### **ENGINE - 2.5L**

The 2.5L (153 CID) 4-cylinder engine has the following features:

- Dual overhead camshaft
- Four valves per cylinder
- Sequential multiport fuel injection (SFI)
- Aluminum cylinder head
- Aluminum cylinder block
- Electronic ignition system with coil-on-plug 4 ignition coils

The 2.5L engine is a 4 valve-per-cylinder, dual overhead camshaft engine. The engine uses a coil-on-plug ignition system. The cylinder block is made of aluminum and the bearing caps are integrated into the ladder assembly. An aluminum oil pan bolts to the bottom of the lower cylinder block and to the transmission to provide greater strength. The camshafts are mounted in the cylinder heads and act against valve tappets to open and close the valves. The camshafts are driven off the front of the cylinder head by one timing chain. The chain is driven by a sprocket that is located on the crankshaft. The piston assembly is an aluminum piston with a cast iron connecting rod. The oil pump is driven by the crankshaft via a dedicated chain that is driven by the same sprocket that drives the timing chain.

#### **IDENTIFICATION**

Always refer to these labels when installation of new parts is necessary, or when checking engine calibrations. The engine parts often differ within a CID family. Verification of the identification codes will make sure that the correct parts are obtained. These codes contain all the pertinent information relating to the dates, optional equipment and revisions. The Mazda Master Parts Catalog contains a complete listing of the codes and their application.

#### **CODE INFORMATION**

The engine code information label, located on the side of the valve cover and the front side of the valve cover, contains the following:

- Engine build date
- Engine plant code
- Engine code

#### **EXHAUST EMISSION CONTROL SYSTEM**

Operation and necessary maintenance of the exhaust emission control devices used on this engine are covered in the Powertrain Control/Emissions Diagnosis (PC/ED) Service Information.

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#### INDUCTION SYSTEM

The sequential multiport fuel injection (SFI) provides the fuel/air mixture needed for combustion in the cylinders. The 4 solenoid-operated fuel injectors:

- are mounted in the intake manifold.
- meter fuel into the air intake stream in accordance with engine demand.
- are positioned so that their tips direct fuel just ahead of the engine intake valves.
- are connected in series with the fuel pressure sensor.
- supply fuel from the fuel tank with a fuel pump mounted in the fuel tank.

A constant fuel pressure is maintained across the fuel injectors by the fuel pressure sensor:


• is positioned upstream from the fuel injectors on the fuel injection supply manifold.

#### **LUBRICATION SYSTEM**

The engine lubrication system operates as follows:

- Oil is drawn into the oil pump through the oil pump screen cover and tube in the sump of the oil pan.
- Oil is pumped through the oil filter on the left front side of the cylinder block.
- Oil enters the main gallery where it is distributed to the crankshaft main journals and to the cylinder head.
- From the main journals, the oil is routed through cross-drilled passages in the crankshaft to lubricate the connecting rod bearings. Controlled leakage through the crankshaft main bearings and connecting rod bearings is slung radially outward to cool and lubricate the cylinder walls as well as the entire connecting rod, piston and piston ring assembly.

# ACCESSORY DRIVE - 2.5L

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
#### ACCESSORY DRIVE

The accessory drive:

- has a single serpentine belt with 6 ribs.
- has automatic tensioning.
- is not adjustable.

The accessory drive system provides power to operate components which power other systems. These could include components such as the generator, power steering pump and A/C compressor. Each of these components is equipped with a pulley which is driven by the accessory drive belt. The accessory drive belt is driven by the engine crankshaft pulley. One or more idler pulleys may be provided to facilitate belt routing and alignment. The automatic belt tensioner maintains correct belt tension and compensates for component wear and changes in system load. System load changes can be caused by the A/C compressor clutch engaging or disengaging, or demand changes on other systems powered by the accessory drive belt. To maintain correct operation of this system, it is critical that the correct length drive belt be installed. The pulleys must also be correctly aligned and kept clean.

#### **BELT TENSIONER**

# NOTE: • The accessory drive belt tensioner must be replaced as a complete unit.

Automatic tensioners are calibrated to provide the correct amount of tension to the belt for a given accessory drive system. Unless a spring or damping band within the tensioner assembly breaks, or some other mechanical part of the tensioner fails, there is no need to check the tensioner for correct tension.

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


Fig. 3: Exploded View Of Front End Accessory Drive - 2.5L Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

# ACCESSORY DRIVE BELT REMOVAL/INSTALLATION - 2.5L

- 1. With the vehicle in NEUTRAL, position it on a hoist. See **LIFTING**.
- 2. Remove the pin-type retainer, 5 bolts and the RH splash shield.
  - To install, tighten to 9 N.m {0.9 kgf.m, 80 in.lbf}.
- 3. Using the hex feature, rotate the accessory drive belt tensioner clockwise and remove the accessory drive belt from the water pump pulley.
  - Remove the accessory drive belt from the engine.




Fig. 4: Identifying Accessory Drive Belt Tensioner Rotating Direction - Clockwise Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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4. To install, reverse the removal procedure.

### ACCESSORY DRIVE BELT TENSIONER REMOVAL/INSTALLATION - 2.5L

- 1. With the vehicle in NEUTRAL, position it on a hoist. See **LIFTING**.
- 2. Remove the pin-type retainer, 5 bolts and the RH splash shield.
  - To install, tighten to 9 N.m {0.9 kgf.m, 80 in.lbf}.

