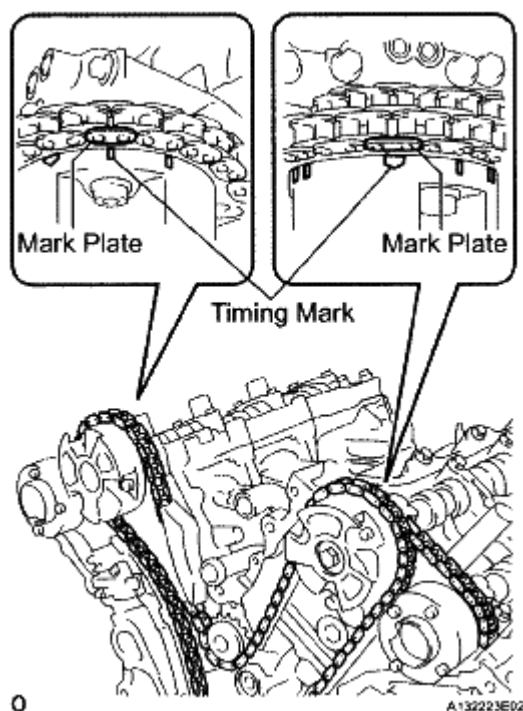


Fig. 446: Identifying Timing Mark On Marking Plate

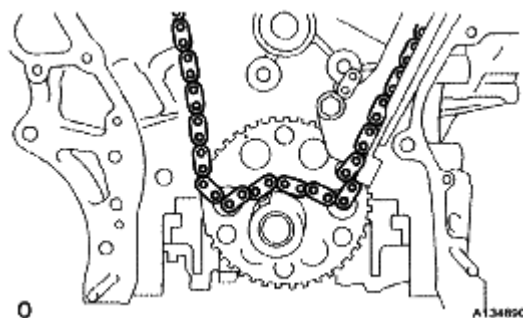
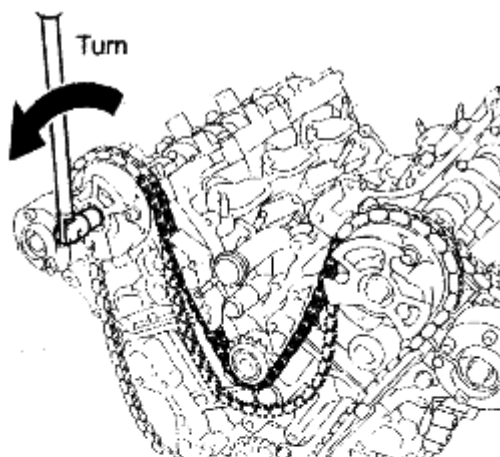