#### NOTE:

- The accessory drive belt tensioner must be replaced as a complete unit.
- 3. Using the hex feature, rotate the accessory drive belt tensioner clockwise and remove the accessory drive belt from the water pump pulley and remove the accessory drive belt from the pulley.




Fig. 5: Identifying Accessory Drive Belt Tensioner Rotating Direction - Clockwise Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

- 4. Remove the 2 bolts and the accessory drive belt tensioner.
  - To install, tighten to 25 N.m {2.5 kgf.m, 18 ft.lbf}.

#### NOTE:

 The accessory drive belt tensioner must be replaced as a complete unit.

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
5. To install, reverse the removal procedure.

# ACCESSORY DRIVE BELT IDLER PULLEY REMOVAL/INSTALLATION - 2.5L

#### REMOVAL/INSTALLATION

#### All idler pulleys

- 1. With the vehicle in NEUTRAL, position it on a hoist. See **LIFTING**.
- 2. Remove the pin-type retainer, 5 bolts and the RH splash shield.
  - To install, tighten to 9 N.m {0.9 kgf.m, 80 in.lbf}.
- 3. Using the hex feature, rotate the accessory drive belt tensioner clockwise and remove the accessory drive belt from the idler pulley.

#### **Smooth idler pulley**

- 4. Loosen the bolt and remove the smooth accessory drive belt idler pulley.
  - To install, tighten to 25 N.m {2.5 kgf.m, 18 ft.lbf}.

### **Grooved idler pulleys**

- 5. Remove the 3 bolts and the grooved accessory drive belt idler pulley and bracket.
  - To install, tighten to 25 N.m {2.5 kgf.m, 18 ft.lbf}.
- 6. To install, reverse the removal procedure.

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



Fig. 7: Identifying Valve Cover Removal/Installation - 2.5L (1 Of 2) Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

#### **REMOVAL**

#### **CAUTION:**

- During engine repair procedures, cleanliness is extremely important.
   Any foreign material, including any material created while cleaning gasket surfaces, that enters the oil passages, coolant passages or the oil pan can cause engine failure.
- 1. With the vehicle in NEUTRAL, position it on a hoist. See **LIFTING**.
- 2. Remove the ignition coil-on-plugs. See <u>IGNITION COIL-ON-PLUG REMOVAL/INSTALLATION</u> 2.5L.
- 3. Disconnect the crankcase vent hose from the valve cover.
- 4. Remove the 4 engine cover studs.
- 5. Detach the 3 wire harness retainers from the valve cover stud bolts.

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- 6. Disconnect the camshaft position (CMP) sensor electrical connector.
- 7. Disconnect the cylinder head temperature (CHT) sensor electrical connector.
- 8. Disconnect the Variable Camshaft Timing (VCT) solenoid electrical connector.
- 9. Remove the oil level indicator.
- 10. Remove the 14 valve cover retainers, the valve cover and the gasket.

#### INSTALLATION


Clean and inspect the sealing surfaces.

#### **CAUTION:**

- Do not use metal scrapers, wire brushes, power abrasive discs or other abrasive means to clean the sealing surfaces. These tools cause scratches and gouges which make leak paths.
- 2. Apply silicone gasket and sealant to the locations shown in the figure.

#### NOTE:

 The valve cover must be secured within 4 minutes of silicone gasket application. If the valve cover is not secured within 4 minutes, the sealant must be removed and the sealing area cleaned with metal surface prep.

- 3. Install the valve cover, gasket and retainers.
  - Tighten in the sequence shown in the figure to 10 N.m {1.0 kgf.m, 89 in.lbf}.

#### NOTE:

Clean and inspect the gasket. Install a new gasket, if necessary.

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


Fig. 10: Identifying Valve Cover Retainers Tightening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

- 4. Install the oil level indicator.
- 5. Connect the VCT solenoid electrical connector.
- 6. Connect the CHT sensor electrical connector.
- 7. Connect the CMP sensor electrical connector.
- 8. Attach the 3 wire harness retainers to the valve cover stud bolts.
- 9. Install the 4 engine cover studs.
- 10. Connect the crankcase vent hose to the valve cover.
- 11. Install the ignition coil-on-plugs. See <u>IGNITION COIL-ON-PLUG REMOVAL/INSTALLATION 2.5L</u>.




Fig. 11: Identifying Valve Train Components - 2.5L Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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### CAMSHAFTS REMOVAL/INSTALLATION - 2.5L

#### REMOVAL

#### **CAUTION:**


During engine repair procedures, cleanliness is extremely important.
 Any foreign material (including any material created while cleaning gasket surfaces) that enters the oil passages, coolant passages or the oil pan can cause engine failure.

# **CAUTION:**

- Do not rotate the camshafts unless instructed to in this procedure. Rotating the camshafts or crankshaft with timing components loosened or removed can cause serious damage to the valves or pistons.
- 1. With the vehicle in NEUTRAL, position it on a hoist. See **LIFTING**.
- 2. Disconnect the battery ground cable.
- 3. Remove the degas bottle. See <u>DEGAS BOTTLE REMOVAL/INSTALLATION 2.5L</u>.
- 4. Remove the valve cover. See <u>VALVE COVER REMOVAL/INSTALLATION 2.5L</u>.
- 5. Remove the front RF wheel and tire. See <u>WHEEL AND TIRE REMOVAL/INSTALLATION</u>.
- 6. Remove the accessory drive belt. See <u>ACCESSORY DRIVE BELT REMOVAL/INSTALLATION 2.5L</u>.
- 7. Using the crankshaft pulley bolt, turn the crankshaft sprocket to position the No. 1 piston at top dead center (TDC).
  - The hole in the crankshaft pulley should be in the 6 o'clock position.

#### **CAUTION:**

 Failure to position the No. 1 piston at top dead center (TDC) can result in damage to the engine. Turn the engine in the normal direction of rotation only.

8. Install the special tool in the slots on the rear of both camshafts.

#### **CAUTION:**

 The Camshaft Alignment Plate 303-465 is for camshaft alignment only. Using this tool to prevent engine rotation can result in engine damage.




Fig. 13: Identifying Camshaft Alignment Plate 303-465 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

#### NOTE:

- The camshaft timing slots are offset. If the special tool cannot be installed, rotate the crankshaft one complete revolution clockwise to correctly position the camshafts.
- 9. Remove the engine bolt plug.




Fig. 14: Locating Engine Bolt Plug Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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10. Install the crankshaft timing peg and turn the crankshaft clockwise until the crankshaft contacts the crankshaft timing peg.

#### NOTE:

 The special tool will contact the crankshaft and prevent it from turning past TDC. However, the crankshaft can still be rotated in the counterclockwise direction. The crankshaft must remain at the TDC position during the camshaft removal and installation.




Fig. 15: Identifying Special Tool 303-507 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

11. Install a standard 6 mm bolt (0.23 in) x 18 mm (0.7 in) bolt through the crankshaft pulley and thread it into the front cover.

### **CAUTION:**

 Only hand-tighten the bolt or damage to the front cover can occur.




Fig. 16: Locating Standard Bolt 6 x 18 mm (0.23 x 0.7 in) Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

12. Remove the front cover timing hole plug from the engine front cover.

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


Fig. 17: Locating Front Cover Timing Hole Plug **Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.** 

13. Remove the upper front cover timing hole plug from the engine front cover.





Fig. 18: Locating Upper Front Cover Timing Hole Plug Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.


14. Reposition the special tool to the slot on the rear of the intake camshaft only.



- 15. Using a small pick tool, unlock the chain tensioner ratchet through the lower front cover timing hole.
  - Using the flats of the camshaft, have an assistant rotate the exhaust camshaft clockwise to collapse the timing chain tensioner plunger.
  - Insert an M6 x 30 mm (1.18 in) bolt into the upper front cover timing hole to hold the tensioner arm in the retracted position.

#### NOTE:


- Releasing the ratcheting mechanism in the timing chain tensioner allows the plunger to collapse and create slack in the timing chain. Installing an M6 x 18mm (1.18 in) bolt into the upper front cover timing hole will hold the tensioner arm in a retracted position and allow enough slack in the timing chain for removal of the exhaust camshaft gear.
- 16. Remove the special tool.




Fig. 23: Locating Timing Chain Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 24: Locating Camshaft Lobe Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

- 20. Remove the camshafts from the engine.
  - Loosen the camshaft bearing cap bolts, in sequence, one at a time until all tension is released from the camshaft bearing caps.
  - Remove the bolts and the camshaft bearing caps.
  - Remove the camshafts.

#### **CAUTION:**

• Failure to follow the camshaft loosening procedure can result in damage to the camshafts.

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



Fig. 25: Identifying Camshaft Bearing Cap Bolts Loosening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

#### NOTE:

- Mark the location and orientation of each camshaft bearing cap.
- 21. If removal of the camshaft phaser and sprocket is necessary, mark the sprocket and camshaft for reference during installation.
  - If necessary, place the camshaft in a soft-jawed vise. Remove the bolt and the camshaft phaser and sprocket.


#### **INSTALLATION**

- 1. If necessary, position the camshaft in a soft-jawed vise and install the camshaft phaser and sprocket and the bolt.
  - Align the reference marks on the camshaft phaser and sprocket and the camshaft. Tighten the bolt to 72 N.m {7.2 kgf.m, 53 ft.lbf}.

#### NOTE:

 If new parts are installed, transfer the reference marks made during disassembly to the new parts.

2. Install the camshafts and bearing caps in their original location and orientation. Tighten the bolts in the sequence shown in the figure in 3 stages.

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- Stage 1: Tighten the camshaft bearing bolt caps one turn at a time until tight.
- Stage 2: Tighten the bolts to 7 N.m {0.7 kgf.m, 62 in.lbf}.
- Stage 3: Tighten the bolts to 16 N.m {1.6 kgf.m, 141 in.lbf}.

#### **CAUTION:**

 Install the camshafts with the alignment slots in the camshafts lined up so the camshaft alignment plate can be installed without rotating the camshafts. Make sure the lobes on the No. 1 cylinder are in the same position as noted in the removal procedure. Rotating the camshafts when the timing chain is removed, or installing the camshafts 180 degrees out of position can cause severe damage to the valves and pistons.