Fig. 447: Identifying Chain Set

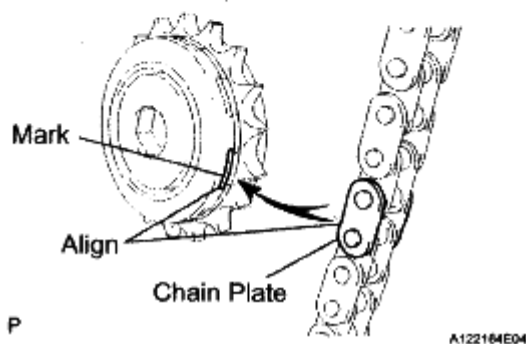


Fig. 448: Turning Camshaft Timing Gear Assembly

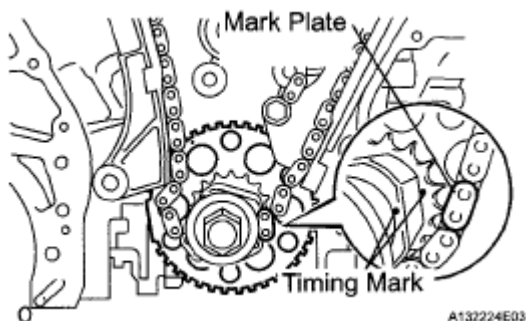


Fig. 449: Identifying Timing Mark

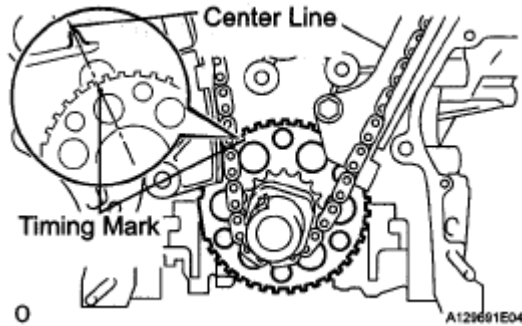


Fig. 450: Identifying Timing Mark

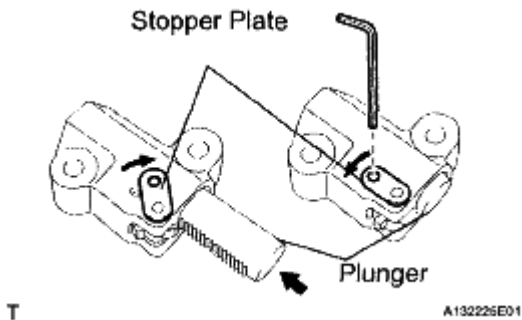


Fig. 451: Identifying Stopper Plate And Plunger