Fig. 28: Identifying Camshaft Bearing Cap Bolts Tightening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 30: Locating Timing Chain Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

- 5. Position the exhaust camshaft drive gear in the timing chain and install the gear and bolt on the exhaust camshaft.
  - Hand-tighten the bolt.

#### NOTE:

 The timing chain must be correctly engaged on the teeth of the crankshaft timing sprocket and the intake camshaft drive gear in order to install the exhaust camshaft drive gear onto the exhaust camshaft.

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


Fig. 31: Locating Exhaust Camshaft Drive Gear And Bolt On Exhaust Camshaft Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.


6. Remove the M6 x 30 mm bolt from the upper front cover timing hole to release the tensioner arm.

NOTE:

- Releasing the tensioner arm will remove the slack from the timing chain release.
- 7. Using the flats on the camshaft to prevent camshaft rotation, tighten the bolts.
  - Tighten to 72 N.m {7.3 kgf.m, 53 ft.lbf}.

NOTE:

• The special tool 303-465 is for camshaft alignment only. Using this tool to prevent engine rotation can result in engine damage.

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


Fig. 33: Identifying Camshaft Alignment Plate 303-465 **Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.**






Fig. 34: Locating Standard Bolt 6 x 18 mm (0.23 x 0.7 in) **Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.**





Fig. 37: Locating Lower Front Cover Timing Hole Plug Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

- 2. Remove the camshafts. See <u>CAMSHAFTS REMOVAL/INSTALLATION 2.5L</u>.
- 3. Remove and inspect the valve tappets. See <u>VALVE TAPPETS REMOVAL/INSTALLATION 2.5L</u>.

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**CAUTION:** 

 If the camshafts and valve tappets are to be reused, mark the location of the valve tappets to make sure they are assembled in their original locations.

NOTE:

- The number on the valve tappets only reflects the digits that follow the decimal. For example, a tappet with the number of 0.650 has the thickness of 3.650 mm.
- 4. To install, reverse the removal procedure.
  - Coat the valve tappets with clean engine oil prior to installation.

### VALVE SPRING REMOVAL/INSTALLATION - 2.5L

#### REMOVAL

**CAUTION:** 

- During engine repair procedures, cleanliness is extremely important.
   Any foreign material created while cleaning gasket surfaces, that enters the oil passages, coolant passages or the oil pan may cause engine failure.
- 1. With the vehicle in NEUTRAL, position it on a hoist. See **LIFTING**
- 2. Remove the camshafts. See <u>CAMSHAFTS REMOVAL/INSTALLATION 2.5L</u>.
- 3. Remove and inspect the valve tappets. See <u>VALVE TAPPETS REMOVAL/INSTALLATION 2.5L</u>.

NOTE:

 If the camshafts and valve tappets are to be reused, mark the location of the valve tappets to make sure they are assembled in their original positions.

NOTE:

- The number on the valve tappets only reflects the digits that follow the decimal. For example, a tappet with the number 0.650 has the thickness of 3.650 mm.
- 4. Remove the spark plugs. See SPARK PLUGS REMOVAL/INSTALLATION 2.5L.
- 5. Connect the compressed air supply to the No. 1 cylinder.

**CAUTION:** 

- Use compressed air at 7 to 10 bars (100-150 psi). Do not disconnect the compressed air from the cylinder until the valve spring, valve spring retainer and valve collet is installed.
- 6. Apply compressed air to the cylinder and remove the valve spring.
  - Using the special tools, compress the valve spring and remove the valve collet, using some multipurpose grease and a small screwdriver.








Fig. 41: Illustrating Removing/Installing Valve Spring Retainer And Valve Spring Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 42: Identifying Special Tool (303-468, 303-005) Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





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

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




Fig. 48: Locating Hole On Crankshaft Pulley Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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



Fig. 51: Identifying Special Tool 303-507 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






Fig. 54: Locating 6 mm (0.23 in) Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 55: Locating Crankshaft Pulley Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 56: Locating Crankshaft Pulley Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 57: Identifying Special Tool 303-507 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 58: Identifying Camshaft Alignment Plate 303-465 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 59: Identifying Special Tool 303-507 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 60: Identifying Special Tool 303-507 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 62: Identifying Camshaft Alignment Plate 303-465 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 63: Identifying Camshaft Alignment Plate 303-465 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 64: Locating 6 mm (0.23 in) x 18 mm (0.7 in) Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 65: Identifying Special Tool 303-507 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 66: Identifying Special Tool 303-507 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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

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


Fig. 68: Identifying Special Tool 303-096 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 69: Identifying Flexplate Bolts Tightening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 70: Identifying Flexplate Bolts Tightening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 71: Identifying Special Tool 303-328 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.







Fig. 74: Identifying Oil Pan Bolts Tightening Torque




Fig. 76: Identifying Engine Front Cover Removal/Installation - 2.5L Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 77: Illustrating Removing Crankshaft Front Oil Seal Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 78: Locating Engine Front Cover Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






Fig. 80: Identifying Engine Front Cover Bolts Tightening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 81: Identifying Special Tool 303-096 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 82: Locating 6 mm (0.23 in) x 18 mm (0.7 in) Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 83: Locating CKP Sensor And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 85: Locating 6 mm (0.23 in) x 18 mm (0.7 in) Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.