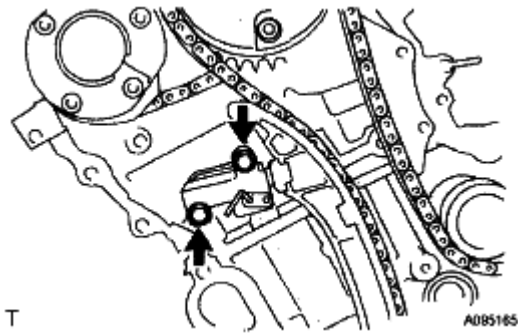


Fig. 452: Locating Chain Tensioner With Bolts

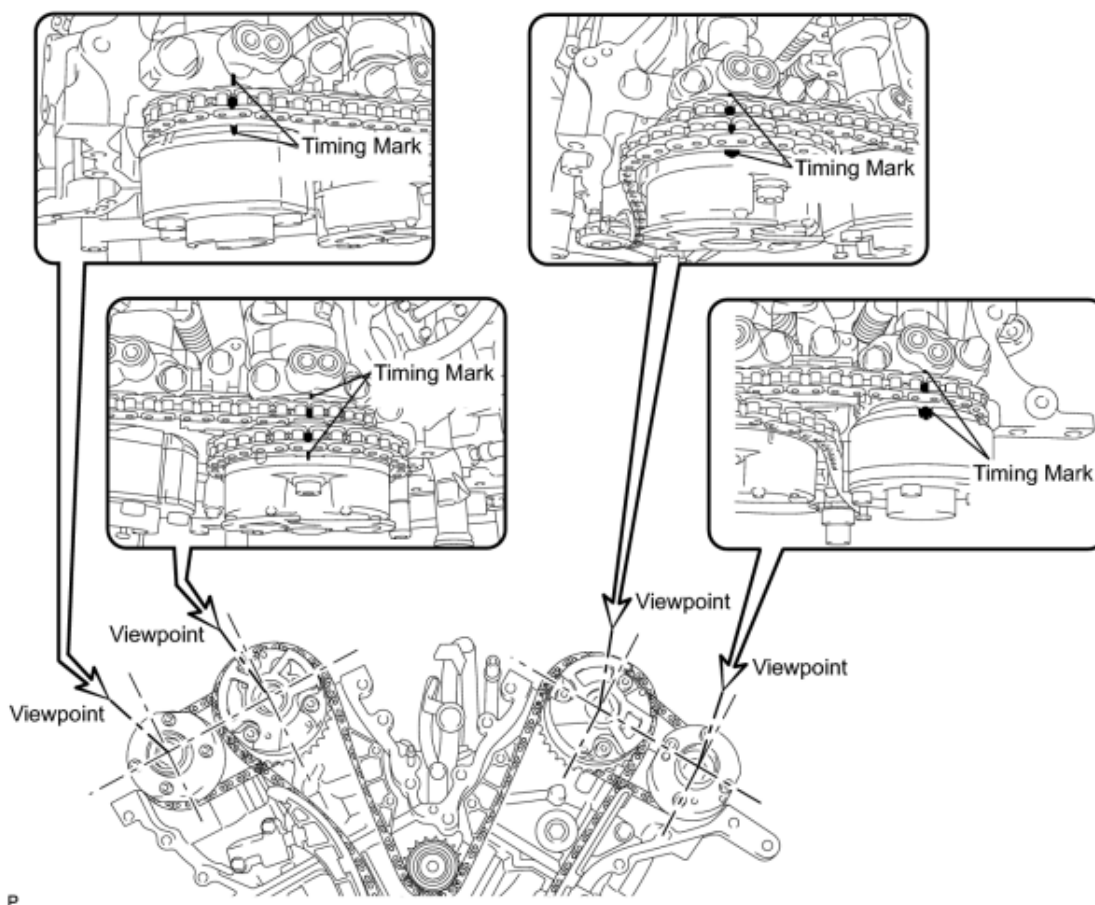

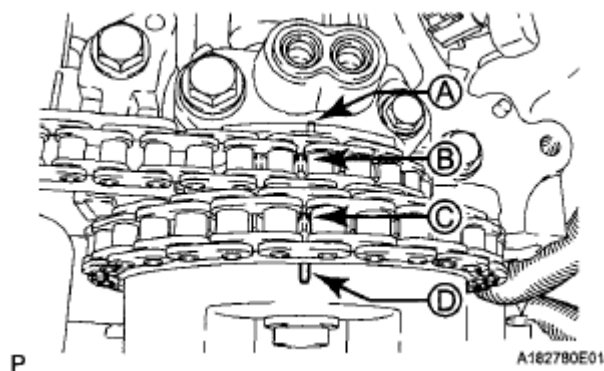

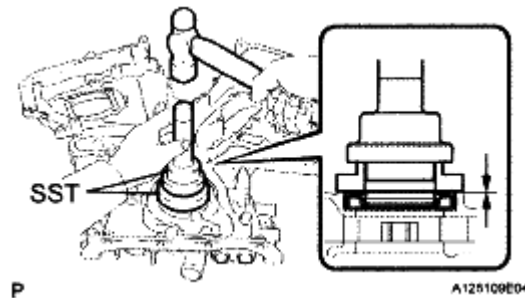


Fig. 455: Installing Timing Chain Case Oil Seal

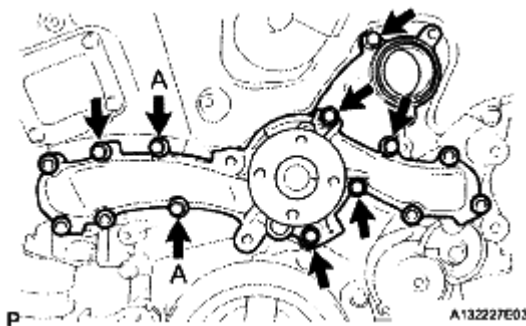
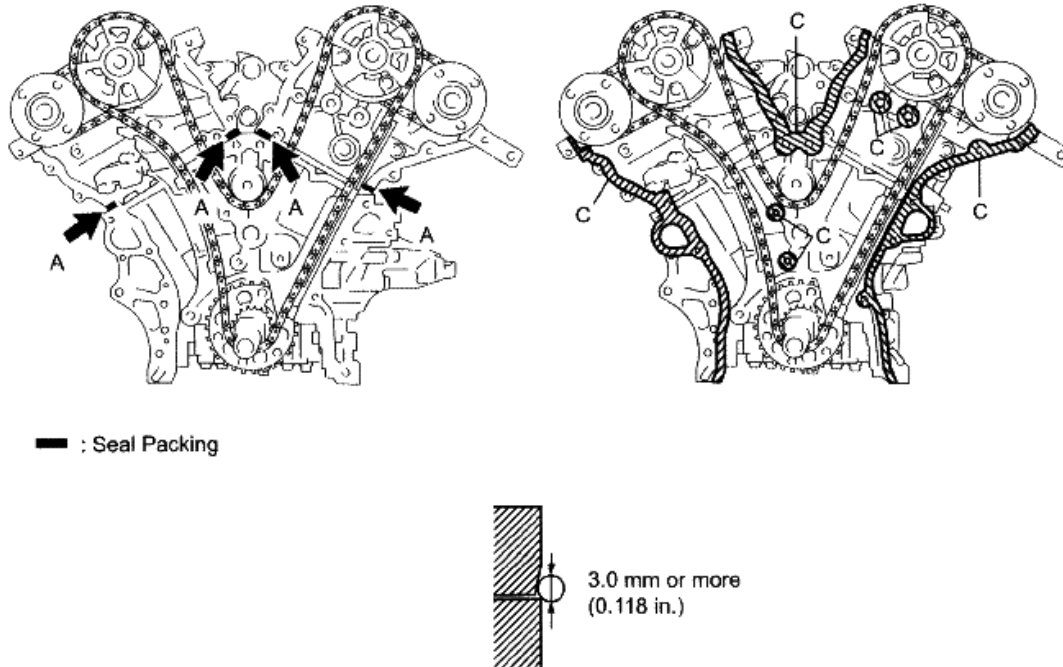