Fig. 87: Locating Timing Chain Tensioner Arm Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 89: Locating Timing Chain Guide Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 91: Locating Flats On Camshaft, Bolt And Camshaft Phaser And Sprocket Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 92: Locating Camshaft Sprockets And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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



Fig. 96: Locating Timing Chain Tensioner, Bolts And Paper Clip Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 98: Identifying Engine Mount Removal/Installation - 2.5L Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 99: Identifying Special Tool 303-F072 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 100: Identifying Special Tool 303-F072 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 102: Identifying Camshaft Alignment Plate 303-465 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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


Fig. 105: Locating Silicone Gasket And Sealant Applying Locations Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 106: Identifying Cylinder Head Bolts Tightening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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



Fig. 108: Identifying Bearing Cap Bolts Tightening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 110: Locating Lateral Support Crossmember Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 112: Locating Bolt And Ground Eyelet Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 114: Locating Cable Nut

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


Fig. 116: Locating Bolt And Ground Strap Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 117: Locating Wiring Harness Retainers Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 118: Identifying Clutch Hydraulic Line Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





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


Fig. 123: Locating Block Heater Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 124: Locating Upper Radiator Hose Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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


Fig. 127: Locating Vacuum Supply Tube Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 128: Locating Fuel Vapor Return Tube Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 129: Locating Fuel Supply Tube Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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


Fig. 132: Locating Generator Electrical Connector And Retainers Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 133: Locating A/C Compressor Electrical Connector And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 135: Locating Front Roll Restrictor Bolt And Engine Support Crossmember Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




<u>Fig. 136: Locating Rear Nut And Engine Support Crossmember</u> Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 138: Locating Engine-To-Transaxle Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 139: Locating Engine Oil Filter





Fig. 141: Locating Engine Mount Bracket Bolt

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





Fig. 144: Locating LH Transaxle Mount Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 146: Locating Ground Wire Nut

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




Fig. 149: Identifying Special Tools (014-0001 - 014-00765) Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 150: Locating Starter Motor Isolator Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 151: Locating Starter Motor Stud Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






Fig. 152: Locating Ground Wire Nut Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 155: Locating Rear Transaxle Mount Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 156: Locating Engine Mount Bracket Nuts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 157: Locating Engine Mount Bracket Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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




Fig. 158: Locating Spin On Engine Oil Filter Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 161: Locating Engine Support Crossmember And Nut Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 163: Locating Lower Radiator Hose




Fig. 165: Locating Generator Electrical Connector And Retainers Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 166: Locating Engine Control Harness Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 168: Locating Fuel Supply Quick Connect Coupling Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 169: Locating Fuel Vapor Return Tube And Retainer Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 171: Locating Heater Hoses




Fig. 172: Identifying Heater Hose Support Strap Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 173: Locating Upper Radiator Hose Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




<u>Fig. 174: Locating Block Heater Electrical Connector</u> Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 176: Locating Shift Cables Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 177: Locating Reversing Lamp Indicator Switch Electrical Connector And Wiring Harness Retainers

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



Fig. 178: Locating Vehicle Speed Sensor Electrical Connector And Pin-Type Retainers Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.







Fig. 182: Locating Power Distribution Box Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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


Fig. 185: Locating Ground Eyelet Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 186: Locating Locking Tab And Generator Air Duct Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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



Fig. 189: Locating Locking Tabs Of Lower Air Duct Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.








Fig. 193: Identifying Stabilizer Bar Link, Tie Rod End Retaining Nut And Lower Control Arm Knuckle Bolt





Fig. 194: Locating Brake Hose Retainer And ABS Sensor Retaining Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 196: Identifying Special Tool For Removing Tie-Rod End Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 197: Locating Halfshaft





Fig. 198: Locating Intermediate Shaft Retaining Nuts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 200: Locating Driveshaft To PTU Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.







Fig. 203: Locating PDB Cable Nut Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 205: Locating Ground Strap Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 206: Locating 34-Pin Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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




Fig. 208: Locating Transaxle Vent Tube Retaining Clip Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 211: Locating Wiring Harness Pin-Type Retainer And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 212: Locating Transaxle Range Sensor Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 214: Locating Rear Transaxle Fluid Cooler Tube Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 215: Identifying Transaxle Fluid Cooler Tube Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 216: Locating OSS Sensor Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 218: Locating Upper Radiator Hose Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 220: Locating Heater Hoses Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 222: Identifying Accelerator And Speed Control Cable And Accelerator Cable Bracket Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 223: Locating Accelerator Control Cable Bracket And Nut Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 224: Locating Accelerator Control Cable Bracket And Nut Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 226: Locating Fuel Vapor Return Tube And Retainer Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 227: Locating Fuel Supply Tube Quick Connect Coupling Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 229: Locating Ground Wire Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 230: Locating PCM Electrical Connectors Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 231: Locating Lower Radiator Hose Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






Fig. 234: Locating Rear Nut And Engine Support Crossmember Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 235: Locating Bolts And Dampener Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 237: Locating Transaxle-To-Engine Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 239: Locating Engine Mount Bracket Bolt





Fig. 240: Locating Engine Mount Bracket Nuts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






Fig. 243: Identifying Battery Cable Nut And Starter Solenoid Terminal Nut Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 244: Locating Wire Harness Clip Retainer And Ground Wire Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 245: Locating Starter Motor Stud Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






Fig. 248: Locating Catalytic Converter Heat Shield Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 249: Locating Exhaust Manifold Nuts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 250: Locating PTU Bracket-To-Engine Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 251: Locating PTU Bracket-To-PTU Bolts And Bracket Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 252: Locating PTU Vent Hose Retainer Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






Fig. 255: Locating Torque Converter Nuts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 256: Locating Torque Converter Nuts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 257: Identifying Special Tools (014-0001 - 014-00765) Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.








Fig. 261: Locating Starter Motor Isolator Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 262: Locating Starter Motor Stud Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 263: Locating Ground Wire Nut Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






Fig. 265: Locating LH Transaxle Mount Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 268: Locating Engine Mount Bracket Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 269: Locating Spin On Engine Oil Filter Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 273: Locating Dampener And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 275: Locating Transaxle-To-Engine Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.







Fig. 278: Locating Lower Radiator Hose Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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



Fig. 281: Locating Engine Control Harness Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 283: Locating Fuel Supply Quick Connect Coupling Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 285: Locating Vacuum Supply Tube Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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



Fig. 293: Locating Wiring Harness Retainers Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.







Fig. 296: Locating PDB Cable Nut Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.







Fig. 304: Locating Driveshaft To PTU Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





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

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## **ENGINE DISASSEMBLY - 2.5L**

#### DISASSEMBLY

#### **CAUTION:**

• Do not loosen or remove the crankshaft pulley without first installing the special tools as instructed in this procedure. The crankshaft pulley and the crankshaft timing sprocket are not keyed to the crankshaft. The crankshaft, the crankshaft sprocket and the pulley are fitted together by friction, using diamond washers between the flange faces on each part. For that reason, the crankshaft sprocket is also unfastened if you loosen the pulley bolt. Before any repair requiring loosening or removal of the crankshaft pulley bolt, the crankshafts and camshafts must be locked in place by special service tools, otherwise severe engine damage can occur.

## **CAUTION:**

During engine repair procedures, cleanliness is extremely important.
 Any foreign material, including any material created while cleaning gasket surfaces that enters the oil passages, coolant passages or the oil pan, can cause engine failure.

#### NOTE:

 Due to the precision fit and timing of the balancer shaft assembly, it cannot be removed from the engine block.

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


Fig. 312: Locating Clutch Pressure Plate To Clutch Disc Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 313: Locating Starter Motor Isolator Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 314: Locating Flywheel Bolts





Fig. 315: Locating Flexplate Bolts






<u>Fig. 317: Locating Nut And Generator Electrical Connections</u> Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 319: Locating Heat Shield Bolts And Heat Shield Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 321: Locating Generator Nut And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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


Fig. 324: Locating Coolant Pump Pulley Bolts **Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.**





Fig. 325: Locating Coolant Pump Bolts **Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.**




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# Fig. 326: Locating Wiring Harness Retainers Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 328: Locating Bolt And Oil Level Indicator Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 329: Locating Engine Oil Pressure Switch Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 331: Locating Bolts And Oil Filter Adapter Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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




Fig. 333: Locating Wiring Harness Retainers Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 336: Locating Idle Air Control Motor Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 337: Locating Swirl Control Valve Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 338: Locating Fuel Rail Pressure And Temperature Sensor Electrical Connector And Vacuum




Fig. 339: Locating Radio Capacitor Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 340: Locating Throttle Position Sensor Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






Fig. 345: Locating Nut And Radio Capacitor Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 346: Locating Stud Bolts And Fuel Rail With Fuel Injectors Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 347: Locating Wiring Harness Retainer Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 348: Locating EGR Valve Electrical Connectors Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.







Fig. 351: Locating Rubber Boot And Cylinder Head Temperature Sensor Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 353: Locating Coolant Hose Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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





Fig. 357: Locating Block Heater Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 359: Locating Spark Plugs And CHT Sensor Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 360: Locating Bolts And Valve Cover Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 361: Locating Crankshaft Pulley Hole Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.



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


Fig. 363: Locating Engine Plug Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 364: Identifying Special Tool 303-507 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


<u>Fig. 365: Locating Special Tools And Hardened Washers</u> Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






<u>Fig. 367: Removing Crankshaft Front Oil Seal</u> Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 369: Locating Engine Front Cover Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 370: Identifying Timing Chain Tensioner Bolts And Paper Clip Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 371: Locating Timing Chain Tensioner Arm **Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.**





Fig. 372: Locating Timing Chain **Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.**






Fig. 375: Identifying Tensioner Spring, Tensioner And Shoulder Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 376: Identifying Bolt And Sprocket Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 378: Identifying Camshaft Bearing Cap Bolts Loosening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 379: Locating Cylinder Head Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 380: Locating Cylinder Head Alignment Dowels **Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.**





Fig. 381: Locating Oil Pan Bolts **Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.**





Fig. 383: Locating Oil Pump Pickup Tube Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

# **ENGINE ASSEMBLY - 2.5L**

#### **ASSEMBLY**

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#### **CAUTION:**

• Do not loosen or remove the crankshaft pulley bolt without first installing the special tools as instructed in this procedure. The crankshaft pulley and the crankshaft timing sprocket are not keyed to the crankshaft. The crankshaft, the crankshaft sprocket and the pulley are fitted together by friction, using diamond washers between the flange faces on each part. For that reason, the crankshaft sprocket is also unfastened if you loosen the pulley bolt. Before any repair requiring loosening or removal of the crankshaft pulley bolt, the crankshafts and the camshafts must be locked in place by the special tools, otherwise, severe engine damage may occur.