Fig. 456: Locating Water Pump With Bolts

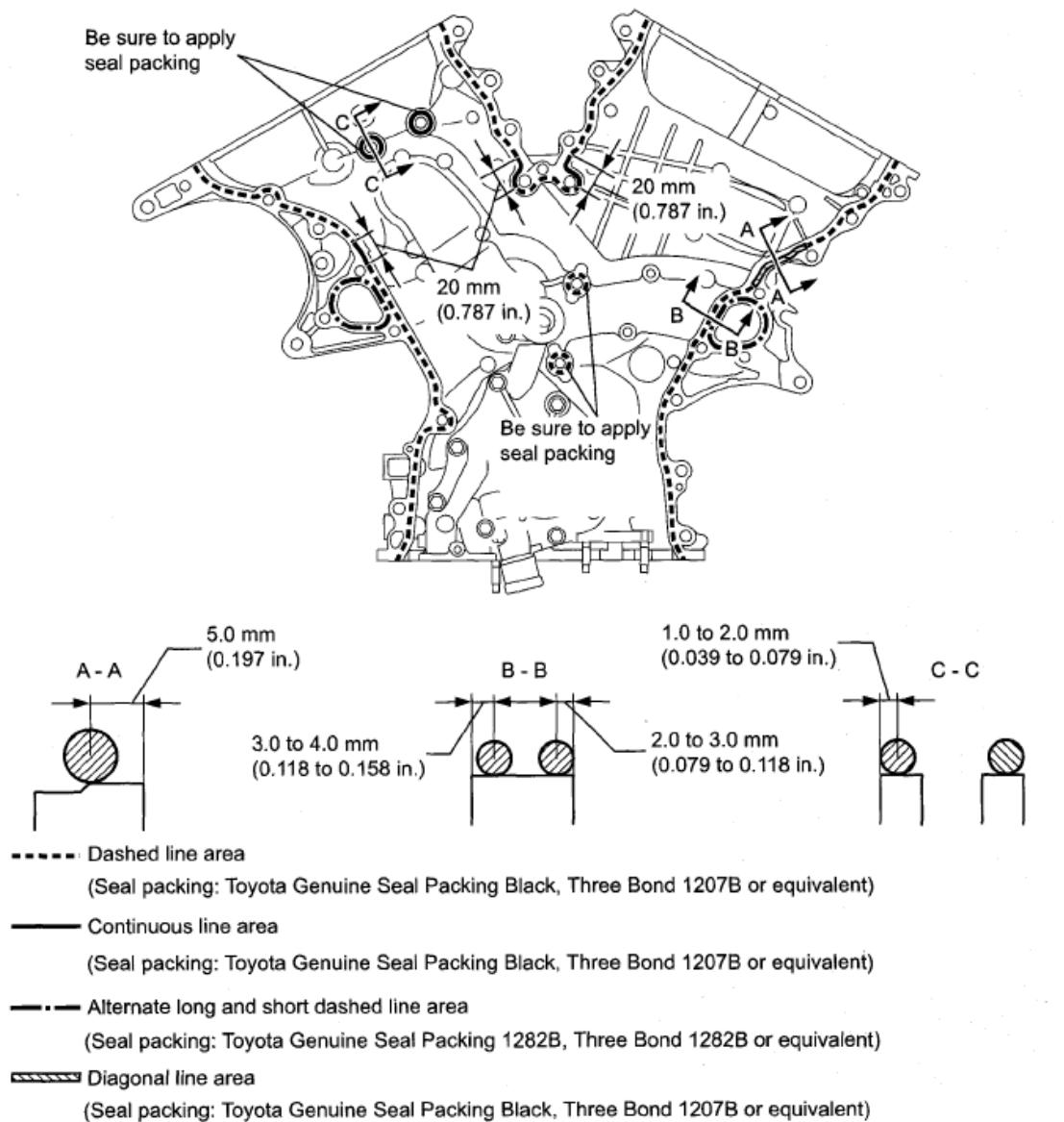


Fig. 458: Applying Seal Packing In Continuous Line To Timing Chain Cover

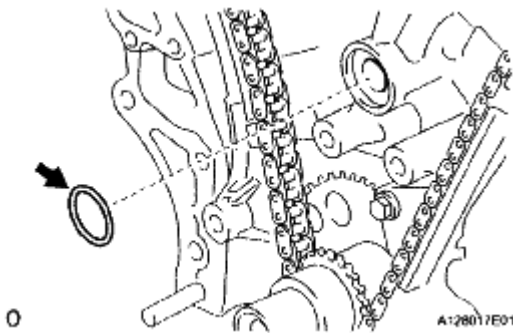


Fig. 459: Locating Gasket

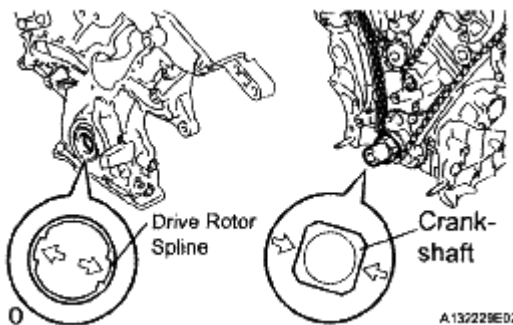


Fig. 460: Aligning Oil Pump Drive Rotor Spline And Crankshaft

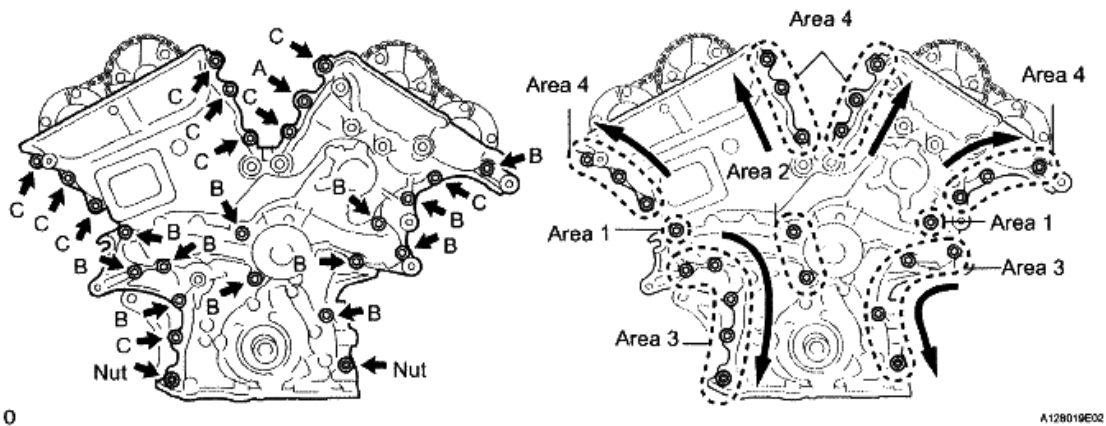


Fig. 461: Locating Timing Chain Cover With Bolts

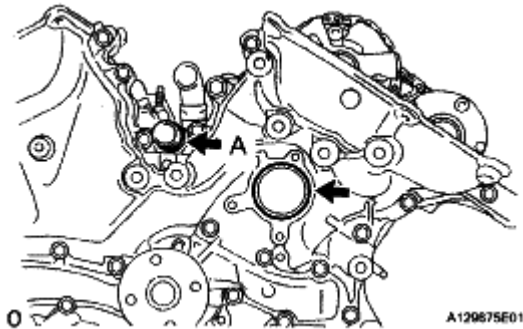
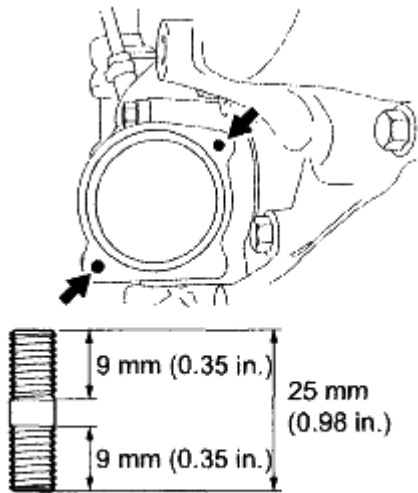