#### **CAUTION:**


During engine repair procedures, cleanliness is extremely important.
 Any foreign material (including any material created while cleaning gasket surfaces) that enters the oil passages coolant passages or the oil pan, may cause engine failure.

#### All vehicles

1. Turn the crankshaft clockwise to position the No. 1 piston at top dead center (TDC).

#### **CAUTION:**

- Failure to position the No. 1 piston at TDC can result in damage to the engine. Turn the engine in the normal direction of rotation only.
- 2. Remove the engine plug bolt.

3. Install the special tool.

NOTE:

 The special tool will contact the crankshaft and prevent it from turning past TDC. However, the crankshaft can still be rotated in the

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counterclockwise direction. The crankshaft must remain at the TDC position until the timing drive components and crankshaft pulley are installed.




Fig. 386: Identifying Special Tool 303-507 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

- 4. Install the oil pump assembly. Tighten the bolts in the sequence shown in the figure in 2 stages.
  - Stage 1: Tighten the bolts to 10 N.m {1.0 kgf.m, 89 in.lbf}.
  - Stage 2: Tighten the bolts to 20 N.m {1.5 kgf.m, 177 in.lbf}.

#### NOTE:

• Clean the oil pump and cylinder block mating surfaces with metal surface cleaner.




Fig. 387: Identifying Oil Pump Assembly Bolts Tightening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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- 5. Install a new oil pump pickup tube gasket and the pickup tube.
  - Tighten to 10 N.m {1.0 kgf.m, 89 in.lbf}.




Fig. 388: Locating Oil Pump Pickup Tube Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

6. Using the special tool, install the crankshaft rear main oil seal.





Fig. 389: Identifying Special Tool 303-328 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

  - To install, tighten to 10 N.m {1.0 kgf.m, 89 in.lbf}.


8. Clean and inspect all mating surfaces.

#### **CAUTION:**

- Do not use metal scrapers, wire brushes, power abrasive discs or other abrasive means to clean the sealing surfaces. These tools cause scratches and gouges, which make leak paths. Use a plastic scraping tool to remove traces of sealant.
- 9. Apply a 2.5 mm (0.098 in) bead of silicone gasket and sealant to the oil pan. Install the 2 oil pan bolts finger-tight.

#### NOTE:


 If the oil pan is not secured within 4 minutes of sealant application, the sealant must be removed and the sealing area cleaned with metal surface cleaner. Allow to dry until there is no sign of wetness, or 4 minutes, whichever is longer. Failure to follow this procedure can cause future oil leakage.



<u>Fig. 391: Locating Oil Pan And Bolts</u> Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.


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10. Using a suitable straightedge, align the front surface of the oil pan flush with the front surface of the engine block.


- 11. Install the remaining oil pan bolts and tighten the oil pan bolts in the sequence shown in the figure.
  - Tighten to 25 N.m {2.5 kgf.m, 18 ft.lbf}.

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- 12. Install the cylinder head alignment dowels.
  - Dowels must be fully seated in the cylinder block.

- 13. Clean the cylinder head-to-cylinder block mating surface of both the cylinder head and the cylinder block.
  - 1. Remove any large deposits of silicone or gasket material with a plastic scraper.
  - 2. Apply silicone gasket remover, following package directions, and allow to set for several minutes.
  - 3. Remove the silicone gasket remover with a plastic scraper. A second application of silicone gasket remover may be required if residual traces of silicone or gasket material remain.
  - 4. Apply metal surface prep, following package directions, to remove any traces of oil or coolant, and to prepare the surfaces to bond with the new gasket. Do not attempt to make the metal shiny. Some staining of the metal surfaces is normal.

#### CAUTION:

 Do not use metal scrapers, wire brushes, power abrasive discs or other abrasive means to clean the sealing surfaces. These tools cause scratches and gouges that make leak paths. Use a plastic scraping tool to remove all traces of the head gasket.

NOTE:

Observe all warnings and cautions and follow all application

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directions contained on the packaging of the silicone gasket remover and the metal surface prep.

NOTE:

- If there is no residual gasket material present, metal surface prep can be used to clean and prepare the surfaces.
- 14. Apply silicone gasket and sealant to the locations shown in the figure.





Fig. 395: Locating Silicone Gasket And Sealant Applying Locations Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

  - Stage 1: Tighten the bolts to 5 N.m {0.51 kgf.m, 44 in.lbf}.
  - Stage 2: Tighten the bolts to 15 N.m {1.5 kgf.m, 132 in.lbf}.
  - Stage 3: Tighten the bolts to 45 N.m {4.6 kgf.m, 33 ft.lbf}.

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- Stage 4: Turn the bolts 90 degrees.
- Stage 5: Turn the bolts an additional 90 degrees.





Fig. 397: Identifying Cylinder Head Bolts Tightening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

NOTE:

The cylinder head bolts are torque-to-yield and must not be reused.
 New cylinder head bolts must be installed.

NOTE:

- Lubricate the bolts with clean engine oil prior to installation.
- 17. Install the camshafts and bearing caps in their original location and orientation. Tighten the bearing caps in the sequence shown in the figure in 3 stages.
  - Stage 1: Tighten the camshaft bearing bolt caps one turn at a time until finger-tight.
  - Stage 2: Tighten the bolts to 7 N.m {0.71 kgf.m, 62 in.lbf}.
  - Stage 3: Tighten the bolts to  $16 \text{ N.m } \{1.6 \text{ kgf.m}, 141 \text{ in.lbf}\}.$

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#### **CAUTION:**

 Install the camshafts with the alignment slots in the camshafts lined up so the camshaft alignment plate can be installed without rotating the camshafts. Make sure the lobes on the No. 1 cylinder are in the same position as noted in the disassembly procedure. Rotating the camshafts when the timing chain is removed, or installing the camshafts 180 degrees out of position, can cause severe damage to the valves and pistons.

#### NOTE:

- Lubricate the camshaft journals and bearing caps with clean engine oil.
- 18. Install the VCT system oil filter and the plug in the intake camshaft thrust cap.
  - Tighten the bolts to 17 N.m {1.7 kgf.m, 150 in.lbf}.




Fig. 399: Locating VCT System Oil Filter And Plug Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

- 19. Install the Variable Camshaft Timing (VCT) solenoid and the bolt.
  - Tighten the bolts to 10 N.m {1.0 kgf.m, 89 in.lbf}.




Fig. 400: Locating Variable Camshaft Timing Solenoid And Bolt





Fig. 401: Locating Crankshaft Sprocket Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 403: Locating Oil Pump Chain Tensioner Shoulder Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





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



Fig. 407: Locating Timing Chain Guide Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






Fig. 410: Compressing Timing Chain Tensioner Plunger Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 411: Pushing Back And Hold Ratchet Mechanism Using Small Pick Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 412: Pushing Ratchet Arm Back Into Tensioner Housing Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 413: Holding Ratchet Assembly And Plunger Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 415: Locating Camshaft Bolts

- 36. Apply a 2.5 mm (0.09 in) bead of silicone gasket and sealant to the cylinder head and oil pan joint areas. Apply a 2.5 mm (0.09 in) bead of silicone gasket and sealant to the front cover.

#### NOTE:

 The engine front cover must be installed and the bolts tightened within 4 minutes of applying the silicone gasket and sealant.





Fig. 416: Locating Bead Of Silicone Gasket And Sealant On Front Cover Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 418: Identifying Special Tool 303-096 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 419: Positioning Crankshaft Pulley Hole




Fig. 420: Locating 6 mm (0.23 in) x 18 mm (0.7 in) Bolt In Crankshaft Pulley Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 421: Locating Crankshaft Pulley Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 422: Locating 6 mm (0.23 in) x 18 mm (0.7 in) Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 423: Identifying Special Tool 303-507 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


<u>Fig. 424: Identifying Camshaft Alignment Plate 303-465</u> Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 426: Identifying Special Tool 303-507 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 427: Locating 6 mm (0.23 in) x 18 mm (0.7 in) Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 429: Identifying Camshaft Alignment Plate 303-465 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 431: Identifying CKP Sensor And Alignment Tool 303-1417 Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 432: Locating 6 mm (0.23 in) x 18 mm (0.7 in) Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 434: Locating Engine Plug Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 435: Locating Silicone Gasket And Sealant Applying Locations Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 436: Identifying Valve Cover Bolts Tightening Sequence Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 438: Locating Coil-On-Plugs, Bolts And Crank-Case Vent Tube Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 439: Locating Oil Level Indicator Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 440: Locating Block Heater Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 441: Locating Crankcase Vent Oil Separator And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 442: Locating Knock Sensor And Bolt Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 443: Locating Coolant Hoses

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



Fig. 444: Locating Coolant Hose Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 446: Locating EGR Tube Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 448: Locating Intake Manifold And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 450: Locating Fuel Rail With Fuel Injectors And Stud Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 451: Locating Radio Capacitor And Nut Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 452: Locating Fuel Rail Insulator Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 454: Locating Radio Capacitor Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 455: Locating Coil-On-Plugs And Camshaft Position Sensor Electrical Connectors Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




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

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



Fig. 459: Locating Electronic Throttle Control And Evaporative Emission Canister Purge Valve Electrical Connectors

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


Fig. 461: Locating Wiring Harness Retainers Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 462: Locating Crankcase Vent Hose Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 464: Locating VCT Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 465: Locating Capacitor And Bolt **Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.**

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



Fig. 466: Locating Oil Filter Adapter And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 468: Locating Coolant Tube Retainer Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 469: Locating Thermostat Housing And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 470: Locating Coolant Pump And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 471: Locating Coolant Pump Pulley And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 472: Locating Accessory Drive Belt Idler Pulley Bracket And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 474: Locating Accessory Drive Belt Tensioner And Bolts Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




Fig. 475: Locating Exhaust Manifold Studs In Cylinder Head Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






<u>Fig. 476: Identifying Exhaust Manifold Nuts Tightening Sequence</u> Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.





Fig. 478: Locating Heated Oxygen Sensor Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 480: Locating Generator Electrical Connection And Nut Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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



Fig. 482: Locating CKP Sensor Electrical Connector Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.






Fig. 485: Locating Transaxle Input Shaft Pilot Bearing Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.

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


Fig. 486: Positioning Clutch Disc On Flywheel Courtesy of MAZDA MOTORS CORP.