Fig. 462: Locating O-Ring

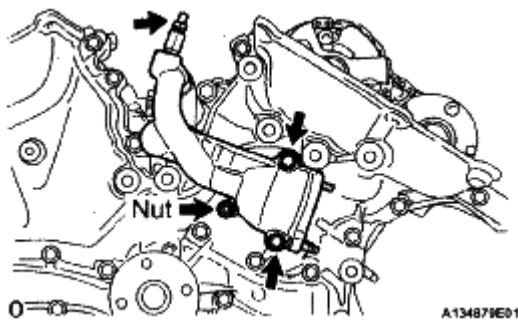


Fig. 464: Locating Bolts, Nut, And Water Inlet Housing

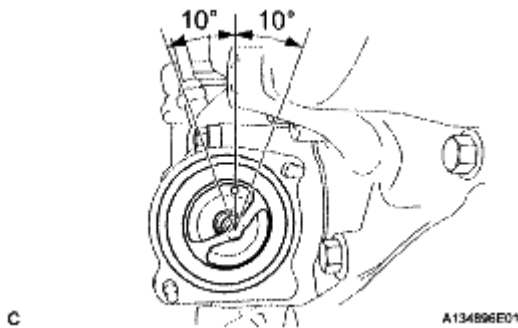


Fig. 465: Identifying Jiggle Valve Angles

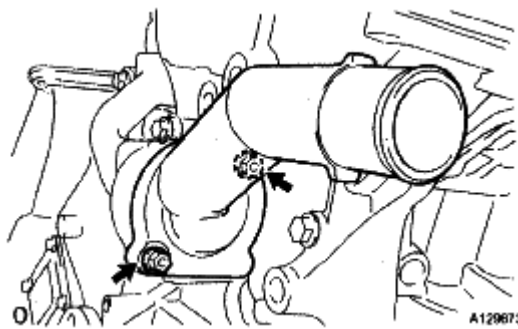


Fig. 466: Locating Water Inlet With Nuts

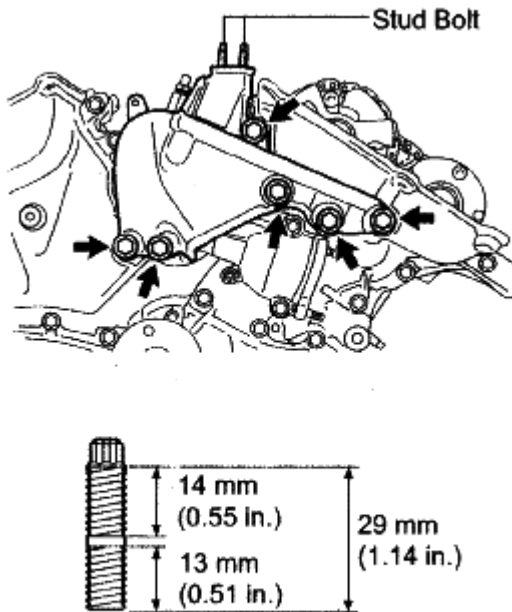

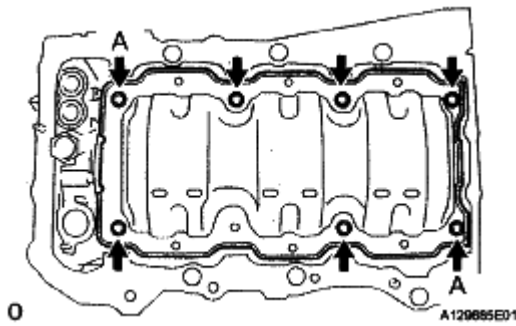
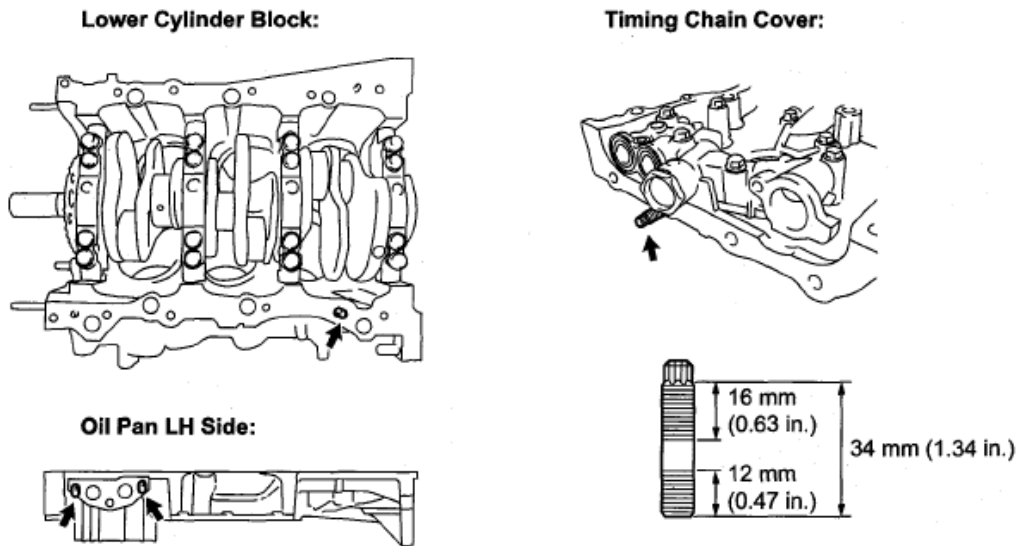


Fig. 468: Locating Oil Pan Baffle Plate Bolts

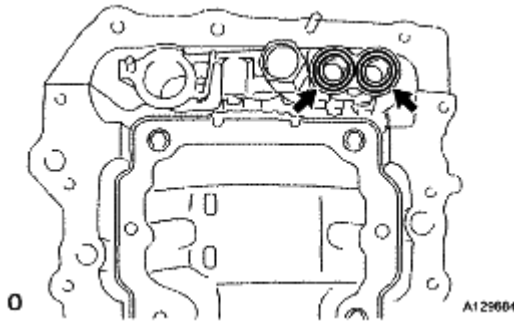


Fig. 470: Locating O-Rings

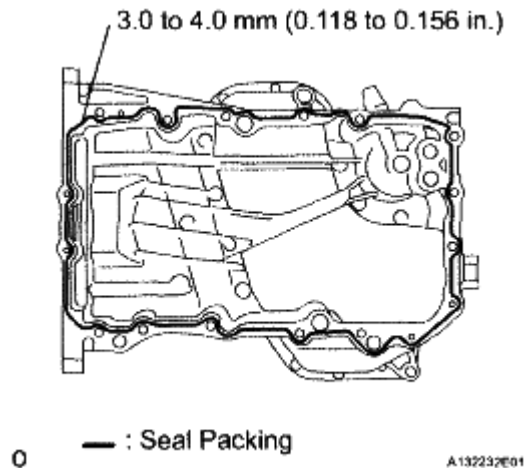

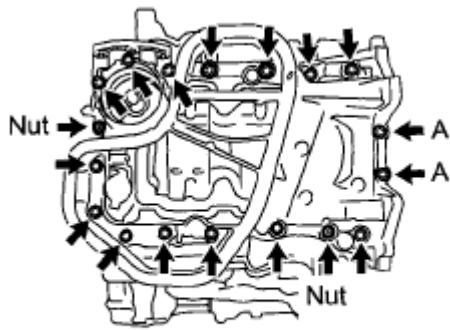
Fig. 471: Applying Seal Packing

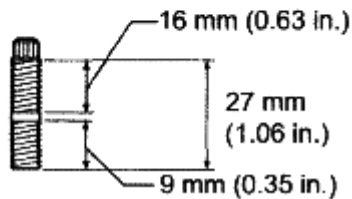
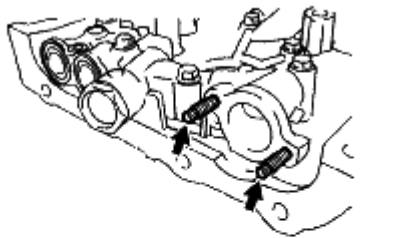

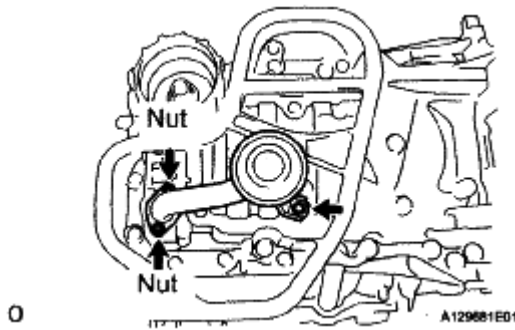


Fig. 474: Locating Gasket And Oil Strainer With Bolt And Nuts

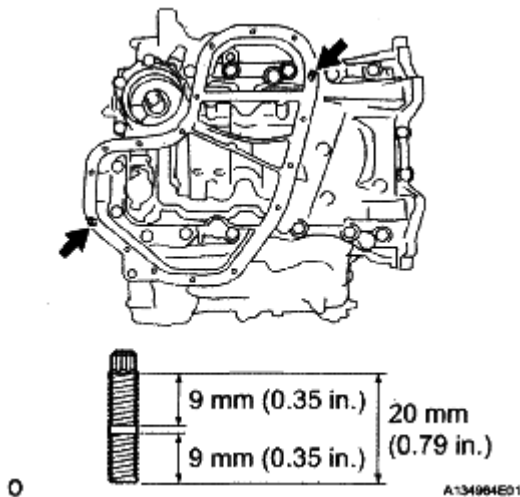


Fig. 475: Locating No. 2 Oil Pan Sub-Assembly Stud Bolts

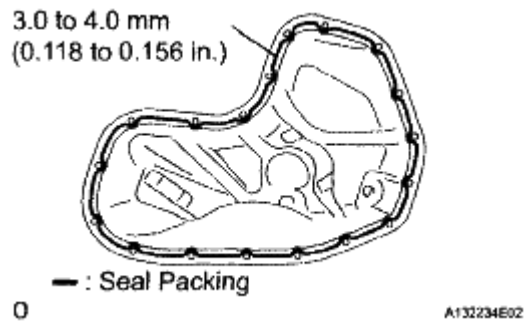


Fig. 476: Identifying Seal Packing

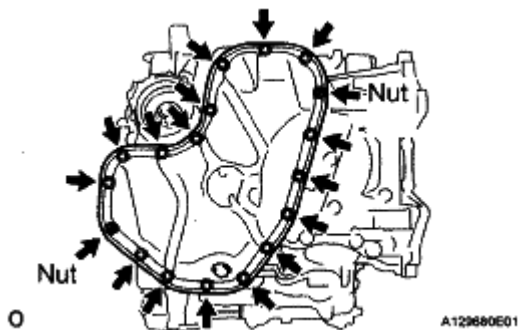


Fig. 477: Identifying Oil Pan With Bolts And Nuts

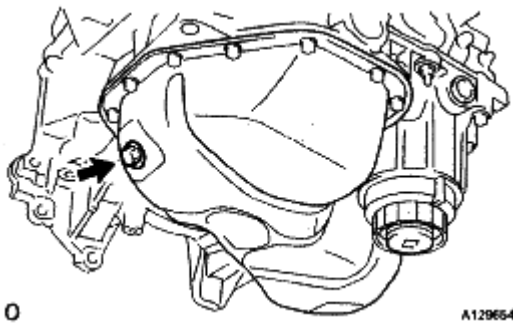


Fig. 478: Locating Oil Pan Drain Plug

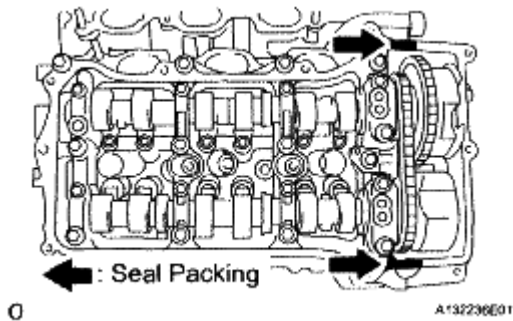


Fig. 479: Identifying Seal Packing

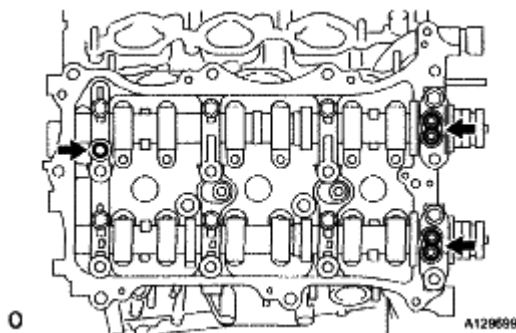


Fig. 480: Locating Gaskets

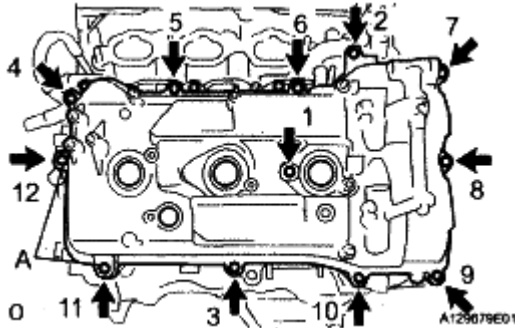


Fig. 481: Identifying Head Cover With Bolts

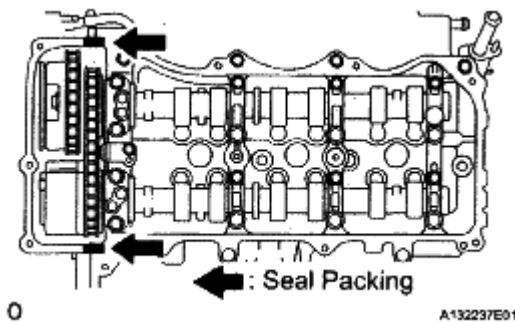


Fig. 482: Identifying Seal Packing

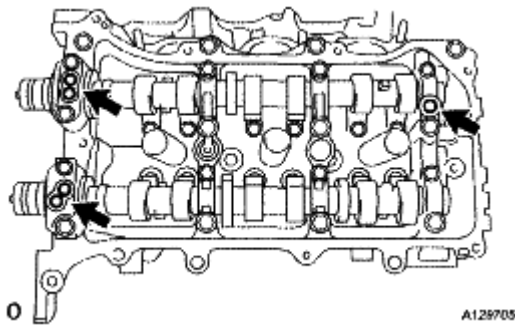


Fig. 483: Locating Gaskets

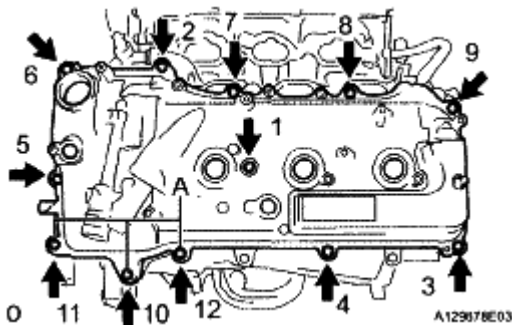


Fig. 484: Locating Head Cover With Bolts And Washer

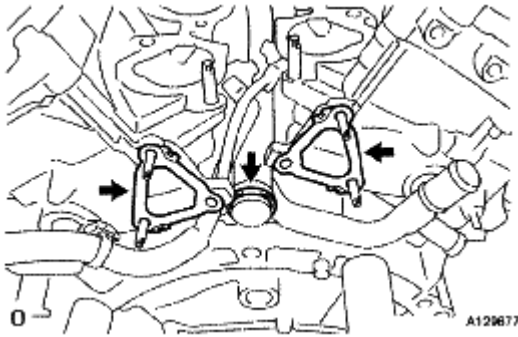


Fig. 485: Locating Water Outlet Gaskets And O-Ring

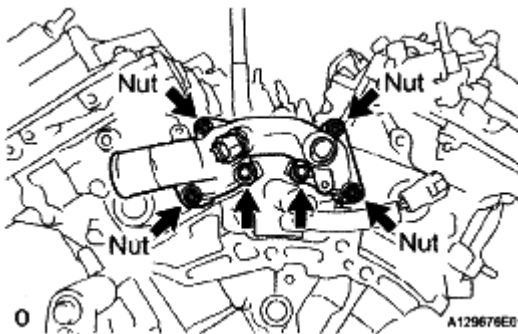


Fig. 486: Locating Bolts, Nuts And Water Outlet

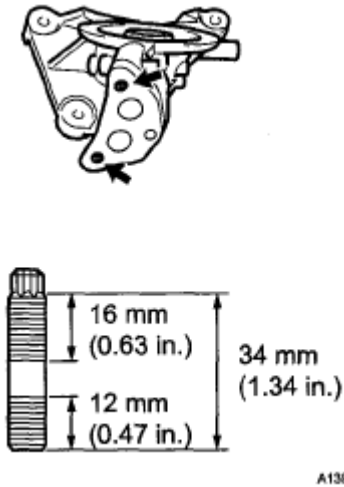


Fig. 487: Locating Stud Bolts

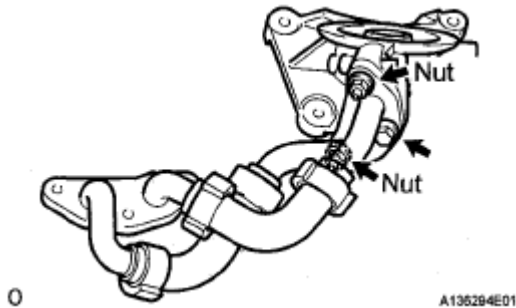


Fig. 488: Locating Bolt, Nuts, No. 1 Oil Cooler Bracket, And Gasket

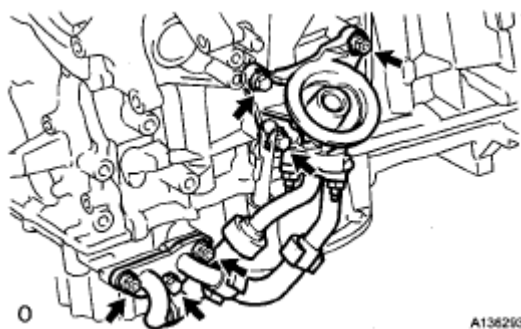


Fig. 489: Locating Bolts, Nuts, And Oil Cooler Pipe With No. 1 Oil Cooler Bracket

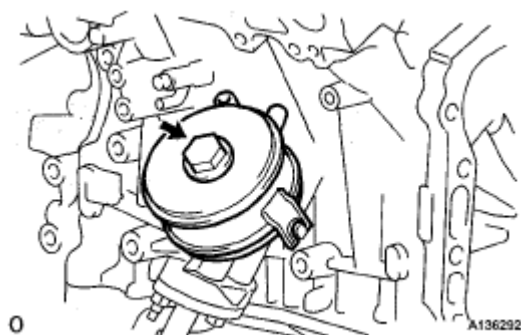


Fig. 490: Locating Oil Cooler Union Bolt

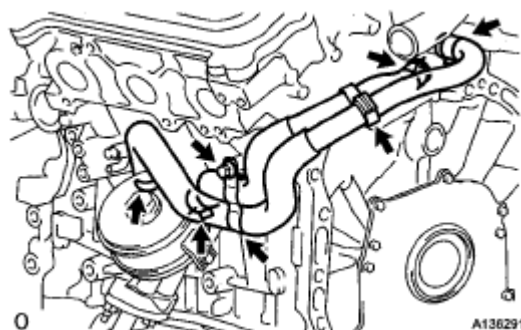


Fig. 491: Locating Bolt, Clamps, And Clips

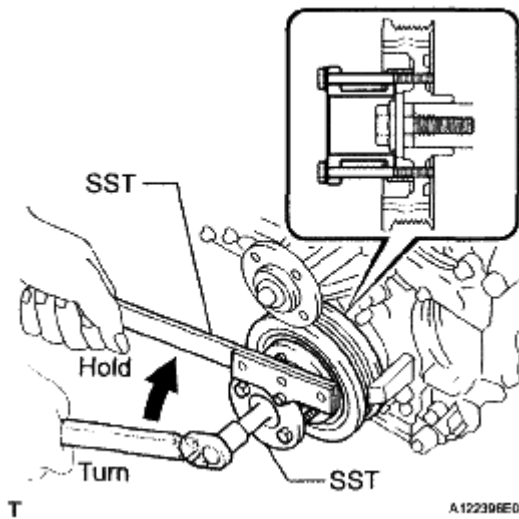


Fig. 492: Installing Crankshaft Pulley Bolt Using SST

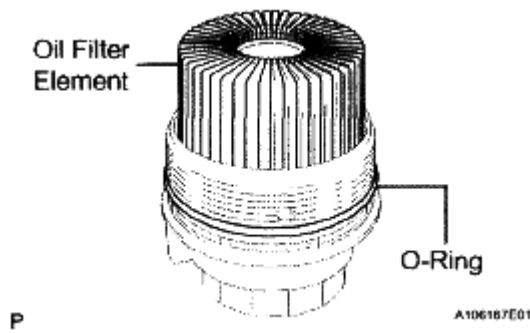


Fig. 493: View Of Oil Filter Element And O-Ring

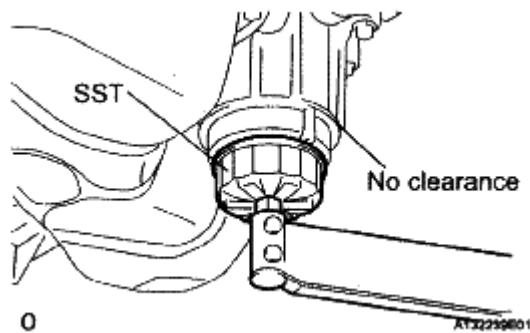


Fig. 494: Tightening Oil Filter Cap

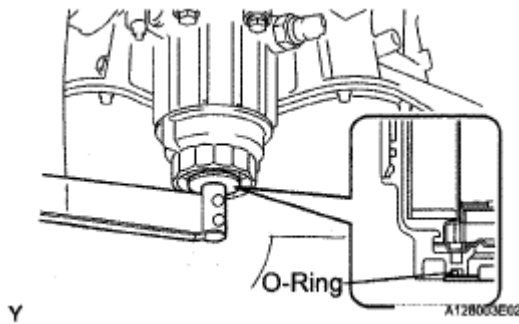


Fig. 495: Locating Oil Filter Drain Plug To Oil Filter Cap

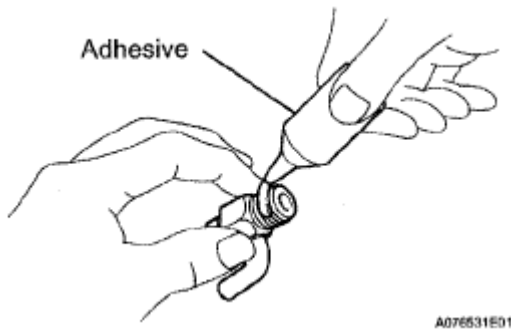


Fig. 496: Applying Adhesive Around Drain Cocks

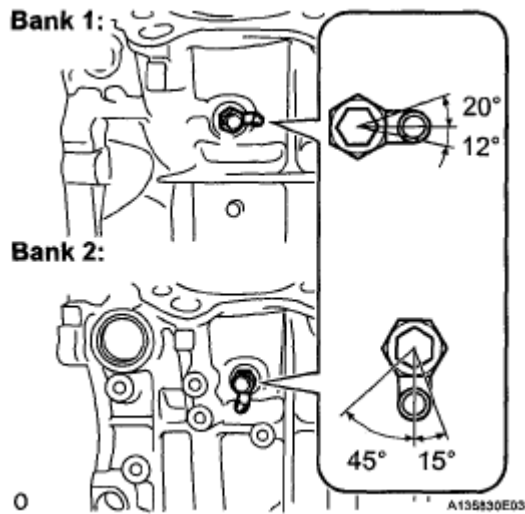


Fig. 497: Installing Water Drain Cocks

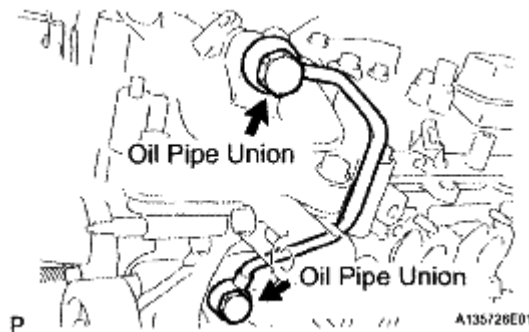


Fig. 498: Locating Oil Pipe Unions And Oil Pipe

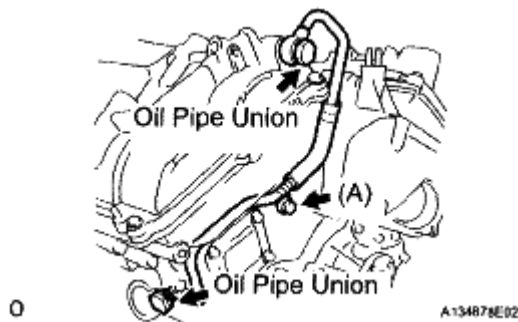


Fig. 499: Locating Oil Pipe Unions

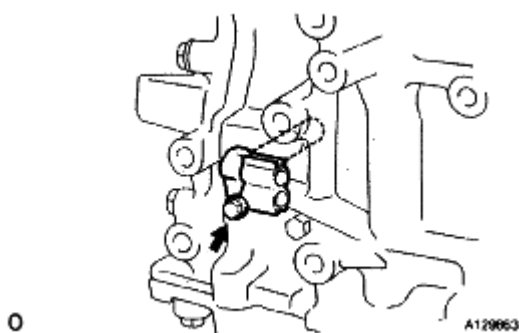


Fig. 500: Locating Crankshaft Position Sensor

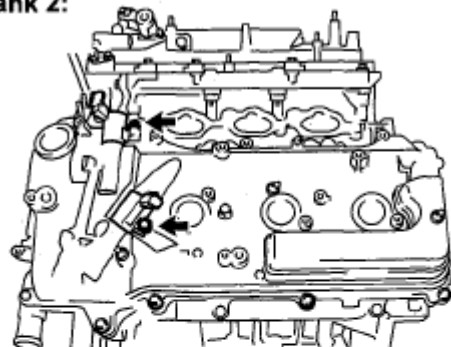

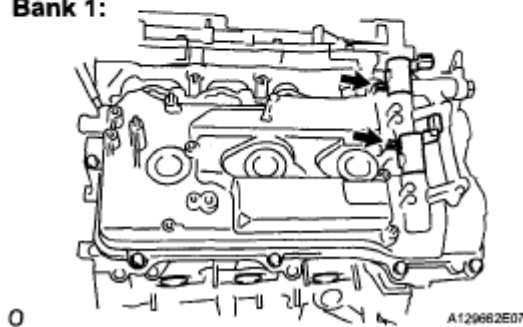


Fig. 501: Locating Bolts And Camshaft Oil Control Valves

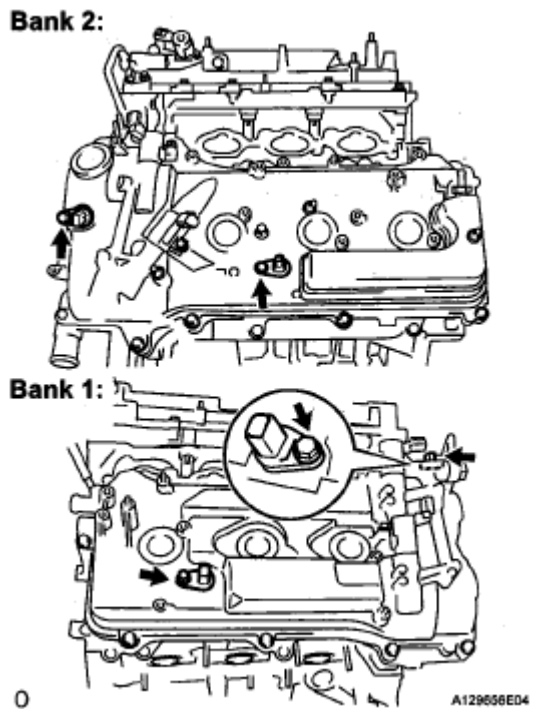


Fig. 502: Locating Bolts And Camshaft Position Sensors

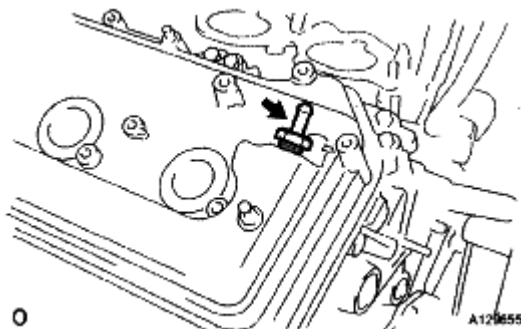


Fig. 503: Identifying Ventilation Valve Sub-Assembly
